

Pathfinders: Where we've been, where we are and where we're heading

From February 17th through the 19th, the Castle Rock Police Department hosted a Pathfinders session, welcoming law enforcement partners from Brooklyn Center, MN, and Overland Park, KS. The multi-day collaboration provided an opportunity for visiting agencies to learn more about CRPD's approach to strengthening the policing profession both within the department and throughout the community with our One-By-One policing philosophy.

Pathfinders is a facilitated, yet informal information-sharing experience designed to encourage open, honest, and thoughtful dialogue among participating agencies. The program creates space for reflection and conversation, allowing policing professionals to share ideas, discuss challenges, and learn from one another's experiences.

During their visit, members of the visiting agencies connected with personnel from across the department to ask questions, engage in discussion, and gain insight into CRPD's practices, leadership philosophy, and organizational culture. The experience highlights the value of collaboration and mutual learning in advancing the policing profession.









Community Response Team: Calls for service



● 2026 ● 2025 ● 2024




Animal Welfare Unit: Calls for service

Customer survey results
