Re: 2023 Castle Rock Senior Activity Center; Year End Town Contract Report

In 2023, as the community returned to a new normal after the pandemic, the Castle Rock Senior Activity Center continued to see the programs and services grow in both scope and numbers. The Center saw record increases in the transportation program, wellness activities and social engagement offerings. With the support of the community, and the Town of Castle Rock, we have truly become a focal point for older adults to thrive and continue to "Love Life in the Second Half."

The Castle Rock Senior Activity Center offers programs and services that give seniors a community environment with which to stay active and connected to others. We provide educational, social, health and recreational programming geared toward meeting people and exploring a variety of options for activity and involvement. The National Institute on Aging (NIA) shares that among older adults, loneliness and social isolation are associated with higher rates of depression, a weakened immune system, heart disease, dementia, and even early death. We truly believe that our programs and services are a prevention to this potential threat, extending lives, giving seniors the means and desire to remain engaged in the community.

Douglas County's Older Adult population is projected to increase 154% by 2050. Douglas County is the fastest growing of all Counties in Colorado. Over the past year our older adults have come back to the Center in record numbers. Our membership shot up 8% from 1,100 to over 1,200. The need for additional space is becoming increasingly important to meet the demands of the community for programs, services, and activities for older adults. The Center is a focal point for the community, and we ask that you keep us in mind if space opens at the Recreation Center so we can expand in our current location.

Attached documents detail the growth and outcomes from 2023. Please feel free to let me know if you need additional documentation or have questions. 2023 PROPOSED PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

Programs and Activities

- 1.) Provided over an average 140+ activities and/or events per month that are recognized as essential components to healthy and successful aging.
 - In 2023 the Center offered an average of 167 activities and/or events each month, 125 on-site and an additional 46 off-site. Increases in activities were the result of more individuals returning to the Center and requesting more opportunities for engagement with their peers.
- 2.) Continue to serve over 3200 (duplicated) senior participants each month with social, cultural and educational opportunities.

Our total participation in all Center programs and services (on-site, off-site, and virtual) was 25,815. With many of our trips and activities being full and having a waitlist, we have been able to add additional buses or schedule additional trips to accommodate the demand. Some of the greatest growth has been in the wellness programs. Center membership continues to be strong with over 1,200 unduplicated members.

Transportation

- 1.) Continue to provide over 650+ monthly shuttle rides to seniors and adults with disabilities to medical appointments, social events, and basic living needs.
 - In 2023 the Center provided 9,982 for an average of 832 rides per month. We provided 2,802 medical rides, 3,441 nutrition/meal/grocery rides and many more rides into the Center for social activities, volunteer opportunities and wellness programs. Our "specials" those trips outside of Castle Rock for important medical appointments in the Denver or Colorado Springs area were 432, an average of 36 per month. These trips take a vehicle and driver away from the Town for much of the day. As Federal and State transportation funds tighten up, the Center has partnered with ARDC to provide more of the outside of town trips and focused our rides on those within the Town borders. We will continue to work closely with our partners to ensure Castle Rock residents get the best possible transportation opportunities available.
- 2.) Added at least 75 new riders to the Transportation Program in 2022.

There were 134 NEW riders in 2023. During the year there were 289 registered active riders.

Health & Wellness

1.) Continue to provide VOA low-cost meals 2 times a week and continue to coordinate Meals on Wheels weekly home deliveries to qualified clients.

During 2023, in partnership with the Volunteers of America, the Center provided 4,176 hot meals to Castle Rock participants. These participants were also provided with 1,014 boxed meals to supplement weekly meals. The Home Delivered Meal Program (Meals on Wheels) provided meals to 171 unduplicated clients, 65 of whom were new in 2023. This program provided 14,100 regular meals and 11,915 breakfast meals to home bound older adults in the region.

2.) Provide a Hot Lunch Delivery Program 2 times a week to Low Income Senior Housing communities. This service works with Castle Rock's RUOK Program.

This goal has been a bit of a challenge in 2023. Numbers have declined as the VOA switched to a frozen meal only program when they moved the kitchen during late summer. The frozen meals were convenient, but not as popular as the hot meals. At the same time, the Reyn Rock senior apartment complex in downtown Castle Rock was being sold, and the Center was unable to market to increase participation in the meal delivery program. However, there are plans in place to create a new marketing plan for 2024 to increase meal delivery numbers. Below are the statistics for how the program declined during the changes of 2023.

As an assist to Reyn Rock, the Center does provide a bus to allow 5 residents from Reyn Rock to attend the dining room hot meal program and participate in social activities after lunch. This ensures the residents have a hot meal, community engagement and do not lose their very coveted parking spots downtown.

3.) Continued to expand the Wellness Programming to serve the needs of our seniors.

Wellness and sports activities have continued to grow for all ages and abilities of participants at the Center. The Center provides activities for all levels from "sit and be fit" and "tai chi for arthritis" classes to golf and softball leagues to active hikes during the warmer months. Wellness clinics such as foot care and hearing screening bring many participants into the center on a regular basis and the various massage offerings have developed such a following there are always wait lists.

Care and Connect Call Program: The US Surgeon General has declared that loneliness and social isolation is an epidemic in 2023. Social isolation can be caused by many circumstances, including no longer able to drive, loss of mobility, death of a spouse or even just living alone without informal support systems. Chronic loneliness and social isolation can increase the risk of dementia by approximately 50% in older adults and it has been shown that the highest rates of isolation are found in older adults aged 65 and over. The Center partners with Castle Rock PD's "R-U-OK" program and is working with the Douglas County Sheriff's Office in a similar program County wide and will use funds to ensure these clients have regular contact with others and are able to access resources in the community.

The Connect and Care Call Program currently serves 55-60 older adult residents of Douglas County. Each resident gets 3-4 calls per month, more during a crisis or concerning situation. In addition to staff that make calls, 23 trained and supported volunteers make calls to isolated older adults. This program will lose funding at the end of June 2024 unless additional funding can be found.

Center Objectives

1.) Be a leader in community outreach for Senior Resources – 9th Annual Senior Life Expo – Douglas County Events Center.

The 2023 Senior Life Expo continued to be a popular place for older participants, their families, and the community. The 9th Annual Senior Life EXPO held on June 29th, 2023, was a huge success as 700+ seniors and their families connected to a wide-variety of senior resources available to them through the Senior Life EXPO. Guests received genuine care, valid communication, and pertinent information specific to their senior needs all in one compact room for a very strategic, informative afternoon together.

With over 88-senior related resources (including 8-presentations and 3-demonstrations); all participants benefitted from these moments of networking and communication that provided each with hope and direct contact information for opportunities and assistance. Resources included therapy animals, vision & hearing, healthy aging, exercise & mobility, fall-prevention, insurance services, Medicare, legal counsel, public safety, in-home technical assistance, homecare, hospice, housing options, sports, activities, and much more.

The 2024 10th Annual Senior Life Expo "All Things Senior" will be held on Wednesday, June 5th at the Douglas County Events Center from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m.
