DIR 2024-003

Discussion/Direction: Cobblestone Metro District Mill Levy for Fire/Emergency Services

David Corliss, Town Manager, provided background on the metro district known as Villages at Castle Rock Metro District #6. The property was annexed in the 1980's, and there was an IGA with the Town in June of 2004 for 10 mils to pay for Fire and Emergency services. They plan to have a new station operational in 2026 with an estimated cost of \$8M. Staff is proposing to reduce the mil levy down to 5 mil starting after the station is built by 1 mil per year for 5 years until it is reduced to 5 mils to be in line with what other metro districts pay.

Citizens that addressed Council:

Stan DePue is a Cobblestone resident of 5 years and is on the metro district board. They refinanced their bonds to pay off debt in 25 years and is happy with the proposal.

David Garris(?) is a resident of Cobblestone and is happy Council is considering the mil reduction.

Councilmember Cavey stated this issue was brought to her and she felt it was appropriate for the mil to be in line with the rest of Castle Rock.

Moved by Councilmember Cavey, seconded by Councilmember Brooks, to Direct Staff proceed with preparation of a revised Intergovernmental Agreement for future Council consideration. The motion passed by a vote of:

Discussion/Direction: Council Electronic Participation, Connected & **Hybrid Meeting Policy**

Kristin Read, Assistant Town Manager, presented information on online participation at Council meetings. During COVID, the Town instituted remote participation, connected meetings, and hybrid which is the practice the Town continues.

Citizens that addressed Council online:

Unidentified man feels it is informative and he can participate remotely when he is unable to come in, and asks Council to continue to allow citizens remote participation.

Mayor Gray stated CML discussed issues some municipalities have had with online callers. He feels citizens can email Council and submit their comments if they cannot appear in person.

Councilmember Cavey wants to continue to allow citizens to participate remotely and feels they deserve access to Council.

Councilmember Brooks clarified they can still watch the meetings, they just cannot comment. Council is only voting if it should be brought back to vote on. Brooks stated he is not a fan of remote participation.

Councilmember Bracken encourages people to attend in person.

Councilmember Hollingshead feels it is beneficial for the elderly, those that have kids and can't stay for a whole meeting, or if there is bad weather. He does not feel it has been abused and does not feel it is hurting anything.

Mayor Pro Tem LaFleur asked if there is an option to take them offline if they go rogue.

Mike Hyman, Town Attorney, stated it has been discussed that if we offer public comment, we have to allow them to speak the entire time or we open ourselves up to violating their 1st amendment right.

Councilmember Dietz prefers in person citizen participation but wants to allow Council to remote in.

Moved by Councilmember Brooks, seconded by Councilmember Bracken, to Direct Staff to bring back for Council's consideration a Resolution that would update Council's Electronic Participation, Connected & Hybrid Meeting Policy. The motion passed by a vote of:
