

RESULTS OF 2023 COMMUNITY SURVEY



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Introduction



Background and Objectives

Home to more than 80,000 residents, the Town of Castle Rock provides police, fire and rescue, parks and recreation, development, public works, and water services to residents, as well as general government services of communications, facilities, finance, human resources, innovation and technology, and municipal court system. Beginning in 2011, the Town has conducted a biennial survey of residents and businesses to gauge local attitudes. The survey is intended to collect statistically reliable data that represents all Castle Rock residents, as well as reaching out to all businesses.

The 2023 Community Survey was built on the previous research efforts but was modified to address the changing environment for conducting market research and the changing needs of the Town. The survey provides insights into...

- Perceived quality of life in Castle Rock and the extent to which residents and businesses believe the Town provides high-quality services, is headed in the right direction, and delivers value for the tax dollars paid.
- Use and perceptions of Town services (public safety, roads and public works, water, parks and recreation).
- Community character.

The 2023 Community Survey was conducted February 9th to April 5th, 2023.

Methodology: Resident Survey

The methodology used an address-based sample, similar to the approach used since 2015. However, rather than taking a sample of 12,000-15,000 households, all households within the Town were invited to participate in the survey.

The sample frame was composed of a list of all addresses in Castle Rock—as defined by a shape file—including those indicating that post office boxes are the only way they get mail. All addresses in this area were matched against a comprehensive database to determine if the household had a matching landline or cell phone number. Additionally, email addresses were appended where possible.

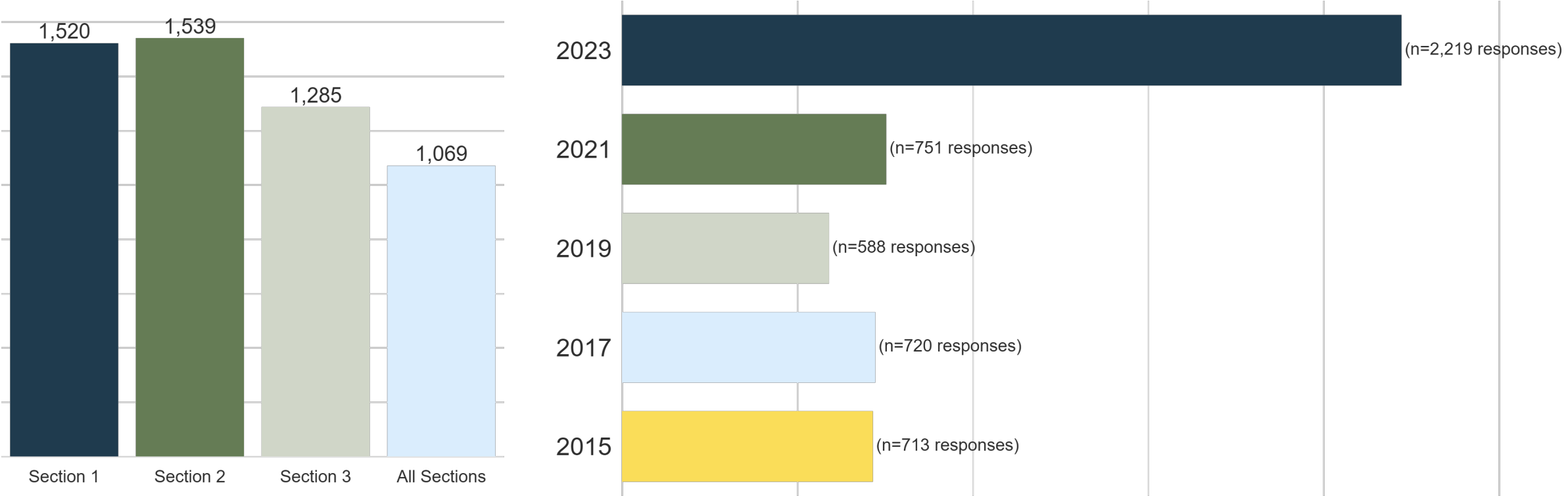
1. All households received a postcard inviting them to participate in the survey. The postcard had a brief description, a call to action, and a short URL and QR code. Postcards also had a one-time use access code.
2. Households with an email address: All households with an email address were sent an email inviting them to complete the survey online.
3. Finally, all households where cell phones were appended were sent a text message with an invitation.

Invitations were staggered into three waves with roughly 1/3 of the households being invited to participate during each wave.

Who we Spoke to

In all 2,219 residents completed at least one survey section.
Of those, 1,069 residents completed all three survey sections.

Unlike previous years, the 2023 survey was conducted in three waves. Some respondents completed all waves, while others completed only one, and others left the survey unfinished. The number of responses recorded was much higher than in previous years, as was the number of respondents who completed all three waves.



Questionnaire Design

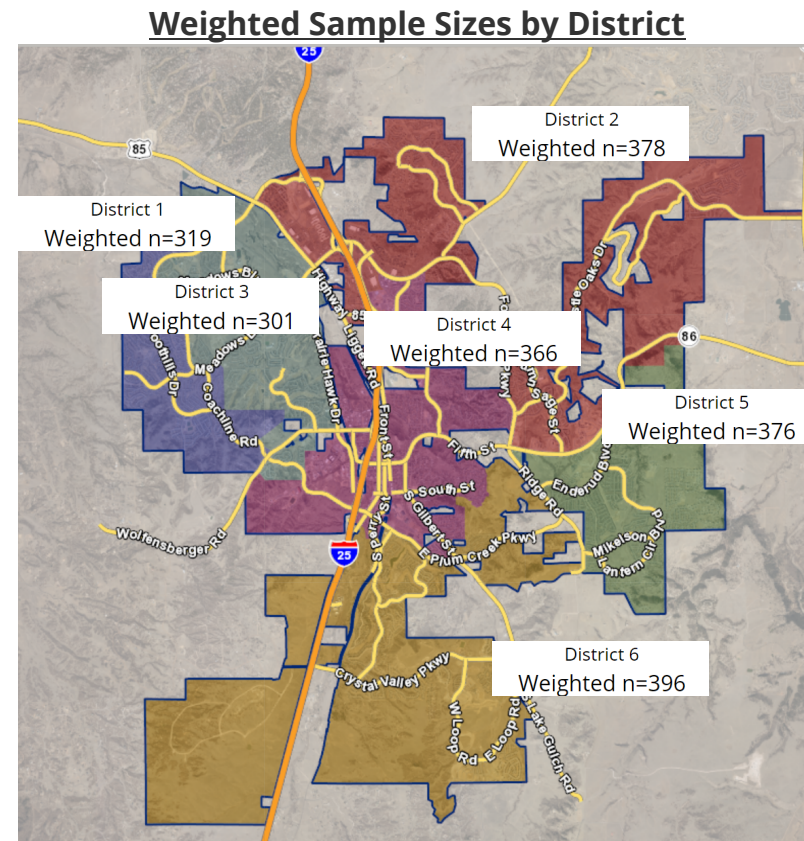
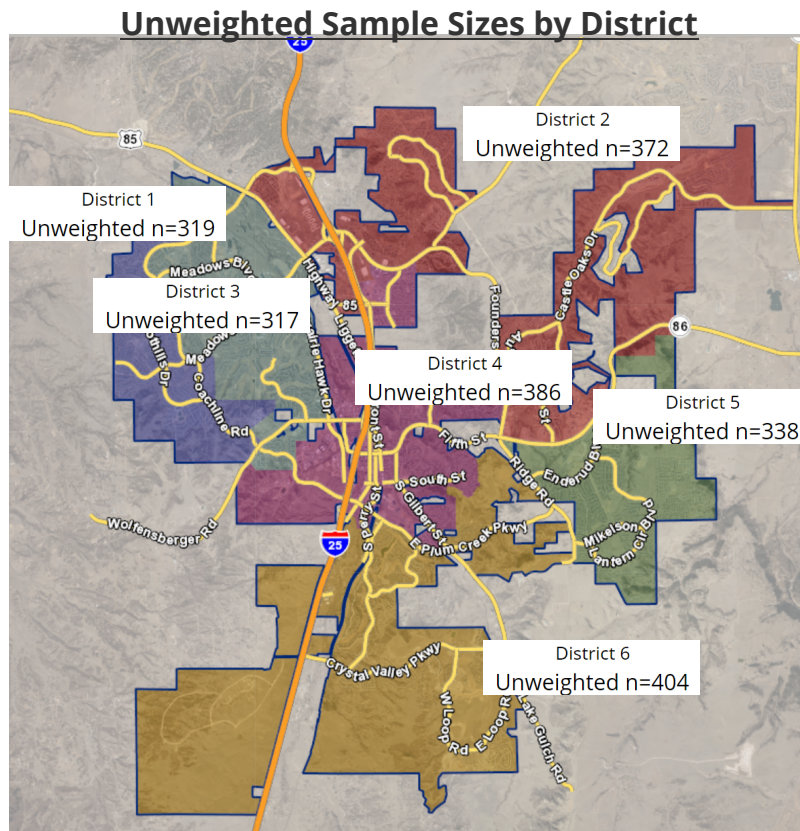
The questionnaire design process began with a careful review of previous questionnaires. While key measures were retained, some questions were dropped or revised to provide higher-quality data. The survey was split into three waves, with the total average survey time running 21 minutes. Questions were regarding:

- Castle Rock as a Place to Live
- Community Character
- Police and Safety
- Fire and Emergency Medical Services
- Public Works
- Castle Rock Water
- Parks and Recreation
- Strategic Priorities
- Planning for Growth
- Communications and Media
- Special Topics
- Demographics

Town Council was given the opportunity to review the questions and approved the questionnaire in December 2022.

Geography

In addition to analysis by key demographic segments, the analysis looks at differences in results by each of the Town's six council districts. The left map below shows the total unweighted number of surveys completed from each district, and the right map shows the total weighted number of surveys from each district. No weighting was performed by Council District.



Understanding the Data

This report summarizes the major findings of the research for each survey topic overall.

Tables and charts provide supporting data. Unless otherwise noted, column percentages are used. Percentages are rounded to the nearest whole number. Columns generally sum to 100 percent except in cases of rounding. In some instances, columns sum to more than 100 percent due to multiple responses given to a single question; these cases are noted.

Mean values are reported on an 11-point scale where “0” is low and “10” is high. For reporting purposes, the 11-point scale was collapsed into four groups: “Very Satisfied” (10–9), “Somewhat Satisfied” (8–6), “Neutral” (5), “Dissatisfied” (4–0). On some occasions, the “Dissatisfied” group is further split into “Somewhat Dissatisfied” (4–2) and “Very Dissatisfied” (1–0).

Throughout the report, “top box” scores are shown. These are the sum of “very satisfied” and “somewhat satisfied.” In some instances, the sum of the two scores is a percentage greater or less than the sum of the individual scores. This is due to rounding, as the percentages are first summed and then rounded to the nearest whole number. For example, if 12.42 percent are “very satisfied” and 7.3 percent are “somewhat satisfied,” the report will show 12 percent “very” and 7 percent “somewhat” satisfied ($12+7=19$), while the total percent satisfied will be reported as 20 percent ($12.42 + 7.3 = 19.72$, which rounds to 20).

Except as noted, “don’t know” and “refused” responses are counted as missing values and are not included in the reported percentages.

The base for a question may vary depending on answers to previous questions or inclusion in a specific analytical group—for example, residents who have had contact with the police versus those who have not had contact. Unless otherwise noted, the results in this report are based on the final weighted sample data, although actual (unweighted) base sizes are used to determine statistically significant differences and reliability.

The report also identifies differences that are statistically significant. If a difference is large enough to be unlikely to have occurred due to chance or sampling error, the difference is statistically significant. Unless otherwise noted, statistical significance was tested at a 95% confidence levels. A statistically significant difference may not always be practically significant. The differences of practical significance depend on the judgment of the organization’s management.

Benchmarking

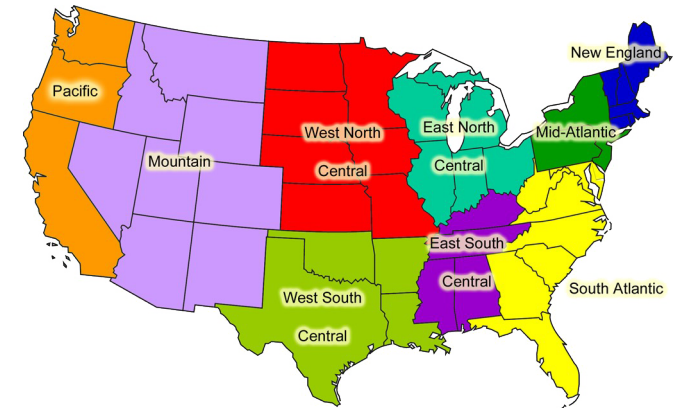
Benchmarking is defined as “the routine comparison with similar organizations of administrative processes, practices, costs, and staffing to uncover opportunities to improve services and/or to lower costs.” [\[1\]](#). Benchmarking enables communities such as Castle Rock to

- Quantify measures of performance
- Quantify differences between community performance and best practices
- Encourage focus on outcomes rather than simply performance

The sample for the benchmarking data consists of over 2,400 randomly selected households from across the United States. The sample was not designed to gather a specific number of completed surveys from a select number of cities. Therefore, there is no specific list of benchmark cities to which to compare. Benchmarking is performed against individuals residing in specific geographic areas.

For benchmarking, Castle Rock results for key questions are compared to:

- All respondents nationwide,
- Respondents living in other 3.5-Star communities, as well as those in 4.0-Star communities,
- Respondents in the Mountain census division (Colorado, Utah, New Mexico, Arizona, Nevada, Wyoming, Montana), and
- Respondents living in cities of similar sizes (between 50,000 and 100,000 residents).



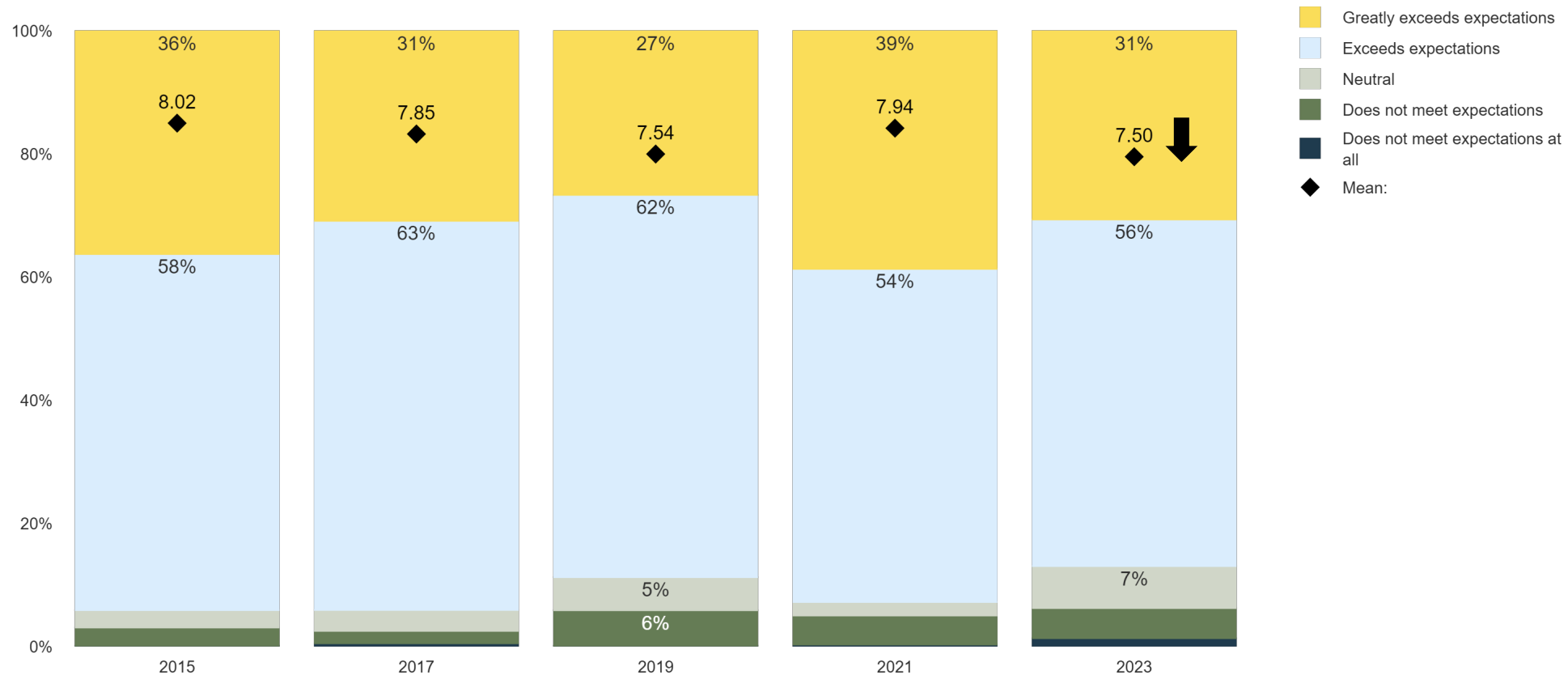
Note, benchmarking is only available on questions in this survey that match NWRG’s benchmarking survey data. The 2021 Castle Rock Survey contains questions that are unique to the Town and cannot be benchmarked.

