IGA with Douglas County Sheriff's office – Enforcement of Bus Limitation Ordinance



Timeline

- March 12, 2024 Douglas County adopts an ordinance limiting the unloading of commercially transported passengers within unincorporated Douglas County.
- April 16, 2024 Town Council directs Town Attorney's Office to explore the potential legal ramifications associated with the enforcement of a "bus limitation" ordinance within Town boundaries.
- May 7, 2024 the Town Attorney and Town Manager recommend that the Town Council enter into an IGA allowing the County Sheriff's Office to enforce the County's bus limitation ordinance within the Town.

IGA—Terms and Conditions

- Douglas County Sheriff's Office agrees to enforce the County's ordinance limiting the unloading of commercially transported passengers within the Town.
- The Town will reimburse the Sheriff's Office for actual costs incurred in enforcing the ordinance, up to a maximum annual amount of \$50,000.
- The Board of County Commissioners will amend the ordinance to allow for its enforcement where a local government has conferred enforcement authority to the Sheriff.

Recommendation

The Town Manager and Town Attorney recommend that the Town Council approve the proposed IGA to will allow the County Sheriff to enforce the County bus limitation ordinance within Town boundaries.
