Partnership

Your generous gift, along with other gifts from Douglas County governmental jurisdictions, allowed DCCF to maintain our focus of utilizing private donations for impact. With administrative expenses supported by governmental jurisdictions whom we serve, we were able to leverage all private individual and corporate donations to our grant cycles, resource events, and community funds. This past year we had a record-breaking number of organizations apply for funding and doubled our grant dollars in support of their amazing causes. Through our work as Regional Champion for Colorado Gives Day, we helped our local nonprofits raise over 2.1 million dollars. We also held our very first symposium to a sold-out crowd of philanthropists and charities. We believe that with your support, our community foundation thrives, and when we thrive, our nonprofits thrive. And we can all agree that when our nonprofits thrive so does Douglas County.

PHILANTHROPIC SUPPORT

DCCF looks forward to expanding our reach to help more donors and philanthropists in Douglas County truly embrace their giving potential. We are eager to launch our DAF program by the end of year, recently went to RFP for an investment partner, and can now accept gifts of stock on behalf of smaller Nonprofits. DCCF will also have a record breaking amount of internal funds to grant out in 2026!

SYMPOSIUM

Because of your support, DCCF hosted our first ever Symposium engaging businesses, nonprofits, and other community stakeholders for a day of education, collaboration, and growth. We sold out with over 100 people in attendance.

MORE FUNDS

We now administer not only our own grant program, but two external programs (Opioid & PSM), as well as manage five funds (Castillo, HEART, CERF, Roose, Klobetanz, Garden).
