LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

APRIL 1, 2025 TOWN COUNCIL



OVERVIEW

- General Assembly in session January-May
- Staff monitors, but does not take any positions on, legislation unless Council directs it
- Staff is presently tracking roughly 85 potential and introduced bills (down from 100)
- If Council is interested in information on any specific bills not addressed tonight, staff can provide an update at a future meeting



NEW RECOMMENDATION

RECOMMENDED TO OPPOSE

SB 256: FUNDS FOR SUPPORT OF DIGITAL TRUNKED RADIO SYSTEM

This bill proposes using severance taxes that support local governments to fund the Statewide emergency radio network for the next 10 years. While this network is important to local governments, they should not be wholly responsible for funding it, as it is used Statewide, including by State entities.

SB 257: MODIFY GENERAL FUND TRANSFERS TO STATE HIGHWAY FUND

Staff believes this bill would significantly reduce funding toward transportation infrastructure, including grants available to local governments.



OPPOSED ITEMS UPDATES

HB 1007: PARATRANSIT SERVICES

Would require local governments to have plans for how to provide these services during emergencies and to consult with impacted members of the community before reducing services. (Passed and awaiting Governor's signature)

HB 1093: LIMITATIONS ON LOCAL ANTI-GROWTH LAND USE POLICIES

Clarifies the State's anti-growth law to also include any restriction that seeks to limit a particular housing type and mandates in-lieu fees for land dedication. (Passed and awaiting Governor's signature)

HB 1147: FAIRNESS & TRANSPARENCY IN MUNICIPAL COURT

This bill would place limitations on municipal sentencing guidelines, among other provisions. (Next hearing is on the Senate floor)



OPPOSED ITEMS UPDATES

HB 1169: HOUSING DEVELOPMENTS ON FAITH AND EDUCATIONAL LAND

This bill would require an administrative approval process for housing proposals on property owned by religious institutions or schools, with no limitations on density or affordability. (Next hearing is on the Senate floor)

HB 1239: COLORADO ANTI-DISCRIMINATION ACT

Per CML, promotes a culture of litigation rather than promoting resolution of disputes; increases liability for public entities; and unfairly places public funds at risk. (Has passed the House and will be moving to the Senate)

HB 1261: CONSUMERS CONSTRUCTION DEFECT ACTION

Per CML, would further discourage condos and other housing projects being built in the State and counters legislation related to construction defects litigation reform. (Postponed indefinitely)

OPPOSED ITEMS UPDATES

SB 1: COLORADO VOTING RIGHTS ACT

This would extend powers of the State Attorney General and the Secretary of State over some municipal elections and would open the Town up to additional litigation surrounding elections. . (Introduced in the House)

SB 3: SEMIAUTOMATIC FIREARMS & RAPID-FIRE DEVICES

Prohibits the manufacture, distribution, transfer, sale and purchase of specified semiautomatic firearms and classifies a device that increase the rate of fire of a semiautomatic firearm as a dangerous weapon. (Passed and awaiting Governor's signature)

SB 62: FAILURE TO APPEAR CHARGES IN MUNICIPAL COURT

This bill would prohibit municipalities from making contempt of court a jailable offense under local ordinance, which is a provision that exists within our Town Code. (Next hearing is second reading on the House floor)



SUPPORTED ITEMS UPDATES

HB 1112: LOCAL AUTHORITIES ENFORCE VEHICLE REGISTRATION

Would allow local authorities to enforce these requirements, providing municipalities with increased flexibility and helping restore timely registrations. (Has passed the House and will be moving to the Senate)

HB 1152: TECH ASSESSIBILITY LIABILITY CONTRACTOR

Potentially reduces Town's liability under State's digital accessibility law. (Next hearing is on the Senate floor)

HB 1272: CONSTRUCTION DEFECTS & MIDDLE MARKET HOUSING

Seen by CML as a means to create more owner-occupied housing options. . (Has passed the House and will be moving to the Senate)

HB 1276: COURT ACTIONS RELATED TO FAILURE TO APPEAR IN COURT

This bill would allow municipal courts to issue surety or cash bonds after a certain number of failures to appear or personal recognizance bond violations, helping to combat petty thefts. (In Judiciary April 2)

SUPPORTED ITEMS UPDATES

SB 77: MODIFICATIONS TO COLORADO OPEN RECORDS ACT

This bill would give staff additional time to respond to open records requests. (Passed and awaiting Governor's signature)
