COUNCIL DINNER & INFORMAL DISCUSSION

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

COUNCIL COMMENTS

Mayor Gray recognized Dennis Carnahan who led Keepers of the Rock that recently passed away. Al Block also passed away and was instrumental in developing Crystal Valley Ranch. Mayor Gray extended his condolences. Mayor Gray recognized Rick Martin with Castle Rock Fire and congratulated him on his upcoming retirement.

Councilmember Cavey stated her concerns with illegal immigrants in Denver and requested Council and staff to put together a Resolution that supports why we are not a sanctuary city in line with the Commissioners and the city of Monument.

David Corliss, Town Manager, noted they have also seen some of the concerns. The Town has an active plan to provide resources to unhoused individuals. We do not have a shelter in the Town or in the County.

Police Chief Cauley stated the priority is to keep our community safe, and they have an officer who is assigned to assisting with unhoused individuals.

Councilmember Hollingshead feels people are over-reacting to national news.

Councilmember Brooks asked if we have a policy. Corliss stated we have a practice and have an SOP to deal with individuals that are unhoused. Brooks confirmed that we do not have a statement that we are not a sanctuary city.

Councilmember Dietz feels we should make it official so that citizens can see what our policy is.

Mayor Pro Tem LaFleur is not comfortable with the word sanctuary. Corliss stated this is the nomenclature that is used. Hollingshead doesn't feel we need to say anything.

Councilmember Cavey asked to direct staff to put information on social media that we are not a sanctuary city, how we deal with unhoused individuals, and that we do not have a shelter in the Town or the County.

Consensus of Council for staff to circulate a draft to Council before publishing on the website.

QUASI JUDICIAL HEARINGS

Mayor Gray read the script into the record.

Resolution Approving a Request for the Demolition of the Building Located at 104 North Lewis Street

Mayor Gray confirmed there are no conflicts of interest noted. Town Clerk Anderson confirmed the item was properly noticed.

Emails received after the deadline today were passed out to Council by Brad Boland who is also the Historic Preservation Board liaison.

Tara Vargish, Director of Development Services, provided an overview of the proposal to demolish the home at 1st and North Lewis Street. Homes built prior to 1945 must go to the Historic Preservation Board then to Council for final determination for demolition. The house was built in 1923; and the current property owners would like to replace the building. The property is not landmarked, and has no architectural significance or historical significance. There are extensive repairs and asbestos removal needed that are not reimbursable by a grant, and moving it is not desirable because there is no historic significance. The majority of adjacent property owners support the demolition. Staff and the Historic Preservation Board recommend approval of the demolition and noted that

the new building will need to go through the Historic Preservation Board.

Councilmember Brooks asked about the Town's process for removing a home that has asbestos. Vargish stated there is a State process that must be followed.

Councilmember Cavey inquired why two Historic Preservation Board members voted no. Brad Boland stated that some of the members felt it had architectural significance.

Mayor Pro Tem LaFleur stated the members were also concerned about the precedence set for demolition of other buildings in that area.

Property Owner, Steve Thayer, stated they are 25 year rear residents, currently live in the Meadows, own other properties and businesses in Castle Rock, and have served on boards and commissions. Their goal is to get back to that neighborhood and build their forever home and feel it is a special lot. They hired a Castle Rock builder, and they offered it to the Fire department to use it to train before demolishing it. They will ensure the new home fits in with the neighborhood.

Citizens that addressed Council:

Charlie Whitt lives a block away and supports it.

John DeLay, has been a resident on Lewis street since 1990. He said it is a great community, the Thayer's are first class, and he has known them 25 years. He feels they are adding so much to their community.

Mayor Gray stated that he believes in property rights.

Councilmember Dietz feels it adds value to the neighborhood.

Mayor Pro Tem LaFluer stated it is a great neighborhood and knows there were a lot of repairs that were needed.

Councilmember Brooks feels it is valuable to know the reason for dissenting opinions and they should be made a part of the staff report.

RES 2024-029

Resolution Authorizing the Execution of the Agreement Between World Compass Academy and the Town of Castle Rock Regarding Funding for Police Officer to Serve as School Resource Officer (SRO)

Police Chief Cauley, provided a summary of the agreement that the Douglas County School Board will provide 100% of the cost for two School Resource

Officers for one year.

Councilmember Cavey asked why officers would just work for World Compass. Cauley stated because they want a police officer that has jurisdiction and that is specially trained. Cavey confirmed that the Sheriff's Office only has jurisdiction over schools in unincorporated areas; and the Police have jurisdiction in their own municipalities. Staff supports this resolution.

No public comment.

Councilmember Hollingshead noted how important the SRO's are in the schools and they help create better citizens.

Councilmember Dietz stated his wife is a teacher and he is glad there are trained professionals there and that it is good the kids see that police are good.

Mayor Pro Tem LaFleur noted that the relationships built with the kids provide safety and mental health and breeds an environment that is positive.

Councilmember Brooks feels it is about more than just safety and it is good they receive additional training.

RES 2024-030

Resolution Approving the Purchase and Sale Agreement for the Castle Rock Reservoir Property and the Extra-Territorial Water and Wastewater Service Agreement Between the Town of Castle Rock and the Plum Creek Trust [Douglas County near Sedalia, Colorado]

Mark Marlowe, Director of Castle Rock Water, provided an overview. It is to purchase the property we currently have an easement for; and a water service agreement for water service to the surrounding property the owner plans to develop in the future; which would have to comply with our water conservation regulations. This allows us to collect system development fees worth millions where previously we would not have collected those. This requires a budget amendment, and they do have reserves to pay for it. Water Commission and staff recommends approval.

Councilmember Cavey confirmed they would supply up to 600 homes. Marlowe stated they already had a commitment to provide water to this area anyway without any revenue. We now get system development fees worth up to \$20M.
