# CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES

## *Parks, Open Space & Trails*

The following updates summarize general progress that occurred throughout the month on capital projects managed through the Parks and Recreation department; for background information and additional details visit [CRgov.com/ProjectUpdates](https://CRgov.com/ProjectUpdates).

### EMERALD PARK

Progress continues at Emerald Park in Crystal Valley Ranch as contractors complete grading work and site prep for future playground installation. Throughout May, the welcome sign was re-poured, entrance boulders installed and spaded trees were planted. Concrete will continue to be placed throughout the month, and the shade structure will be erected. The playground will be installed in July.



### COBBLESTONE RANCH PARK

Reconstruction work at Cobblestone Ranch Park is now complete. The soil surrounding the sewer line was backfilled and compacted, replacement sidewalks and curbs were installed, irrigation was modified, and landscaping and sod were replaced where needed. Some of the concrete in the center core plaza was replaced and the design has been sandblasted so that the flower is in full bloom again. The park is ready for a flurry of activity this summer, and we thank everyone for their patience during this process.



### TWILIGHT ON THE TRAILS EVENT SAW HUGE SUCCESS

The Castle Rock Parks and Trails Foundation hosted their second Twilight on the Trails at Metzler Family Open Space on Thursday, May 30. The exclusive, sunset event featured a guided nature hike, a tour of the 1880's homestead, wine tasting, charcuterie, live music and a silent auction. The sold-out program raised nearly \$10k to continue to support the valuable efforts of enhancing Castle Rock's parks and trails.

### SLIDE TOWER STRUCTURE RENOVATION

Town Council approved the second amendment to the construction contract with Saunders to expand the scope of work for the Slide Tower Reconstruction project at the Castle Rock Recreation Center. The amendment addressed the structural column in the southeast corner of the leisure pool area, which has subsequently been removed and replaced to address corrosion. Now that the project is nearing completion, final mechanical, plumbing and slide inspections are underway, and staff are training lifeguards on new operations. The slides will soon open, followed by the hot tub once final parts are received and installed.
