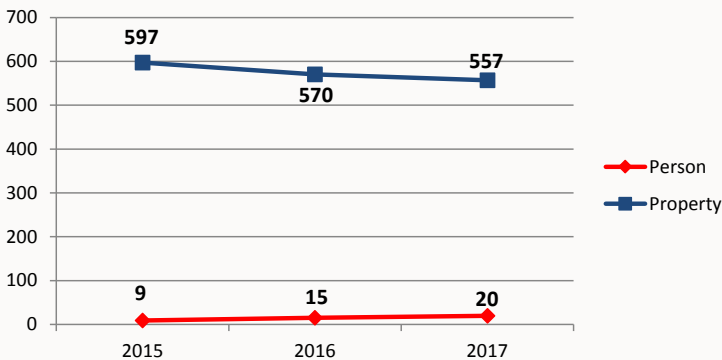

COMMUNITY CRIME MAP

Are you curious about what type of activity is going on in your neighborhood? Do you want to be more aware of current crimes or trends? If your answer is “yes” to either of these questions, then check out Community Crime Map at www.communitycrimemap.com!

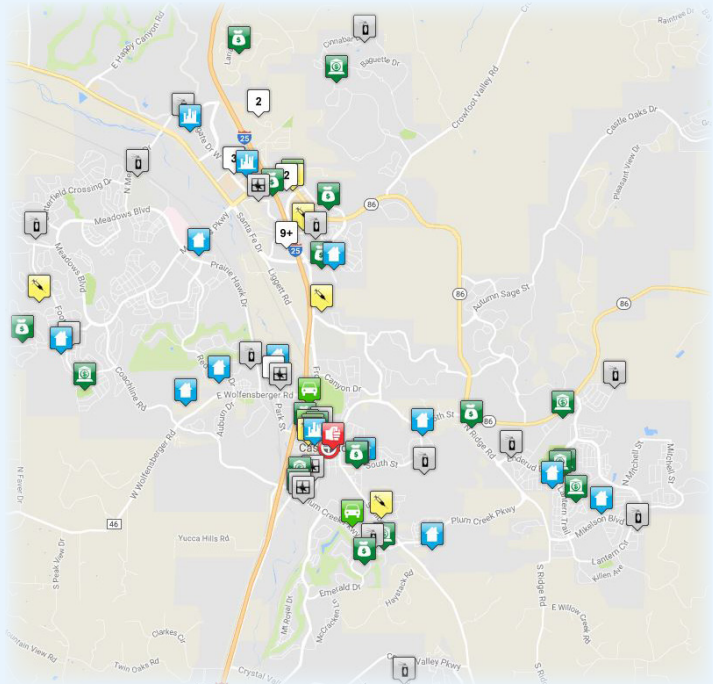
With the help of Community Crime Map, the public can view crime data in order to be more aware of what is going on in their neighborhood, as well as in participating cities and counties. The data in Community Crime Map is sanitized to protect sensitive and private information, but the public is still able to view: case number, crime type, date and time, location (actual address is sanitized and offset on the map).

Community Crime Map has both mapping and analytic capabilities, where the public is able to select where they want to look at crime, what crime types they see, and to create a density map to see the concentration of crimes geographically. The public can also look at analytics, to find out more about the number of each crime type, the timeline of crime by day, and the peak times of day and days of week for crimes that are selected on the map.

Lastly, and perhaps my favorite feature, are the Crime Alerts. I have signed up for the Crime Alerts service on Community Crime Map, which sends a summary of crimes within a certain radius of my address directly to my inbox. I also find it useful that I can choose the frequency of the Crime Alerts (daily, weekly, monthly, etc.) and what crime types I want to see.

If you are interested in signing up for Crime Alerts, simply click on the button in the upper right-hand corner of www.communitycrimemap.com, “Sign up for crime alerts.”

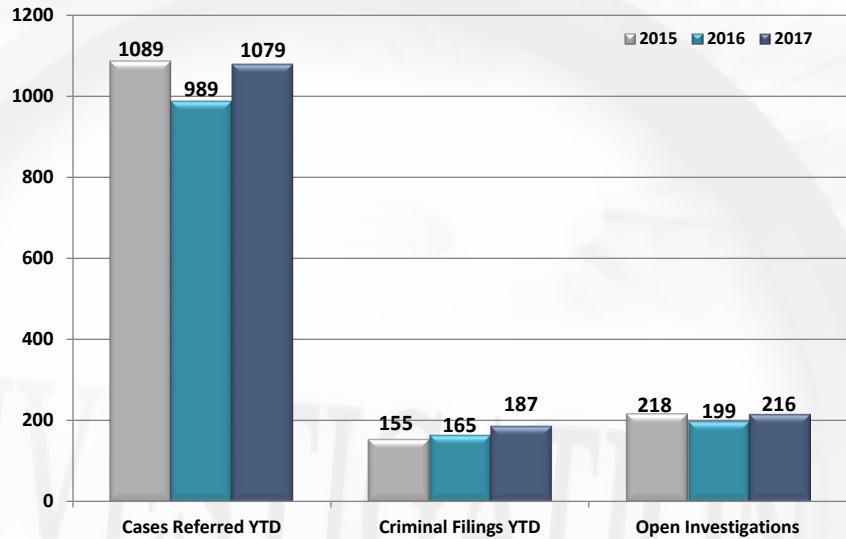


DETECTIVE UNIT

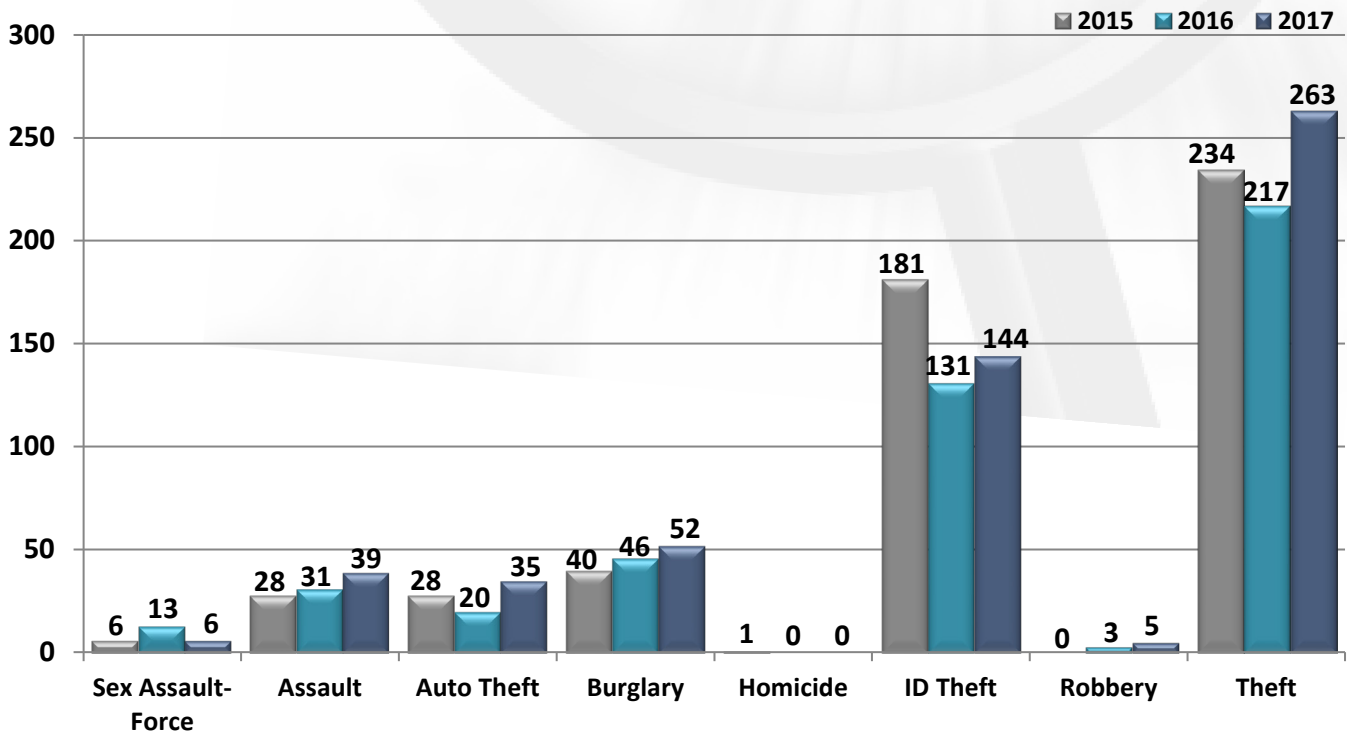
YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: JULY (2015-2017)

