Ladies and Gentlemen,

The Castle Rock Museum is a valuable cultural resource for the community. One of its primary goals is to provide an interesting way to educate the community on the tremendous and varied history of this town. Our Castle Rock Museum gives its residents a sense of place. New residents frequently visit the museum to get a perspective on the community they have chosen to make their home. The museum is also on the top of the list of places for visitors to Castle Rock. We frequently field questions about the community from folks who are making decisions about choosing to buy a home here. The museum is often a choice for out of town visitors with guests from at least 40 states and nine or ten foreign countries yearly. CRHS provides this service via the Museum at the lowest cost because of its management by a non-profit organization. The CRHS board contributes their time, talent, ideas and dollars to make the Museum a success. Because the Society and Museum adhere closely to the goals of the Miller Fund, the resources for the operation of the museum can be provided mostly with non-tax dollars. Your consistent support has made it possible for the museum to be in its 27th year of operation. For the fourth year the museum has conducted the Scavenge the Rock scavenger hunt as a community event with the support of the Town of Castle Rock and the Downtown Merchants association. The scavenger hunt features historic buildings and promotes awareness of downtown businesses.

The goal of the Historical Society for 2025 is two-fold: A) continue to form new relationships with a broader base of members from our growing community and B) provide a quality learning experience for the enjoyment and education of the visitors. The museum has increased support from community volunteers with help from the Douglas County Garden Club, the Aspen Effect organization and Eagle Scout projects. Our volunteer program has grown with more individuals participating. In recent years the museum has expanded the vision of highlighting our history by adding featured exhibits which focus on a special event or an era in Castle Rock History. The museum has provided exhibits at other local sites as well. The museum has three exhibits at Adventist Hospital featuring local historic medical personnel. We expanded our reach with outdoor access through the marker program and outdoor interpretive signage. We are now using a variety of social media platforms. The Society and Museum personnel speak at schools and civic organizations and provide special tours.

Over the last few years through grants, donations and the support of local businesses, the museum has been able to insure the integrity of the building which will be 150 years old in 2025. The society and museum also provides Trolley tours and walking tours (Historic Downtown, Cemetery and Ghost Tours) to further engage the community. Victoria's Tea is our major and growing fundraiser. We would love to host our fundraising tea at Cantril School in the future, if it is affordable.

In addition to the grant from the town the CRHSM seeks funds as follows:

- Grants for museum building and restoration
- Individual and foundation donations
- Leveraging membership in Colorado Gives and other charitable endeavors
- The museum donation box and Gift shop
- Increased membership
- Business and community support
- Donations of gifts or services from local businesses
- Fundraising events

During 2025 the Castle Rock Historical Society and Museum plans to:

- Provide interesting and educational information about the history of Castle Rock. This year's special exhibit is a display on Castle Rock's Continental Divide Raceways that hosted the greatest racers of the day in the 1960s. The staff at the museum maintains the three exhibits at Castle Rock Adventist Hospital medical office buildings. In conjunction with the town Historic Preservation Board and Downtown Merchants we now have an annual Scavenger Hunt to provide a fun way to learn about town history. Even out of town visitors participated.
- Use volunteers to run tours, support new museum exhibits, guide visitors, help promote the Society and perform restoration duties.
- Provide community education by hosting school group tours of all ages, and historic based programs for local community groups, both onsite and off site.
- Participate in local community events such as the Car Show, Festival of Trees, County Fair, Fangtastic and Senior Center Craft Fair and participate in other area events like archeology day.
- Provide no cost historic walking tours, trolley tours, cemetery tours and fun ghost tours, while welcoming donations from participants.
- Expand its outreach through online exhibits and videos and connection with DCSD teachers around the CO State History Standards.
- Welcome new residents and provide them with an historic view of the community.
- Offer entertaining, historical and educational programs monthly, perhaps at Cantril School.

Several of these ventures have involved working with town staff and we are grateful to partner with the town in promoting this special place. We are also participating in plans to celebrate the 250th anniversary of the country's founding and the 150th anniversary of Colorado statehood. We will also celebrate the 150th birthday of the depot/museum building in 2025.

The Castle Rock Historical Society is committed to our mission of historical education, maintaining the sense of community, and the small-town feel of Castle Rock. Your steadfast support has helped enable us to receive over \$100,000 in grants and donations over the last few years. These grants help ensure the continued preservation and stability of our beloved 149-year old D & RG Depot museum. Although we have been able to obtain more sponsorships this year, we are asking for an increase in funding to manage the costs of insurance and wages. We look forward to the approval of our 2025 grant request and meeting with you at the Town Council meeting as scheduled.

### III. 2025 Proposed Performance Objectives

Specific services to the Town the organization proposes to provide as a result of Town funding:

- 1. To continue to discover, collect and promote the preservation of any archive material, sites, buildings and oral history which may help to establish or illustrate the history of the Castle Rock area. The Castle Rock Museum has illustrated the geology, exploration, settlement, development, town government, conditions, events, public figures and progress of the town.
- 2. Hold open the Castle Rock Museum four days per week, five hours per day, excluding holidays, with no admission charge.
- 3. Provide permanent exhibits of artifacts and curated exhibits at the Castle Rock Museum.
- 4. Continue to curate traveling and rotating exhibits at the Castle Rock Museum while improving our online presence.
- 5. Continue hosting historical tours of the Castle Rock area. Past examples include an annual Trolley Tour, Summer Walking Tours, Cemetery Tour, our popular ghost tours and other requested tours.
- 6. Continue providing informative historical presentations to groups including the general public, seniors, and to school children. If school budgets are such that schools cannot send children to the Museum we have prepared to go to the schools.
- 7. Assist economic development of Castle Rock by presenting the development of Castle Rock from the founding to the present day, and encourage growth of local businesses as our partners, all the while preserving the small town atmosphere. The walking tours and Scavenger Hunt are designed to encourage people to spend time in the downtown area. The museum frequently entertains questions from newcomers and visitors about information on the town beyond history.
- 8. Participate in local community activities, such as Starlighting, Car Show, County Fair, Fangtastic, Senior Center Craft Fair and others when the society and museum can make a beneficial contribution.
