Description of specific project for requested funds:*

Harry C. Miller American Legion Post 1187 supports many programs that enhance the quality of life for residents of Castle Rock. We provide gas, food, and shelter for stranded Veterans in Castle Rock and to homeless Veterans around Douglas County. We visit and aid local needy families of Veterans and service men and women. We serve local retirement facilities by gathering and donating food and clothing to assist those in need, and by visiting these facilities for flag raisings, presentations, and to offer emotional support. We have implemented a Buddy Check system to contact veterans to help prevent veteran suicide. We purchased US and POW Flags for the downtown Castle Rock area. We provide military honors and support for roughly 200 families at Ft. Logan National Cemetery and cemeteries around the Castle Rock Community. We sponsor local high school students for the annual American Legion Oratorical Contest, which helps develop knowledge and appreciation for the U.S. Constitution among high school students. While we serve the general Castle Rock community, one program in particular has numerous benefits for youth in our town: American Legion Boys State. Founded in 1935, American Legion Boys State is a highly respected and selective leadership and citizenship program for U.S. high school juniors. During the week-long program, participants are divided into subgroups referred to as cities. The citizens of each city elect mock municipal officials and representatives to the mock state legislature, as well as state-level officials. The students who are elected to these various offices run the Boys State activities, which include legislative sessions where bills are passed, as well as court proceedings, law-enforcement presentations, assemblies, bands, choirs and recreational programs. Over the course of the week, students learn the rights, privileges and responsibilities of franchised citizens, as well as the structure of city, county and state governments. Boys State programs take place during the summer, and are in every U.S. state except Hawaii (although Hawaii Boys State is in the planning stages). The American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a separate but similar program for young women called Girls State. Each year, local Castle Rock high schools refer eligible Boys State applicants to Post 1187. Our Post then selects participants to sponsor based on the candidates' demonstrated leadership, character, scholarship, loyalty, and service in their schools and communities. Each year, we select between two and four high school juniors to sponsor at Boys State at a cost to our Post of \$200 per student. This cost includes travel, room and board, and the program participation fee. Colorado Boys State 2025 is planned for June 1 – 7 at Northeastern Junior College in Sterling, CO.

The All Veterans Honor Guard is an all volunteer organization that is made up of Veterans. We provide final military honors at Veterans and Military Retirees funerals. An Honor Guard is a team of Veterans that provides: 1) a rifle detail (for firing of the three volleys or what you may call a 21 gun salute); 2) a bugler to play taps; 3) a commander and chaplain to conduct a service; 4) and two uniformed personnel to fold the flag and present it to the next of kin. Please Note: Our organization has four teams one of which is Castle Rock. We don't have a central location or office. Most business is conducted from the home of a volunteer. That is why the address on this application is in Sedalia. Each team averages (in a good year) approximately \$3000 in donations and now we are entitled to a stipend from the state. The combination of these two resources helps to cover our expenses for uniforms and maintenance of the weapons (WW II M1's). Rarely are funds remaining to cover additional expenses.

Today they have to call our scheduler (or an other team member) and provide the basic information. Between the volume of calls and our ages the potential for making a mistake is higher. We don't want to add to the family's grief and stress by making a mistake. Automation will increase the quality of the data and the user will receive a confirmation that the request was received and a team will be assigned to that service. That data will then be electronically passed on to the appropriate team. This website would benefit everyone including the very large number of Veterans and Military retirees residing in Castle Rock as it will be easier to request this service for their loved one who so faithfully served this country. How does this project benefit Castle Rock residents?*

This project directly benefits seniors of Castle Rock. Eligible seniors will be granted wishes, based on the amount of funds received. These wishes can be simple needs, celebrating a life, or living life to the fullest. Our Twilight Wish recipients report overwhelmingly that having their wish granted impacted their life for the better. Their mental and physical health often improves, positively changing their outlook on life. Simple Needs Wishes, such as hearing aids, dentures, and lift chairs often have the biggest impact on improving the quality of life for low-income seniors. Items such as these reduce isolation, increase self-esteem, and allow many seniors to continue living on their own. We measure the impact of our wish granting process with follow-up surveys to wish recipients. With over 52% of our wish recipients responding to these surveys, 90% report that their wish granting improved their outlook on life. In addition, 94% report that having their wish granted changed their life positively and 100% report that they felt cared for and respected.
