#### Note

McManus opened the public hearing for DSSK Company Inc dba Interstate 25 Liquors.

The last hearing on August 1 we heard the testimony from the petition circulator for the needs and desires of the neighborhood, from the applicant, and from a citizen objecting to the license that owns the store.

Anderson added that the applicant reposted the public hearing sign.

McManus reminded the applicant that the oath they took on August 1 still continues and asked if the applicant had anything further to add.

The applicant's son read the applicant's testimony. They signed another contract, she had one violation that she regrets and has not had any other violations. The statement was read into the record and given to the Town Clerk as Exhibit A.

Further he read a statement in response to the citizen complaint in regards to selling alcohol to his son.

Randy Sorenson stated that they still sold liquor to his son and the reason he gave up his liquor license to take away that temptation. He has sold a lot of alcohol in the state. He has also witnessed others that are intoxicated that purchased alcohol from them.

McManus swore in David Kim as he wished to make a statement. Mr. Kim is the previous owner of the liquor store. He stated that when they were asked not to sell to individuals that have drinking problems, they stopped selling to them. He displayed a record they keep of when they refuse customers.

McManus asked if the applicant wanted to make any further statement. There were no closing statements.

McManus closed the public hearing.

McManus finds that the applicant is of good morale character and no evidence has been presented to show otherwise. The needs and desires of the neighborhood has been met. All state and local requirements have been met. He noted one conviction on the record for selling alcohol to a minor. Further, there are no police records to support any issue with violations. McManus granted the liquor license and closed the hearing.
