MAJOR PROJECTS UPDATE

Second Quarter

Each year, the Town undertakes a major projects work program to accomplish priority projects.

Each quarter, Town staff prepares a status report regarding the projects for Town Council and community review. These reports are archived at CRgov.com/MajorProjects.



Public input was sought, and multiple
Town Council discussions occurred, before
Town Council approved seven key priorities
for 2024. Listed under each priority are key
2024 action items; the lines beneath each
action item provide updates.

Second Quarter

ENSURE OUTSTANDING PUBLIC SAFETY

- Add three firefighter/EMT positions
 These staff were hired in late 2023, graduated the academy and are now online; complete
- Design Fire Station 156 in northeastern Castle Rock
 An owner's representative has been hired; staff requested and has received proposals for architectural services and plans to make a selection in July; staff is also working to replat and rezone the property on which the station will be located
- Add three Police positions a dispatcher, an Investigations sergeant and a Community Response Team officer

All three positions have been filled

 Replace the Fire and Police departments' emergency radios and fund other equipment and operational cost needs for the departments

Fire has completed evaluations of two different systems, selected Motorola and is working on a quote for third quarter purchase; Town Council in June approved the purchase of Motorola radios for CRPD

PRESERVE OUR COMMUNITY CHARACTER

- Continue improvements at Cantril School
 Renovations are underway to add restrooms, an ADA lift
 and a check-in area, and to renovate the kitchen; planning
 is also in progress to upsize the building's electrical supply
 and to make other improvements to the '50s/'60s addition
- Double funding for the Council Community Grant program for community-based projects by nonprofit organizations
 Funding was increased to \$4,000 per quarter beginning in third quarter 2023; this increased funding level has continued into 2024



Second Quarter

ENHANCE OUR ROADS

 Obtain final approvals from CDOT and FHWA and begin construction on our top infrastructure priority, a new interchange on Interstate 25 at Crystal Valley Parkway

Package 1, on the east side of Interstate 25, is under construction and progressing on schedule — concrete for the east half of the roundabout is expected to be placed in July; the notice to proceed has been issued for Package 2, which includes the interchange itself

 Complete a scaled-back annual Pavement Maintenance Program, focused in 2024 on western Castle Rock

Progress is continuing on schedule

 Complete construction of the "Four Corners" intersection improvements

This project continues, with work mainly focused on the northwest and southwest quadrants; completion is still on track for this year

 Begin improvements to Crowfoot Valley Road east of Knobcone Drive

Staff is continuing to make progress toward this project; schedule adjustment may be needed due to scope of work received by CORE to relocate their electric infrastructure

 Union Pacific completes construction and Town staff works with authorities to finalize Downtown railroad quiet zone

Union Pacific should complete its construction in early July; then, notifications and approvals will have to occur for implementation of the quiet zone

- Acquire the right of way needed for the future widening of Fifth Street and Wolfensberger Road Appraisal and survey for property acquisitions are underway, with acquisitions expected to continue through summer
- Update the Town's Transportation Master Plan
 Work continues on this item, which is expected to be completed in 2024
- Add a signs and maintenance position
 This position has been filled

SUPPORT ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT

• Fulfill existing economic incentive agreements and maintain capacity for new agreements

Staff continues to monitor existing economic incentive agreements while forecasting funds available for new opportunities

Second Quarter

SECURE OUR WATER FUTURE

Continue projects, programs and policies to advance the goals of securing 75% renewable water by 2050; reducing per-capita water consumption to 100 gallons per day; and maintaining affordable rates and fees, including:

- Expand the Plum Creek Water Purification Facility
 Awarded Work Packages 1 and 2, finalizing major equipment orders; designing final work package and reviewing equipment submittals; contractor Garney to mobilize for initial construction work in October
- Acquire additional water rights
 Completed purchase of remaining Meadow Ditch water rights
- Continue purchase of Chatfield Reservoir storage and design of Chatfield pump back infrastructure
 Council approved the purchase of 129 acre-feet of storage space in May, and closing is underway; preliminary design of the Chatfield Pump Back project continues
- Install infrastructure within the Cherry Creek Basin and for the WISE project
 Design of Cherry Creek Basin infrastructure is complete —

construction bidding is on hold pending other priorities;
WISE Parker midsection pipeline construction is complete;
WISE Denver International Airport connection construction is underway

Continue to implement advanced metering infrastructure
 Software systems have all been installed and tested
 advanced metering capabilities are now available for more than 50% of customers, including all of Cobblestone
 Ranch and Bell Mountain Ranch; Castle Rock Water will begin reading these meters remotely for the August or
 September billing cycle

 Upgrade piping and pumping and control system equipment for Downtown Castle Rock

Town Council approved the design of the Front Street connection to Downtown in May; completion of the design is expected by year end, with construction planned in 2025

 Complete McMurdo Gulch stream stabilization and storm sewer rehabilitation projects


Design of the McMurdo Gulch Priority 3 project is complete, with bidding expected in July or August, for Town Council approval in October and construction in late fall/winter; construction of East Plum Creek Reach 6 is complete; point repair on storm sewer in The Meadows is in the planning stages

 Complete water and sewer line rehabilitation in parts of the Young American area, along with an upsizing of the Plum Creek gravity sewer (interceptor)

Town Council awarded the sewer line rehabilitation contract to Inliner Solutions on July 2, with construction expected to start in August; water line rehabilitation has been rescheduled for 2025 to 2027; the Plum Creek Interceptor has been put on hold for several years, pending capacity needs

 Add an instrumentation and controls superintendent (SCADA) position and a landscape designer

Hiring for the SCADA position is ongoing; the landscape designer position has been put on hold to save operating costs



Second Quarter

MAINTAIN STRONG PARKS AND RECREATION

- Complete construction on Mitchell Gulch and Emerald parks
 Mitchell Gulch Park construction is complete; Emerald Park
 completion is scheduled for September
- Complete repairs to the slide tower at the Recreation Center
 The slide tower is complete, and the slides are expected to be
 fully operational by mid-July
- If approved, make a \$10 million down payment on a new sports development center for the community
 Construction documents for this potential facility are 30% complete; Town Council is tentatively scheduled to discuss the project's financing and related agreements on Aug. 20
- Acquire Lost Canyon Ranch as open space
 The Town closed on this property in April, and a celebration among the purchasing partners was held in June

 Update the pool, flooring and toddler area at the MAC and the HVAC system at the Recreation Center

The flooring and toddler area improvements at the MAC have been deferred to accommodate updates to the pool there; HVAC updates at the Rec Center are now planned for 2028

 Add a Parks Maintenance position using proceeds from the voter-approved lodging tax

This position has been filled

 Fund new golf carts and maintenance equipment and clubhouse upgrades at Red Hawk Ridge Golf Course
 Complete



Second Quarter

MANAGE TOWN FINANCES CONSERVATIVELY

 Study and present to Council recommendations for ensuring the Town's fiscal sustainability — particularly with regard to public safety, roads and open space

A potential fall 2024 ballot item to ask voters to approve a 0.2% sales tax increase has been presented to Council, with the final decision whether to proceed with an election occurring in August

 Closely monitor the Town's sales tax revenue relative to what is budgeted and adjust expenditures as may be required

Staff continues to monitor sales tax monthly, which is tracking slightly above the budgeted 3% increase over 2023 year to date; staff will recommend adjustments as necessary as this trend merits

 To ensure they are used only in the manner approved by voters, receive any "excess" TABOR revenues into a dedicated fund

Staff is finalizing the 2023 audit and related information, including the TABOR calculation

 To ensure maximum efficiency and accuracy of financial information, acquire new financial management software
 Staff is continuing preliminary discussions in this process and anticipates working with a Government Finance Officers
 Association consultant beginning in 2025 to prepare for this implementation
