Dear Mr. Corliss and Ms. Muller,

Twenty-seventeen was a record breaking year for us. Our membership reached over 1000+ members and our activities continue to grow due to all the new members. We rewrote our mission, value, and vison statements to better reflect who we are and what the center stands for in a more cohesive way. The old statement was over three paragraphs long and really didn't speak to the current times, and so we would like to share our new one with you.

<u>Vision</u> – Be the place where all seniors are welcomed and find their place to enjoy camaraderie along with diverse activities

<u>Mission</u> – To make life more fulfilling and create community for seniors as they come here to engage in a wide variety of programming and services designed for "Loving Life in the Second Half"

Since grant funding and town support remained steady, we were able to continue to meet the needs of our growing senior population. With our focused efforts on increasing fundraising income in 2016 and 2017, we were able to purchase a new 14 passenger bus to add to our fleet. With our increasing membership and variety of activities, purchasing the third bus for our fleet helps us to accommodate all the seniors wanting to go on our trips. This also gave us the opportunity to have multiple events on the same day to accommodate the growing desire for more activities.

We also replaced a few of our aging vehicles in our shuttle fleet. We replaced one of the older minivans last year with a new all-wheel drive Toyota Sienna minivan. This will help us when the weather gets a little messy and we have some rural riders that we need to pick up. In addition, we traded in two of our oldest Hyundai Sonata's for two new ones in November. This is in line with our vehicle replacement program, thus reducing the cost of maintenance expense and to provided vehicles with the best safety and reliability for our riders and volunteer drivers. This was made possible by a very successful 16th Annual Golf Tournament at Bear Dance Golf Course, our record-breaking 25th Annual Craft show, and several other smaller ongoing fundraisers.

The Center greatly appreciates the support we have received from the Town of Castle Rock and recognizes that we could not make the impact we do in seniors' lives without your ongoing support. And it is to that end that we continue to find ways to support and give back to our community; we plan to continue find new ways to do this. We believe one of our ways is our Douglas County-wide outreach event, the "Senior Life Expo," at the Douglas County Events Center. This is planned again for 2018.

From an organizational and community partner standpoint, we continue to be active members in several groups, such as Douglas County Transit Solutions, The Douglas County Seniors' Council, Douglas County Community of Care, Douglas County Volunteer Coalition, Leadership Douglas County, Douglas County Non-Profit Coalition and other community and transportation groups.

I've attached several documents to support many of the Center's statistics. Please feel free to let me know if you are in need of any other documents. Below are the 2017 Performance Objectives and their outcomes for last year.

### 2017 PROPOSED PERFORMANCE OBJECTIVES

### **Programs and Activities**

1.) Provide over 125 or more activities and/or events per month that are recognized as essential components to healthy and successful aging.

2017 was a very busy year for activities with an average of 158 activities or more a month; we saw interest for activities exceeding the maximum trip attendance numbers. Due to successful fundraising, in 2016 we purchased an additional bus for our fleet. This made it possible for us to add additional trips to accommodate the increased participation requests. For some of the more popular trips, we had to add additional dates to accommodate large waiting lists. Our Bucket List trips, along with Mystery Trips, are always favorites. We did a whitewater rafting trip in Brown's Canyon, snow shoeing in the mountains and a jeep tour of Rocky Mountain National Park.

We started a new quarterly program called Discovery Hour for the seniors who do not want to travel, but want to experience new things at the Center. We had Natures Educators come and share 4 raptors to a group of 40 seniors; In December we had two chefs from Flying Horse Catering come and give a demo on holiday appetizers for another large crowd of 36 seniors. We very excited to have Abe Lincoln and Mary Todd Lincoln (Impersonators) coming in February.

2.) Continue to serve over 2500 (duplicated) senior participants each month with social, cultural, and educational opportunities.

As I have shared in our 2017 mid-year report, the center hit a milestone with us reaching the over 1000 member mark. We also have a record 259 new members join the center in 2017. We closed the year with 1049 active memberships. (See Membership Report)

We averaged 3880 (duplicated) participants each month last year with the many different types of programming offered.

