Description of organization:*

The mission of Clothes To Kids of Denver (CTKD) is to provide new and quality used clothing in a boutique setting to students from low-income or in-crisis families in the Denver Metro Area, free of charge. Our vision is that all students will have the clothing they need to feel comfortable, confident and prepared to thrive.

CTKD proudly provides free school clothing and a shopping experience for students in need throughout the 11-county Denver Metro Area. Central to the CTKD mission is our boutique, a 3,000 square foot space where student shoppers are invited to browse our wide selection of clothing for a 21-23 piece school wardrobe, which includes five outfits, new underwear, new socks, a bra, shoes and a coat. Shoppers are also encouraged to take home extra items, which may include winter items, accessories, sports equipment, toys, toiletries, books and school supplies. In addition to shopping in person, students can use Curbside Service, which was originally created in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and allows wardrobe requests to be submitted by phone or email for pick-up. No matter how they choose to shop, students are invited to select a wardrobe every 4 months.

CTKD's attractive store-like setting combined with our emphasis on providing shoppers with the best quality, selection and customer experience possible make CTKD the preeminent clothing resource for students in need. The clothing we provide not only removes a barrier to school attendance, participation and achievement for our students, but also frees up funds families can devote to other necessities, such as medical care, bills, groceries and rent. CTKD has built a strong reputation among hundreds of schools, agencies and faith-based communities across the Denver Metro Area, which have come to rely on CTKD to meet the clothing needs of students from low-income families.

As of July 31, 2025, CTKD has provided a fun shopping experience in a boutique environment to 126,716 students since September 2008. In 2024, CTKD distributed 13,950 wardrobes and 41,359 pounds of extra items, with 93% of shoppers selecting a complete wardrobe (all 21 non-optional pieces). We increased wardrobe distribution by 9% in 2024 compared to 2023 (12,807), 27% compared to 2022 (10,974 wardrobes) and 52% compared to 2021 (9,150 wardrobes). The trend has continued in 2025, and we have welcomed 14 percent more shoppers during January-July of this year (8,459) than we did in the same period in 2024 (7,414). We are on track to distribute more than 14,500 wardrobes in 2025, making this our busiest year ever!

We are seeking support from the Town of Castle Rock for our "Shoes For Every Shopper!" initiative. Shoes for elementary and middle school age students remain difficult to obtain through typical donations. We require that every item we offer be in excellent condition, and kids in this age group are notoriously hard on their shoes! Funding in this area will help us fill gaps in our inventory and provide shoppers with the best possible selection and quality. Our partnerships with for-profit apparel companies, including Little Feet, Vans, Nike and Runners Roost, as well as fellow nonprofit organizations, such as Good360 and the Denver Public Schools Pupil Assistance Fund, give CTKD access to free or deeply discounted shoes and allow us to maximize your contribution. A grant of \$1,000 from the Town of Castle Rock will provide new shoes for about 141 students.* This gift would make a huge impact considering that CTKD currently serves an average of 1,208 shoppers/month and anticipates providing approximately 14,500 wardrobes in 2025. CTKD's 2025 budget for shoes is \$60,000.

The students who shop at CTKD are experiencing some of the most difficult circumstances imaginable – poverty, homelessness, displacement, recent immigration and home removal. Even our youngest students are often painfully aware of their family's financial situation and must sacrifice what many of us consider to be basic needs. In this time of tremendous hardship for so many, CTKD has continued to serve as a nurturing, happy place for children and youth.

At a recent training, I asked each of our volunteers to introduce themselves and tell the group why they choose to serve at Clothes To Kids. A new volunteer shared that she found us through her son, who works as a football coach at a local high school. One of his students has two high school age brothers, each attending a different school. When the coach asked the student why his brothers attended different schools, the student confided in him that he and his brothers shared just a few pieces of clothing and attended different schools so that they wouldn't be teased for wearing the same thing every day. Our volunteer discovered Clothes To Kids in her search for resources for this family and had fallen in love with the mission after each of the boys found a full week's worth of clothing, plus athletic shoes, cleats and workout clothing to wear to practice. She was hooked and now helps spread the word about Clothes To Kids to schools in our service area!

