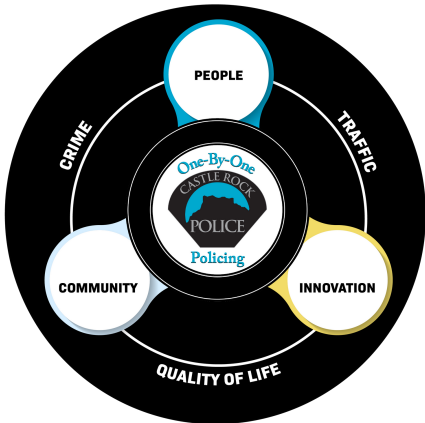

CRPD Expands education on E-motos and E-bikes

During July, the Castle Rock Police Department continued its efforts to educate residents about the growing use of e-bikes, electric dirt bikes and other motorized recreational vehicles. Of particular concern are vehicles commonly referred to as "e-motos," which can resemble e-bikes but do not meet Colorado's legal definition of an electric bicycle. CRPD is working to help riders and parents understand the differences between these vehicles and where they can legally be operated.

Under Castle Rock regulations, Class 1 and Class 2 e-bikes are permitted on Town sidewalks, paths and trails, while Class 3 e-bikes are not permitted in those areas. Electric dirt bikes, unlicensed electric motorcycles and similar off-highway vehicles are prohibited on Town streets and roadways, paths, trails and sidewalks. The ordinance also provides for increased penalties, including a \$250 fine for parents or guardians who knowingly allow a child under 18 to operate or ride an off-highway vehicle within Town limits. CRPD's emphasis remains on education, safe riding and helping families understand the type of vehicle they own before it is operated in the community.

As part of this educational effort, CRPD has developed resources explaining e-bike classifications, e-motos and other motorized vehicles, along with important safety information for riders and parents. Residents are encouraged to wear appropriate safety equipment, follow traffic laws, remain alert and understand the rules that apply to their specific vehicle. 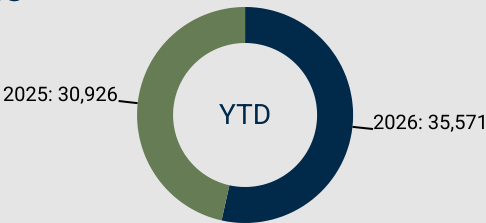
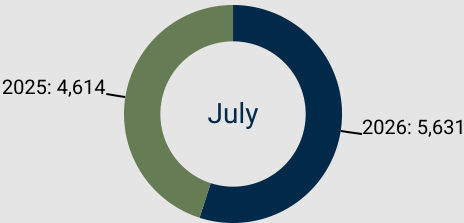

Priority 1 calls for service are incidents requiring an emergent response where an immediate threat or risk to life exists.



