

How To Catalog Your Items

With the holidays behind us, you may find yourself setting up new laptops and phones, riding a new bicycle, taking skis and snowboards to the mountains, or taking photos with a new camera. But, have you ever thought about how you would identify these items should they be stolen from your house, car or purse?



LeadsOnline (www.leadsonline.com) is a website that allows citizens to catalogue up to 100 items with names, photos, descriptions, and serial numbers. If an item is lost or stolen, a citizen can include a LeadsOnline document with their police report. If the item is found, returned to a law enforcement agency or pawned, you and law enforcement will be alerted. With the help of LeadsOnline, law enforcement can have more information on your stolen property in order to increase the chances of it being located and/or returned to you.

We recommend that you catalogue items such as cell phones, laptops, tablets, bicycles, other sports equipment, computers, cameras, televisions, guns, and any other items of value.

Detective Mark Galvan will be assigned to the Detective Unit to replace Detective Finley.








YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: **DECEMBER** (2015-2017)




3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: **DECEMBER** (2015-2017)






VA UNIT STATISTICS

In December, the Victim Assistance Unit held its annual Christmas volunteer appreciation dinner at Castle Café. It was a time to celebrate their dedication to the police department and to the citizens of Castle Rock.

In the last year, the Victim Assistance team has seen many changes. Debbie Lewis was hired as the coordinator in May and continues to assess processes and build on its strengths. Five new volunteers were recruited, trained and welcomed to the team.

The victim assistance volunteers provided 390 twelve-hour shifts and were prepared and ready to serve crime victims in Castle Rock.

In addition to those hours, volunteers provided 430 in-house service hours assisting with data entry, special projects and follow up with crime victims.

Narcotic Deployments - Ronin assisted officers on a burglary in progress at a residence. Three suspects fled after K9 announcements with two suspects surrendering after the K9 warnings.





Ronin sniffing out hidden narcotics during training






EXPLORER UNIT DECEMBER 2015-2017