5-Star Rating



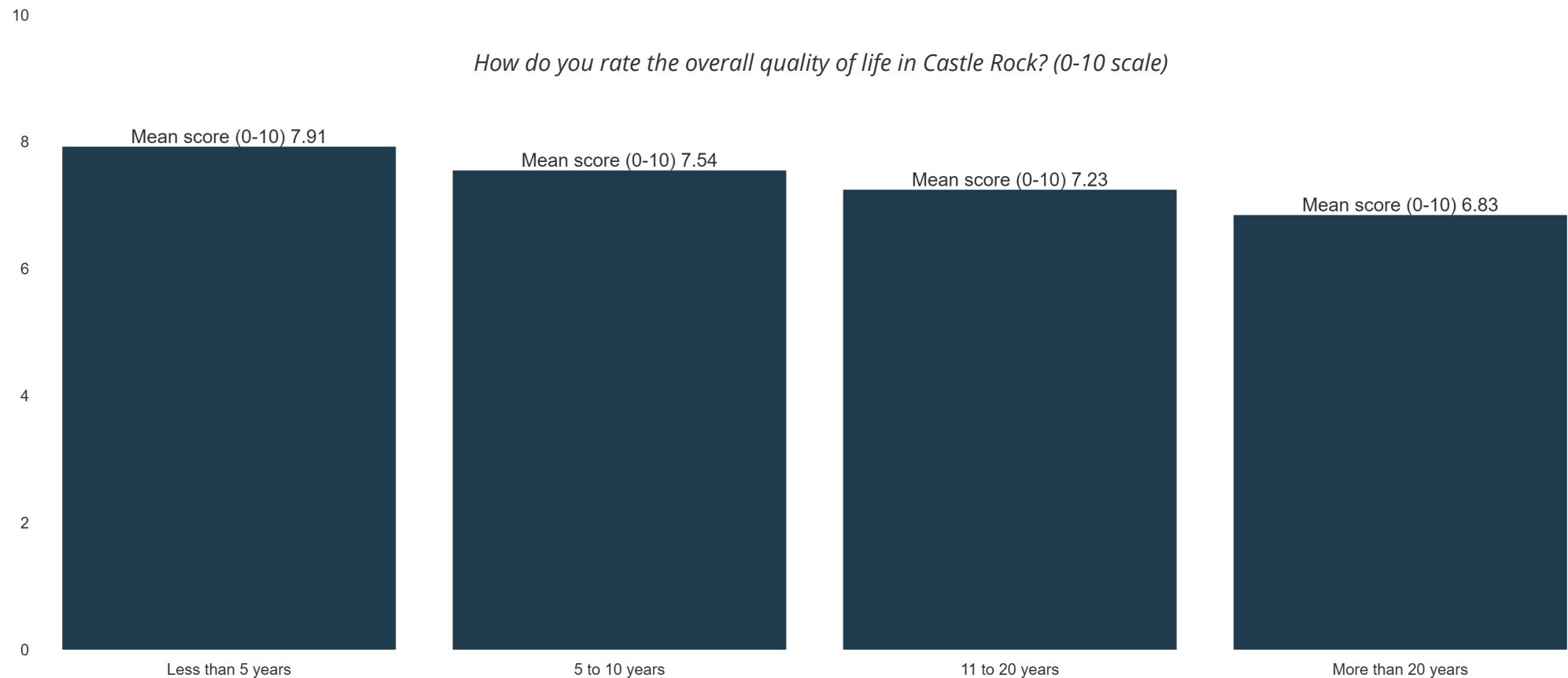
Overall Quality of Life

Nearly 9 out of 10 respondents believe the quality of life exceeds their expectations. About 3 out of 10 say the quality of life greatly exceeds their expectations. After seeing an improvement in ratings between 2019 and 2021, the overall rating and percent giving the highest ratings (greatly exceeds expectations) decreased in 2023, returning to near 2019 levels. This is consistent with findings in other cities.



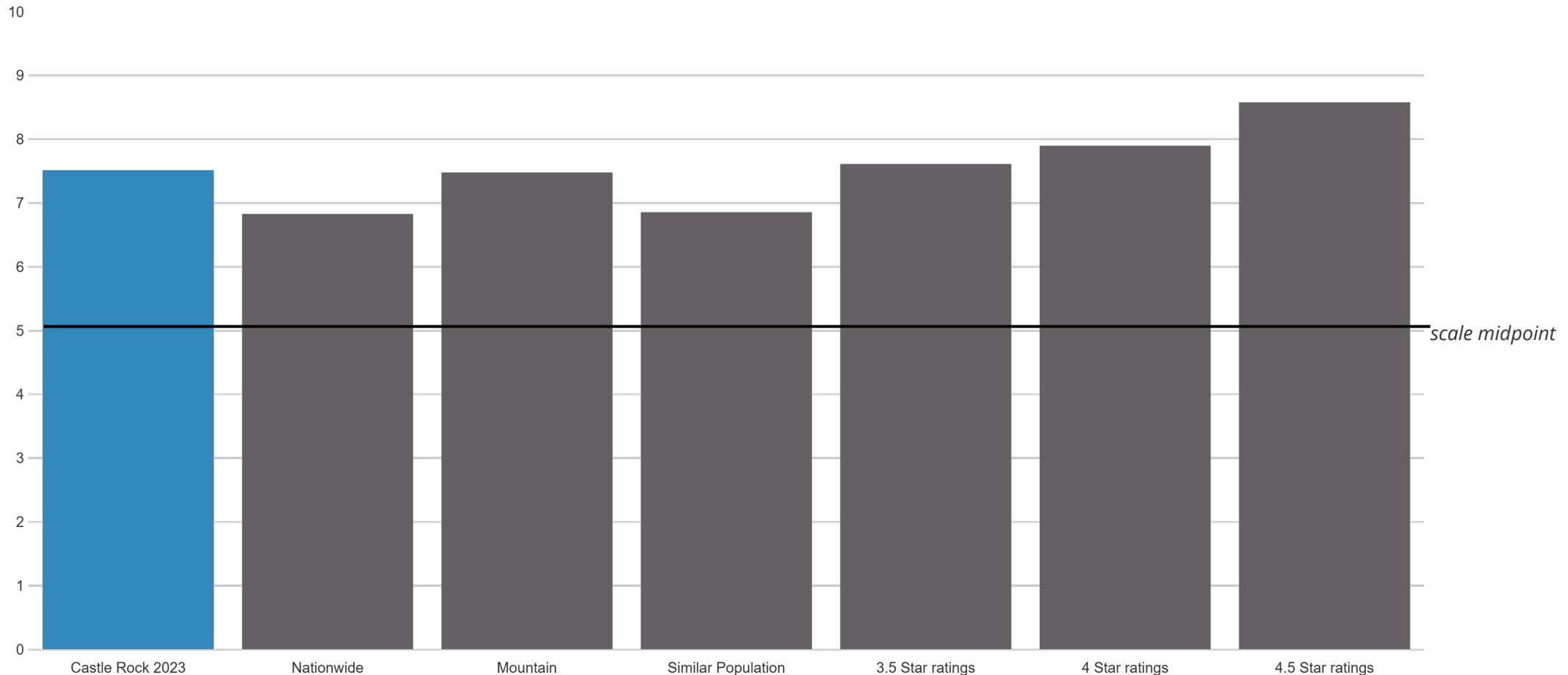
Overall Quality of Life Comparisons

Nearly nine out of ten respondents believe the quality of life exceeds or greatly exceeds their expectations. Ratings for the overall quality of life among new (<5 years) respondents are significantly higher than ratings from all other respondents. Ratings from 5-10 year respondents are higher than ratings from >10 year respondents.



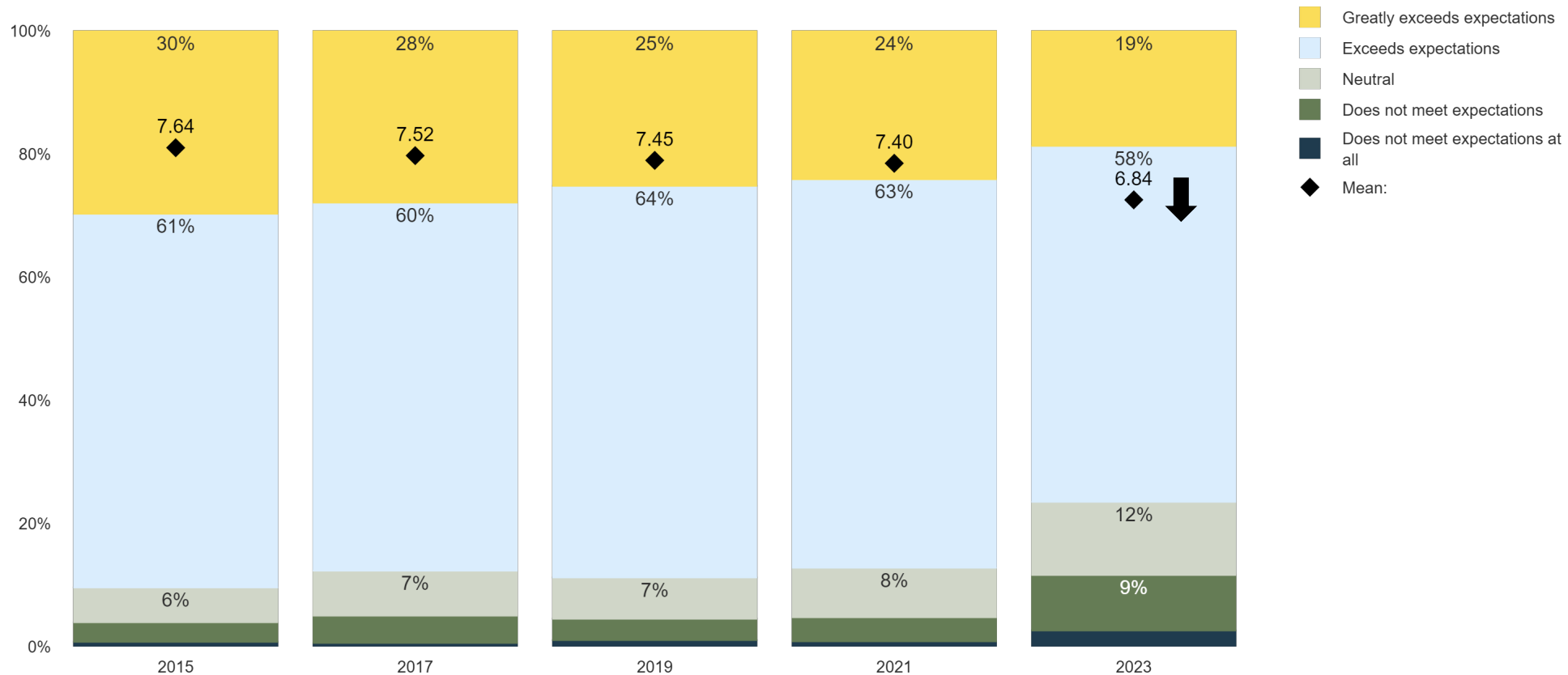
Quality of Life Benchmarking

Castle Rock scores similar to cities with 3.5-Star ratings and other Mountain region communities.



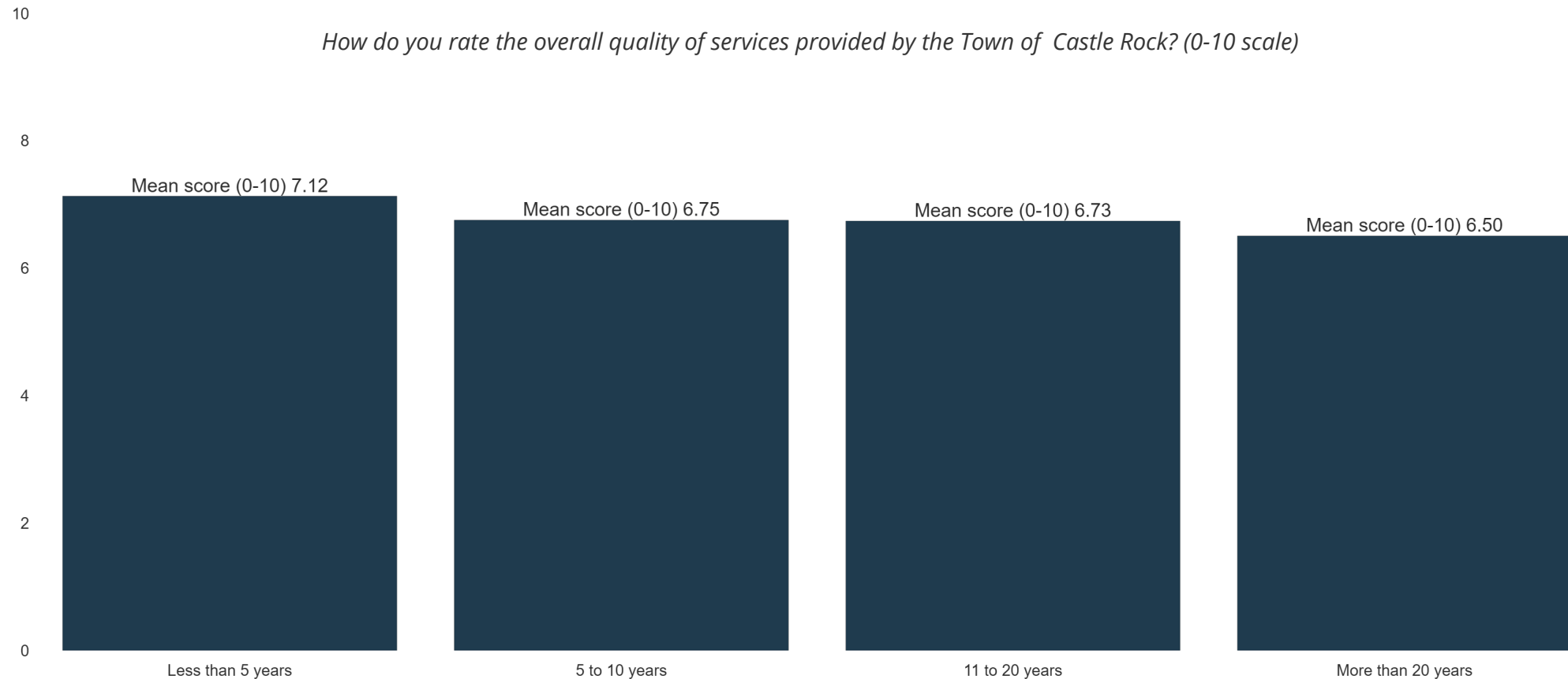
Quality of Town Services

In 2023, just over three-quarters of respondents said that the quality of Town services exceeds or greatly exceeds expectations. However, this rating declined significantly since 2021.



