# DOWNTOWN HISTORIC PRESERVATION GRANTS

TOWN COUNCIL NOVEMBER 7, 2023



#### **DOWNTOWN HP GRANT**

- Goal to support property improvements that maintain historic character of Downtown
  - Town Council approved \$50,000 for program in 2023 Budget
  - Each grant not to exceed \$25,000 of matching funds per project per calendar year
- Eligible projects include exterior work and maintenance of mechanical systems (50%) and roof repair (25%), not interior work
- Grant is a reimbursement after project is constructed and open
- Property receiving grant is encumbered in perpetuity by historic preservation easement to Town

#### **DOWNTOWN HP GRANT**

- Town Council approved grant policy on 11/17/2020
- Two grant rounds per year:
  - 1st round due Feb 1st
  - If funds remaining -2<sup>nd</sup> round due Aug 1<sup>st</sup>
- Historic Preservation Board reviews grants and recommends projects for Town Council decision
- Separate from existing programs:
  - Local Restoration Grant for Landmarked structures in Historic District (\$2,000 per award, funded for up to \$15,000)
  - DDA façade grant program

# CASTLE ROCK CHAMBER FOUNDATION 420 JERRY STREET



- Southeast of Jerry and Fifth St intersection
- Also know as: Christensen House Victoria's House

# CASTLE ROCK CHAMBER FOUNDATION 420 JERRY STREET





- Two-story rhyolite building built around 1889
- Locally landmarked
- Grant request for \$8,210 for roof replacement of main building and carriage house (25% match)

## CANTRIL COURT HOUSE 310 FOURTH STREET



- Southeast of Wilcox and Fourth St intersection
- Originally built in 1890
  by William W. Cantril for
  use as first Douglas
  County Courthouse,
  and moved to this
  location in 1920

## CANTRIL COURT HOUSE 310 FOURTH STREET





- Not locally landmarked, however historically significant
- Grant request for \$7,146 for replacement of 9 second story windows (50% match)

#### **GRANT CRITERIA AND PRIORITIZATION**

- Landmark Designation
  - National or State Landmark take priority over Locally landmarked properties
- Matching funds for an already-awarded State Historic Fund grant or other National grant for historic preservation
- If the property is not landmarked but is in need of restoration/rehabilitation, as determined by the Historic Preservation Board
- Location of building facing Courthouse Square (Douglas County building at 301 N. Wilcox Street, surround by Fourth Street, Wilcox Street, Third Street, and Jerry Street)
- The property is within Downtown Core District
- Owned or leased by a non-profit organization
- The project meets the Secretary of Interior Standards for historic preservation
- The applicant's ability to provide the required matching funds and to complete the project

### **ANALYSIS AND FINDINGS**

- Both grant requests meet the criterion and prioritizations as outlined in the Downtown Historic Preservation Grant Policy.
- The two grants combined total \$15,356 and the 2023 budget available for grants is \$50,000.

### RECOMMENDATION

The Historic Preservation Board voted 4-0 to recommend approval of both grant applications on October 4, 2023.
