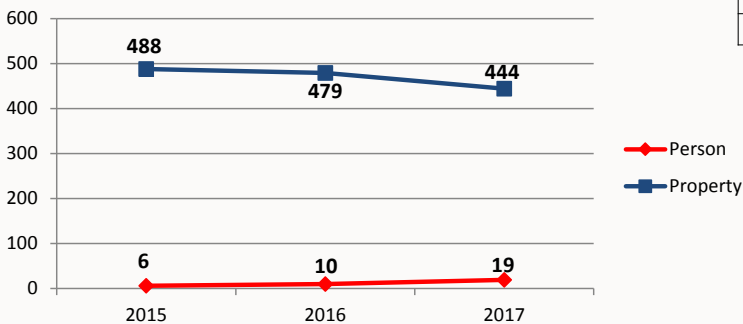

FROM THE DESK OF THE CRIME ANALYST

CRAIGSLIST RENTAL/HOUSING SCAMS

Summer is the time of year when rentals become more readily available and families move into a new home. But, this also means that it's the perfect time of year for rental scams. In the most common rental scam, criminals will post pictures of a home that they claim to own and want to rent out. Once they are contacted by an interested party (their potential victim), they will request that the victim send a security deposit via MoneyGram or Western Union, or will ask for a direct transfer to a Wells Fargo account. The criminal will typically request this money before the victim has even had a chance to see the home or apartment. Once the victim sends the money, the criminal will then become increasingly difficult to contact or will cease contact with the victim altogether.



So, if you are looking for a new home to rent, keep the following in mind during your search:

- Shop wisely – if the rental price seems too good to be true, it probably is.
- Be wary of over-eager landlords who want to “get the deal done” as quickly as possible.
- Know your price – if you're asked to pay an unusually high security deposit or upfront fees, walk away.
- Check for duplicate ads – see if the apartment or home is listed on other websites for different prices or with different contact numbers.
- If you are requested to send money before seeing the apartment or home, do not send the money – ask to meet with the landlord and see the home before you pay a deposit.
- If you go to see a rental or meet the landlord, make sure you do not go alone.

