

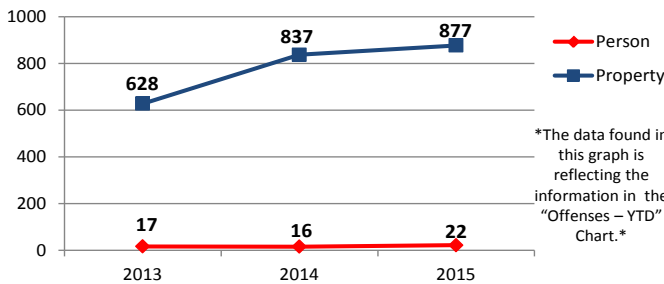

DRUG TAKE BACK DAY
SEPTEMBER 26TH (10-2 PM)

The Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) announced they will be holding the 10th National Drug Take Back day on Saturday, September 26th. The Castle Rock Police Department will be participating by collecting unwanted, unneeded or expired prescription drugs from 10 am to 2 pm in the lobby of the police department (100 Perry St., Castle Rock). As a reminder, the police department collects prescription drugs in their lobby during normal business hours (Monday-Friday, 8 am to 5 pm, excluding holidays).

The National Prescription Drug Take-Back addresses a vital public safety and public health issue. Many Americans are not aware that medicines, which languish in home cabinets, are highly susceptible to diversion, misuse and abuse. Rates of prescription drug abuse in the U.S. are at alarming rates, as are the number of accidental poisonings and overdoses due to these drugs. Studies show that many abused prescription drugs are obtained from family and friends, including home medicine cabinets. In addition, many Americans do not know how to properly dispose of their unused medicine, often flushing them down the toilet or throwing them away – both potential safety and health hazards.

“Prescription drug abuse is a huge problem and this is a great opportunity for folks around the country to help reduce the threat,” DEA Acting Administrator Chuck Rosenberg said. “Please clean out your medicine cabinet and make your home safe from drug theft and abuse.”

In the previous nine Take-Back events from 2010-2014, the nationwide collection of drugs totaled 4,823,251 pounds (or 2,411 tons of drugs).

