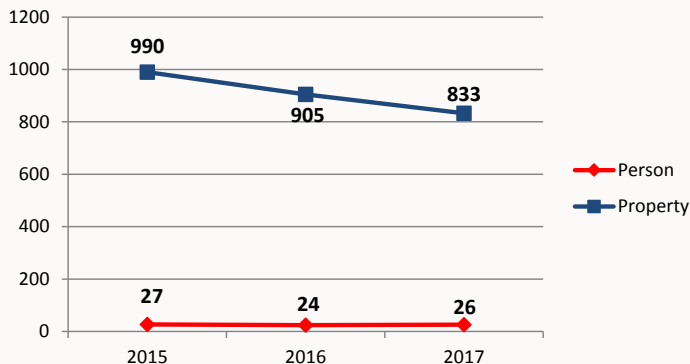

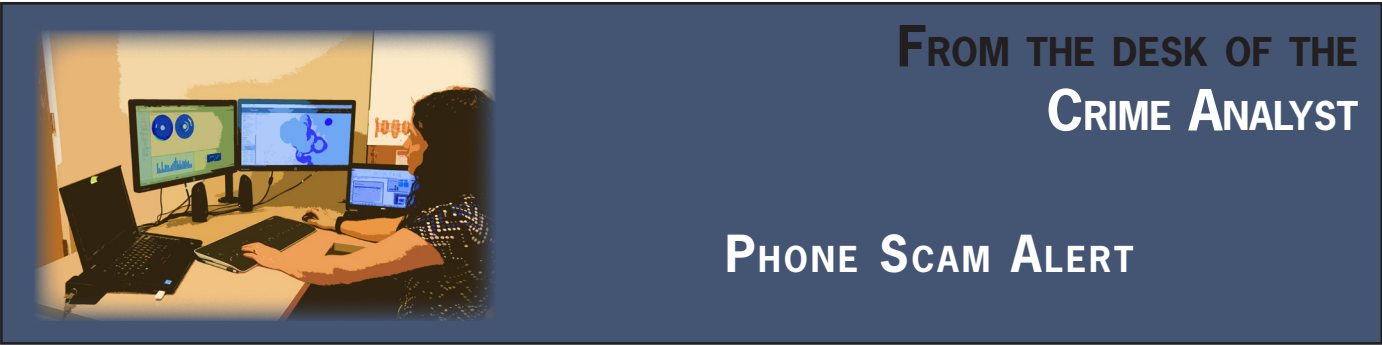

PHONE SCAM ALERT

There has been another phone call scam circulating over the past few weeks, and Castle Rock Police Department wants to ensure that citizens stay informed so they don't become victims of the scam.

In this case, the scammer will call victims claiming to be a deputy or officer for a local law enforcement agency. The scammer will then state the victim has a warrant for their arrest (most will say due to missing jury duty) and that the victim must provide personal information and pay a monetary fee, sometimes in the form of gift cards or prepaid credit cards, in order to take care of the warrant. The scammer has been aggressive in some cases.

Castle Rock PD wants to remind citizens that law enforcement agencies will not contact citizens by phone to alert them of a warrant, nor will they demand payment for the warrants over the phone.

If you receive one of these scam phone calls, do not give out any personal information, do not pay the scammer any money or gift cards, and be sure to write down the phone number of the scammer.

