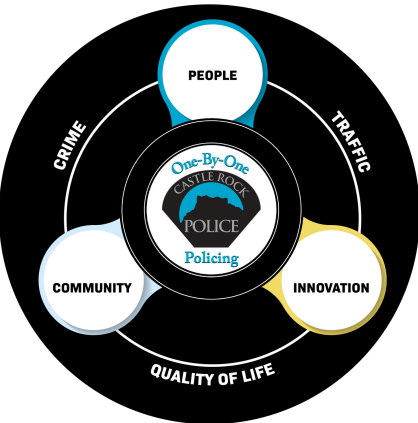
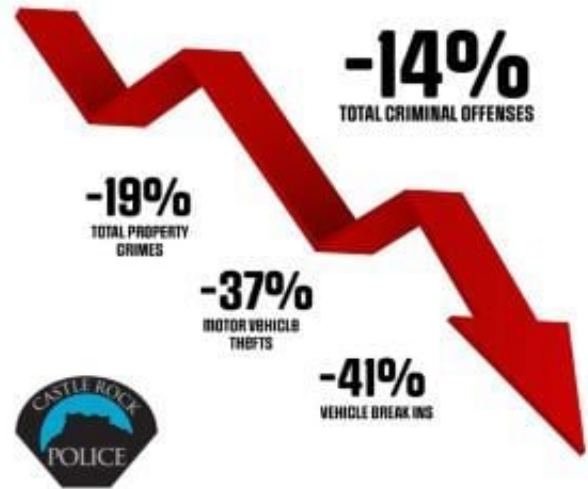

### CRPD Celebrates decrease in overall 2024 crime

The Castle Rock Police Department is celebrating another successful year of fighting crime. Preliminary data shows CRPD saw a significant decrease in property crimes to include motor vehicle thefts and car break-ins in 2024. Overall, CRPD reported a 14% decline in total criminal offenses in 2024 from 2023. This includes a 19% decrease in total property crimes, with persons crimes staying nearly stagnant. Additionally, CRPD saw a 37% decrease in motor vehicle thefts from 2023 to 2024. This is coupled with a 41% decrease in car break-ins for the same time frame. While the one-year results are a great example of the effectiveness of the Police Department, the five-year trend is more notable. During the past five years, the Town's population grew nearly 25% and the calls for service have increased annually. CRPD has leveraged its people with innovative technology to see continued results. That includes 61% decrease in motor vehicle thefts and 74% decrease in car break-ins since 2020. Additionally, persons crimes are down 21% and property crimes down 35% during the same five years.

