

# Town Manager's Office Monthly Report March 2025





- In March, the Facilities team completed **241** work orders including **85** preventative maintenance activities and **36** custodial inspections
- There was **one** emergency work order in March
- Completed fire panel replacement and floor refinishing project on the second floor of the historic Cantril building
- Repaired extensive soffit damage at Fire Headquarters
- Completed annual backflow inspections
- Supported the electrical service upgrade and ADA restroom renovation projects at the Cantril building
- Supported planning and design efforts for the Fire Station #156 project

### Help Desk


Addressed 464 total tickets, with an average time to resolve of 47 hours


- There were **five** emergency tickets this month, 100% of which were resolved within 24 hours (100% is the goal)
- There were **22** urgent priority tickets this month, 100% of which were resolved within two calendar days (85% is the goal)
- There were **366** medium priority tickets this month, 99% of which were resolved within 10 calendar days (90% is the goal)





# **Municipal Court**


# **Key Accomplishments**