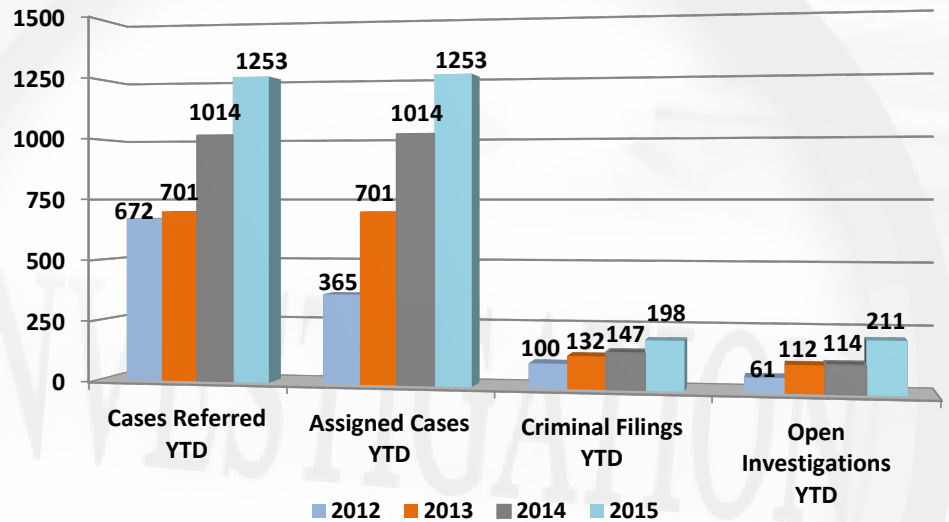


DETECTIVE UNIT

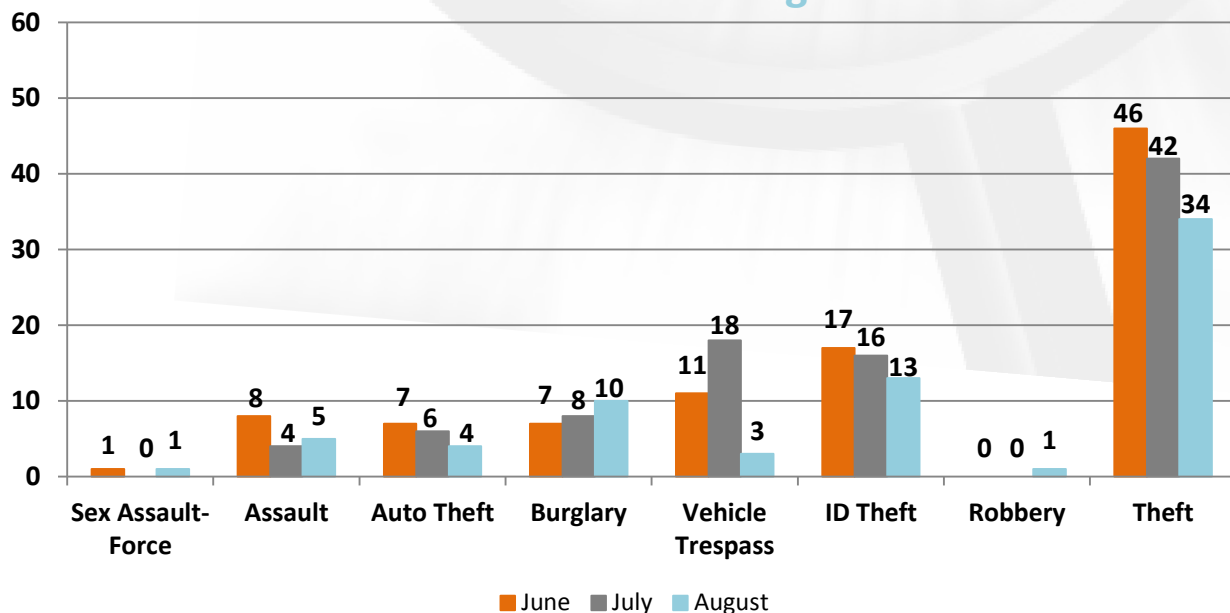
Police Officer Jennifer Dignam completed a rotation through the Detective Unit at the end of August. Officer Dignam performed admirably in this role. She was assigned 238 cases to investigate, some of which required review and contact with the victim; others required coordination with the Crime Analyst and further investigation; and others required criminal filings with the District Attorney's office. In all, Officer Dignam filed criminal charges in 19 cases, including a large filing on the many vandalisms that occurred during the summer months.

Crime Trend Comparison (3-month)

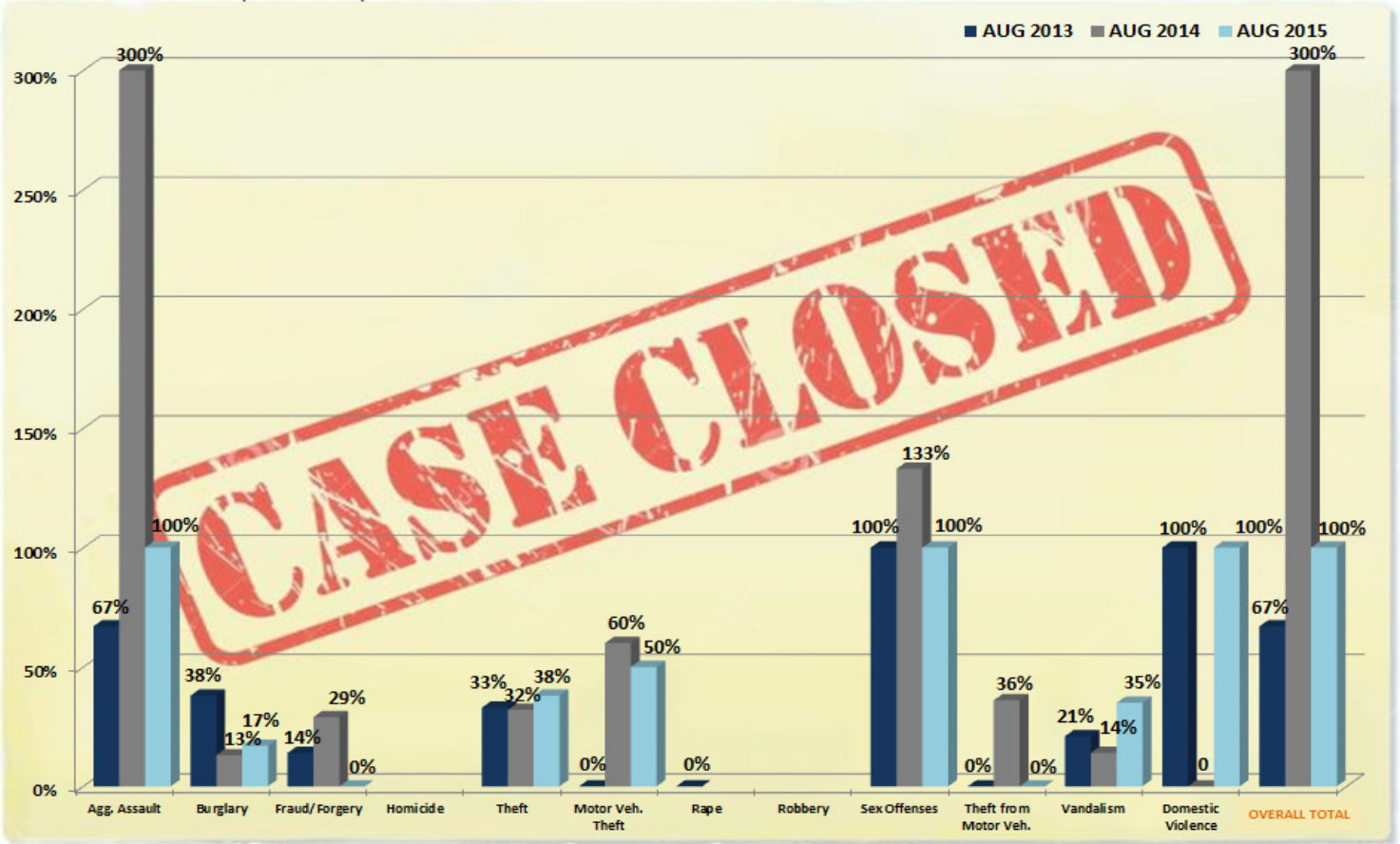
June 2015 to August 2015

(2013-2015)

