




CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES

Parks, Open Space & Trails

The following updates summarize general progress that occurred throughout the month on capital projects managed through the Parks and Recreation department; for background information and additional details visit CRgov.com/ProjectUpdates.



GOAT GRAZING

 Goat grazing commenced at Memmen Ridge Open Space to reduce noxious weeds and vegetative fuel for wildfire mitigation. Goat Green, LLC, provided approximately 700 goats to graze throughout the property and remained on site for approximately three weeks.



MITCHELL GULCH PARK RENOVATION

 Playground and irrigation installation continued throughout the month, and curb and gutter is partially complete. Soil also continues to be imported for the parking lot and courts.

RED HAWK RIDGE GOLF COURSE

A new putting green area has been prepped and seeded at Red Hawk Ridge Golf Course. The green will require water and grow-in time prior to opening to the public, likely this fall or spring 2024 depending on progress.



PLUM CREEK NORTH PARK

 Staff held a pre-construction meeting with the project's general contractor and prepared for a groundbreaking event that will be held from 5-6 p.m. Wednesday, Aug. 2. The community was invited to provide public input on the future park's name, and an online survey was posted to obtain naming suggestions.



VEHICLE COUNTER

Summary

JULY VISITATION DATA

The data below is collected through w, a state-of-the-art vehicle counter collection software.

Historically, vehicle traffic data has been collected and presented in monthly reports at Philip S. Miller Park and Gateway Mesa Open Space. However, construction vehicles working on the access road improvement project accidentally drove over the hidden irrigation box that housed the vehicle counter, covering the unit in dirt and allowing water to infiltrate the protective coverings, which damaged the unit beyond repair. No data was collected in July, and a new unit will be ordered and installed, at which time reporting on