This breaks down to monthly average of:

1415 seniors participating in on-site activities & events

303 seniors participating in off-site activities & events

391 seniors participating in health & wellness activities

711 seniors participating in sports programs

3.) Continue to expand awareness of and attention to our volunteer programs at the Center.

Our Volunteer Coordinator had a very successful year promoting our volunteer programs. We added many new drivers for our shuttle and MOW (Meals on Wheels) programs, along with receptionists for the front desk area. This utilized over 360 volunteers last year. We got the word out in person through volunteer fairs, community events, churches and business clubs. We also used social media and local newspapers.

### **Transportation**

1.) Continue to provide over 600 rides to seniors and those adults with disabilities to medical appointments, social events, and basic living needs.

In 2017 we had 419 registered riders in our transportation shuttle program. We added 124 new shuttle riders to the program. We had 8057 shuttle rides last year, which is an average of 671 rides a month. Of these, 2648 were rides to medical appointments, 990 for grocery trips and 1091 for nutrition/hot meal programs. The other 3328 rides were for local trips, such as coming to the senior center, volunteering, haircuts, etc. While these trips are not as critical as medical appointments, they are very important to the health and wellness of a senior, keeping seniors actively involved in the community is essential to staying independent and living longer lives.

Special note we are limited by the number of vehicles and volunteers we have on the total number of rides we
can provide. We do look at continued ways to maximize these services. Many times we do group pick-ups.

### **Health & Wellness**

1.) Continue to provide VOA low cost meals 3 times a week, and continue to coordinate Meals on Wheels (MOW) weekly home deliveries to qualified clients.

In 2017 we served an average of 40+ MOW clients with over 740 meals delivered to their homes each month.

Our dining room also remained very active with an average just under 300 meals served each month.

2.) Continue to expand the wellness programming to serve the needs of the seniors.

Our wellness programming continues to grow. In 2017 we added a 6 week Tai Chi for Arthritis class. This has been so popular we are on our 5<sup>th</sup> session and have added an advanced class too.

We served a monthly average of 391 seniors each month with our many health and wellness programs.

1.) Continue to expand our use and roll out portions of the new database software system implemented in 2016.

We are continuing to roll out more portions of the software system. The beginning of the year was primarily used to get all the membership up to date. This fall we rolled out the use of sign-in kiosks for the members. This has greatly helped with compiling our participation numbers. It took a little time to for our seniors to embrace the new technology, but they are doing great now. They just have to remember to hit the SAVE button. We began tracking all of our activities and services in December; we are looking forward to the additional data for 2018.

2.) Be a leader in the community outreach for Senior Resources – April 20<sup>th</sup>, 2017 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual Senior Life Expo

Our one stop event for all kinds of senior resources is becoming the important community event. So many of the attendees from this past year loved how they were able to get so many of their senior questions answered and get so much information all in one place. We had 68 senior advocate businesses and organizations come together for this as Community Partners, and more than 600 seniors and/or family members came to this event. The reputation of this event is growing and we have a large waiting list this year 4<sup>th</sup> Annual Senior Life Expo on April 19<sup>th</sup>, 2018 from 2 – 6 p.m. at the Douglas County Events Center.

The Center greatly appreciates the support that we receive from the Town of Castle Rock and recognized that we could not make the impact we do in Senior's life without your ongoing support. We believe that, with our partnership, we truly extend lives and help Senior's "Love Life in the Second Half."

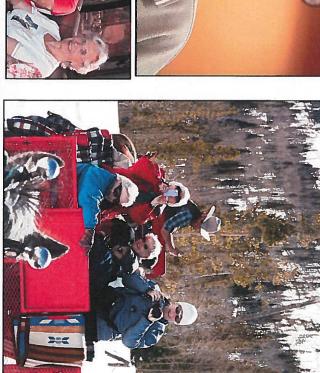


# This is what Loving Life in the Second Half-looks like





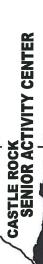