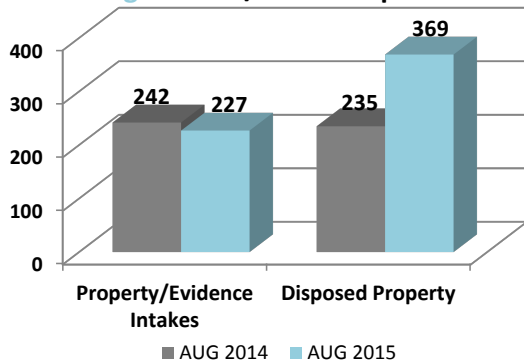

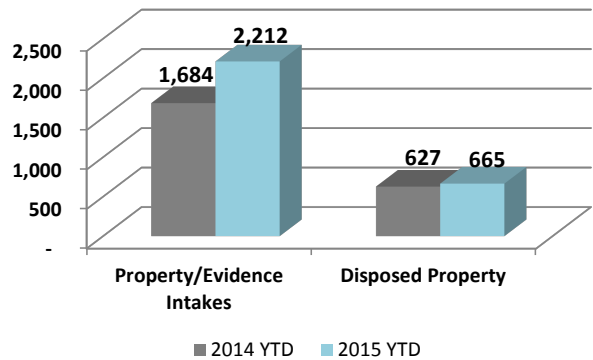
Property Intakes/Disposed

2014-2015 YTD

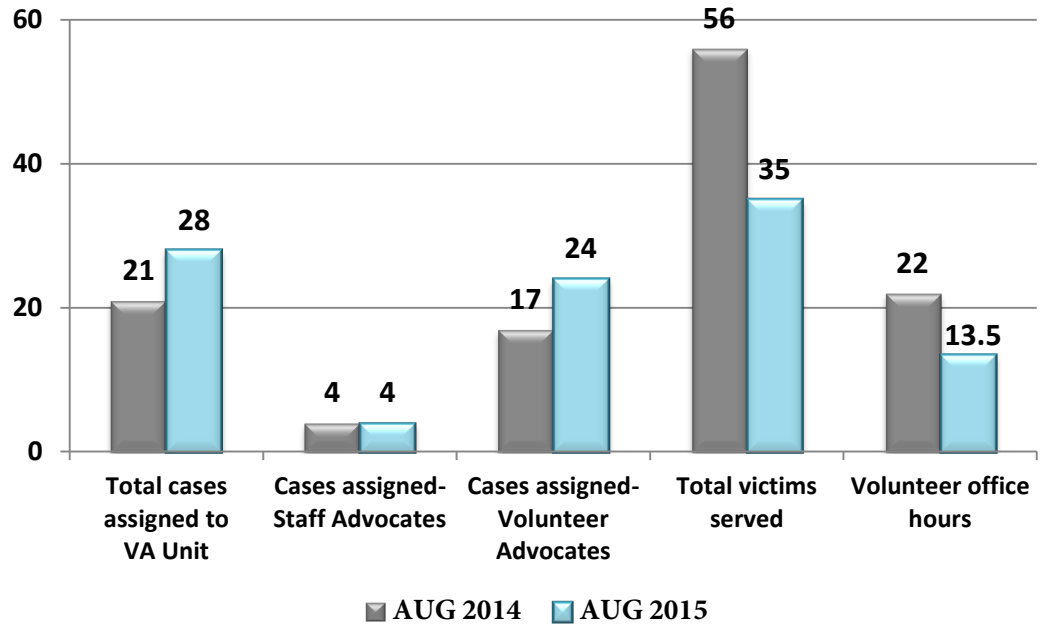

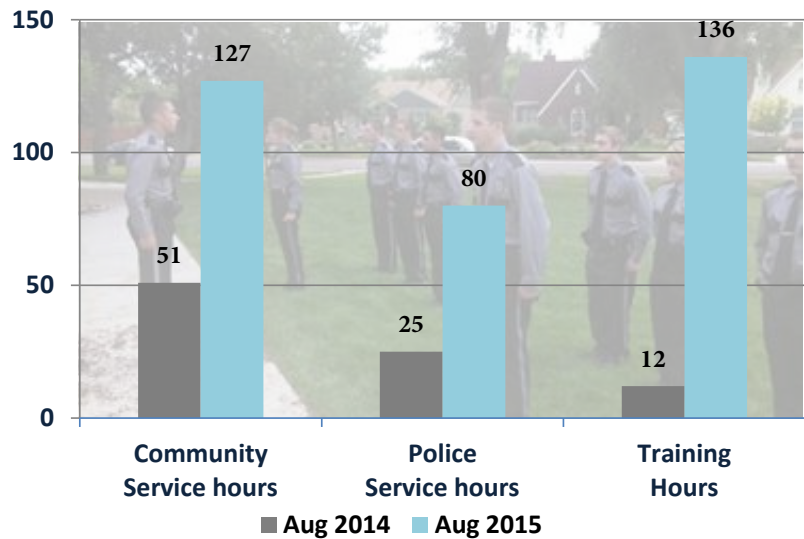