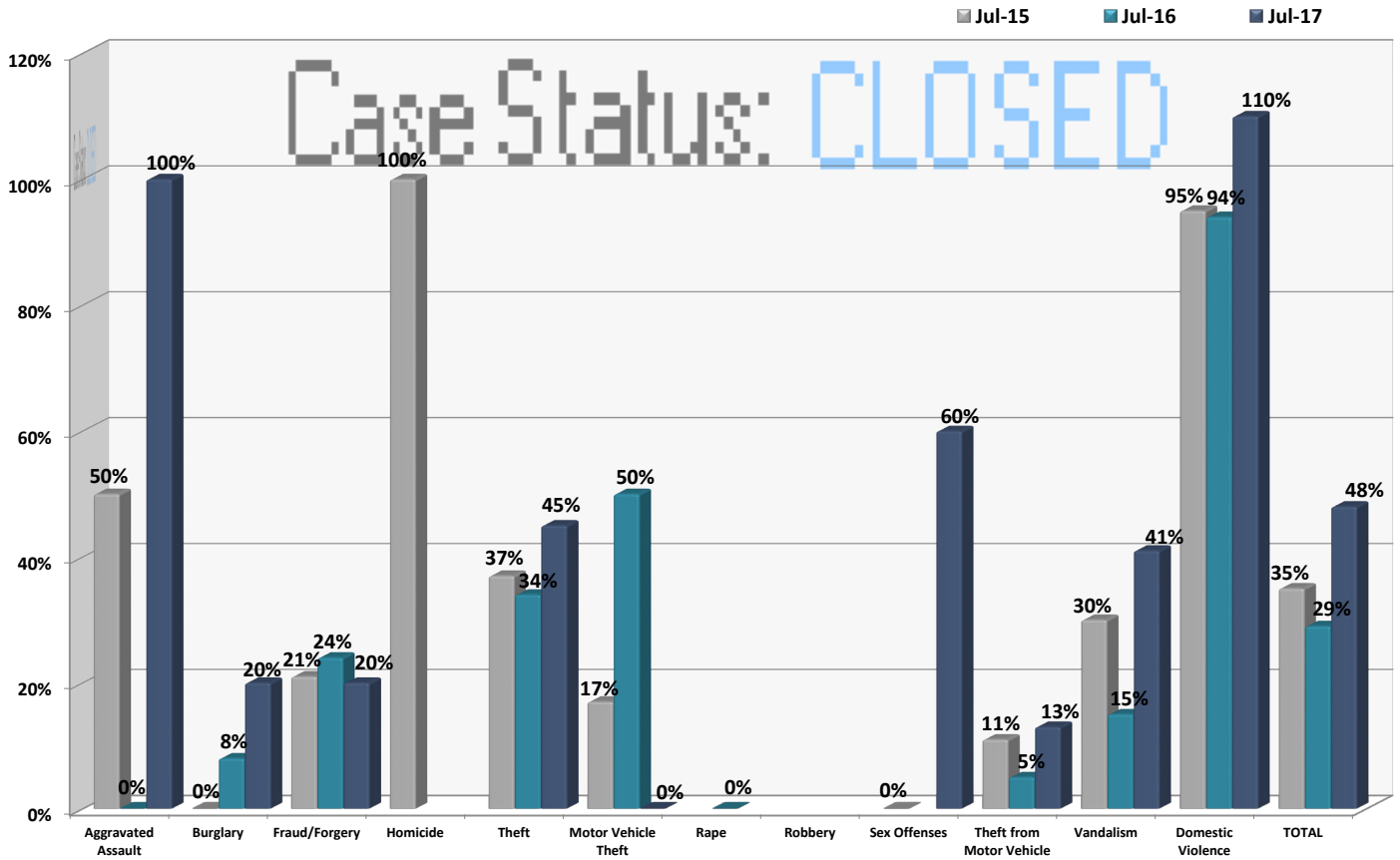
3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: JULY (2015-2017)

No liquor code inspections were conducted at local businesses during the month of July.