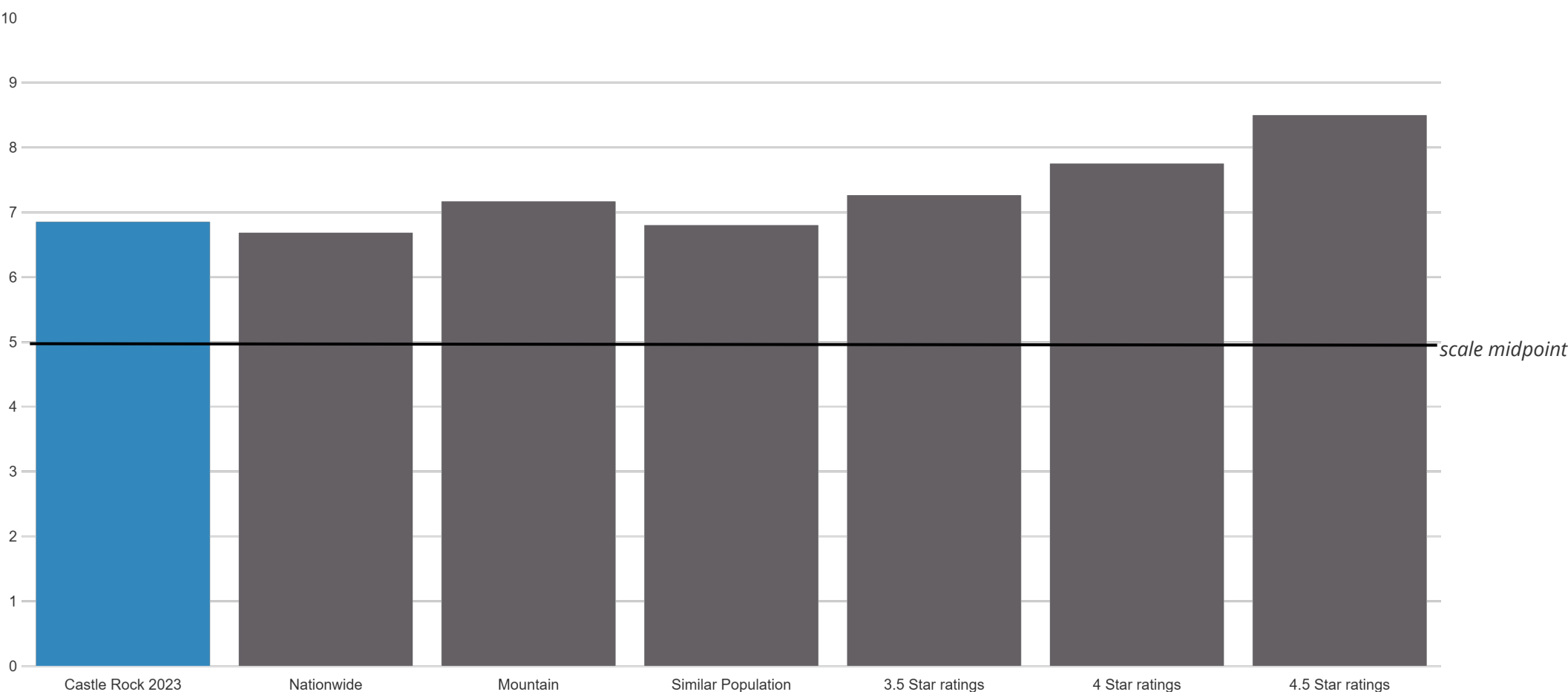
Quality of Services Comparisons

While the overall rating is above the midpoint (5), longtime residents rate the quality of services significantly lower than those living in Castle Rock for 10 years or less.



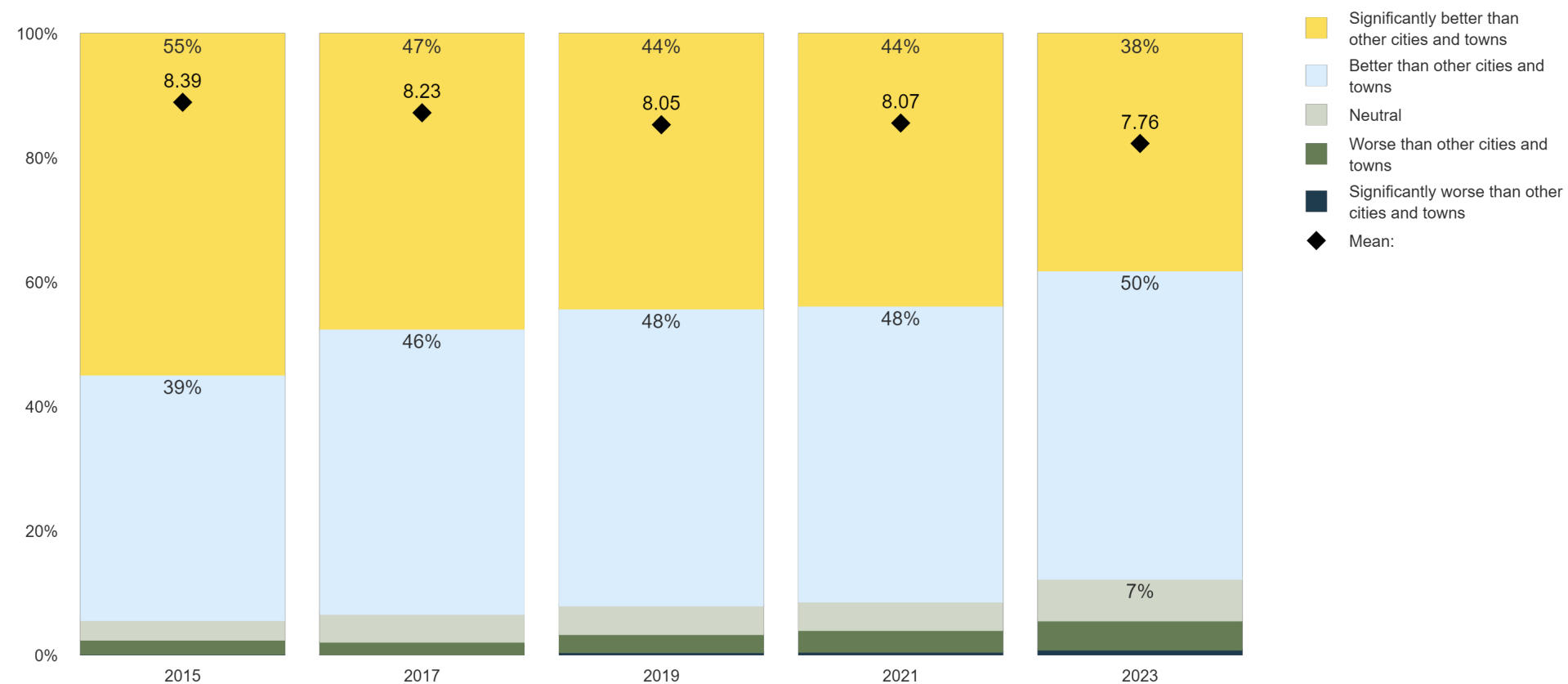
Quality of Services Benchmarking

Castle Rock scores similar to cities with similar populations and to national benchmarks.



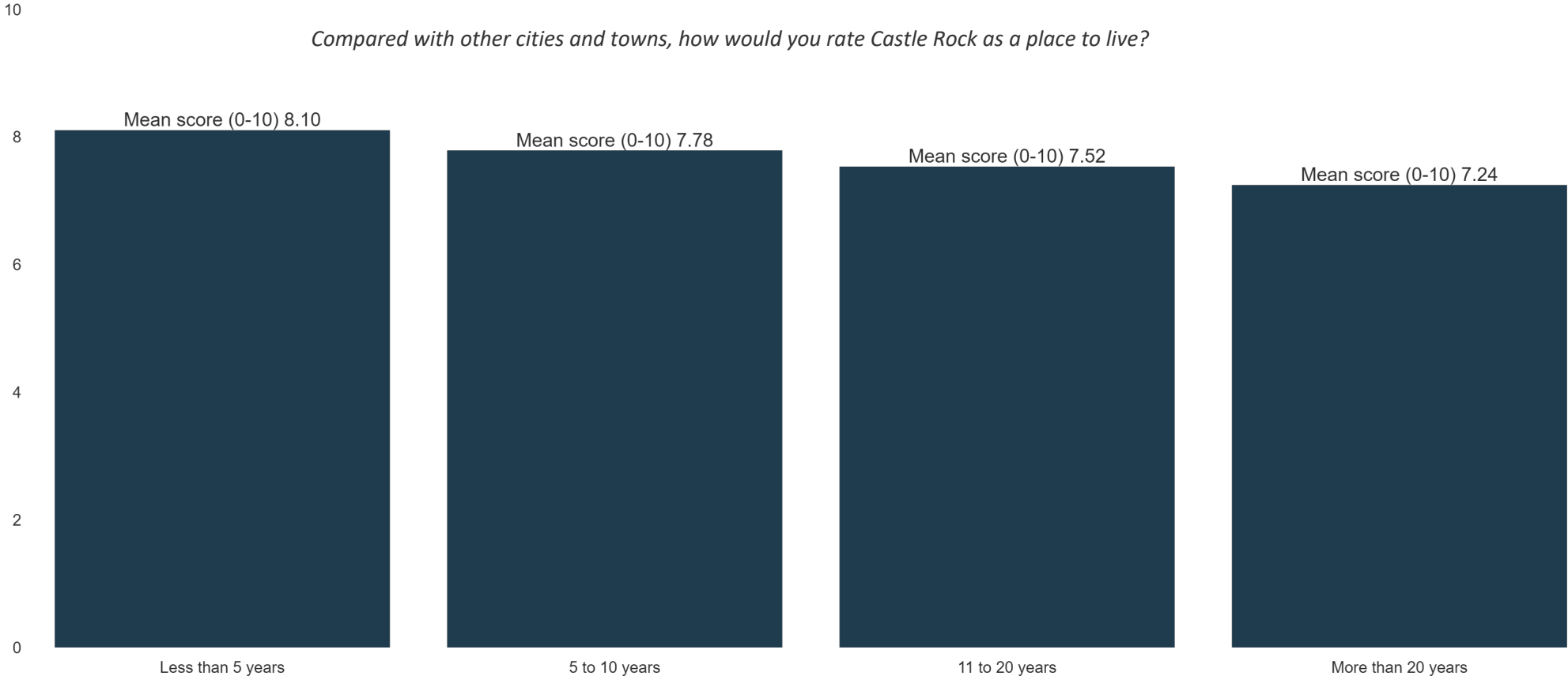
Comparability to Other Communities

Nearly 9 in 10 respondents rate Castle Rock as a better or significantly better place to live than other communities. The the mean rating has decreased slightly between 2021 and 2023, but is still within the margin of error.



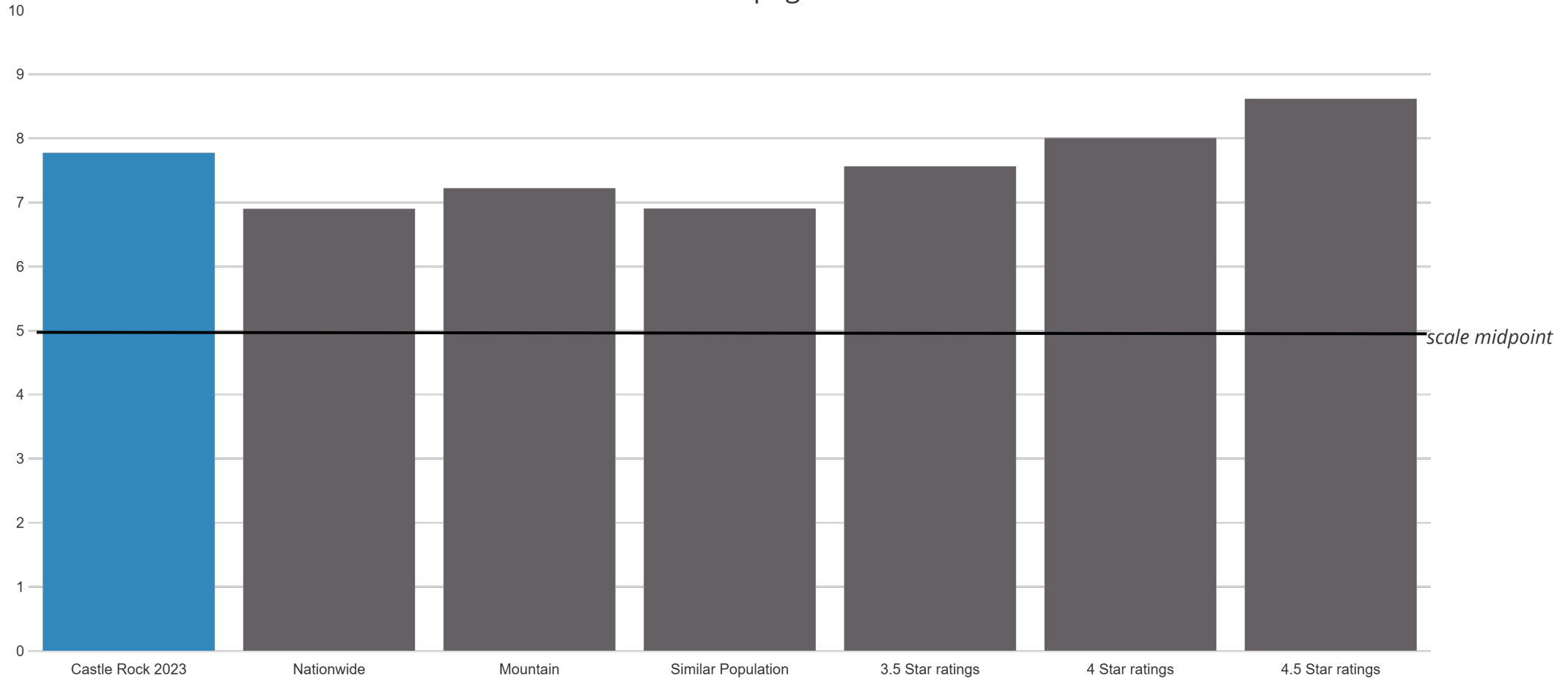
Comparability Comparisons

Nearly 9 in 10 respondents rated Castle Rock as a better or significantly better place to live than other communities. Ratings are related to length of residency. Respondents who have lived in Castle Rock for 10 years or less rate the Town as a better place to live (compared to other cities/towns) than 11+ year respondents.



