

Proclamation of Memoriam Robert Lowenberg

Honoring his Legacy of Service & Commitment to the Town of Castle Rock

Whereas, Robert "Bob" Lowenberg was a historian dedicated to Castle Rock and served on the Historic Preservation Board from 1995-1998, 2009-2010, 2013-2016. He significantly contributed to the implementation of recommendations concerning development within the Historic Downtown area.

Whereas, Bob was a devoted father to Polly and Stacey along with his six grandchildren Aaron, Lauren, Ava, Jameson, Riley and Adison.

Whereas, Bob was a history teacher at Douglas County High School for 30 years from 1968 until his retirement in 1998. As a teacher, Bob held a "What is History" seminar and published his students' papers in his book "Castle Rock, A Grassroots History".

Whereas, Words from his students reflect the type of man and teacher he was: "Talented, visionary, my favorite teacher, engaging, thought provoking, he is why I became a teacher, my most memorable teacher, kind person and caring father, infinitely patient, funny and passionate about teaching, he made me like history, he had a huge impact on my life, Mr. Lowenberg taught in a fashion that had your attention, he taught me to look at the world from a bigger perspective, he made history come alive, he left an indelible mark on my life and I am continually grateful, not only did he give me an appreciation for history but also an appreciation for Monte Python, and he really rocked that mustache."