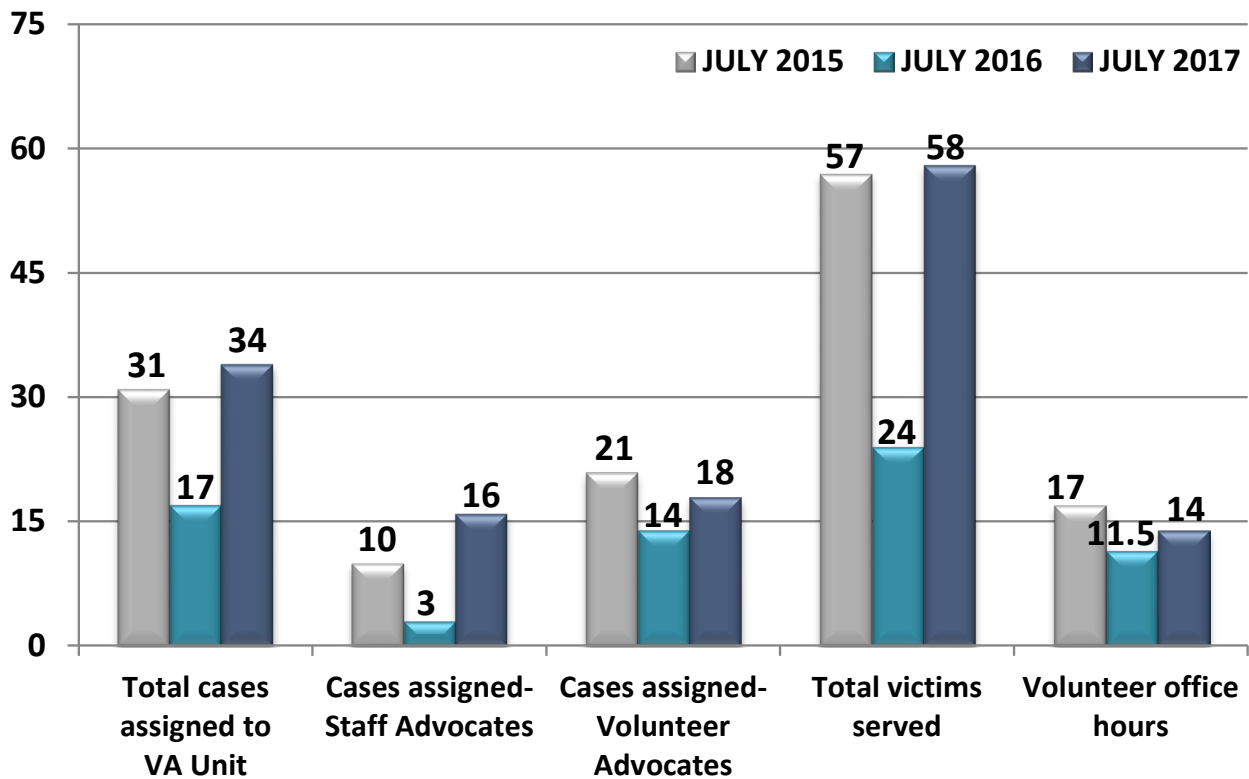


VICTIMS ASSISTANCE (VA) UNIT

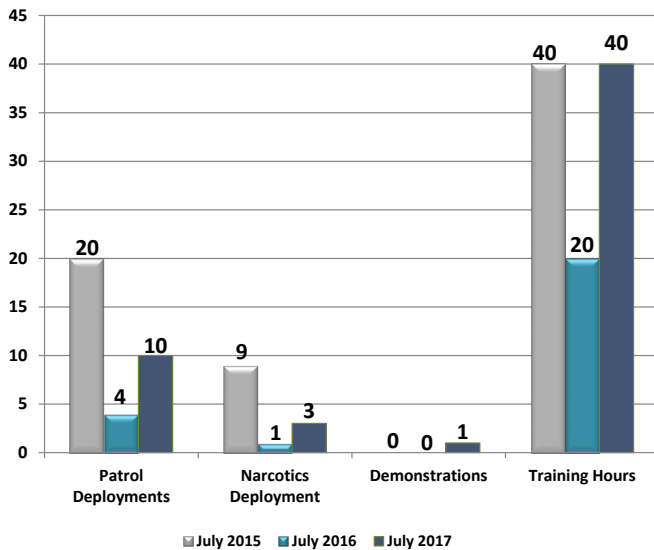
Arrests - Titan and Officer Brown assisted patrol officers with three felony arrests and surrenders.

Demonstrations - Ronin and Officer Thompson participated in a canine demonstration for Chuck and Don's Pet Store Service Dog Appreciation Day.

