

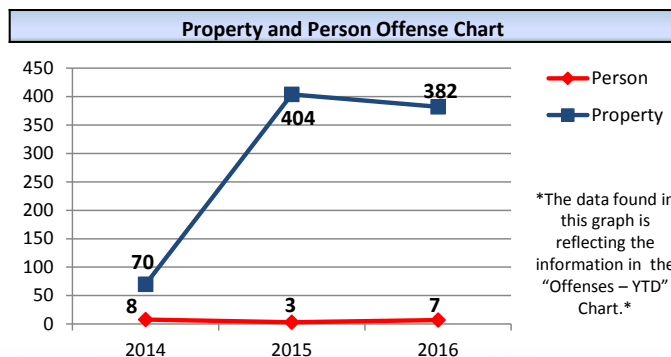

VEHICLE TRESPASSES CONTINUE

As we have mentioned in past issues, there have been multiple vehicle trespasses in 2015 and 2016. Most of these vehicle trespasses have been due to **unlocked** vehicles. Some people may hear things in the late or early hours, some may see something at these times as well, but a call to the police may never occur. You may call Castle Rock Police anytime you see or hear anything suspicious or out of the ordinary (e.g., dogs suddenly barking at 3:00 am).

While another spree of vehicle trespasses occurred recently, a person called the police department to say that she saw a suspicious male in the area getting into vehicles and trying to get into a garage. This person gave a detailed description and location, which led to our officers arresting the suspect. This suspect has been responsible for a large amount of vehicle trespasses. Our department greatly appreciates information like this, *especially when we can catch the bad guy!*



REMINDERS:

- Lock your vehicle at all times.
- Park your vehicle in a garage as often as possible.
- Do not leave items out in plain view (it entices perpetrators).
- If possible, lock all registration, insurance and any other documents with personal information in your glove compartment.
- Try not to keep possessions in your vehicle (to reduce your losses, remove money, jewelry and guns from the vehicle).
- Do not leave car/house keys within vehicle.
- If vehicle is left outside with a garage opener left inside, lock the door between your garage and home.