DETECTIVE UNIT

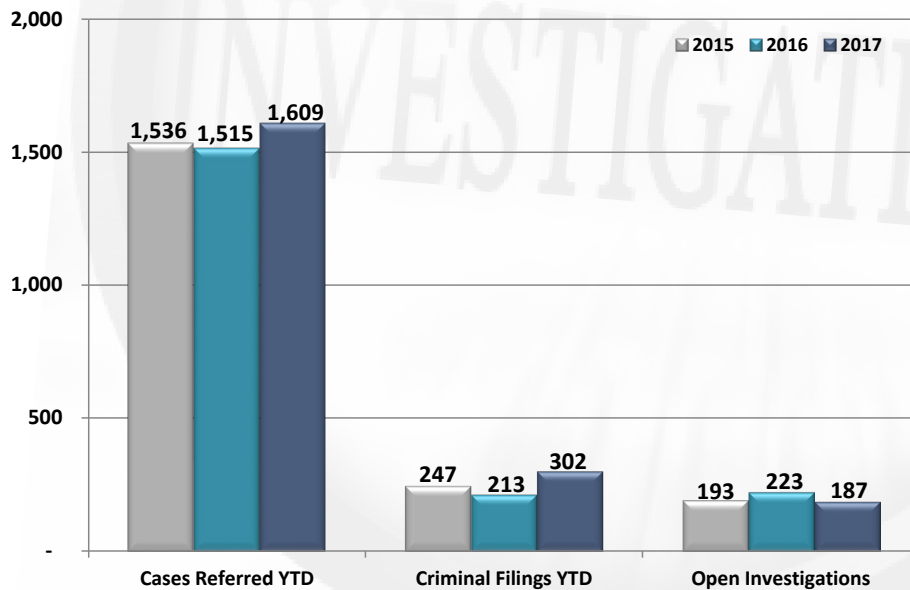

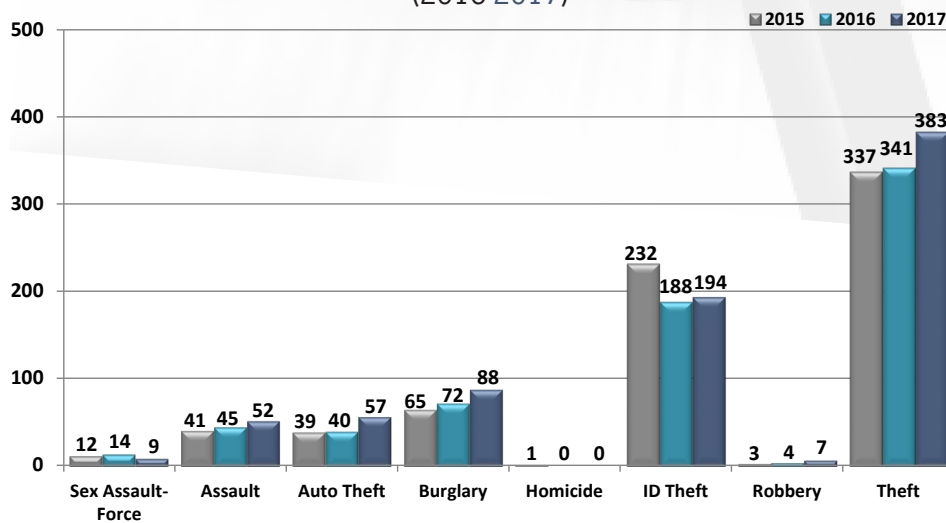

YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: **OCTOBER** (2015-2017)



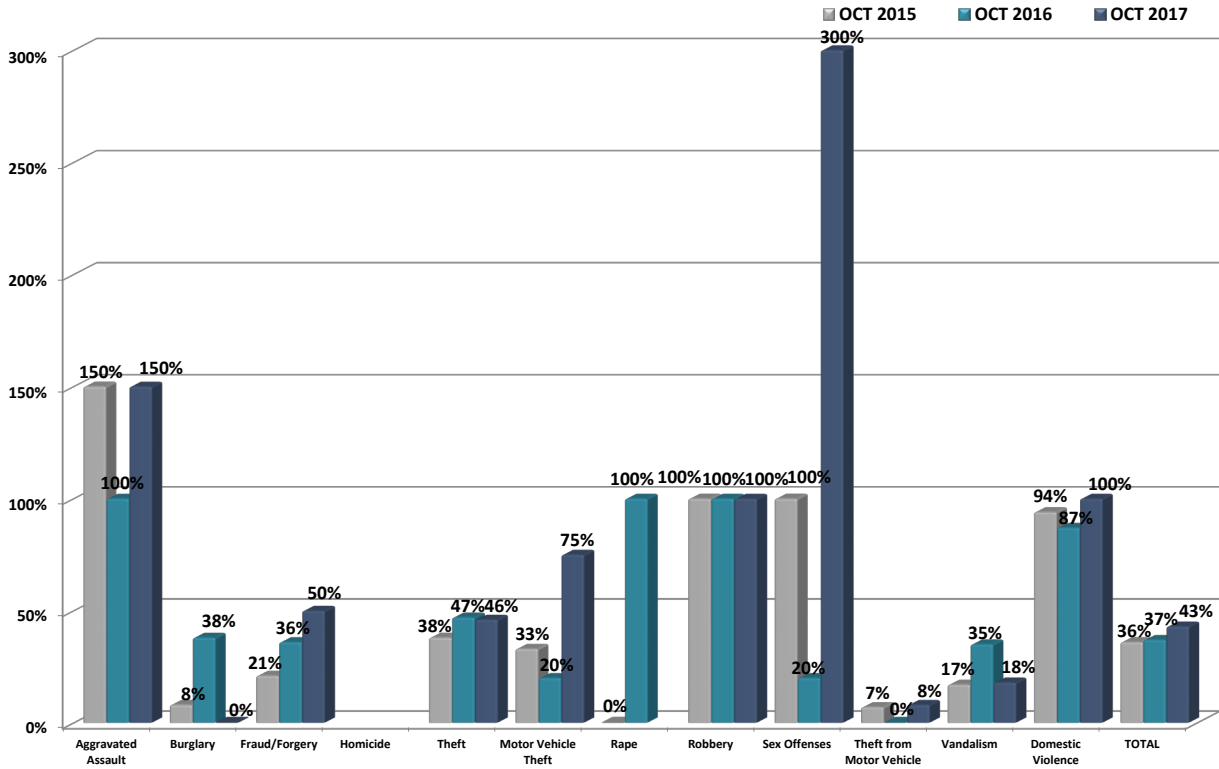
3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: **OCTOBER** (2015-2017)