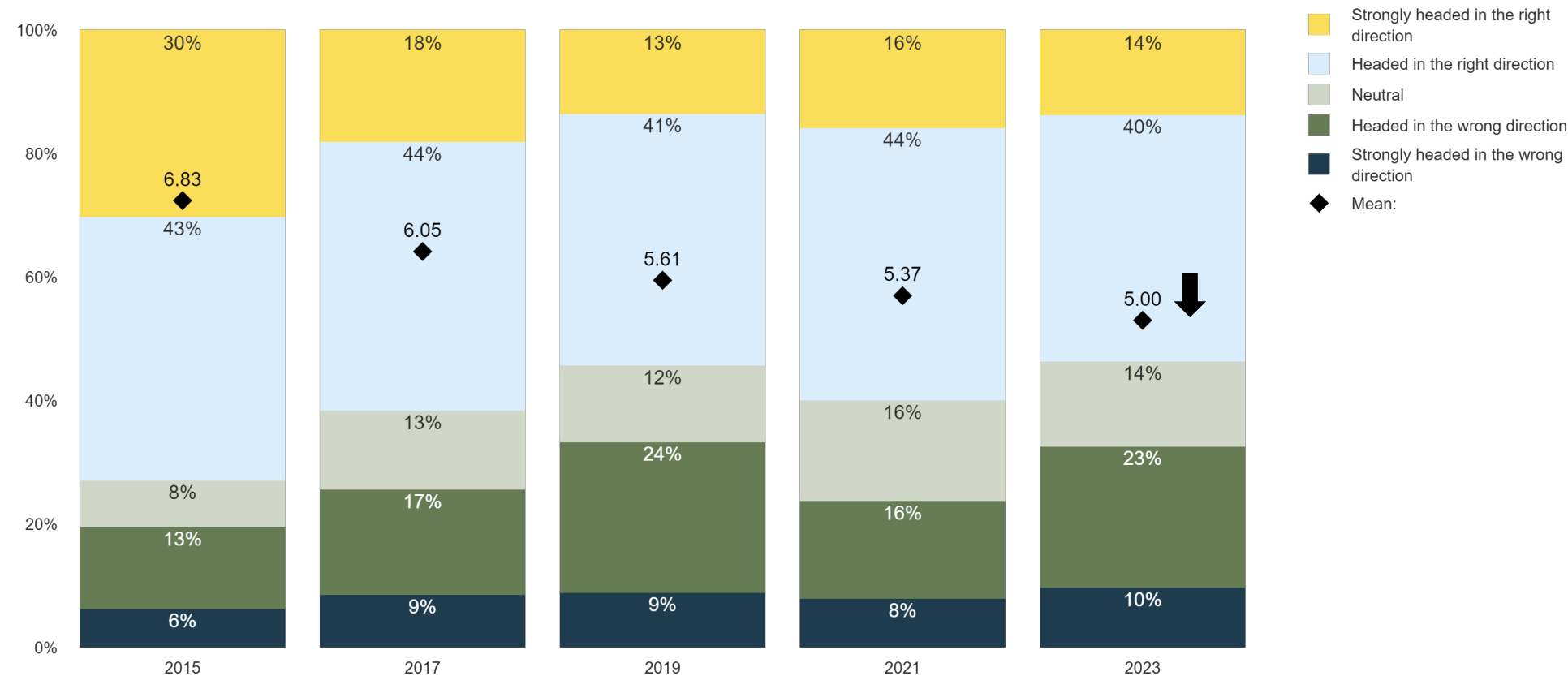
Comparability Benchmarking

Castle Rock scores similar to cities with 3.5 to 4-Star ratings and outperforms several benchmarks on this page.



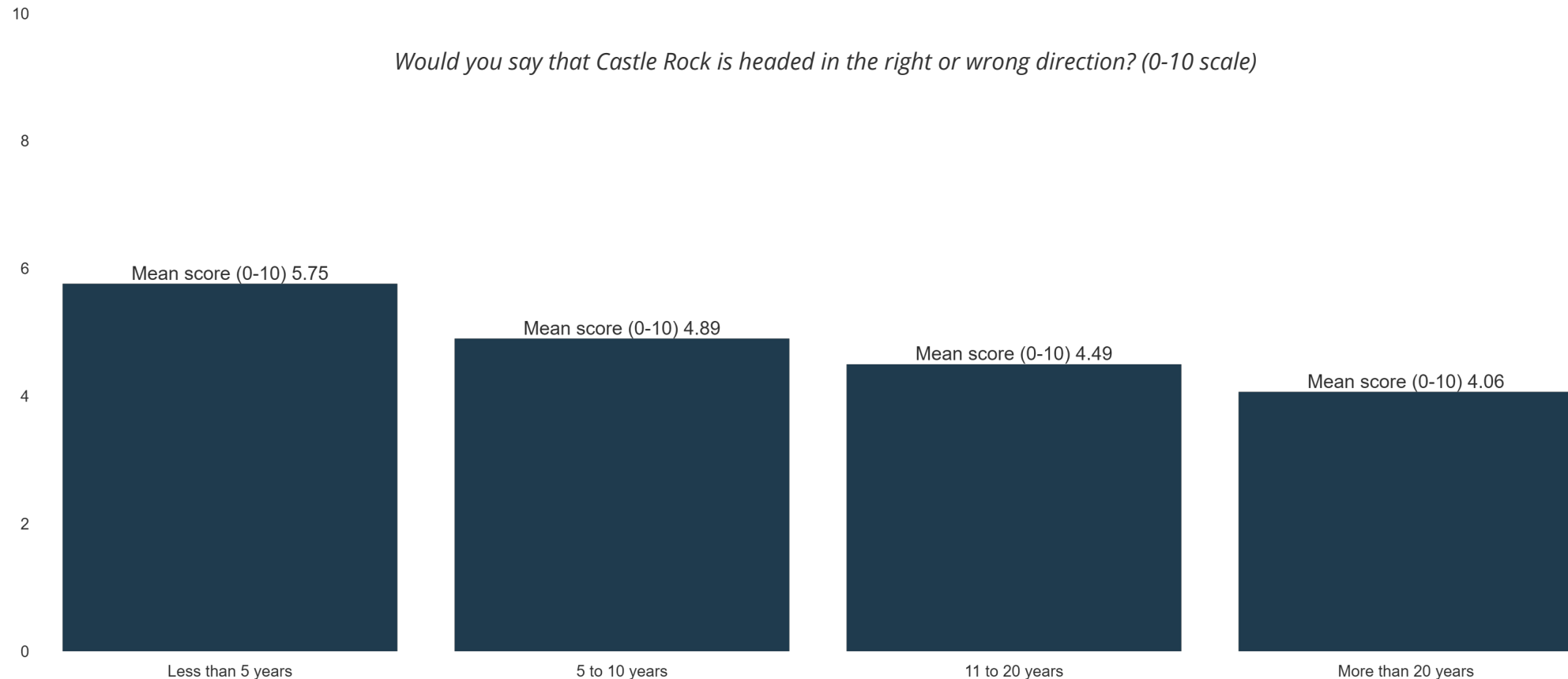
Direction Town is Headed

Just over half of Castle Rock respondents feel the Town is headed in the right direction. Ratings (as measured by the mean) have decreased year over year since the 2015 baseline.



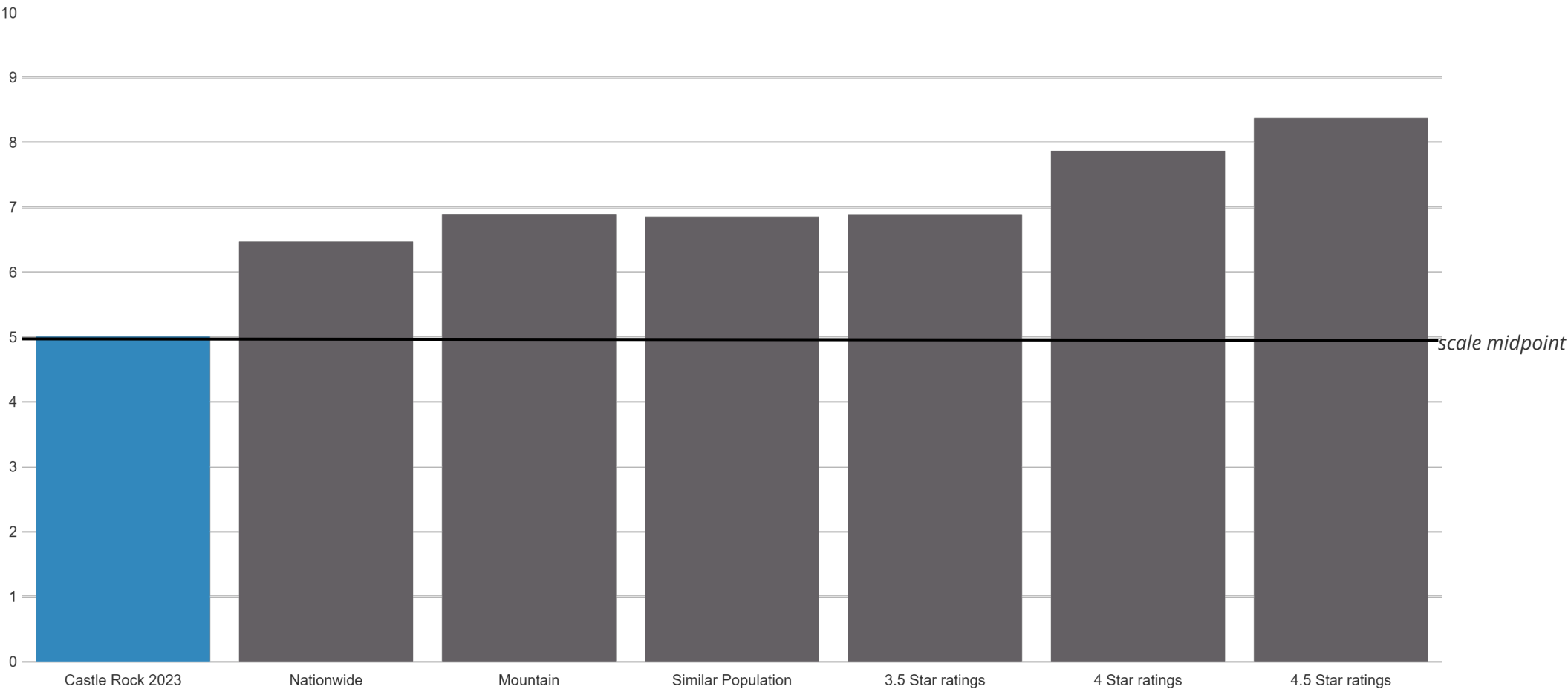
Direction Headed Comparisons

Residents who have lived in Castle Rock for four years or less say that the Town is headed in the right direction more than other groups. Castle Rock residents of 5-10 years ranked the direction the Town is headed higher than 11+ year residents, who gave the lowest score.



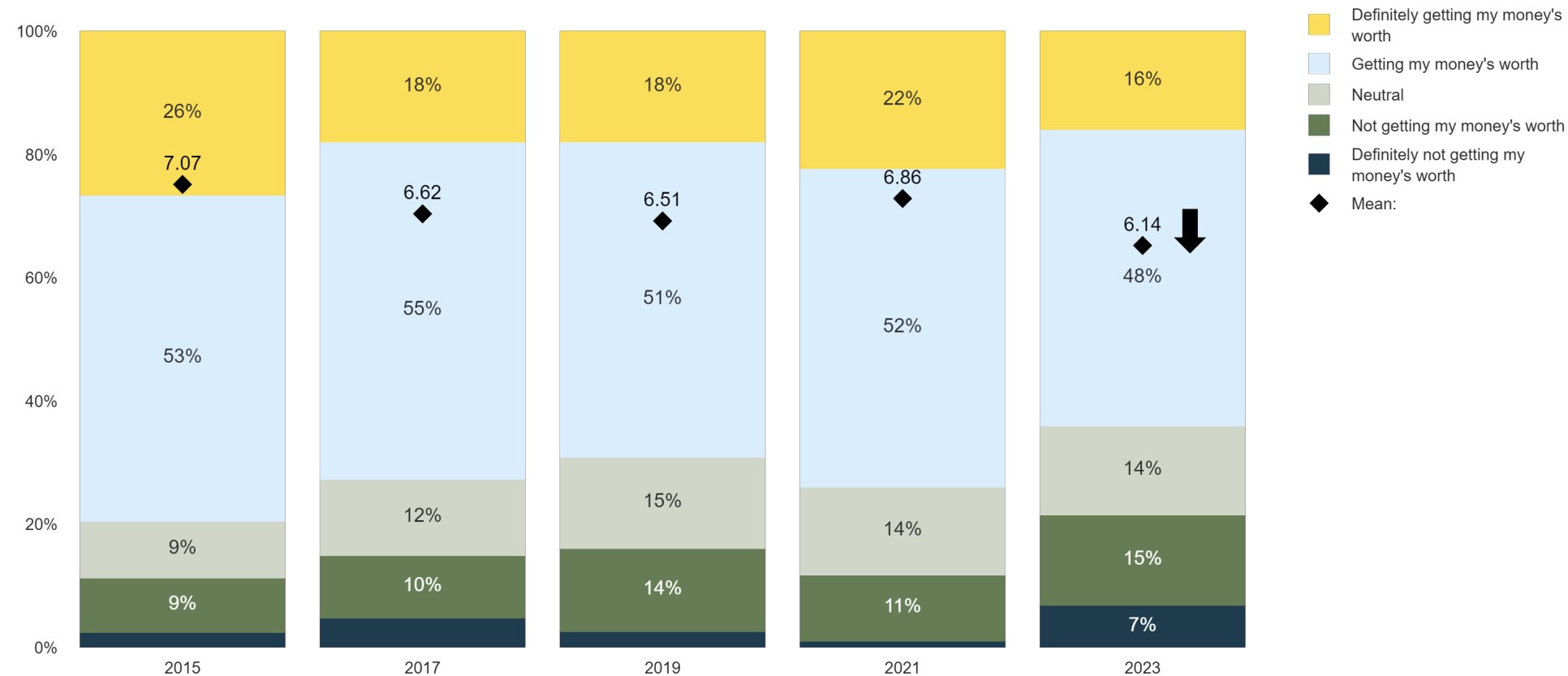
Direction Headed Benchmarking

Castle Rock scores below benchmarks regarding the direction Castle Rock is headed.



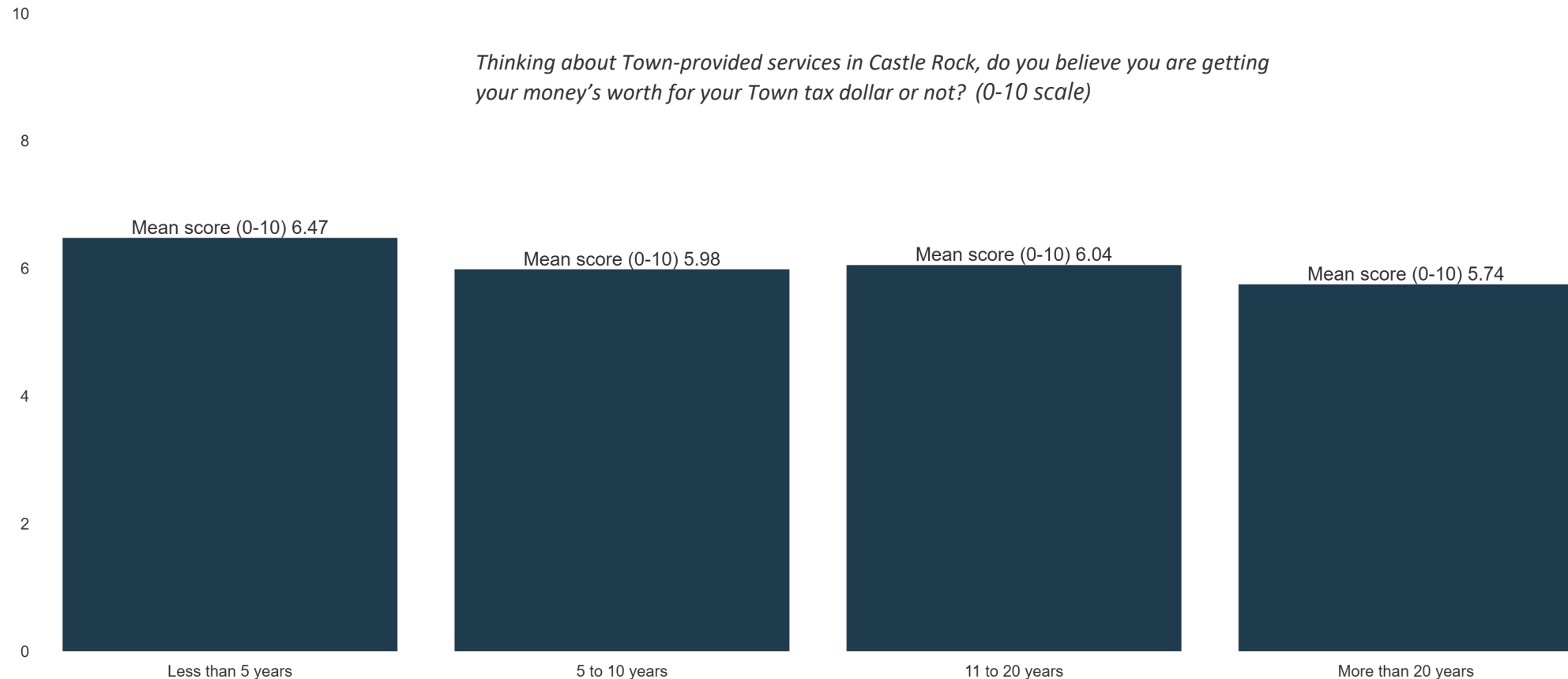
Value for Tax Dollars Paid

Nearly two thirds of respondents say they are getting their money's worth for their tax dollars. The average rating for value is at its lowest level since the 2015 baseline. Nearly one out of four respondents feel they are not getting their money's worth.



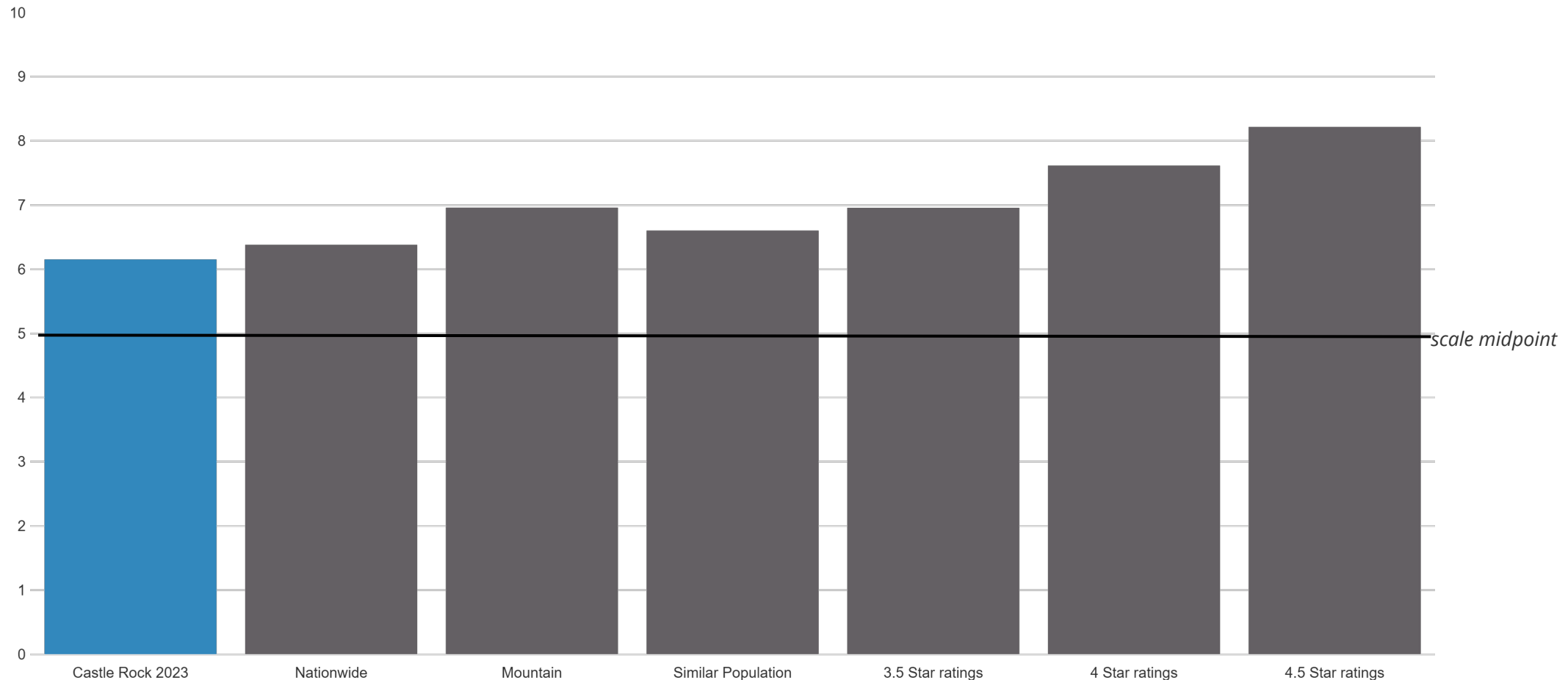
Value for Taxes Comparison

Residents who have lived in Castle Rock for less than five years are significantly more satisfied with the value of their tax dollars than residents of 20+ years. Satisfaction with tax value was not significantly different between residents of 5-20 years and the newest or longest-standing residents.



Value for Taxes Benchmarking

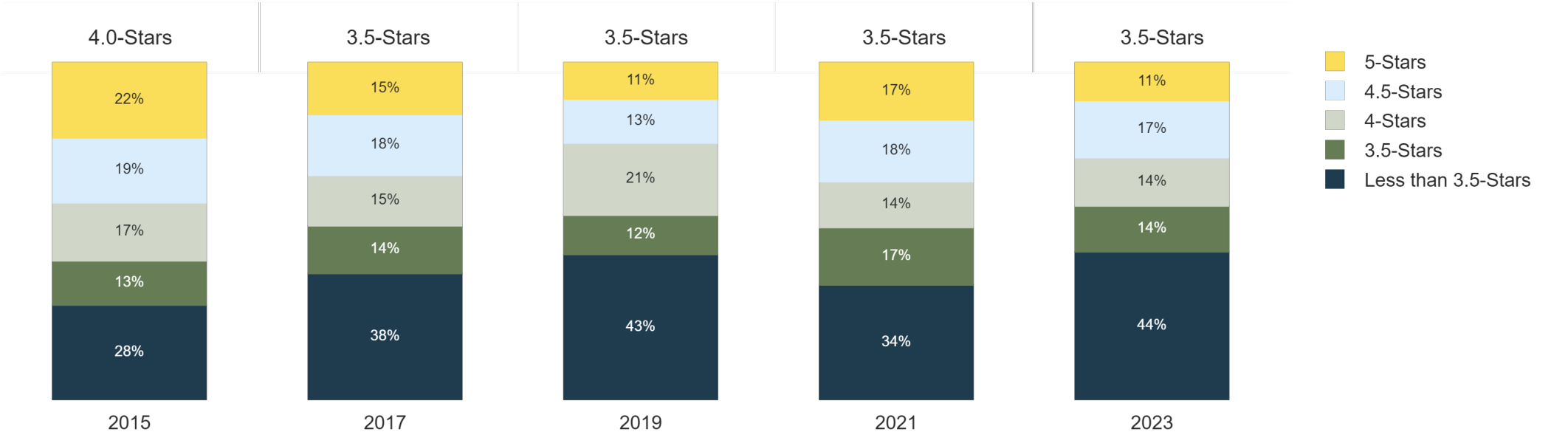
Castle Rock scored close to national benchmarks regarding value of services for tax dollars paid.



Castle Rock's Star Rating



Castle Rock received a 3.5-star rating in 2023. The changes seen in the rating distributions from 2017 to 2023 are within the margin of error, meaning that they are not significant.



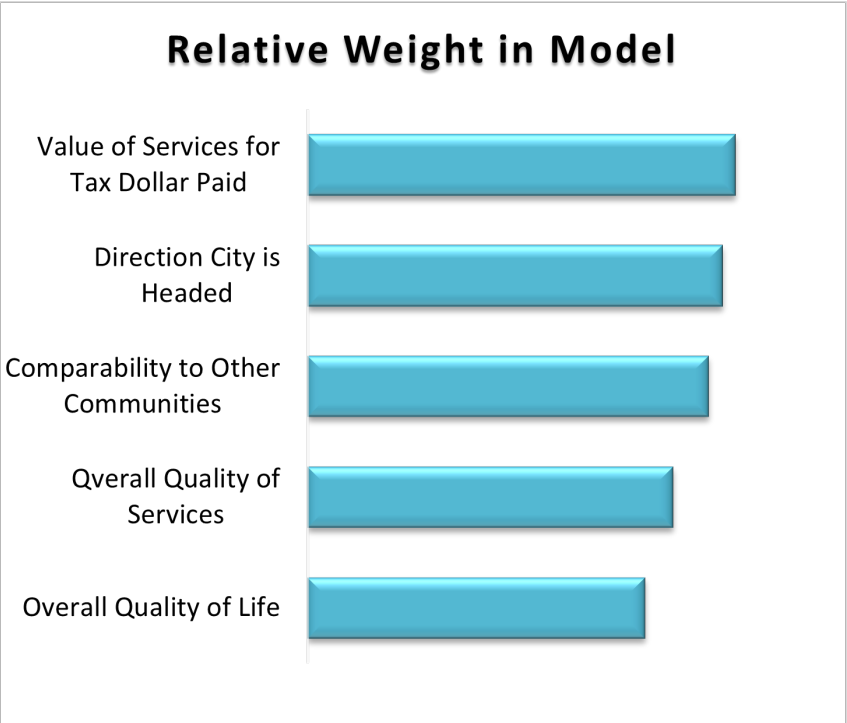
About the 5-Star Rating

ComEngage’s community research programs include a robust theoretical and mathematical index, a 5-Star Rating, that provides a measure of the overall quality of governance and vision. The 5-Star Rating is a composite index that captures the essence of residents' perceptions of their quality of life and how well the governing agency meets their critical needs and expectations. The rating is computed using the weighted sum of five questions:

- 1. Overall quality of life,
- 2. Overall quality of city services,
- 3. Perceived comparability to other communities (*that is, "is Castle Rock seen as better or worse than other communities?"*),
- 4. Direction the community is headed, and
- 5. Perceived value of services for tax dollars paid.

Each question is given a relative weight based on proprietary analysis. The results are then combined using a logarithmic calculation to create the Town’s 5-Star Rating.

The model was initially developed in 2007 then revisited and updated in 2019. The updated model was first used in the 2019 survey and has been retroactively applied to the 2015 and 2017 surveys.

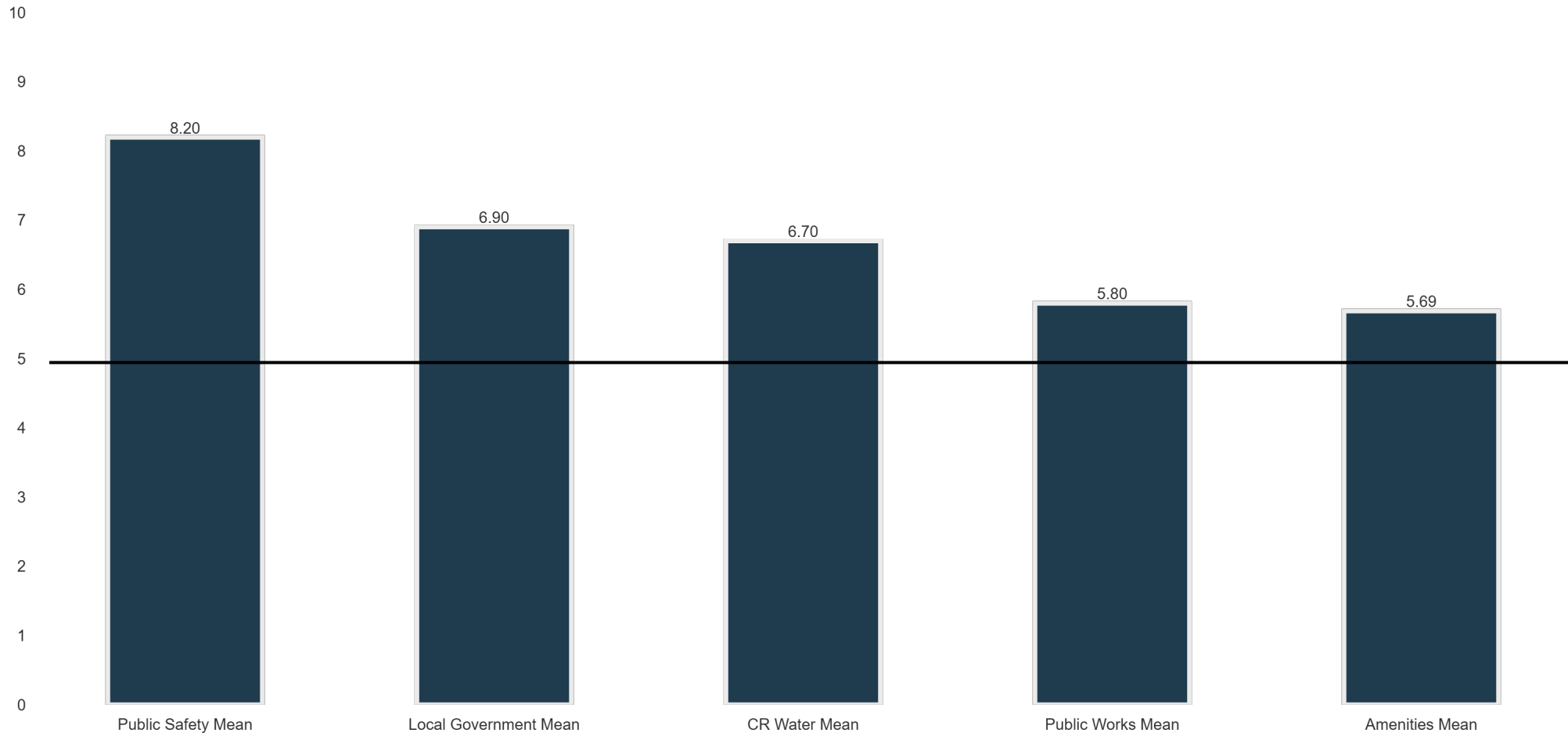


Key Community Questions



Key Community Ratings

All five groups rate above the mid-point (5). The Town receives highest ratings for public safety, and the lowest ratings are for amenities.



Trended Attributes

Excluding the Star-Rating questions, the 2023 survey contained 34 questions that can be compared to the 2021 survey.

Among the trended questions, 0 increased vs. 2021.
17 decreased vs. 2021, and the remaining 17 questions were similar to 2021. Respondents rated 32 out of 34, or 94%, of these items above 5.0 on a scale from 0 to 10.

Driver Analysis



About Driver Analysis

Driver Analysis has routinely been done to assist the Town in understanding the relative importance and performance of Town services.

