






YEAR-To-DATE COMPARISON: **NOV.** (2016-2018)

3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: **NOV.** (2016-2018)






Investigations Unit case review:

In November of 2018, the Investigations Unit detectives reviewed an additional 50 case reports, along with their regularly scheduled caseload.







Property Intakes/Disposed NOV. YTD (2016-2018)






EXPLORER UNIT THREE-MONTH COMPARISON (2018)


Arrests - Ronin and Officer Thompson assisted patrol in locating and arresting two of four car thieves. All four suspects were contacted.

Training - Ronin participated in arrest control training with patrol. He was able to demonstrate his abilities in assisting fellow officers subject to assault.




Ronin on training day






