EXPLANATION

The South Alluvial Well Field consists of three attuvial wells, 11R, 12R, and 13R. Well 12R was constructed in 1997. This well was constructed with a lateral arm that paralleled East Plum Creek at the time of the construction. The lateral arm has failed on this well and the well cannot be rehabilitated to increase its production. Wells 11R and 13R were constructed in 2012. The original design of the project included lateral arms, but they were removed from the project due to their construction cost. The production from 11R and 13R were much lower than anticipated using only the vertical portion of the well. Utilities anticipates that the production of these wells can be increased with the addition of the lateral arms.

Utilities evaluated installing tranched lateral arms on each of these three wells. The ideal design of a tranched lateral arm would require it to be tranched under the creek. This process would require that the Town obtain a permit from the Army Corps of Engineers. The Town met with the Army Corps in November to discuss the project and its required permitting. The Army Corps indicated that the permitting process could possibly take several months to complete. This time frame does not allow the well improvements to be completed before the water demand season in 2016.

The Town identified Directed Technologies Drilling (DTD) as the only contractor with experience installing municipal horizontally directionally drilled wells. The drilling technique is critical to ensure that the wells will produce water, once they have been completed. There are a large number of companies that can directionally drill pipe, but the drilling mud management is key to the success to the pipe's hydraulic connectivity to the surrounding alluvium. DTD has recently been contracted by Velocity Constructors as a sub-contractor to install three lateral arms to the new alluvial associated with the Plum Creek Alluvial Well Field project. They will be mobilized into Castle Rock in early 2016 to drill the wells for that project. There will be a cost saving for both projects if DTD can construct the wells at both site at one time.

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
