EMERALD PARK

Colorado Designscapes continued construction efforts throughout August. The poured-in-place playground surfacing was installed, the pickleball courts striped, the synthetic turf areas placed, the prefabricated restroom erected and trees planted. The contractor will continue to work on punch-list items and landscaping prior to a Wizard of Oz themed grand reopening event scheduled for 5-7 p.m. Friday, Oct. 11.



EMBARK ON TOWN'S TINY ART QUEST; FIND MINIA-TURE ARTWORK CREATED BY LOCAL YOUTH

Add some adventure to your next visit to Downtown Castle Rock. Part scavenger hunt, part mini art installation, the Tiny Art Quest invites you to discover tiny artworks created by talented Castle Rock students.

Earlier this summer, the Town's Public Art Commission solicited submissions from local artists ages 13 and under. Over 50 artists presented their work for consideration, and 14 stand-out pieces were chosen to be included in this first-ever Tiny Art Quest. Celebrate the creativity and artistic talent of local youth as you search for these miniature hidden gems around Festival Park and the Town Hall Plaza.

ICAN BIKE CAMP: EMPOWERING INDIVIDUALS THROUGH THE JOY OF CYCLING

The Therapeutic Recreation program successfully hosted its the iCan Bike Camp, in partnership with iCan Shine, a nonprofit dedicated to empowering individuals with disabilities through recreational programs. This week-long camp offered a transformative experience for 19 participants, ranging in age from eight to 30, who learned how to ride a two-wheel bicycle for the first time.

Research shows that over 80% of individuals with autism and 90% of individuals with Down Syndrome may never experience the independence of riding a bike. The iCan Bike Camp aims to change that statistic, providing opportunities for participants to gain confidence, develop new skills, and experience the joy of riding independently.

This initiative was made possible through a generous grant from the Douglas County Metropolitan Football Stadium District (MFSD), alongside the dedicated efforts of 11 Therapeutic Recreation staff members, two iCan Shine experts, and eight committed volunteers, who collectively contributed 80 hours to ensure the program's success.

The camp's impact goes beyond learning to ride; it fosters personal growth, independence, and social connections among participants, who leave with newfound abilities and a sense of accomplishment.

By the Numbers


Parks Maintenance and Operations