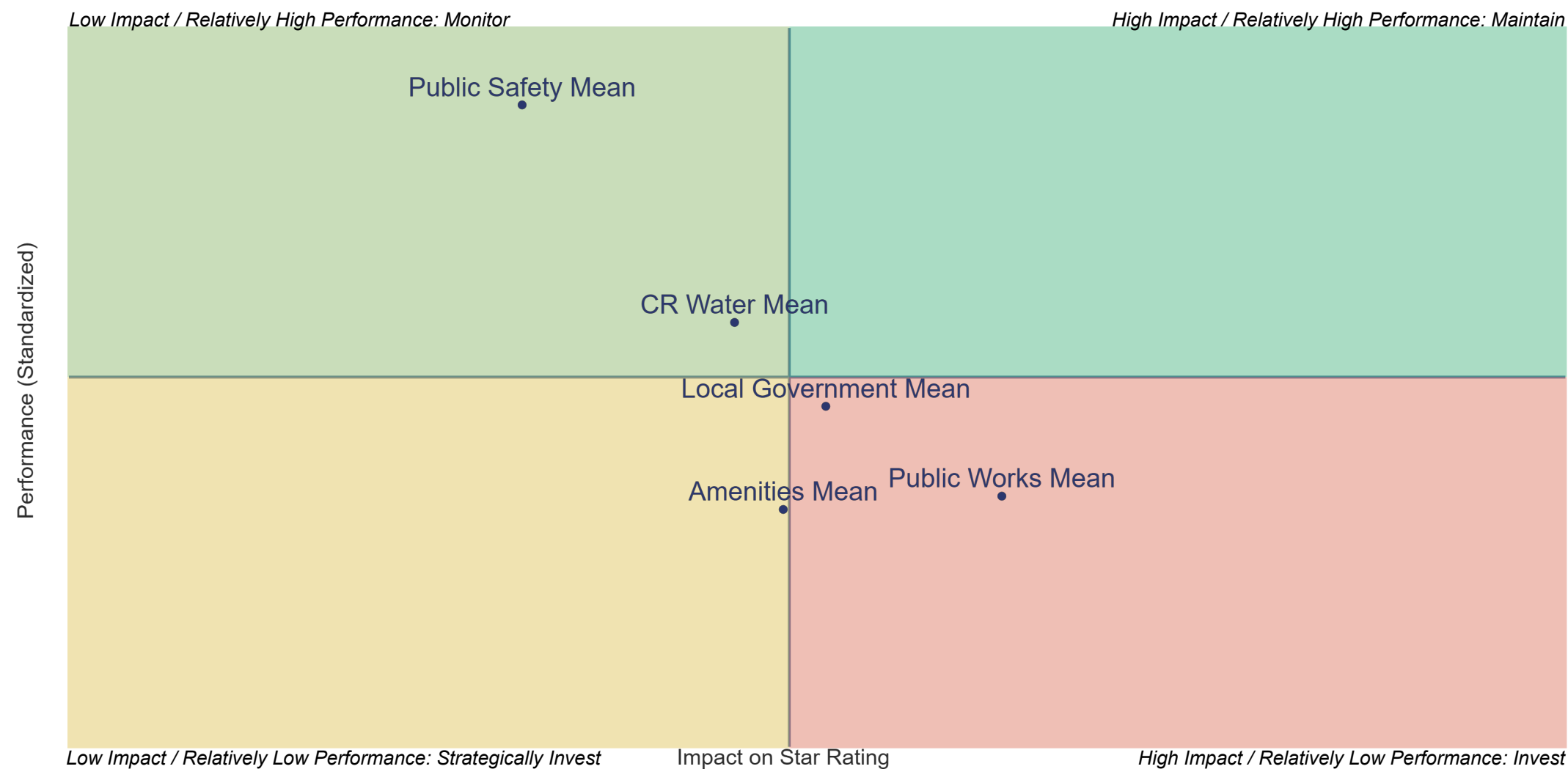
The driver analysis is performed using the following steps:

1. Questions (called "attributes in this report") are reviewed and grouped into similar categories, called Dimensions.
2. The attributes used within each Dimension are standardized. This puts the attributes on a level playing field and provides a better way to compare the performance of the attributes against each other.
3. The dimensions were used as independent variables in Regression analysis (the Star-Rating serves as the dependent variable). This analysis is used to determine the Overall Drivers of the 5-Star rating.
4. Regression analysis is then performed within each Dimension, using the individual attributes as the dependent variables (and continuing to use the Star-Rating as the dependent variable).

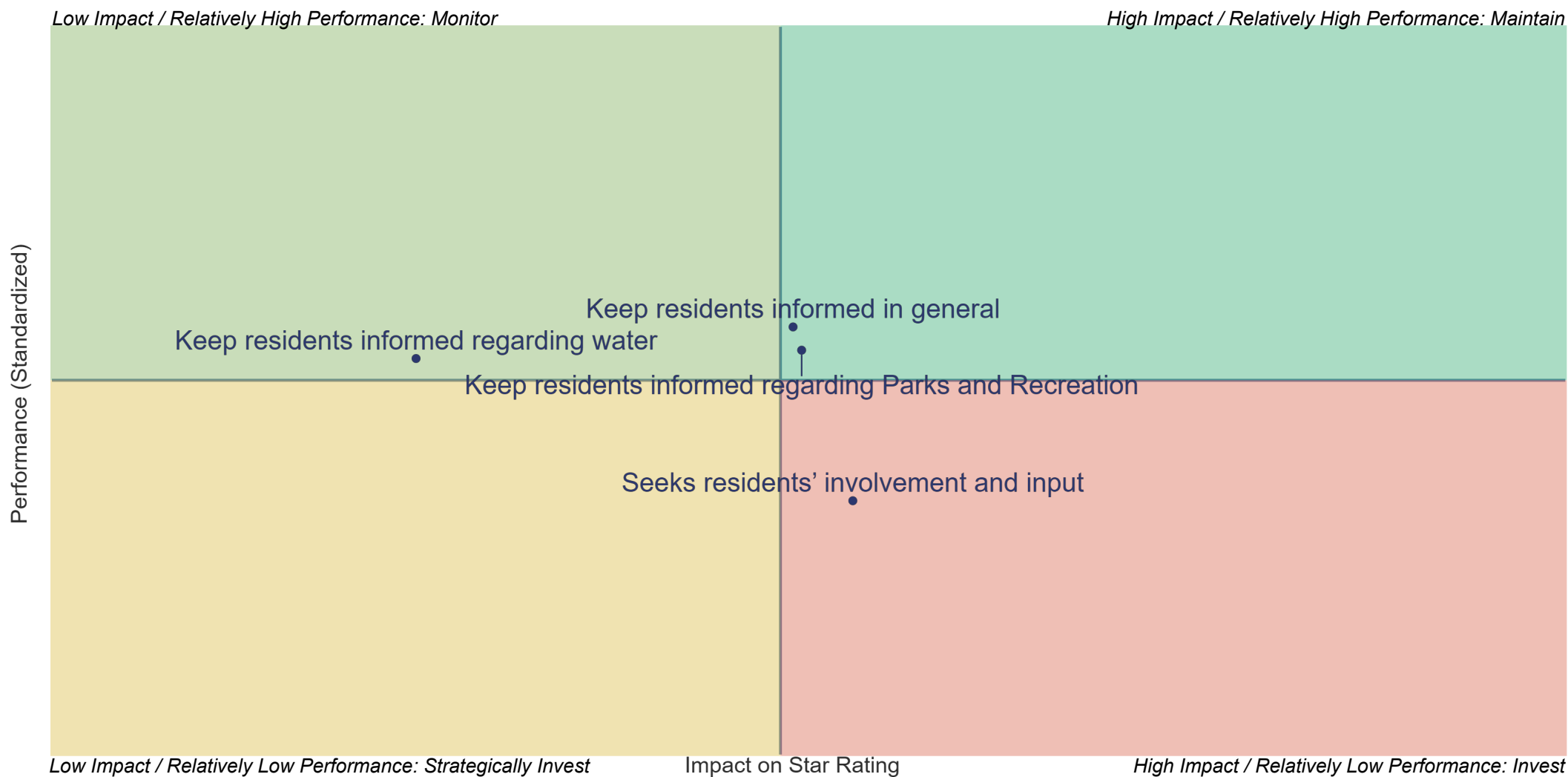
The output, shown on the next several pages, provides powerful, yet easy-to-understand, way to determine areas of relative strength and weakness for the Town. In general, the charts can be interpreted as follows:

- Items in the green quadrants are where the Town performs well, and service should be maintained.
- Items in the yellow quadrant are where the Town performs below average, yet these are also areas of below-average importance. The Town should invest if possible.
- Items in the red quadrant are of relatively high importance, yet the Town is performing relatively low compared to the other items. The Town should focus on improving these areas.

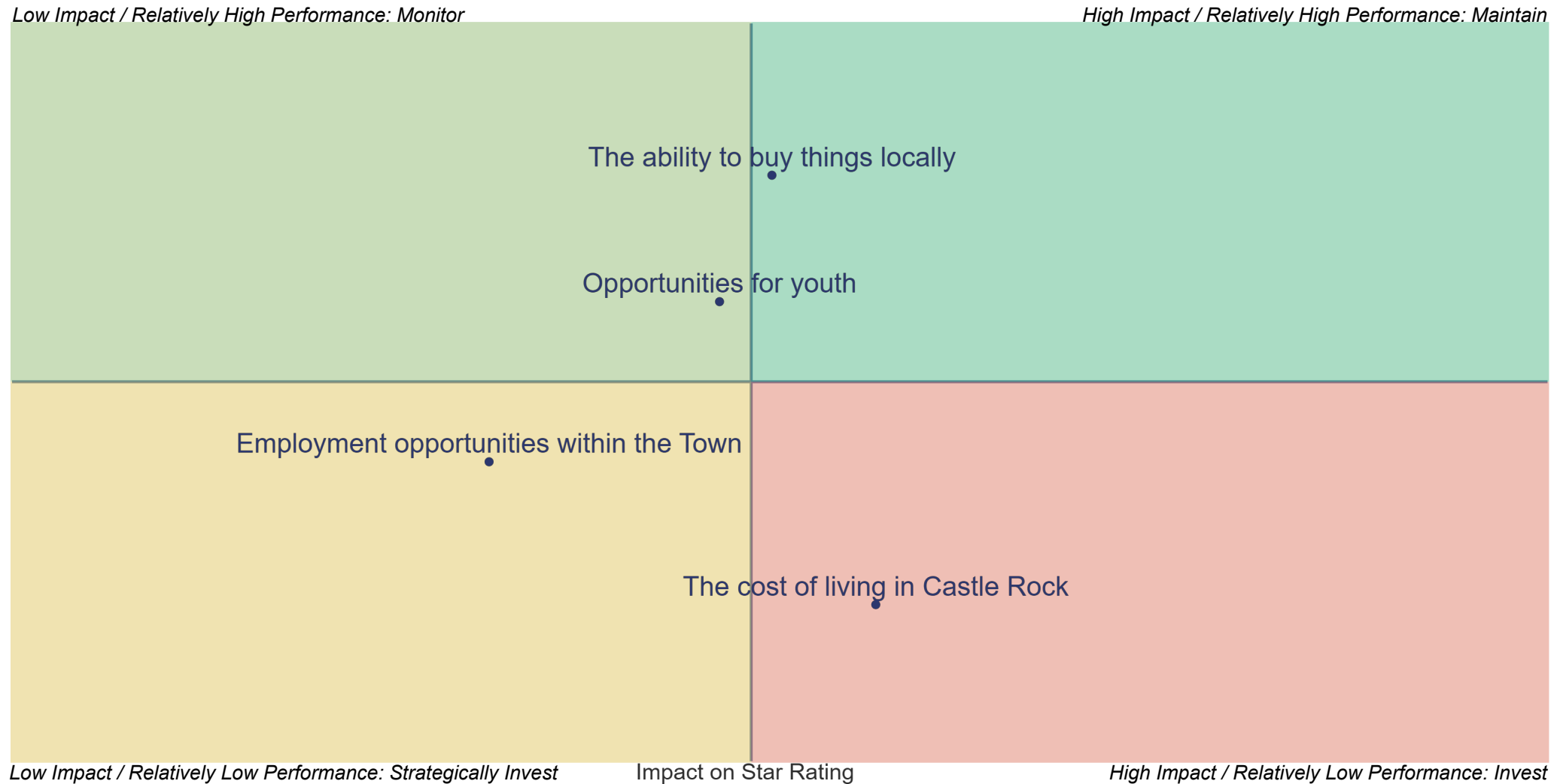
Overall Drivers of 5-Star Rating



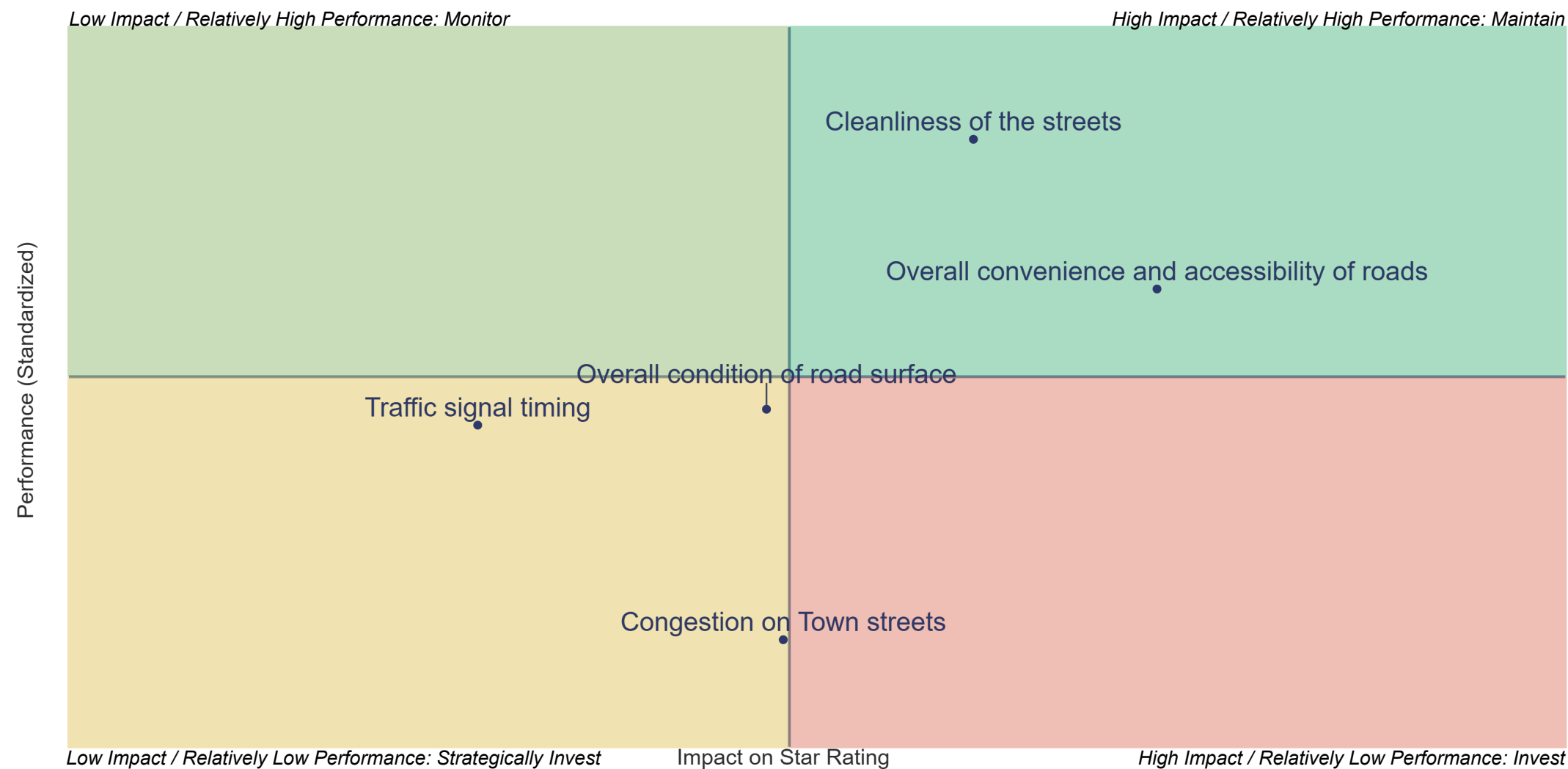
Local Govt Drivers of 5-Star Rating



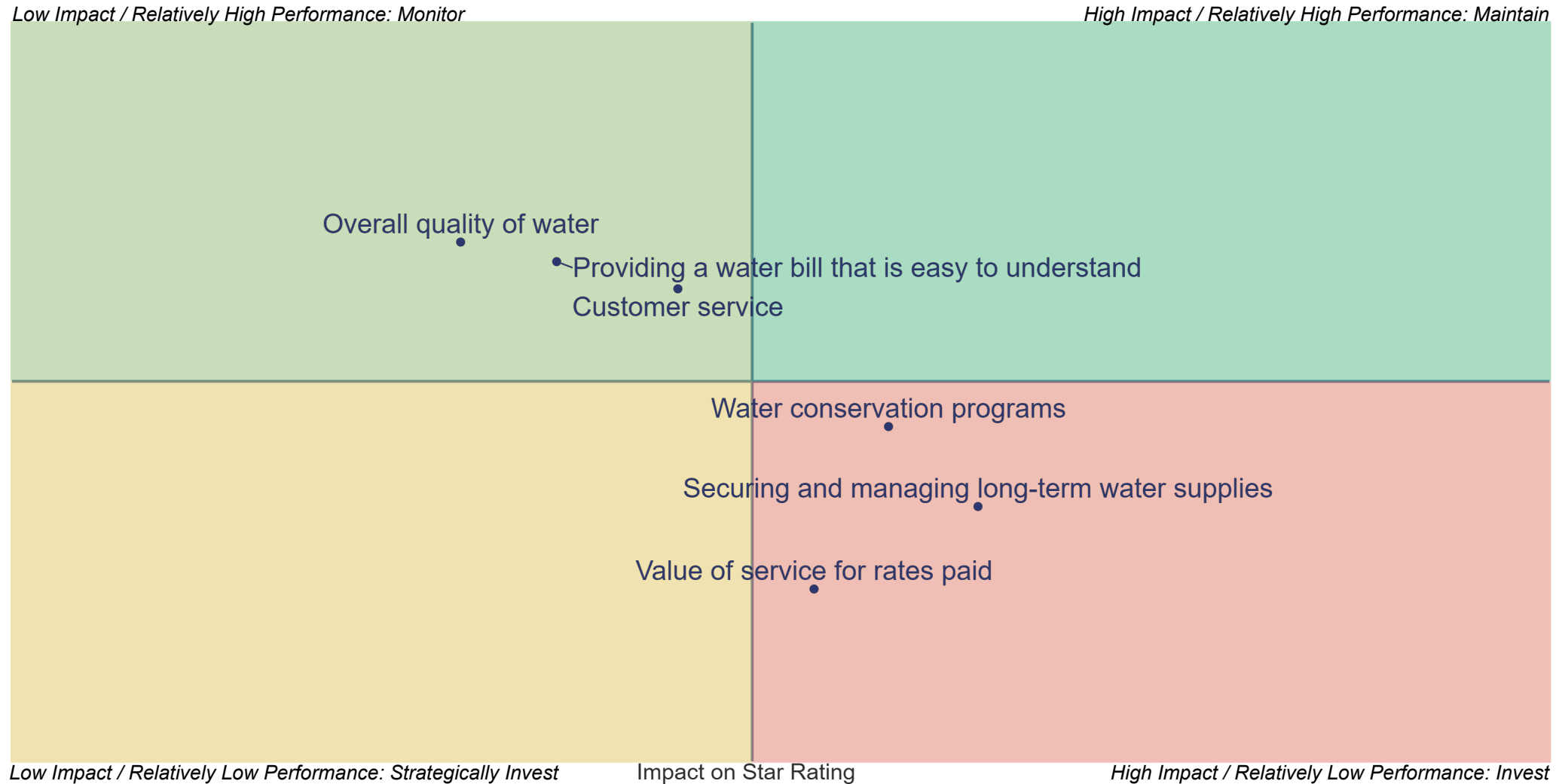
Amenities Drivers of 5-Star Rating



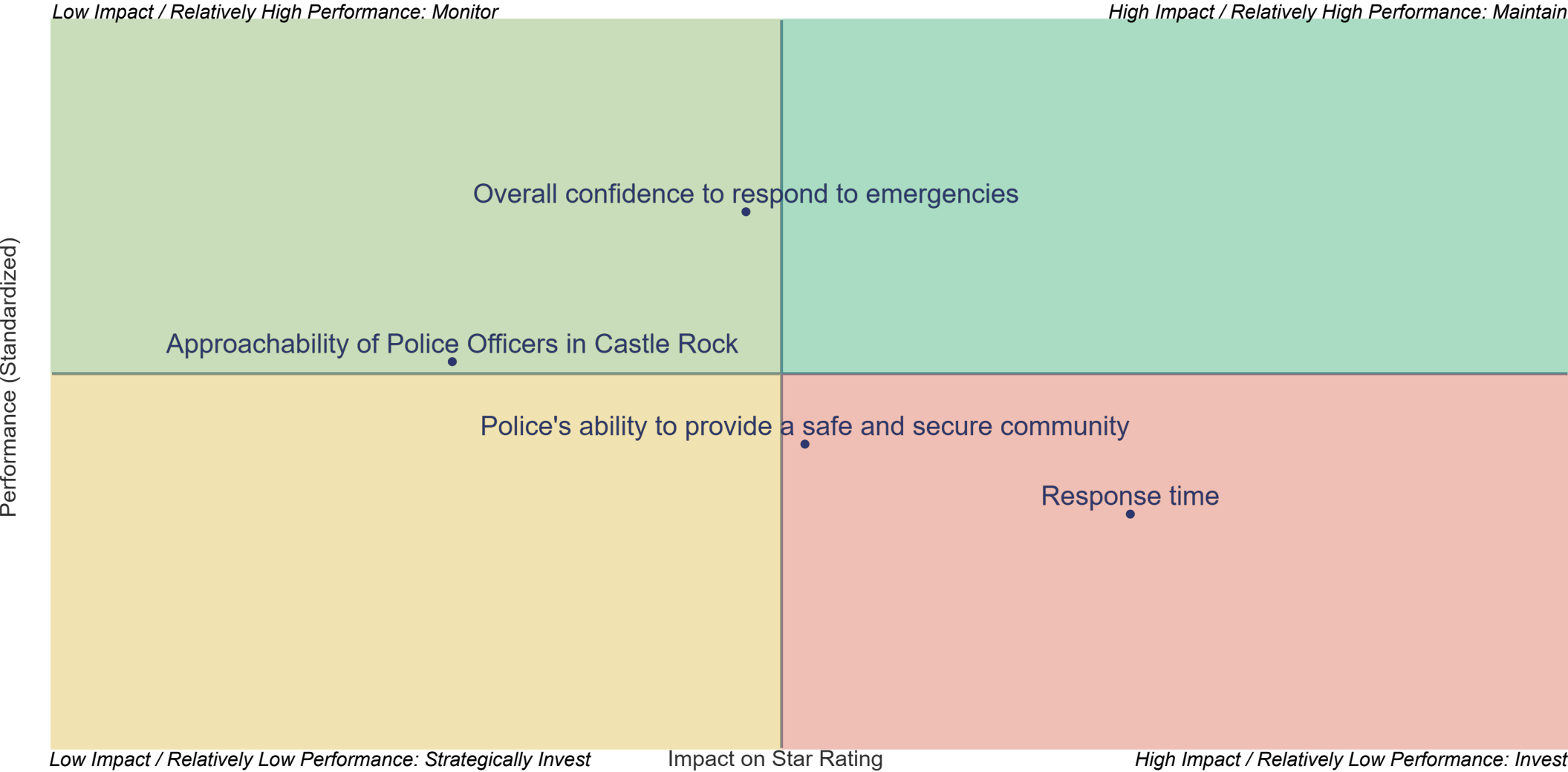
Pub Works Drivers of 5-Star Rating

Potential Strategic Priorities



How Strategic Priorities Are Ranked

The survey asked people to share what they feel should be top strategic priorities for Castle Rock. They were asked to select all priorities that are important to them. There were then two follow-up questions.

- First, people were shown the priorities they selected and were asked to choose their most important priority.
- Then, people were shown the priorities they did not select and were asked to choose their least important priority.

The results of these questions help us understand both the rank order of each priority and the relative importance between the potential priorities.

Utility Score

A simple interpretation of the results is to think of the utility scores as answers to this question: *"if you had \$100 to spend on these items, how would you allocate that money?"* Because utility scores are **ratio** data, the utility score of one priority (like "Trails") can be compared to that of another (like "Parks with gardens"). We can then make statistically valid statements comparing the importance that respondents assign to each priority.

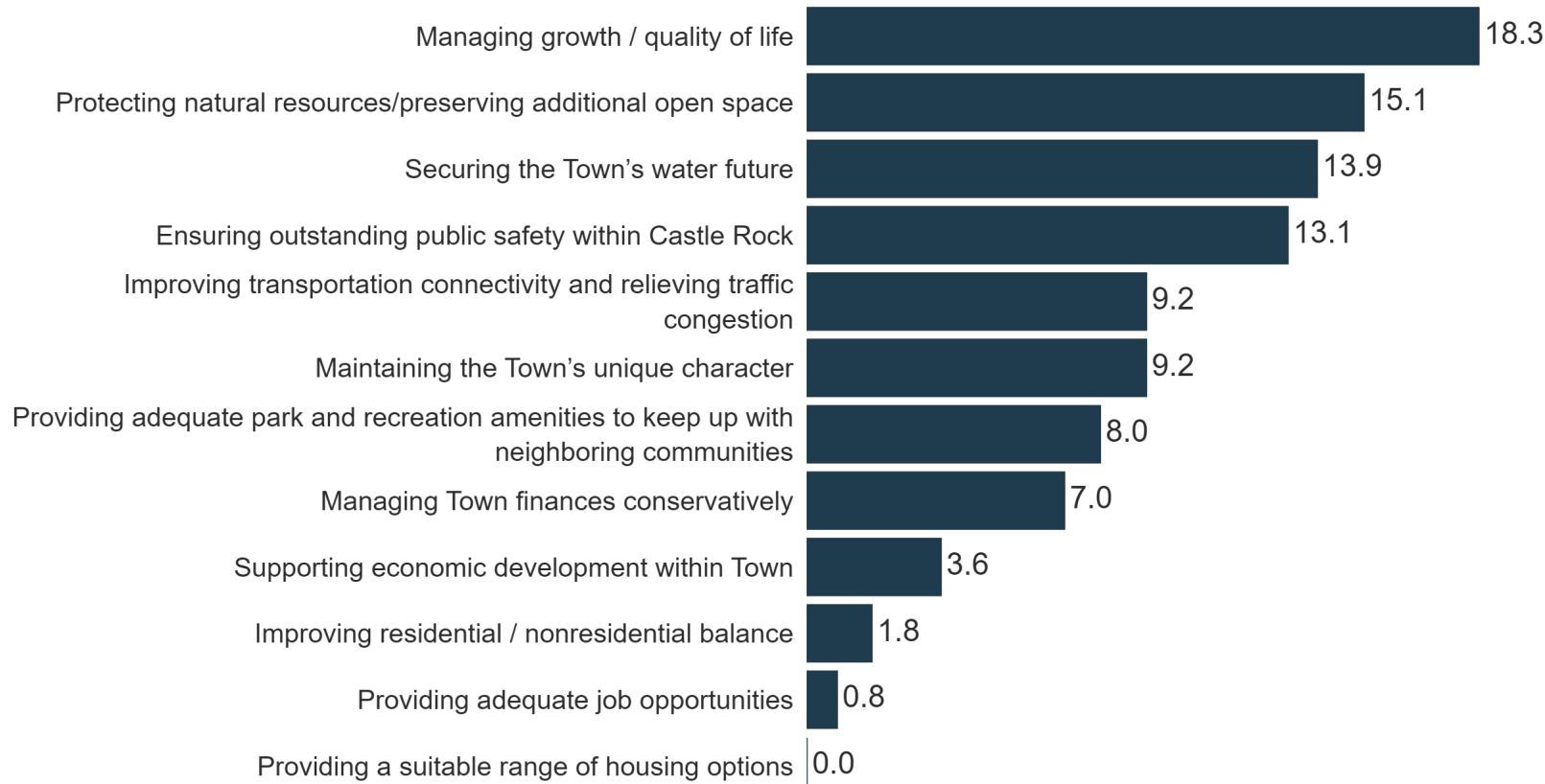
Ex: "Results indicate that 'Trails through natural areas' is twice as important to residents as 'Developing parks with display gardens,' and nearly three times as important as 'Outdoor sports fields or sports courts'."

Potential Strategic Priorities

- Improving transportation connectivity and relieving traffic congestion
- Improving residential / nonresidential balance
- Managing growth / quality of life
- Protecting natural resources/preserving additional open space
- Providing adequate park and recreation amenities to keep up with neighboring communities
- Providing adequate job opportunities
- Providing a suitable range of housing options
- Maintaining the Town's unique character
- Ensuring outstanding public safety within Castle Rock
- Securing the Town's water future
- Supporting economic development within Town
- Managing Town finances conservatively

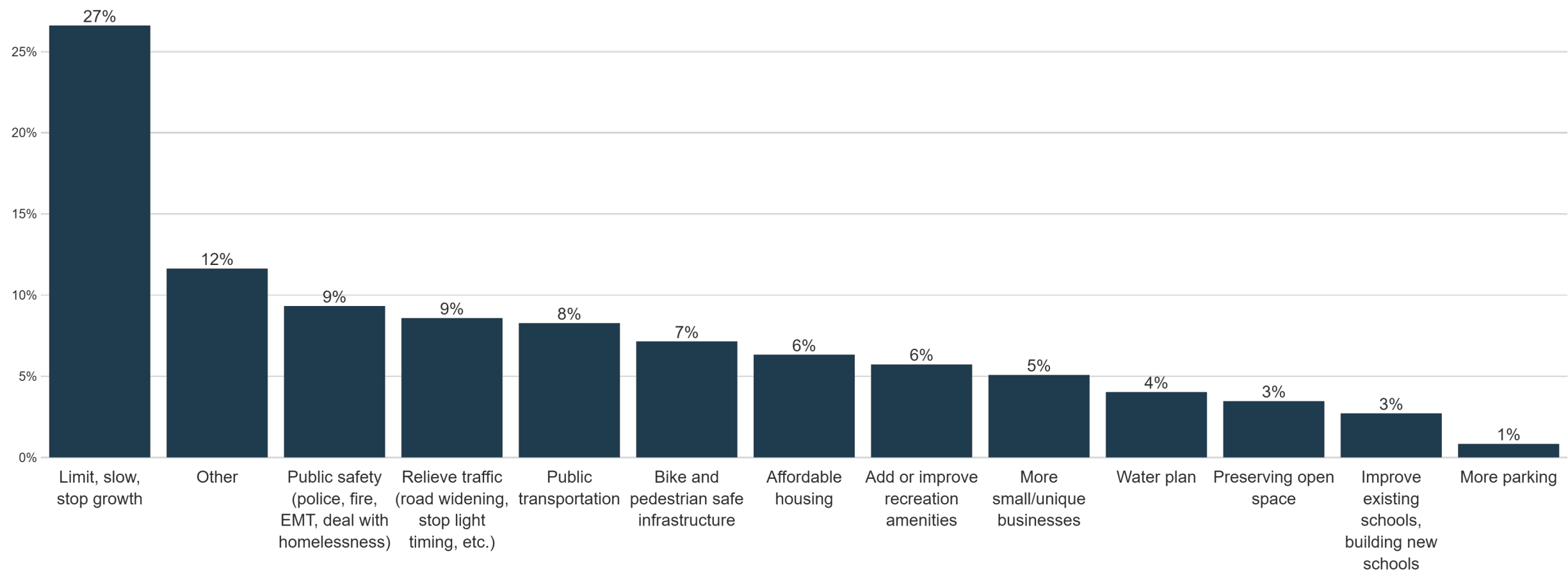
Results - Strategic Priorities

As stated on the previous slide, these scores sum to 100 and represent relative importance, so they can be compared. For example, 'Managing growth / quality of life' receives a score of 18.3, and 'Improving transportation connectivity and relieving traffic congestion' receives a score of 9.2. This means that 'Managing growth / quality of life' is 2 times more important to residents than 'Improving transportation connectivity and relieving traffic congestion'.



