



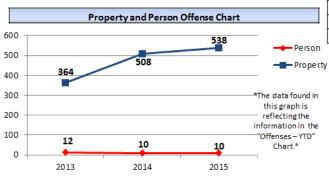

oneyGrams are the latest trend for criminals to steal money. MoneyGrams allow people to send money online or by using a mobile device. The suspect is able to receive the money that was transferred and accepted at places like Walmart.

The MoneyGram scam usually starts with an advertisement about something you may be interested in purchasing and is found on Instagram or Facebook. You then send money via MoneyGram to that suspect and never receive the item you thought you purchased.

Always do research on products, companies and advertisements, especially those on social media sites. MoneyGrams are a great way to send money and pay bills but we do not want you to become a victim of a scam and lose money.



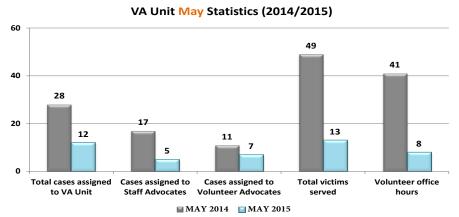
VICTIMS ASSISTANCE UNIT

The Victims Assistance Unit has been operating under the leadership of Carole Malezija for nearly 18 years. She is assisted by long-time staff Victim Advocate Marsha Davenport. The main purpose of this program is to serve the needs of crime victims. In 1993, the Constitution of the State of Colorado and the laws of the state C.R.S. § 24-4.1-302 (1) guarantee certain rights to the victims of 30 different crimes.

The goal of VA Volunteers is to help the



citizens of our community. They have very specific policies and procedures, which they are expected to follow. The commitment of these individuals is outstanding; they are an elite group of individuals with a special skill set. They must be committed to assisting victims at any time of the day or night. They put their personal plans



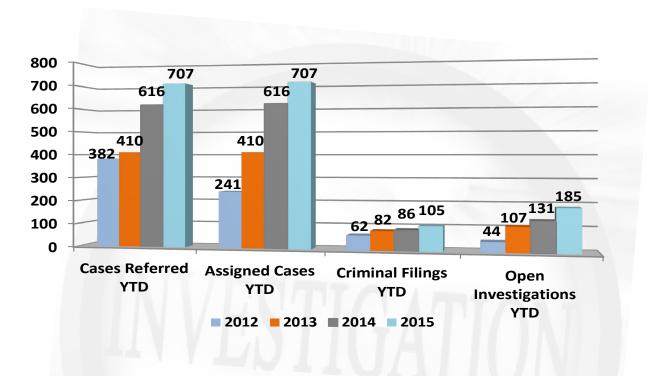
aside to be on call. Over the last four years, this team has donated approximately 18,200 hours of on call service.

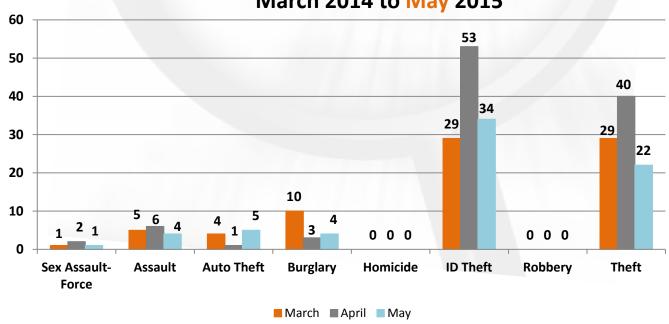


DETECTIVE UNIT

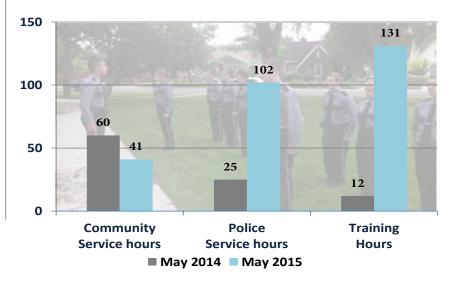
The Explorer Unit participated in the Police Department's Annual Awards Ceremony on May 15, 2015 with the posting of the colors (flags).

(May 2014-2015 Comparison)

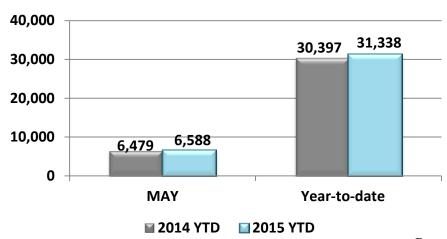


CALLS FOR SERVICE

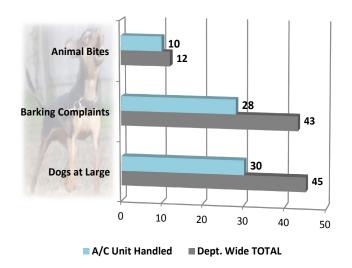

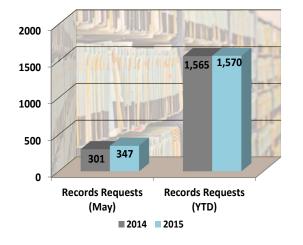
MAY 2015 Training Overview
