5.4 Drought Public Information and Educational Campaign	<p>Added an objective to drought public education and campaign:</p> <p>Clarify drought-related policies affecting landscaping and property maintenance, including notification that brown or dormant turf may result from compliance with drought restrictions and that common interest community (HOAs, metro districts etc.) enforcement actions related to such conditions are prohibited during declared drought stages, as stated in Municipal Code §13.15.080(D).</p>	To include relevant public campaign efforts for the new ordinance
7. Staged Drought Response Program	<p>Added language which incorporates a new ordinance as it relates to drought declaration and enforcement.</p> <p>During any drought stage, compliance with Town-imposed water use restrictions may result in brown or dormant turf and other landscape impacts. In accordance with Town Ordinance 2026-XXX, common interest communities (such as HOAs and metro districts) are prohibited from enforcing landscaping standards that conflict with these drought response measures for the duration of the declared drought stage.</p>	Addition of new ordinance to drought response.