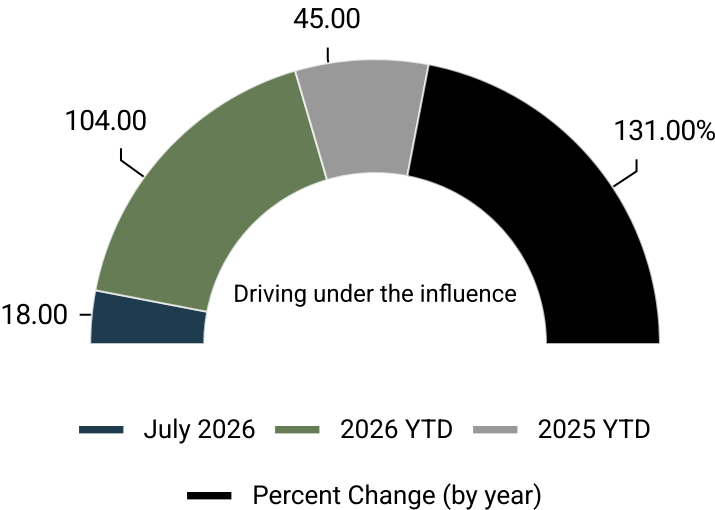
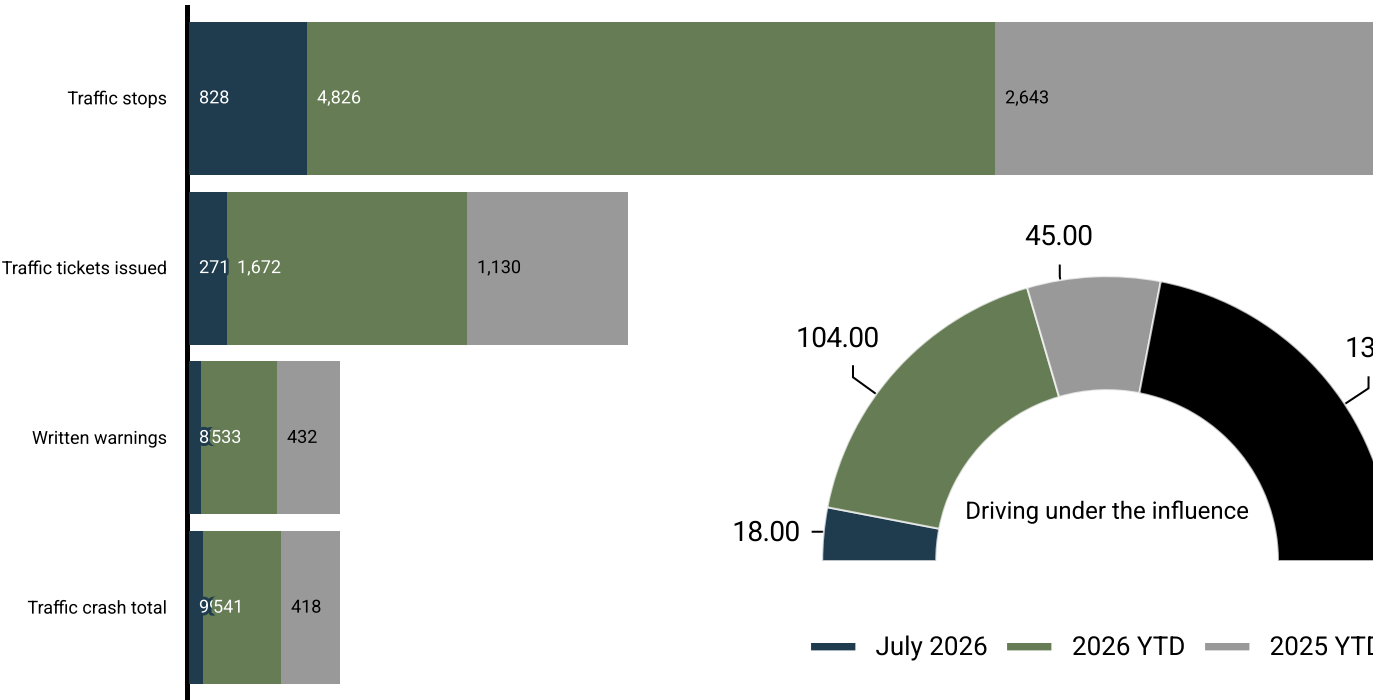