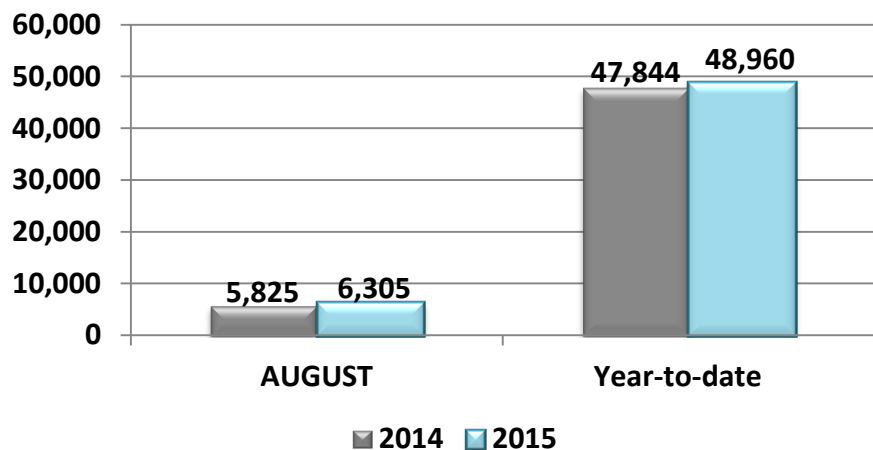

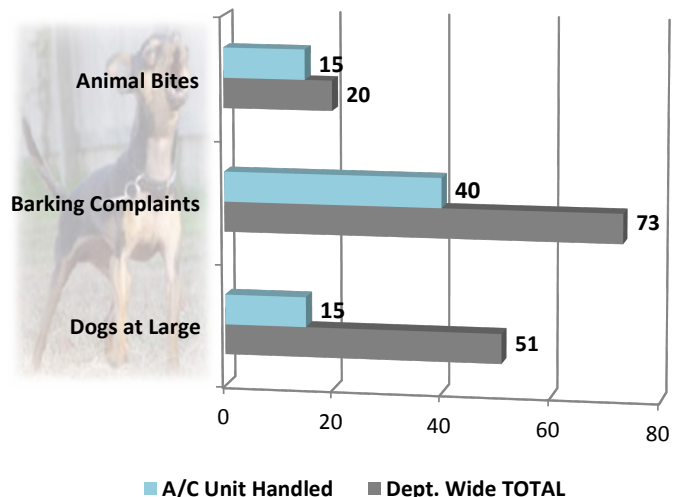

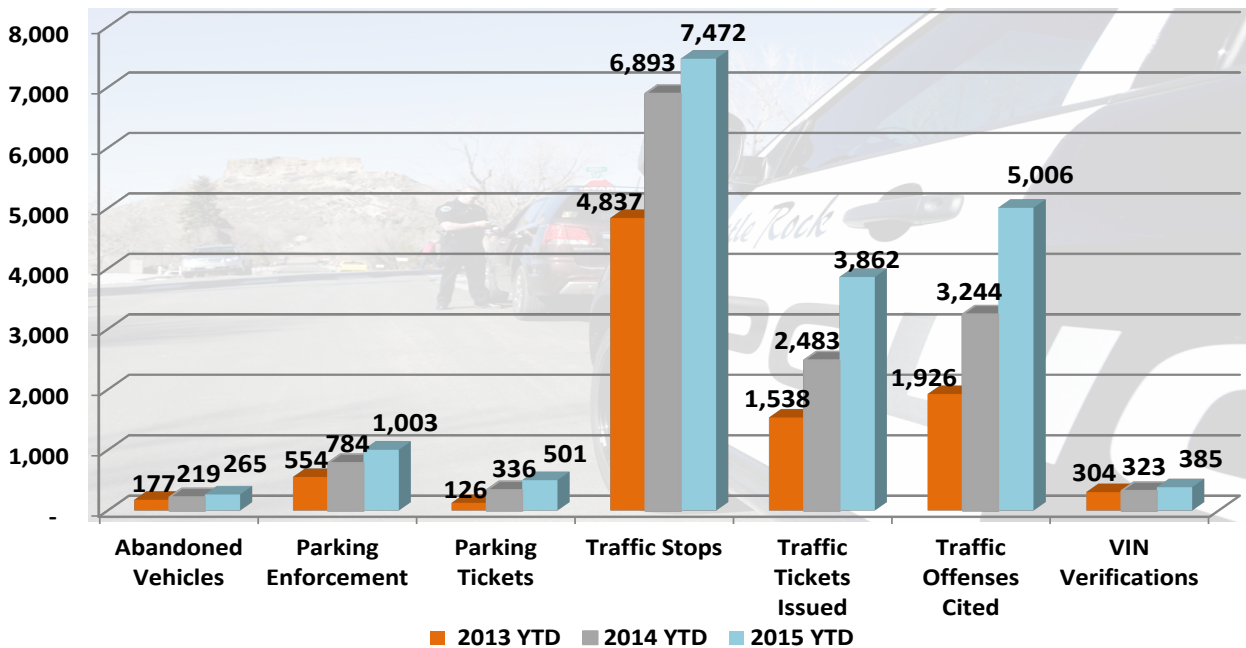

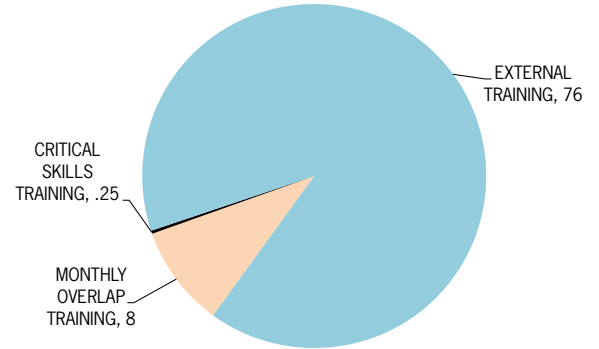

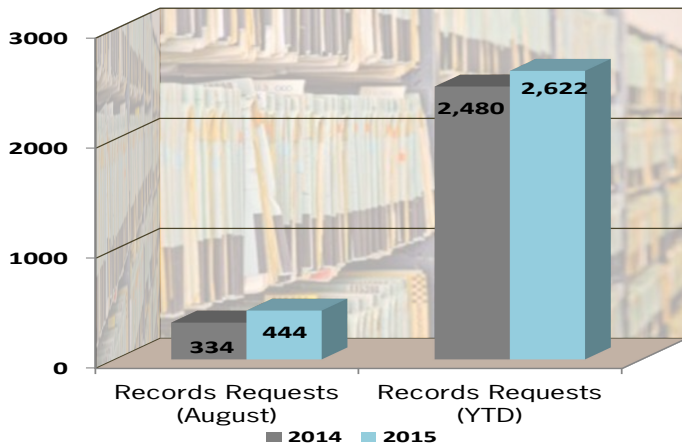


