

CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES *Parks, Open Space & Trails*

The following updates summarize general progress that occurred throughout the month on capital projects managed through the Parks and Recreation Department; for background information and additional details visit CRgov.com/ProjectUpdates.



MATNEY PARK ATHLETIC FIELD TURF REPLACEMENT

- Staff plowed the athletic fields at Matney Park to prepare the site for contractor Academy Sports Turf (AST)
- AST commenced work throughout the month and removed the existing turf
- New turf installation will be completed as soon as possible, weather permitting



METZLER FAMILY OPEN SPACE

- Work continued to prepare the site for the parking lot with grading and stormwater improvements, including the placement of retaining blocks
- Signage for the future open space facility are in production and will likely be installed in March/early April to provide directions, as well as historical and cultural information about the area



BUTTERFIELD PARK RENOVATION

- Significant progress occurred in the playground area and many structures were installed, including the We-go Round, the Roller Slide, the We-go Swing, standard swings, a friendship swing and cubes; the large miracle structure will be set later this month
- Parks and Recreation staff also began installation of the Fit Course
- The Castle Rock Parks and Trails Foundation continues its fundraising efforts to near closer to its \$1.3 million goal having already raised just over \$1 million
- Recognition signage for the project's major donors will soon go under production as well

CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES *Parks, Open Space & Trails*



SPORTS DEVELOPMENT CENTER AT THE BRICKYARD

- Project architect Barker Rinker Seacat continues progress on finalizing the schematic facility design and will soon provide an updated rendering to the Town for review
- The site's soil will also soon be tested in partnership with Confluence Companies



MITCHELL GULCH PARK RENOVATION

- Renovation work at Mitchell Gulch has remained slow this winter due to weather as well as the contractor's focus on rock removal to clear the site for future project development
- Drawings have been released for the tennis courts so staff will now proceed with next steps of preparation to get them installed later this year



PUBLIC ART

- With the assistance of Town staff, artist Amie Jacobsen installed the sculpture Still Wild in the Town Hall Plaza
- The Public Art Commission will soon plan a dedication event, to formally celebrate the artwork with the community and local leadership