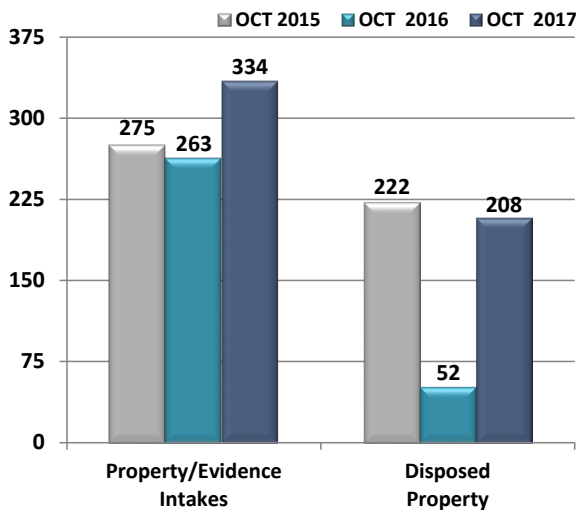
DETECTIVE UNIT CLEARANCE RATES COMPARISON OCTOBER (2015-2017)

PROPERTY INTAKES/DISPOSED OCTOBER (2015-2017)



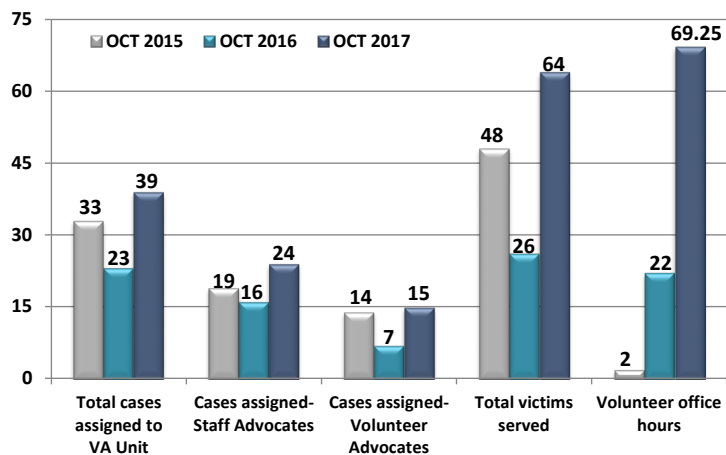

The 29th Annual COVA Conference was held in October. This conference is the largest victim services field conference in the country where participants learn new skills, up-to-date information and laws, and best practices for the victim services field. This year, our keynote speaker was Officer Kerry Lewis. He presented "From Surviving to Thriving: My Journey from Victim to Defender" to an audience of over 900. Officer Lewis shared his story of victimization as a child. He struggled to heal and move forward in the aftermath; his journey led him to the point of empowerment and comfort of sharing his story with others. POST scholarships were provided to Officers Moorhead and Dinges (left), and VA Volunteer Gorrell was provided a COVA scholarship to attend the conference along with VA Coordinator Lewis.

If you were not able to make the event, the department accepts unwanted or expired prescription drugs during normal business hours from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday. This service is free and anonymous, but some items will not be accepted, including needles, mercury thermometers, chemotherapy/radioactive substances, oxygen containers, liquid medicines, pressurized canisters or illicit drugs.