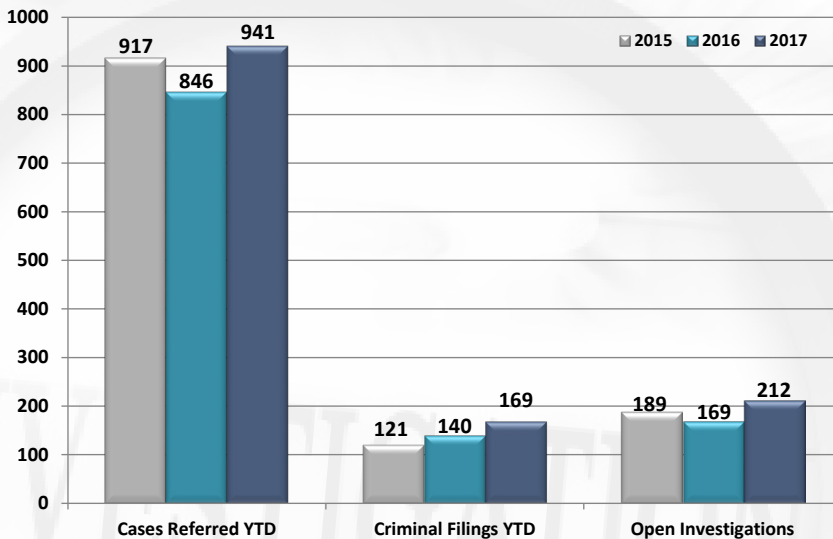

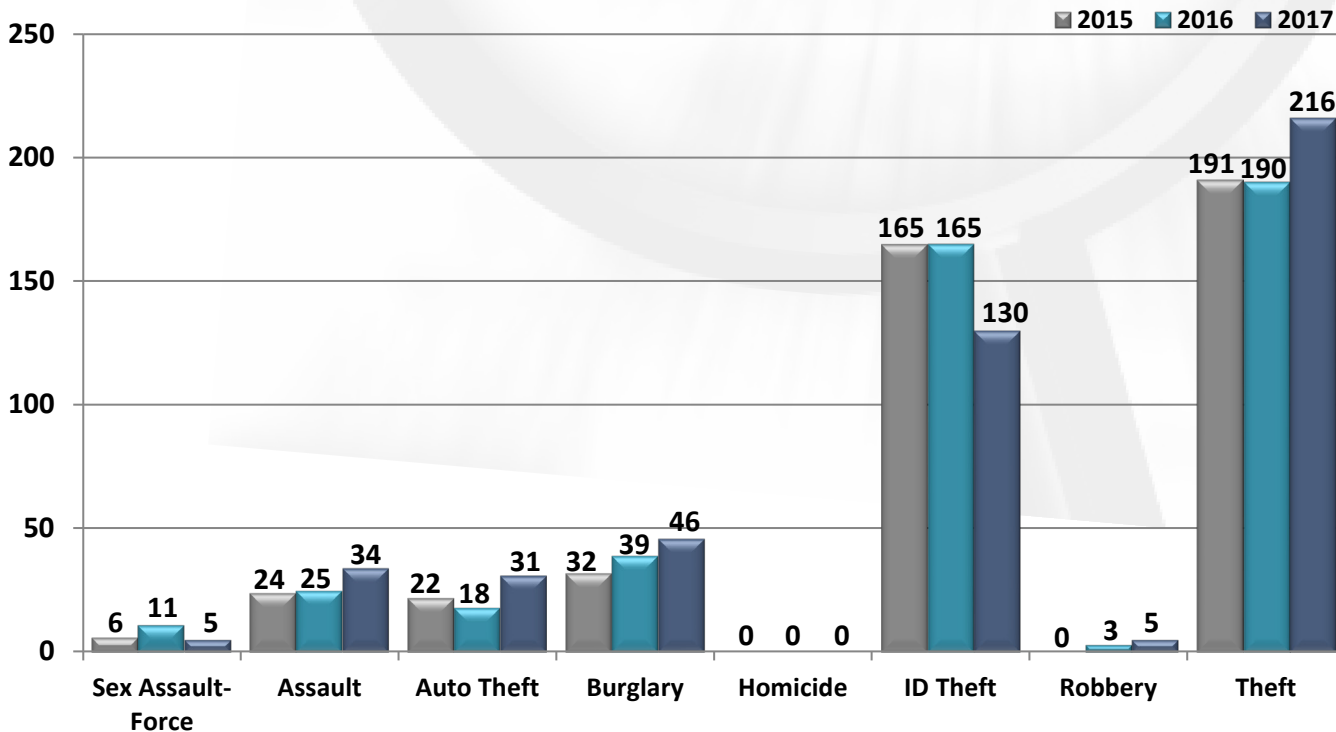
DETECTIVE UNIT

YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: JUNE (2015-2017)

Detective Scott Webster is the lead investigator on the June 27th Burglary and the June 17th Attempted Burglary of DCF Guns on Park Street. In both instances, stolen late 90's or early 2000's Jeep Cherokees were used by the suspects in these crimes. Physical evidence was collected which may lead to the identification of one suspect. The Bureau of Alcohol Tobacco Firearms and Explosives is assisting the Castle Rock Police Department with this investigation and connections to similar firearm retail businesses along the Front Range.



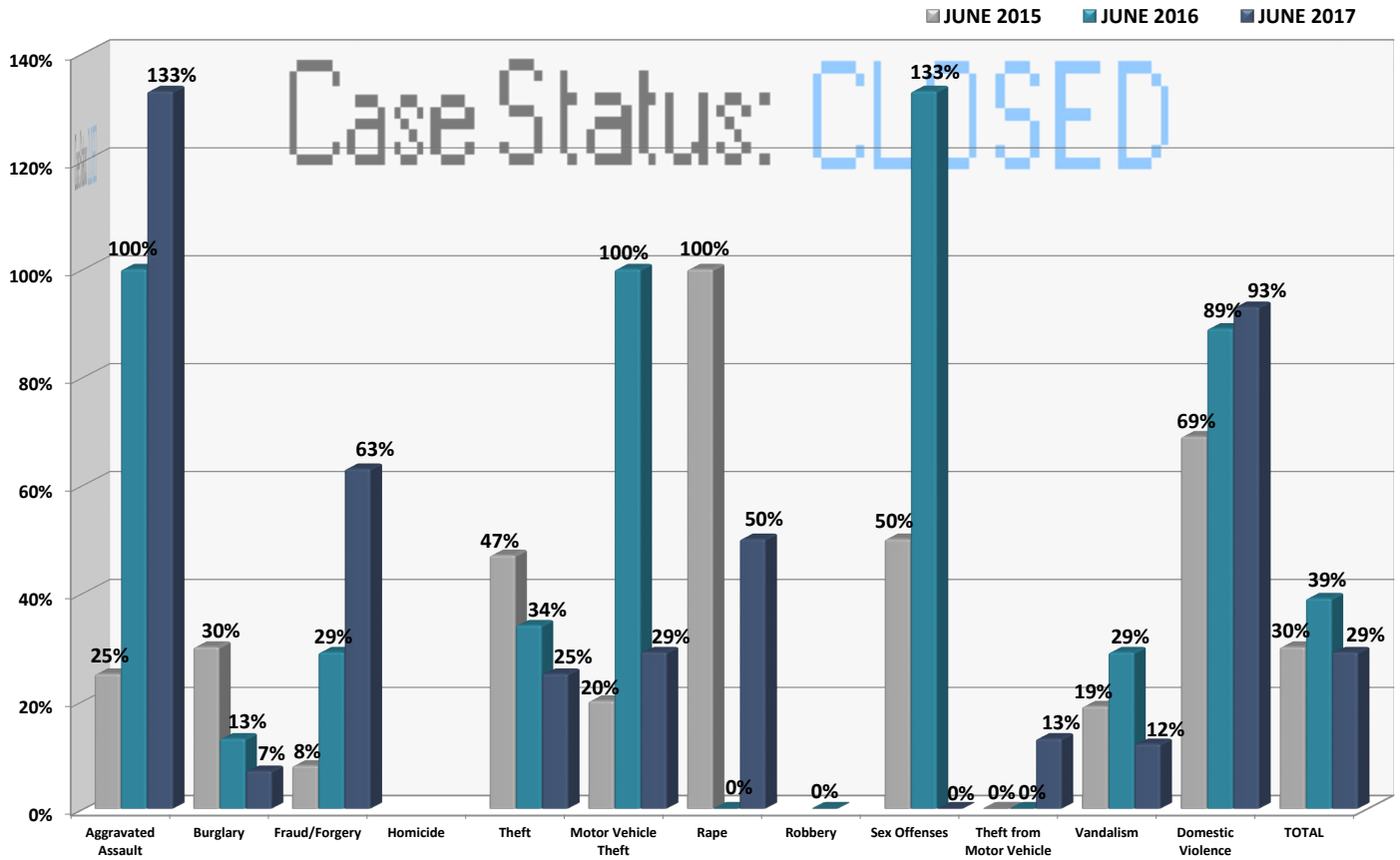
3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: JUNE (2015-2017)

Liquor code inspections were conducted at local 4 businesses during the month of JUNE. No violations were noted.

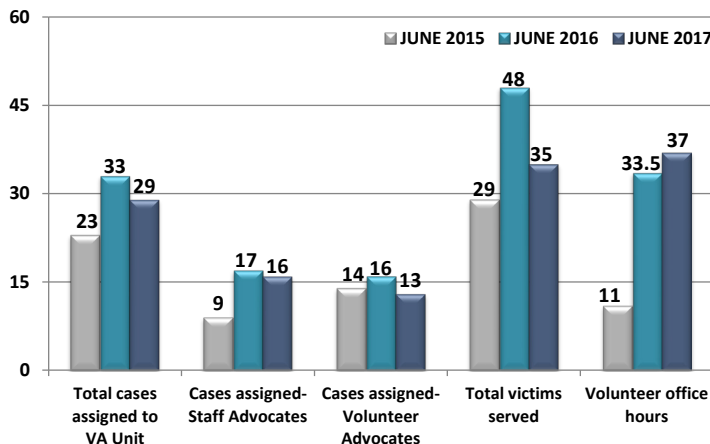




VICTIMS ASSISTANCE (VA) UNIT

Narcotics - Titan found 1 hidden compartment, 30 grams of Methamphetamine, multiple charges of drug paraphernalia.

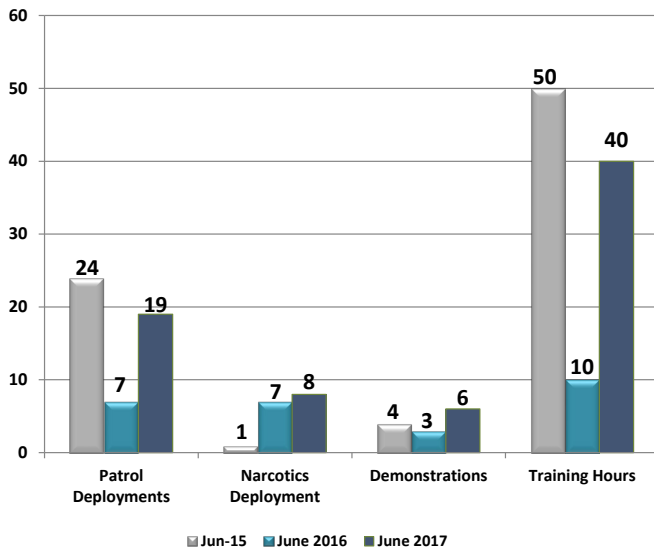
Arrests - Ronin assisted officers with the search of an apartment with a 2nd degree assault suspect hiding inside. Ronin located the male and the male surrendered to K9.

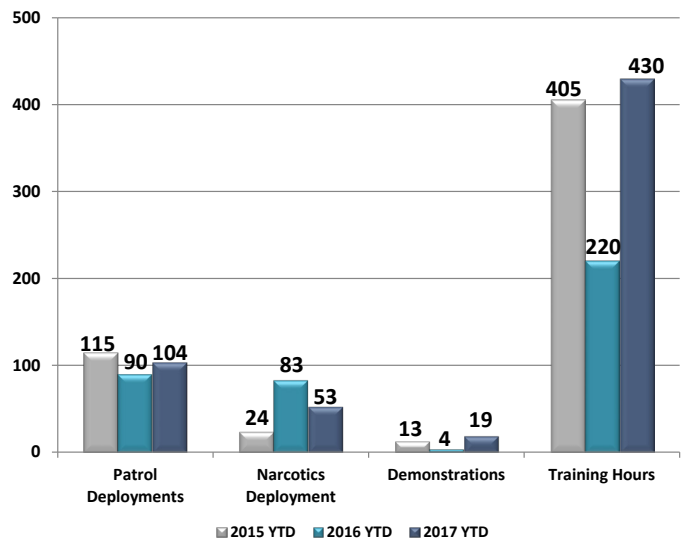
Patrol Deployments - Ronin assisted with 2 suspect tracks and 6 building searches, including 1 felony arrest

YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON JUNE (2015-2017)



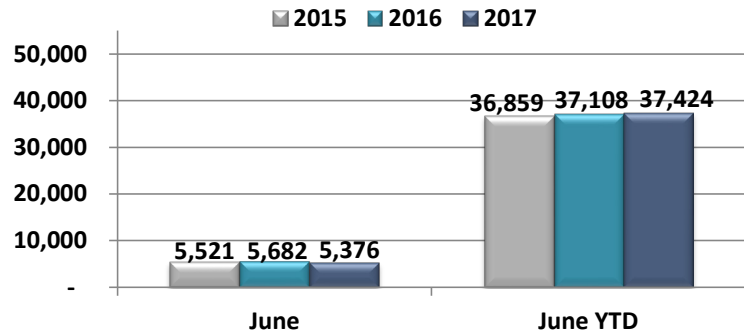

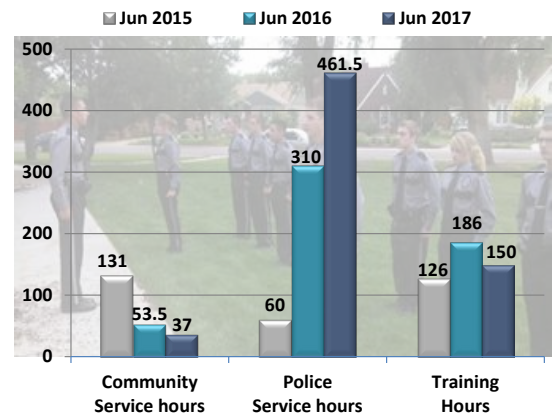


EXPLORER UNIT JUNE 2015-2017

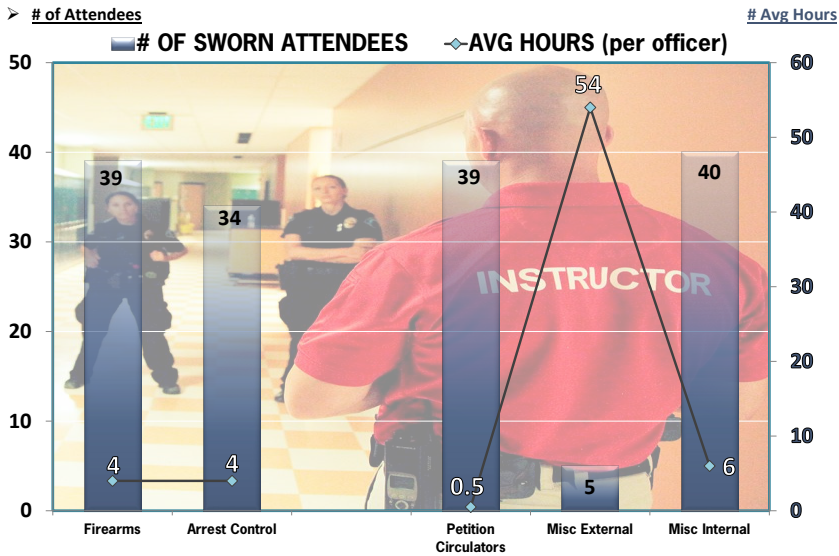

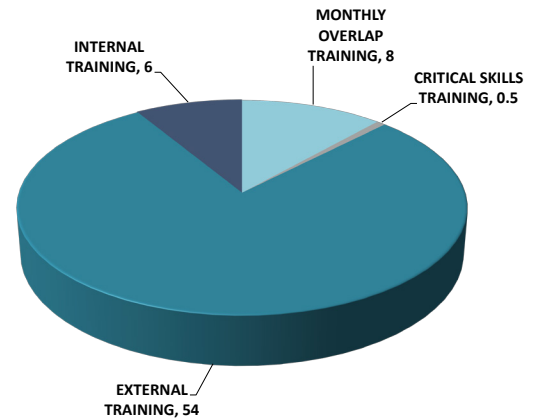

TRAINING OVERVIEW JUNE 2017



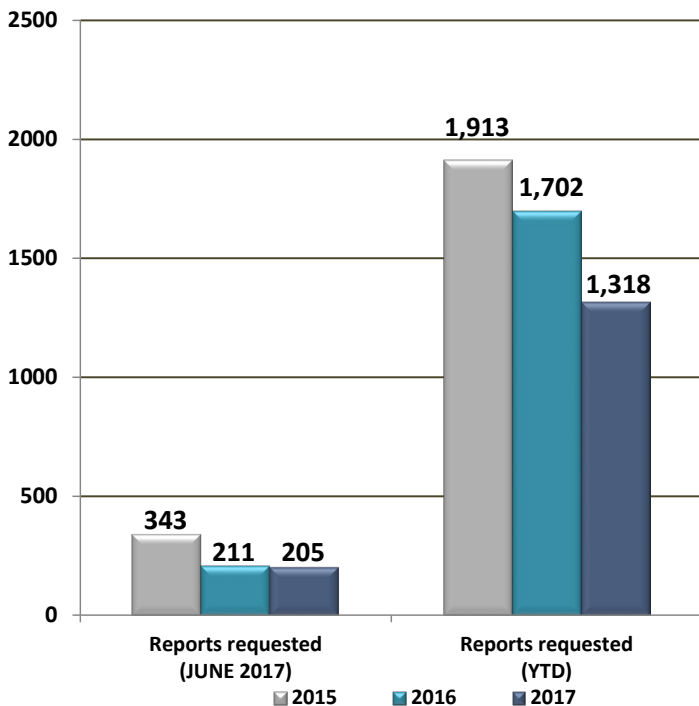
TRAINING HOURS BY CATEGORY (AVERAGE PER OFFICER) JUNE 2017



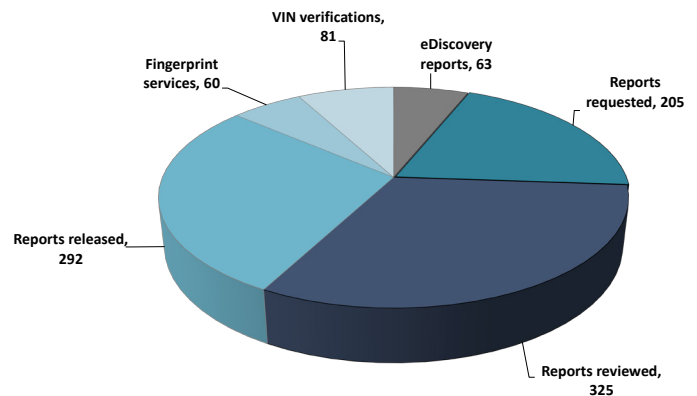

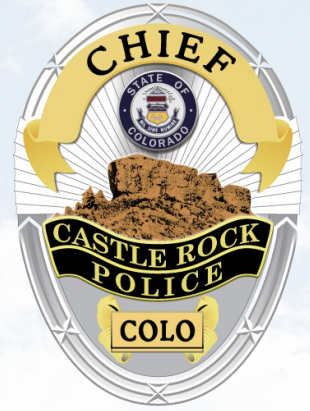