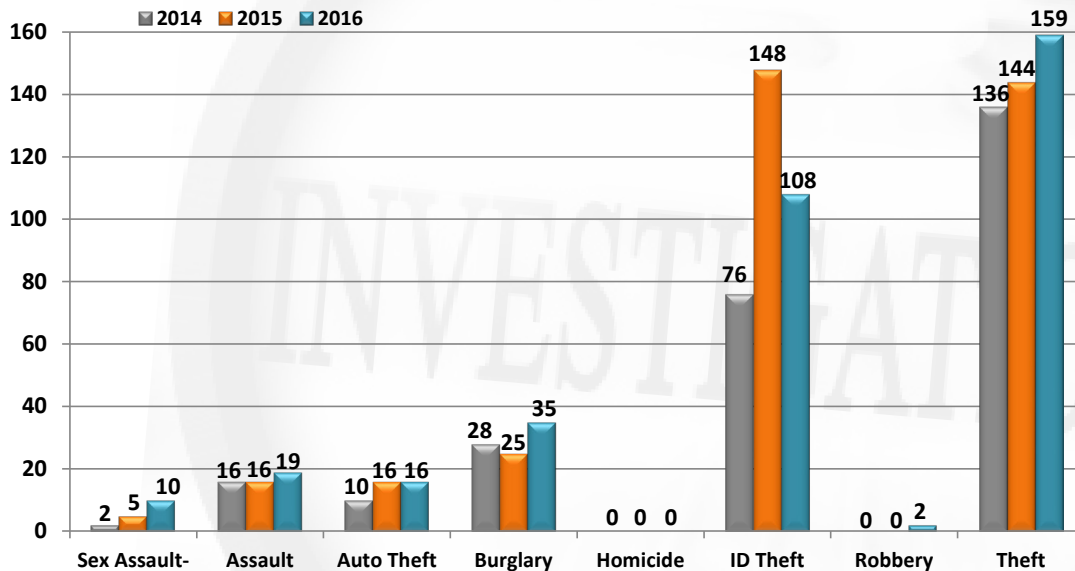

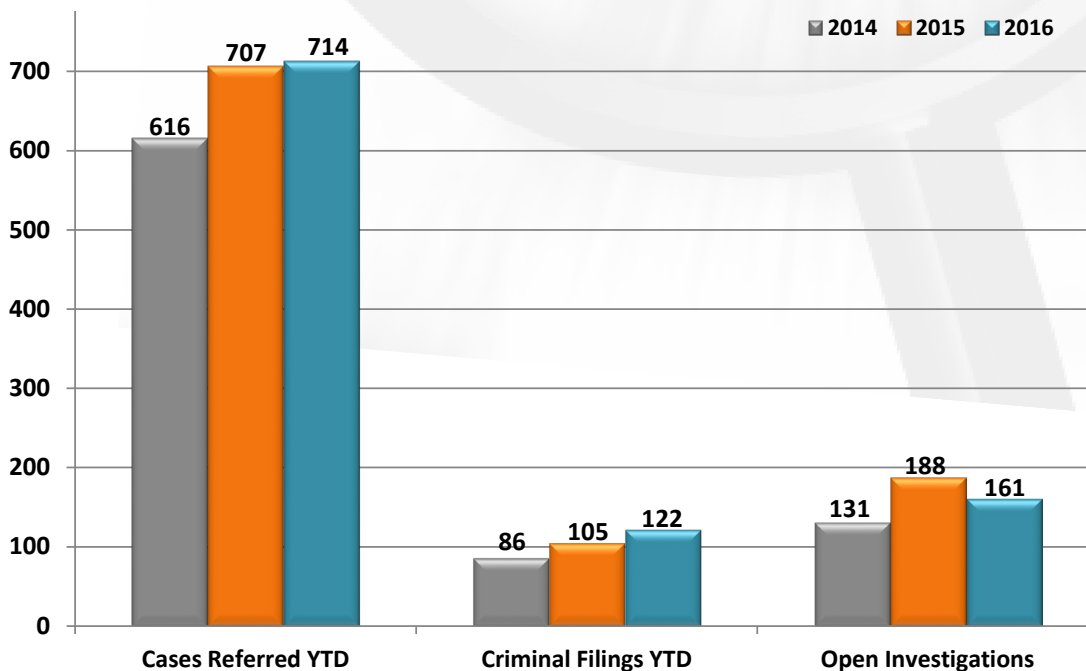

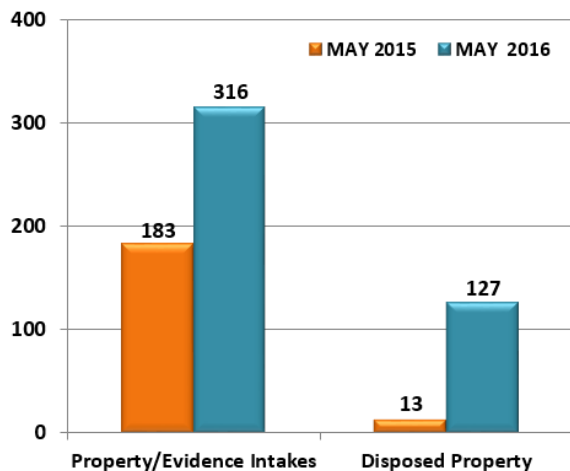
Clearance Rates Comparison - MAY
(2014-2016)