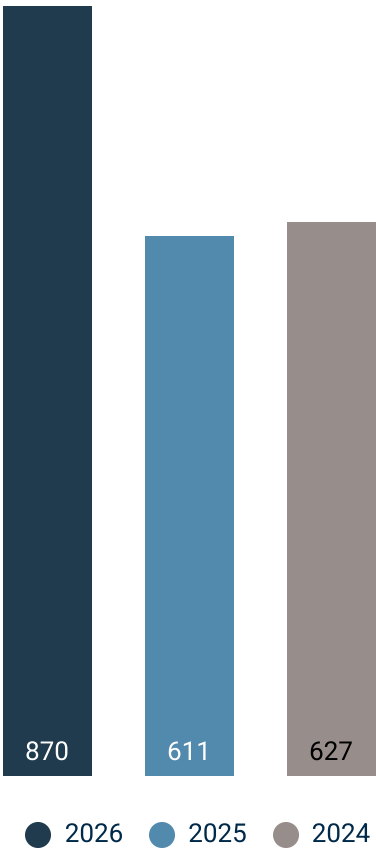

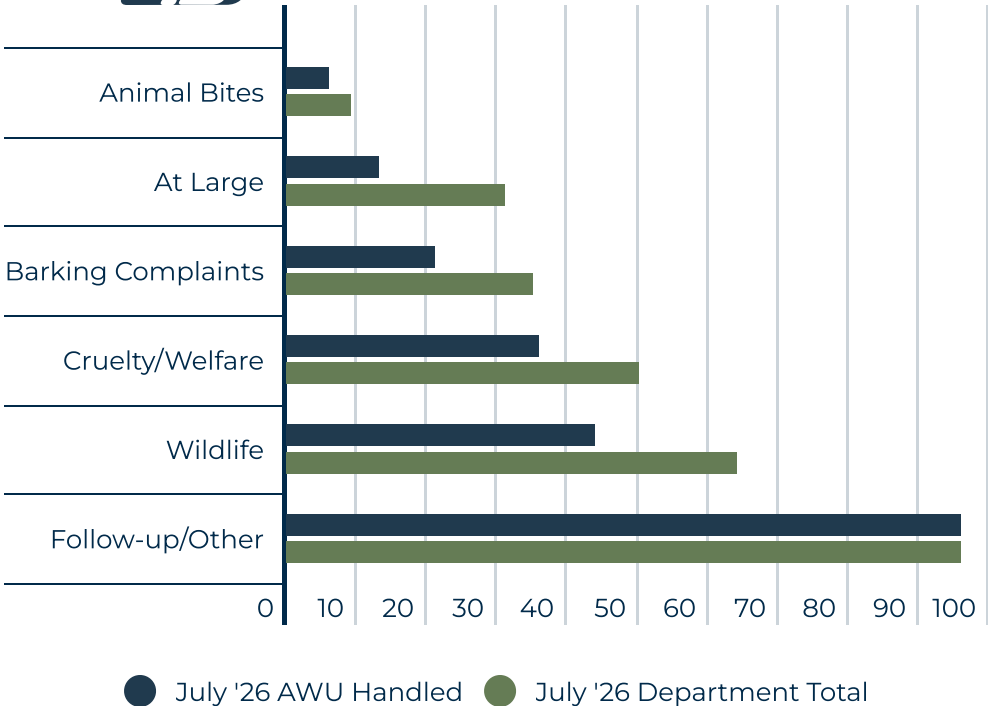

Community Response Team: Calls for service

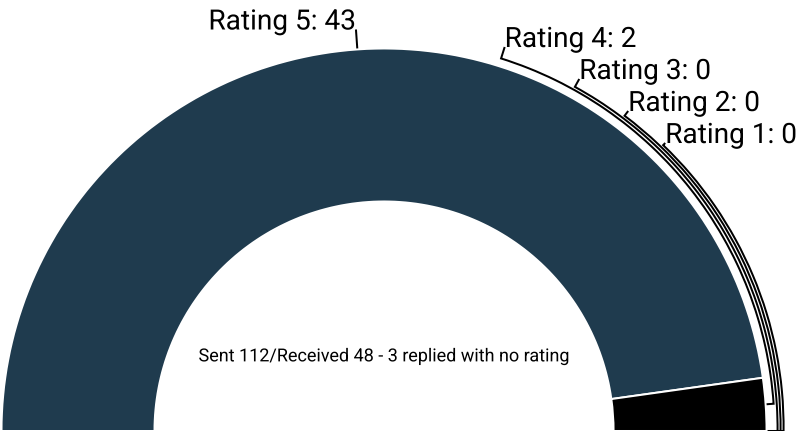


Animal Welfare Unit: Calls for service
