CENTENNIAL PARK COURT REPLACEMENT PROJECT

In November, SaBell's Civil and Landscape mobilzed on site to commence and complete the demolition of the existing tennis and basketball courts. Tree pruning and removal was also completed. Excavation and site grading will continue throughout the close of the year.

Christmas Tree Recycling Program launches this month

Each year the Christmas Tree Recycling Program allows residents to give one last holiday gift to the environment. Four parks, including Founders, Metzler Ranch and Paintbrush parks, and the Douglas County Fairgrounds, serve as drop off areas for trees. Trees are then turned into mulch, which is made available to the public for self-serve pickup at the fairgrounds while supplies last. The Christmas Tree Recycling program is a part of the Town's overall Project Green environmental initiative.

Drop off runs Dec. 26 through Jan. 31 at the following parks:

- Founders Park, 4671 Enderud Blvd.
- Metzler Ranch Park, 4175 Trail Boss Drive
- Paintbrush Park, 3492 Meadows Blvd.
- Douglas County Fairgrounds, 500 Fairgrounds Road; tree drop off and mulch pick up.

Reminders:

- Christmas trees only, no wreaths or garland
- No yard or clean-up debris
- Remove all lights and ornaments
- Remove tree from stand
- Remove plastic wrap or bag from tree
- Remove nails, bolts or wire from tree

Festival of Trees up and running

If your holiday errands involve a trip to Downtown Castle Rock, stop by Festival Park to see this year's Festival of Trees. This heartwarming tradition brings festive joy while making a lasting impact in Town parks. Part of the Season of the Star, this program features 30 live trees in Festival Park sponsored and decorated by local merchants. These beautifully lit and adorned trees, alongside the glowing lights and the iconic 40-foot Christmas tree, make Festival Park a holiday hot spot. The towering tree has been a cherished centerpiece of Downtown's seasonal charm for 10 years, since 2014.