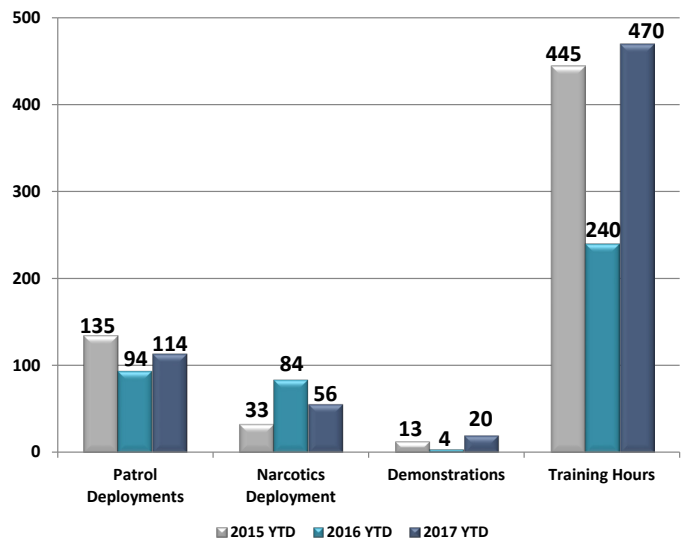
Patrol Deployments - Several officer protection deployments were executed by Officer Thompson and Ronin.

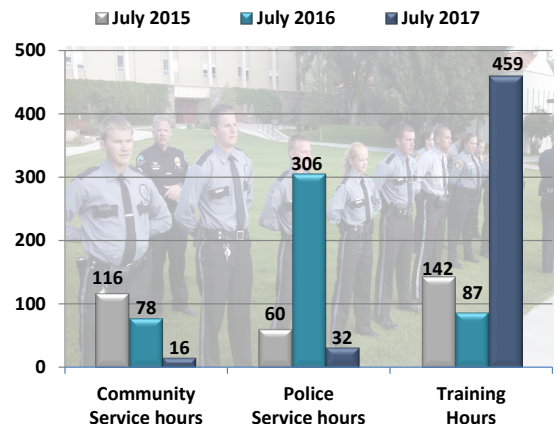
EXPLORER UNIT JULY 2015-2017

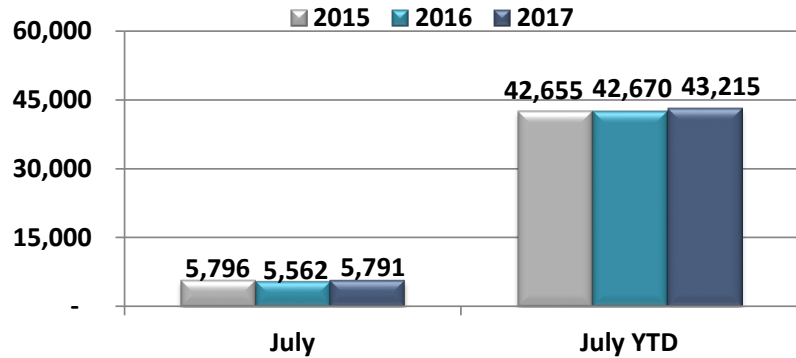




CALLS FOR SERVICE JULY (2015-2017)

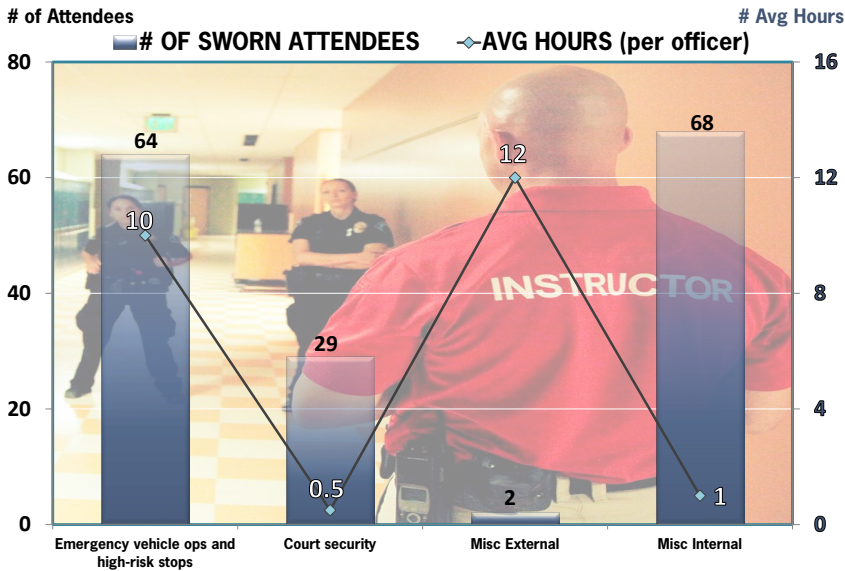

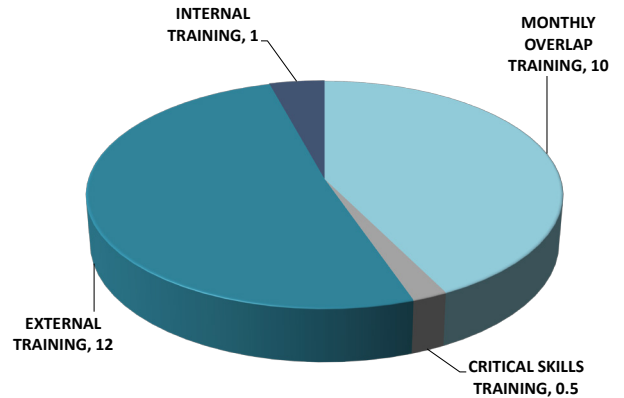

JULY 2017



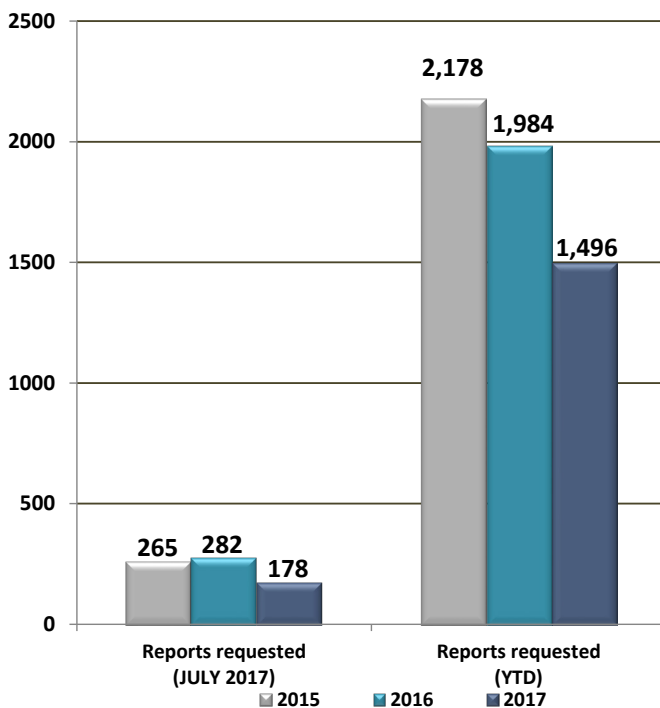
TRAINING HOURS BY CATEGORY

JULY 2017



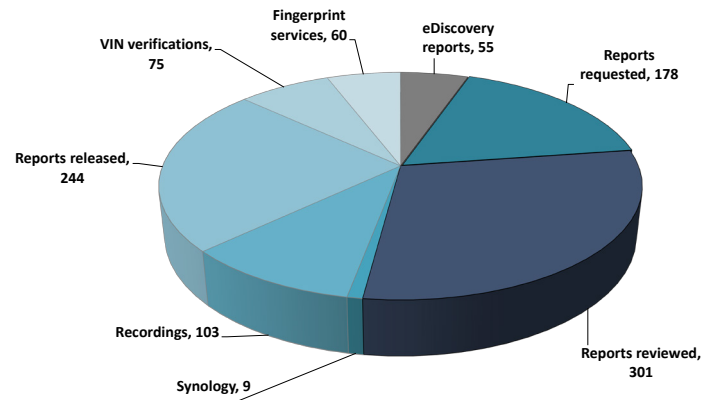

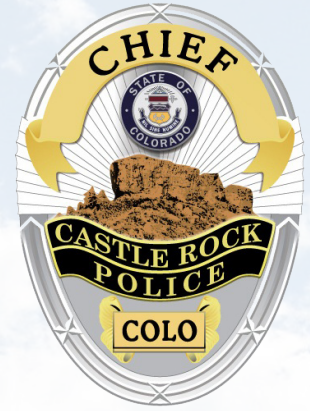