It is common to hear stories like this one, where access to clothing, or a pair of shoes, removed a barrier to school attendance, participation and achievement for a student living in poverty or experiencing crisis.

*Based on the actual average cost per pair of shoes purchased between 1/1/2024 and 12/31/2024 (8,379 pairs purchased for \$59,449 = \$7.09/pair). CTKD's 2024 overall average cost to provide a pair of shoes was \$3.98/student (\$55,518 total shoe spending/13,950 total wardrobes) up \$0.89 from \$3.09/student in 2023 (\$48,627 total shoe spending/12,807 total wardrobes).

CTKD serves preschool-12th grade students residing in the 11-county Denver Metro Area, including the Town of Castle Rock and all of Douglas County. We have provided 2,568 wardrobes to students from Castle Rock and neighboring areas since 2008.

CTKD conducts an ongoing survey designed to collect data about customer satisfaction, customer experience and the quality of the shopping experience we provide. Results of the 2024 customer survey were very favorable, with 94% of respondents saying that CTKD was "Much Better Than" or "The Best" compared to other clothing resources (up from 92% in 2023 and 85% in 2022). A majority of respondents (92%) "Strongly Agreed" that they were treated with respect during their visit. 97% said they would "Recommend" or "Strongly Recommend" shopping at CTKD to their friends and family members. Also notable, 93% of respondents "Agreed" or "Strongly Agreed" that their child found clothes that he/she likes wearing at CTKD, and 91% "Strongly Agreed" that volunteers and staff provided them with good customer service during their visit. Full survey results are available upon request.

CTKD was fortunate to receive funding from the Town of Castle Rock in 2017, 2018, 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023. This funding has enabled CTKD to create additional appointments for shoppers and grow its both its paid and volunteer staff. With your continued support, we will be able to keep expanding our reach and serve even more students in 2025.

The Mane Mission (TMM) is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization based in Sedalia, Colorado, dedicated to supporting the emotional well-being, personal growth, and community integration of underserved individuals—including at-risk youth and those with intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Founded in 2020 by Mike and Kathleen Hulley, TMM was created in response to a critical need for accessible, inclusive, and engaging mental health and recreational programs for people in vulnerable populations. Since its founding, TMM has served more than 1,200 individuals annually from Douglas, Arapahoe, Elbert, Adams, Denver, and other surrounding counties.

Led by a Licensed Professional Counselor and supported by over 70 dedicated volunteers, interns, and licensed therapists, TMM's innovative programs combine the healing power of animal-assisted therapy with nature-based experiences and structured therapeutic support. Participants interact with a wide variety of animals—including horses, goats, cows, chickens, and the organization's beloved certified therapy dog, Bruno—through activities designed to foster joy, self-confidence, and connection. Programs include seasonal IDD Day Programs, trauma-informed therapy groups for teens, and specialized sessions for survivors of human trafficking in partnership with Sarah's Home. In 2024, TMM began integrating grief and loss support for IDD participants, further expanding the depth of its mental health services. TMM's mission is rooted in the belief that everyone deserves access to compassionate, culturally responsive mental health support in an environment that is welcoming, empowering, and life-affirming.

The Mane Mission (TMM) is deeply embedded in the Douglas County community, with its farm-based therapeutic facility located just 17 minutes from Castle Rock. In 2024 alone, TMM served 159 participants from Douglas County, with at least 20% of those individuals being youth—underscoring our commitment to meeting the mental health and developmental needs of local young people.

Our proximity to Castle Rock makes TMM a vital regional resource, particularly for families seeking animal-assisted therapy and trauma-informed care outside of traditional clinical settings. The therapeutic benefits extend beyond individual participants, strengthening families and communities throughout Castle Rock and the surrounding region.