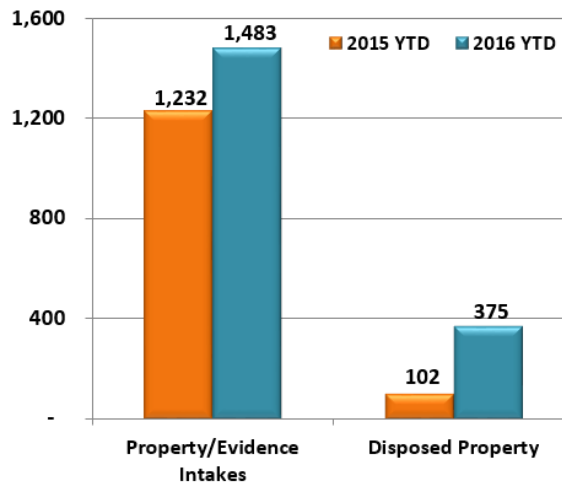

MAY 2015/2016 YTD



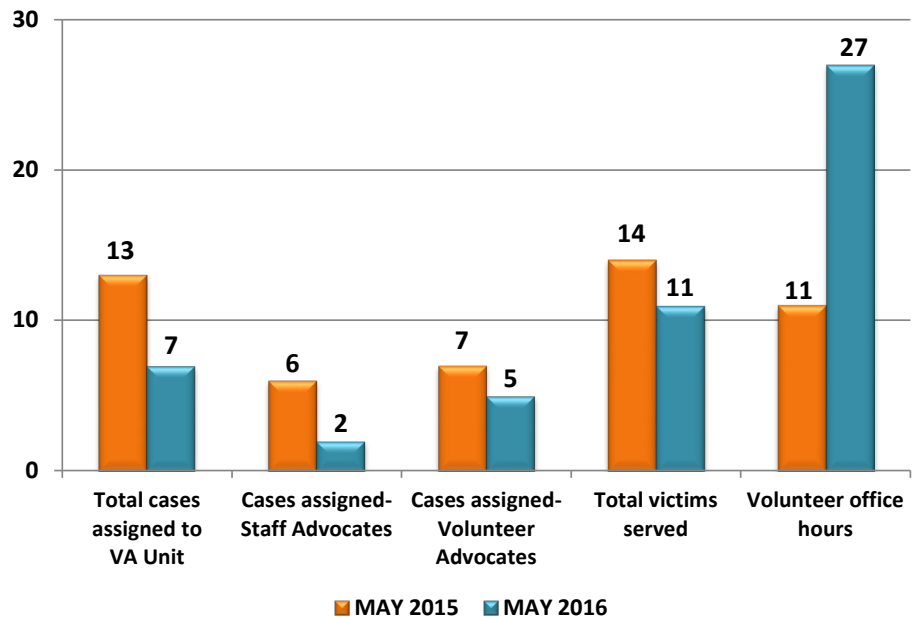

Notes of interest:

***Narcotics** - **Titan** found multiple drugs, drug paraphernalia and assisted in three arrests.

***Training** - Officer Thompson and **Ronin** attended a SKIDDS/CATS training in Loveland. This training will better prepare Ronin to help patrol in dynamic responses to high-risk calls. **Titan** and Officer Brown attended a Tracking class led by DCSO K-9 Unit and in sponsorship with CRPD.

***Assist Other Agencies** - Officer Brown and **Titan** assisted the following agencies during the month of May: Lone Tree PD, Parker PD, Douglas County Sheriff's Office and Immigration & Customs Enforcement (ICE). Many of these assists were for drug sniffs leading to found drugs, paraphernalia, barricaded suspects and arrests.

***Demonstrations** - **Titan** and Officer Brown taught at Lone Tree PD's Citizen's Police Academy.

***Other** - Officer Brown and **Titan** assisted Colorado Springs PD's K-9 Unit in their recent recruit academy.

In May, the department purchased Ronin's bullet resistant vest. We thank Copperfalls Spa who also donated funds toward this purchase.