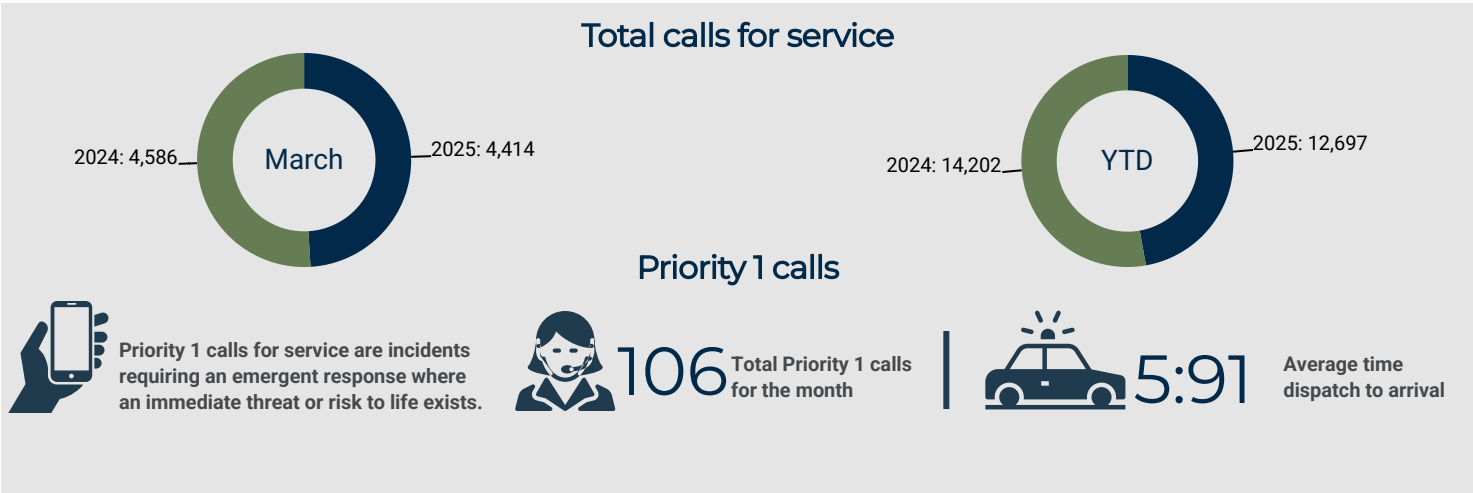

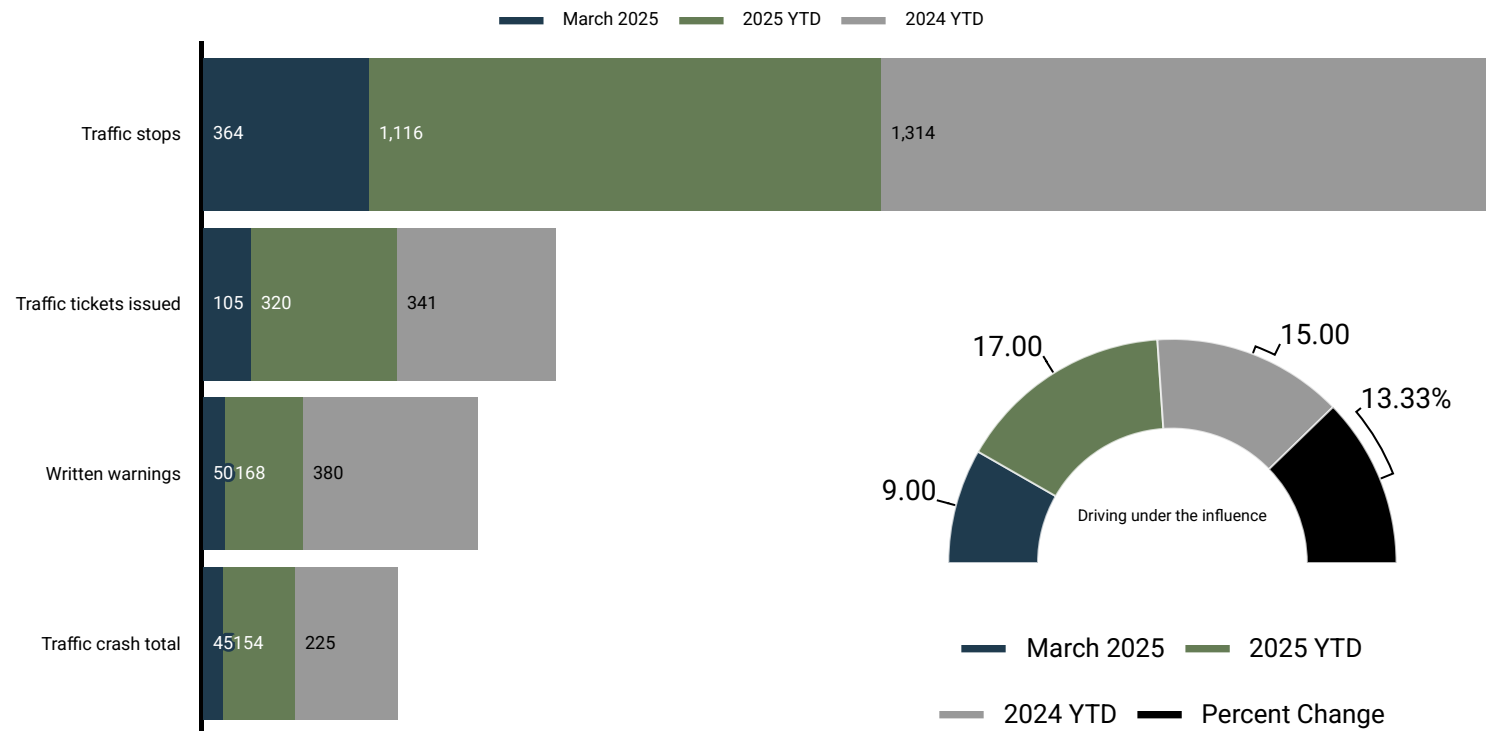

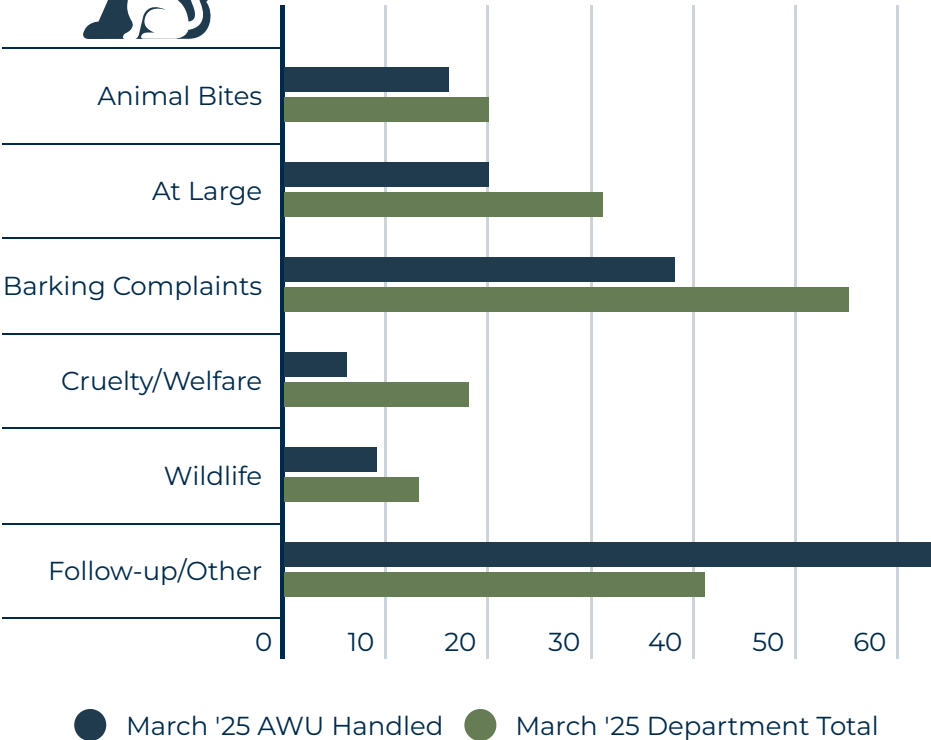

Team: Calls for service

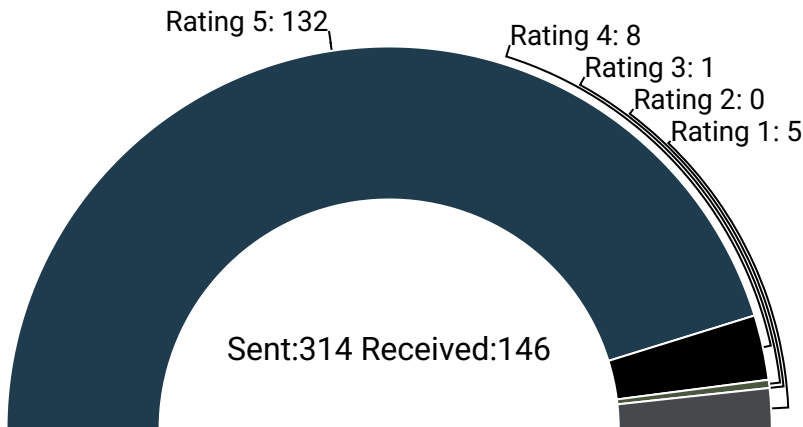


Animal Welfare Unit:
