We are very proud of this accomplishment as it speaks to our mission of helping older adults stay independent, along with providing activities, programs and services. Just being available and around to talk to our older adults gives us the opportunity to help them to stay safe at home and get the resources they need that are so vital to stay active and socially engaged.

We will continue to find ways to support our community and give back by participating in and supporting local events. Our monthly "Dining to Donate" fundraiser not only helps us but also supports local restaurants too. You will see us help out the civic organizations such as Rotary, Kiwanis and Civitan with local programming. We are actively involved with the Chamber and several of their programs, such as helping provide the artists shuttles for Artfest. This is in addition to the events we host such as our Annual Golf Tournament, Craft Show and Senior Life Expo. We continue to be active members in several groups, such as – Douglas County Transit Solutions, Douglas County Senior Council, Douglas County Community of Care, Douglas County High Needs Population Task Force, Douglas County Gives and other community and transportation groups. We also believe in helping others in need. Each year, we help by donating comfort items to the Cancer Closet at Skyridge, along with donating new and handmade items to Denver Health's Newborns in need program and local Veterans groups.

#### **Programs and Activities**

1.) Provide over an average 140+ activities and/or events per month that are recognized as essential components to healthy and successful aging.

This year has been an explosion of new members and activities to match the interest. We are currently offering over 165 activities and/or events each month. In the past year, we have seen an increase in the younger age range of older adults getting more involved with new experiences and activities including sports. We added a Bocce Ball League last year and now have scheduled a Cornhole league for fall. Our indoor sports have been a big hit and we are offering multiple session to accommodate the interest.

As I have shared in the past, we have been experiencing a change in the way restaurants, venues and programs are operating now. We continue to adapt with these new changes and shortages in the workforce as well. We have discovered that we have to run multiple trips with smaller numbers to accommodate the businesses. One of the good things to come out of the pandemic is that many businesses have now made their activities/ programs much more portable. We have been able to offer more activities at the center such as, floral designing, watercolor classes, cooking classes, etc. These programs have been great and have drawn a good attendance.

2.) Continue to serve over 3200 (duplicated) senior participants each month with social, cultural and educational opportunities.

Our membership is over 1200 members currently, with 215 new members so far. Our membership continues to be very diverse, as we seek to provide programming to meet all their desires (see membership by age report). Currently the average age of a member is 73.

### Transportation

1.) Continue to provide over 650+ monthly shuttle rides to seniors and those adults with disabilities to medical appointments, social events and basic living needs.

Transportation remains one of top utilized services in the community. Our monthly average is over 760 rides and about 8-10 new riders have been added each month. We are still seeing our medical rides continue to increase, due to the lack of medical specialists in Castle Rock. Our number of rides are limited by vehicles and volunteers as to what we can provide. When we send a vehicle out of the area, we reduce the amount of local shuttle rides we can do. We currently have 3 to 4 vehicles on the road for the shuttle service each Monday thru Friday, and an average of 10-12 specials each week which are one-on-one rides to medical appointments outside our shuttle area (i.e., VA Hospital, Swedish Hospital, etc.) We do prioritize our ride requests by medical first, nutrition and grocery second and then by local priority. We added two additional vehicles in the past year to also help with being able to provide more rides. Currently or fleet consist of 3 sedans, 2 small SUV's, 3 mini vans and MV1. MV1 and one of the mini

vans are equipped to transport wheelchairs. We are also awaiting a new wheelchair van through a grant with DRCOG. We should take delivery by the end of the year. In addition to the shuttle vehicles, we have three 14-passenger buses (one with wheelchair capability) for our Center's activities.

2.) Add at least 75 new riders to the transportation program in 2023.

As of June 30, 2023 we have added 52 new riders to our program. We are on trend to be over 100 new riders by the end of the year.

### **Health & Wellness**

1.) Continue to provide VOA low cost meals 2 times a week, and continue to coordinate Meals on Wheels weekly home deliveries to qualified clients.

Our Hot Lunch Program is continuing to be a great social and nutritional main stay at the center. We did see numbers decrease during March 1<sup>st</sup> to May 23<sup>rd</sup> due to the Volunteers of America (VOA) moving to their kitchen. During this time frozen entrée meals were provided to the clients. Many clients declined the frozen food during this time. Since hot meals have returned so have the clients along with many new ones as well. We have also added lunch bus service for Reyn Rock Apartments on Tuesdays and Thursdays hot meal program. As you might be aware the residents do not want to leave and lose their parking spot downtown. We have found that some of the residents enjoy getting out and even staying for our afternoon programs (i.e. Bingo, movies and presentations).

Meals on Wheels numbers have decreased some as older adult are feeling more comfortable getting out of the home if possible. This program is also used as a short term meal service when an older adult is recovering from a surgery. We are averaging about 4-5 new clients each month, with about 6 dropping off each month.

2.) Provide a Hot Lunch Delivery Program 2 times a week to Low Income Senior Housing communities. This program is in partnership with RUOK.

We have partnered with the Town of Castle Rock and are receiving CDBG Funding to deliver hot meals to our Low Income Senior Housing Communities such as Oakwood, Auburn Ridge and Castle Rock Apartments. This program has been very successful and continues to reach even more of our older adults each month. This program also experienced the temporary decline in meal delivered due to the VOA kitchen closure and frozen meals being offer. Our Meal Program Coordinator is working with the Senior apartment communities to do some upcoming onsite recruitment for new clients in July and August.

3.) Continue to expand the wellness programming to serve the needs of the seniors.

Currently we offer an average of 8-10 different programs and activities under our wellness programing. One of our newer programs has been a great success that it is

being offered regularly. It is a seated dance class through the Shall We Dance Organization. This will be a great exercise program for those with balance or mobility issues. Our drama group has put on one performance this year and is scheduled for another next month. This program helps with memory and brain simulation. Our low vision group has expanded from 5 older adults to 13 - 15 each month. We are looking at partnering with the Parkinson Association to offer a support group here also.

1.) Be a leader in the community outreach for Senior Resources – June 29th<sup>th</sup>, 2022 9th Annual Senior Life Expo – Douglas County Events Center.

We had another great year with 90 booths and close to 600 in attendance for the event this year. We had 8 presentations and 4 demonstrations during the event. I have attached a program book for you each. This program book is also use as a resource guide after the event for the attendees and is given out at the center when older adults are looking for resources.