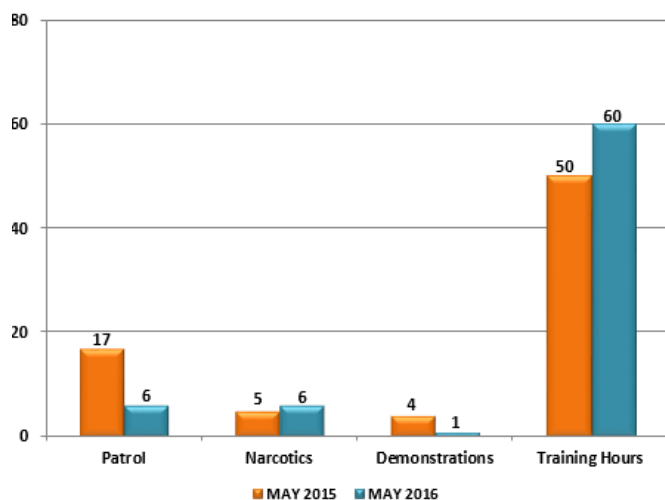

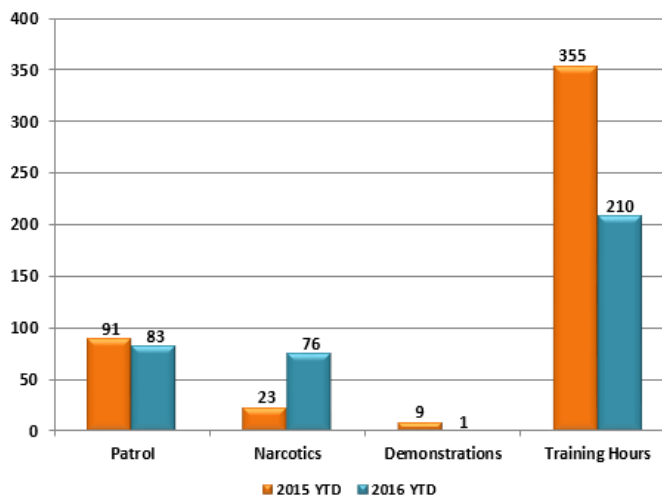

K-9 ACTIVITY: MONTHLY COMPARISON MAY 2015/2016

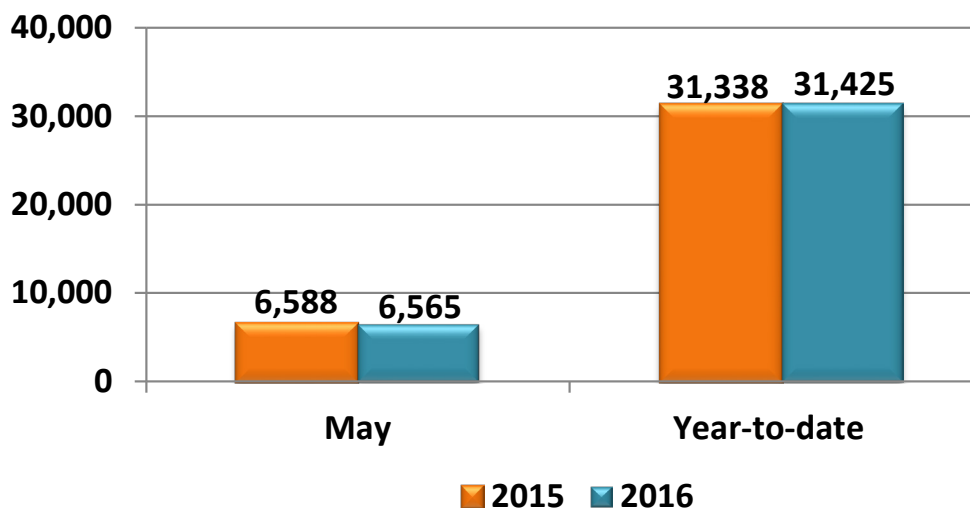


YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON MAY 2015/2016

EXPLORER UNIT MAY 2015/2016

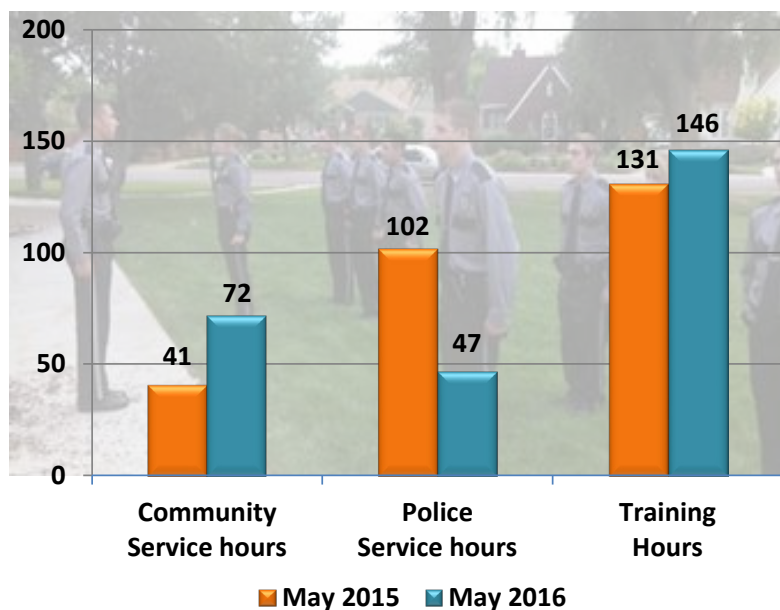
The Explorer Unit participated in the following MAY event:

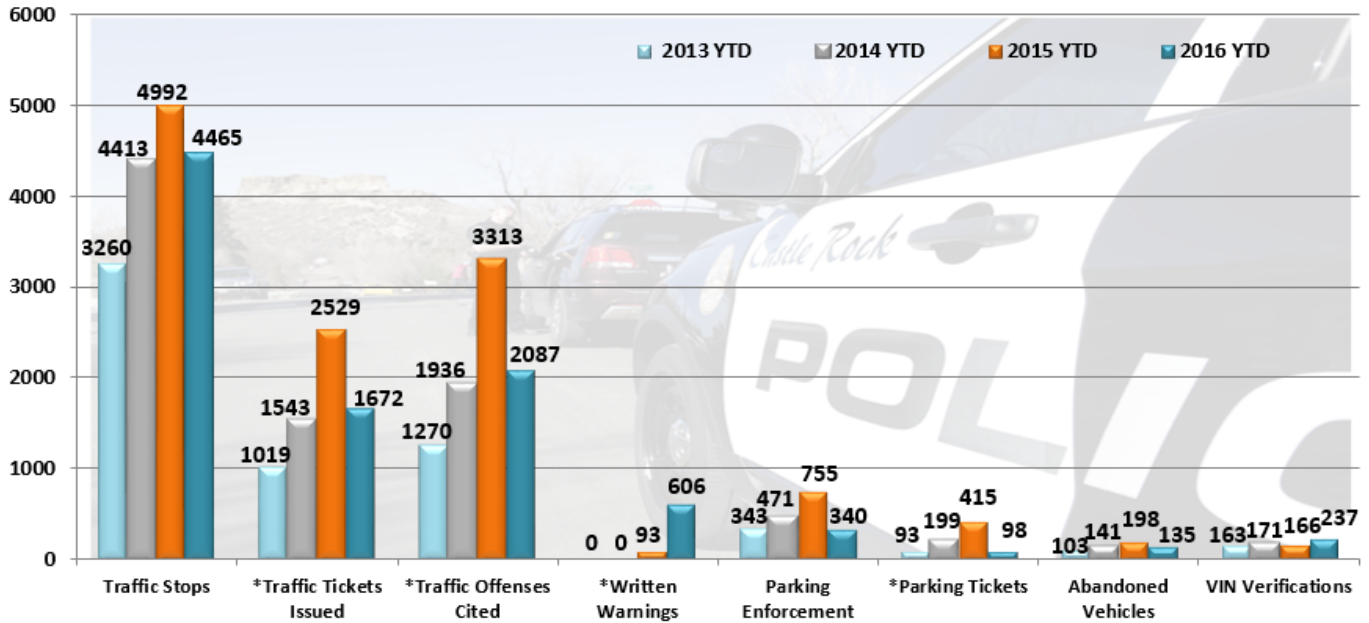

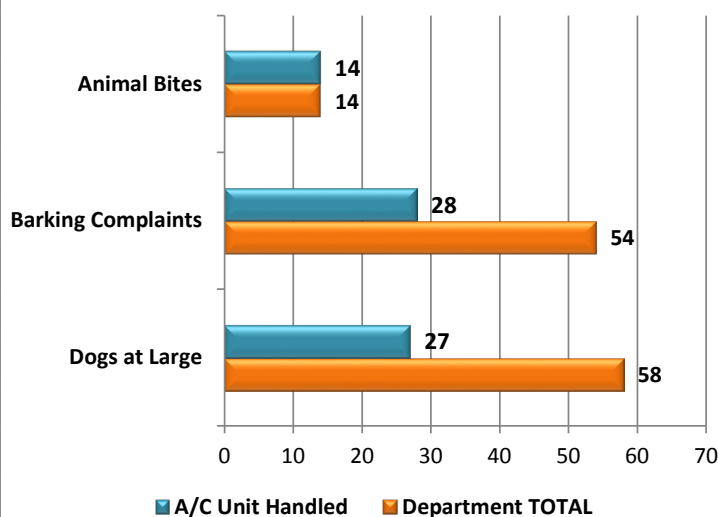

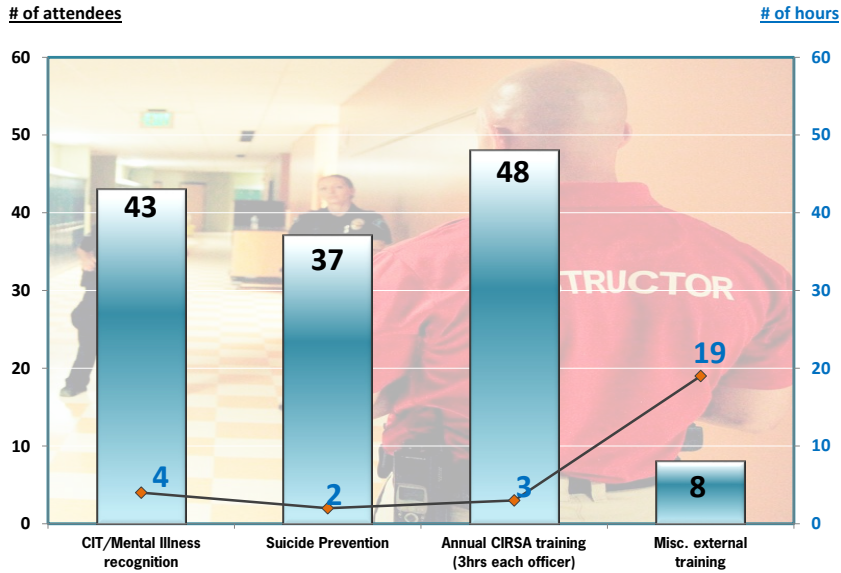

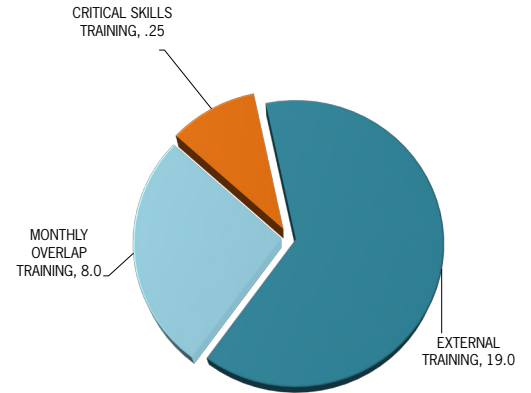