AUGUST 2015

(per employee)

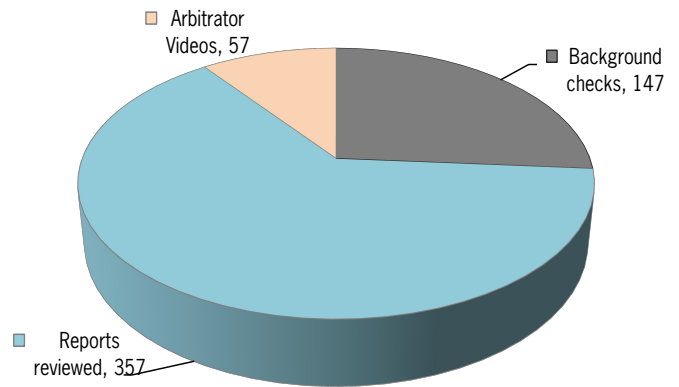

AUG 2014-2015 RECORDS REQUEST COMPARISON



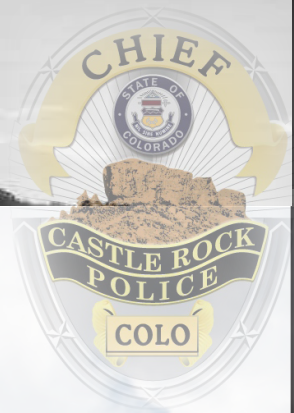
AUGUST RECORDS UNIT WORKLOAD