Patrol Deployments / Arrests

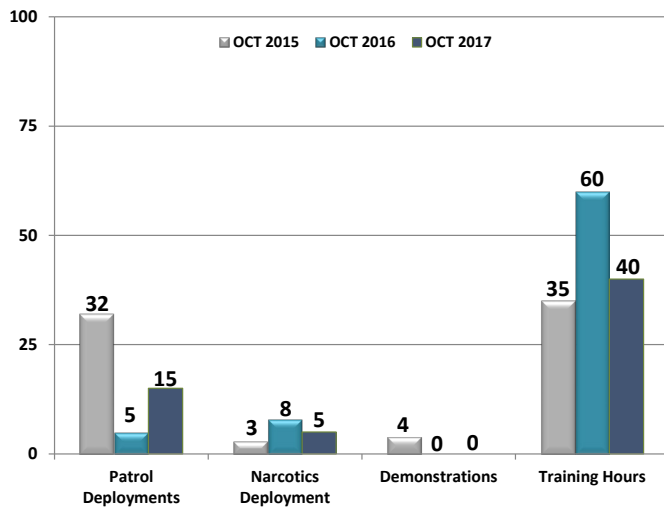

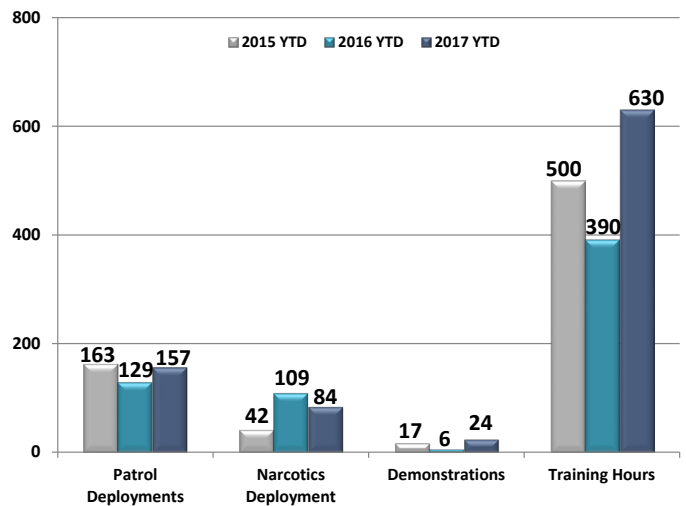

The Bike Unit enjoyed fielding many questions and distributing CRPD goodies. Their presentations were warmly received and appeared to have an educational impact on the children and adults.



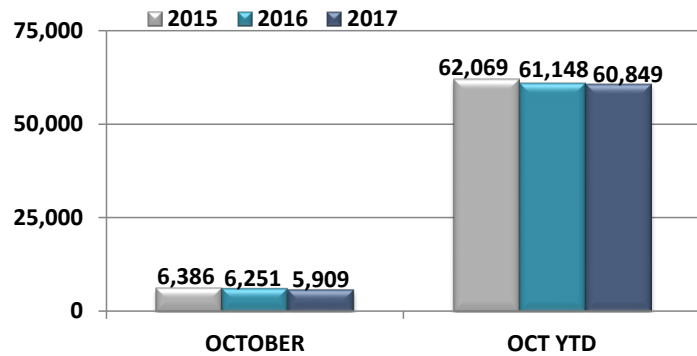

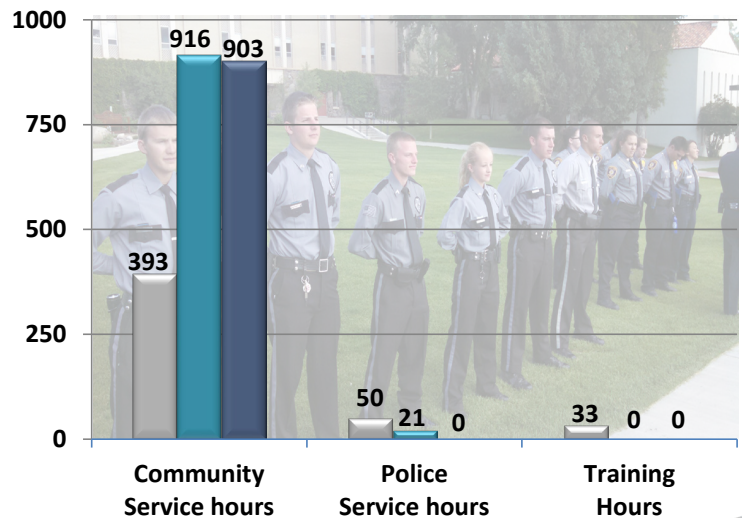
EXPLORER UNIT OCTOBER 2015-2017

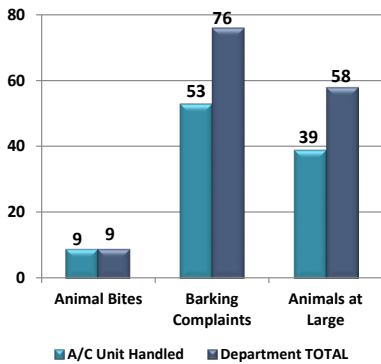