MAY 2016

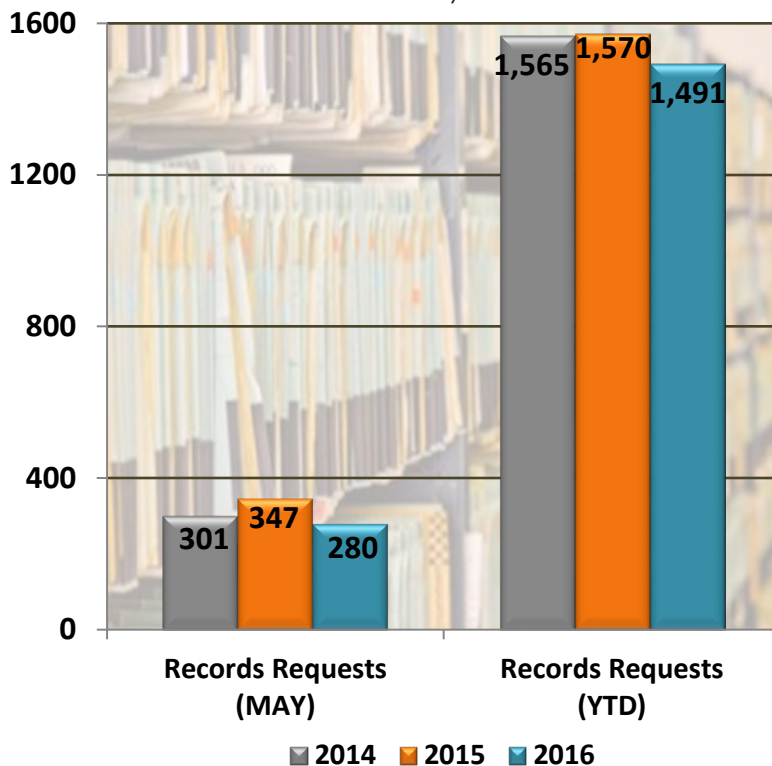


TRAINING HOURS BY CATEGORY

MAY 2016

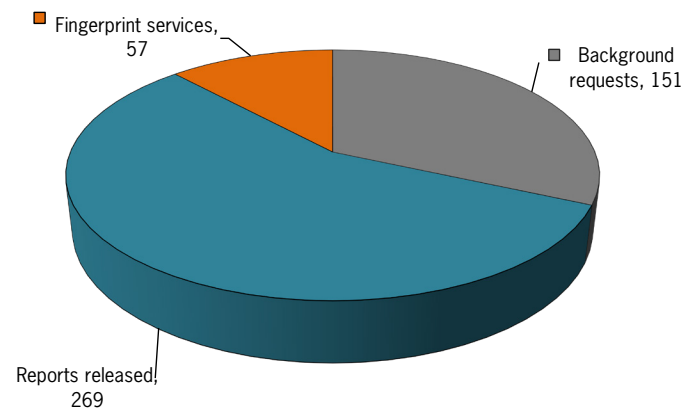


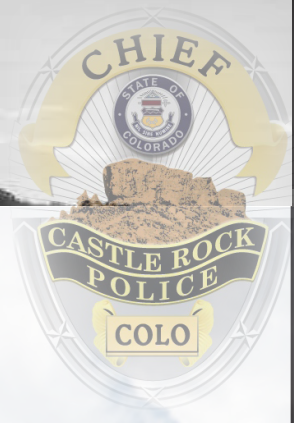
