**Title**: Ordinance: Approving the Second Amendment to the 2016 Budget and Authorizing Changes in Appropriations for Year 2016

## **Discussion**

Total requested changes to appropriations referred to in **Attachment B** net to an increase in total expenditures for 2016 of \$511,595. In terms of identified supplemental expenditure items, some of the more significant amounts requested are described here; the Utilities Department requests that the Utilities Fund budgets be increased by a total of \$295,989. Of this, the majority is requested to meet encumbered obligations. This request also includes \$80,000 for construction of a Recreational Vehicle Dump Station and \$17,000 is requested for contract landscape inspection services.

The Parks and Recreation Department requests supplemental appropriation of funds of \$75,431 in the Conservation Trust Fund to support a new Parks Supervisor position. As part of this organizational change, the department is requesting to add another Parks Supervisor and Business Analyst position in 2016. Funding for these two positions is anticipated to be available from personnel savings related to vacancies in the Assistant Director, Special Events Specialist and Parks Operations Manager positions.

The Finance Department requests an increase of expenditures in the Parks & Recreation Capital Fund, Municipal Facilities Capital Fund, Fire Capital Fund, Police Capital Fund, Transportation Capital Fund and Development Services Enterprise Fund related to the impact fee study that began in 2015. This request totals \$61,651 and is distributed among the funds which are affected by Impact and Development Fees.

A listing of all requests for supplemental appropriations for the Second Amendment to the 2016 Budget, including written justification is included in **Attachment B**.

In addition to the supplemental appropriations requests, departments request that unspent appropriations, referenced in **Attachment C**, for capital improvement projects (CIP) in 2015 be re-appropriated into the 2016 budget in the amount of \$15,976,693.

As per section 9-15 of the Town Charter, appropriations for capital expenditures do not lapse and are automatically re-appropriated into the next year's budget. Therefore, these continuing appropriations are provided for Council's review. It is requested that Town Council adopt the capital projects carry over amounts as presented in **Attachment C**.
