



Partnership Update

THE PARTNERSHIP

Earlier this year, Douglas County Community Foundation (DCCF) and the Town of Castle Rock entered into a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) regarding financial support for the administration of DCCF.

THE INVESTMENT

The Town of Castle Rock made a generous investment in DCCF for 2023 in the amount of \$17,857 for the explicit use of offsetting administrative costs incurred by DCCF. This investment, made in May 2023, represents approximately 12%, or almost one and a half months, of admin costs of DCCF.

THE RESULT

DCCF has, through the generous support of the Town of Castle Rock, been able to have a record breaking operational period for the foundation. In 2023 so far, we have been able to raise funds and grant program awareness to a level never seen by our organization. Your investment in DCCF has allowed us to maintain our operational goal of providing community grants to local nonprofit organizations while growing our Community Emergency Relief fund. Additionally, DCCF has had the greatest penetration and consultancy reach into the nonprofit community of Douglas County of all time.

THE FUTURE

The Town of Castle Rock and DCCF, through our MOU partnership, will continue to allow DCCF to be the cutting edge granting and consultancy partner for the nonprofit community in Douglas County while maintaining agile funds and processes to support all citizens in time of a community emergency.