Other Strategic Priorities

After ranking the potential strategic priorities, residents were asked to mention anything else the Town should have as a strategic priority.

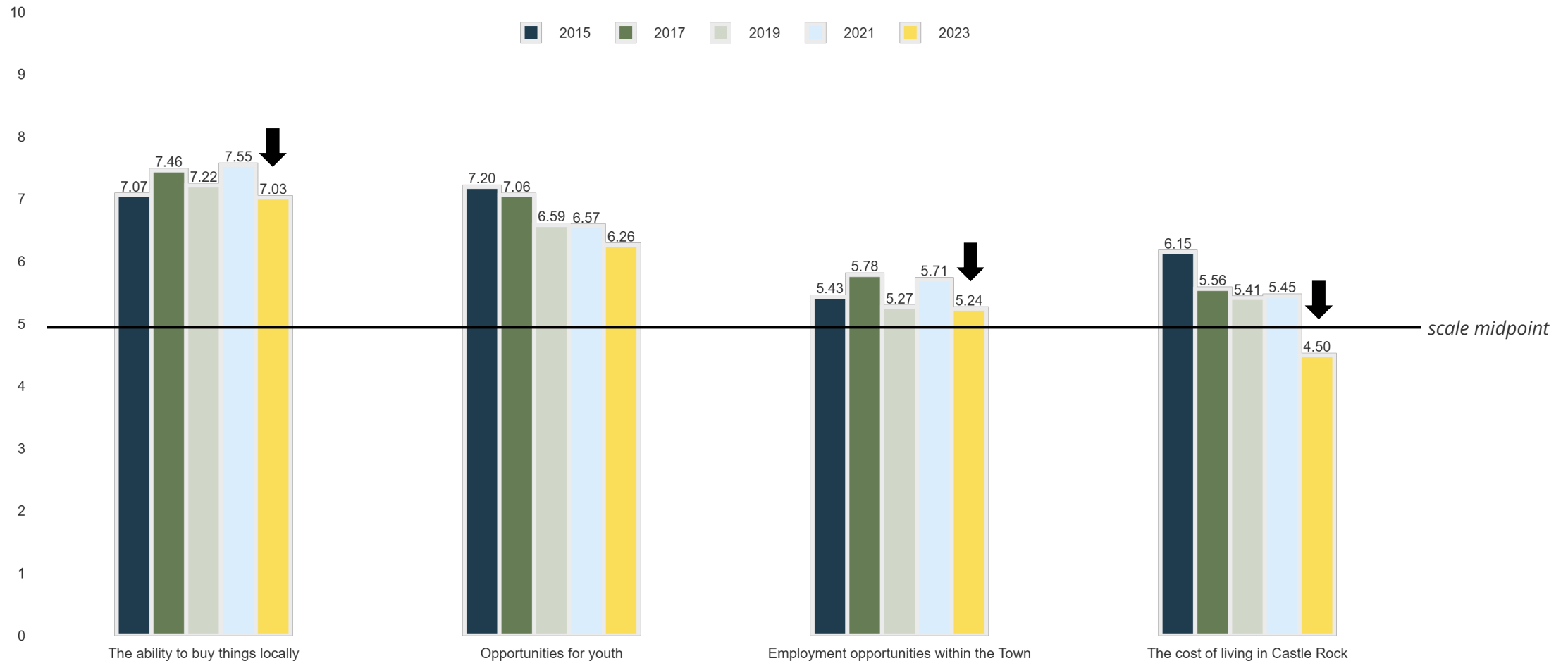

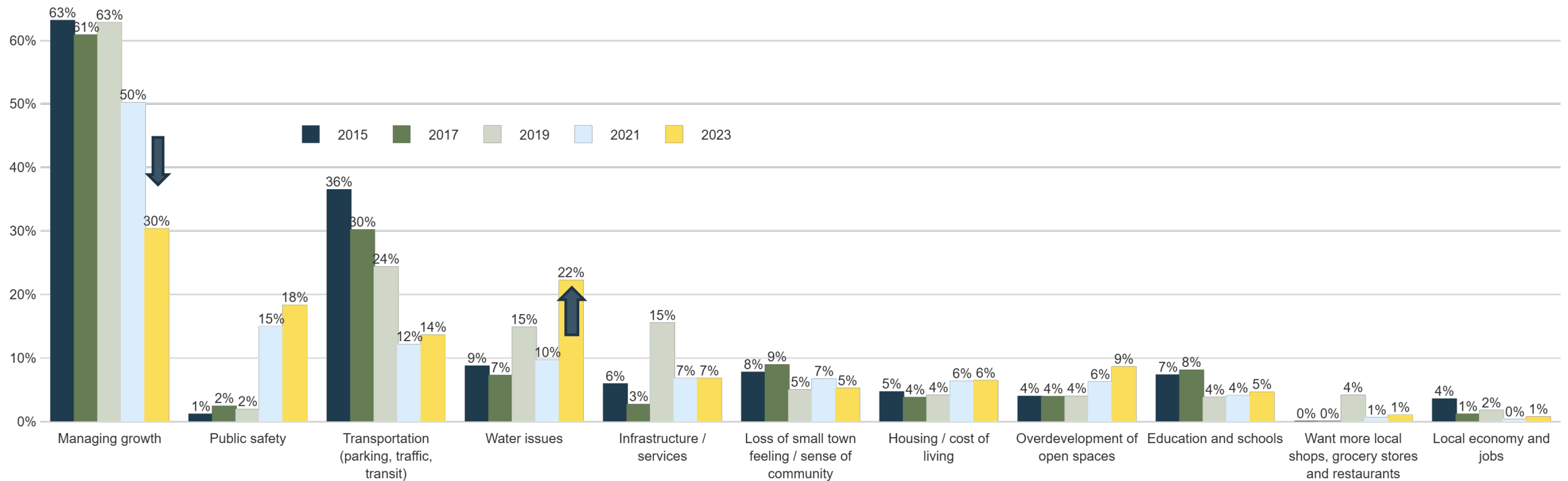
Recent trends in worldwide inflation are reflected in the significant decrease in satisfaction with the cost of living in Castle Rock. Ratings for youth opportunities remain unchanged, while the other three indicators decreased significantly from 2021.



How would you rate each of the following aspects of Castle Rock? (0 to 10 scale)

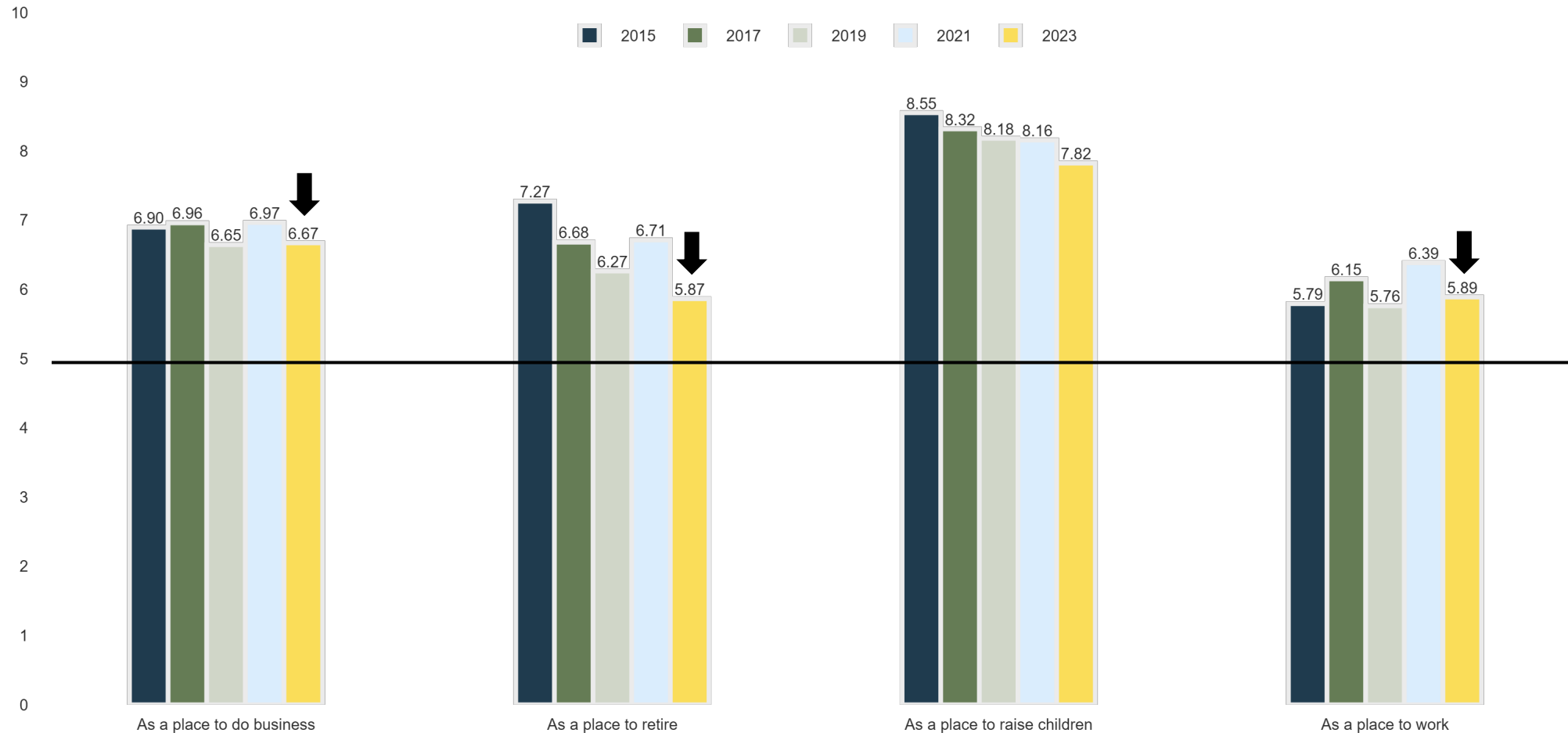
Most Important Issue Facing the Town

When asked to specify the most important issue facing Castle Rock in the next five years, respondents mentioned growth-related concerns, water issues, and public safety the most frequently. While "Managing growth" fell significantly since 2021, it is still the top issue. The proportion of residents who mentioned "Water issues" more than doubled since 2023 -- a statistically significant increase.



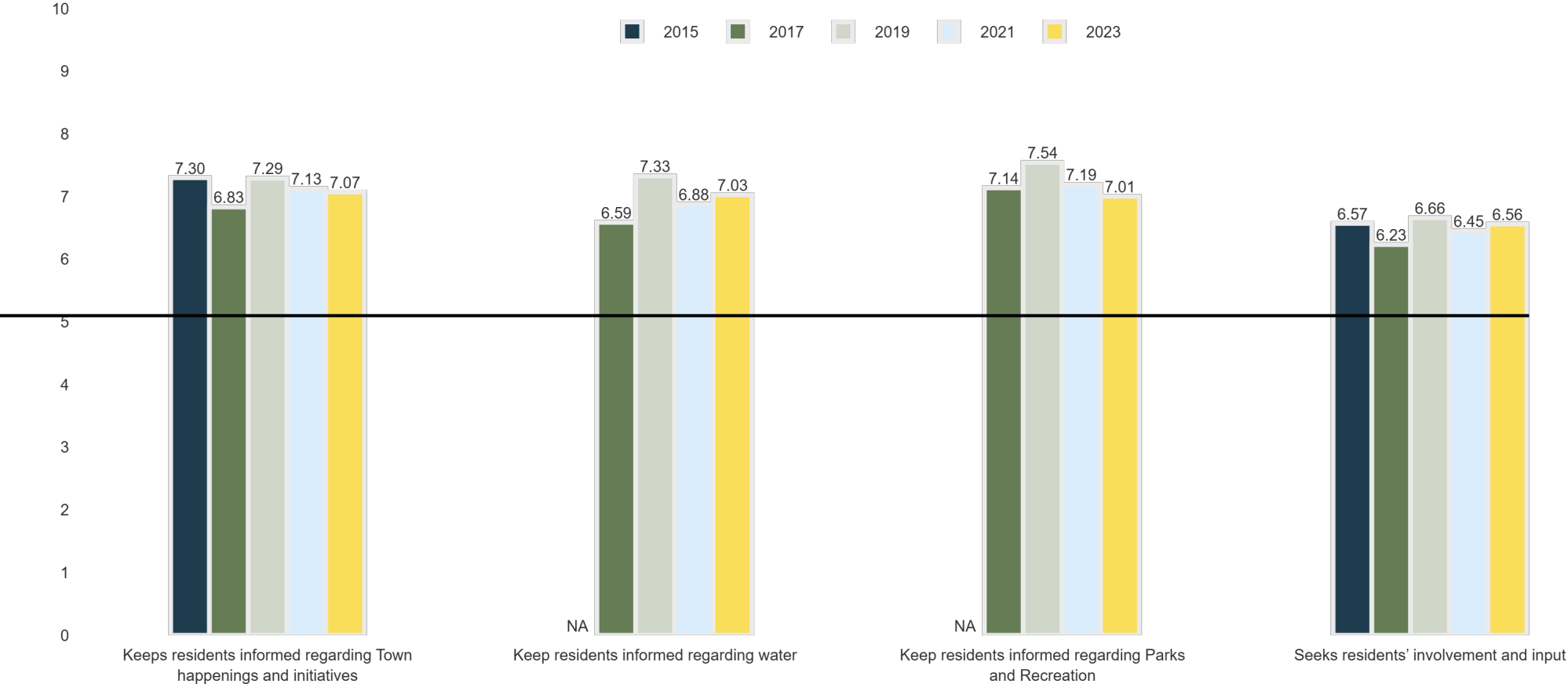
Recommending Castle Rock

Respondents rate Castle Rock as an exceptional place to raise children, but there have been significant decreases in ratings for the other questions since 2021. Ratings for all of the questions remain above average.



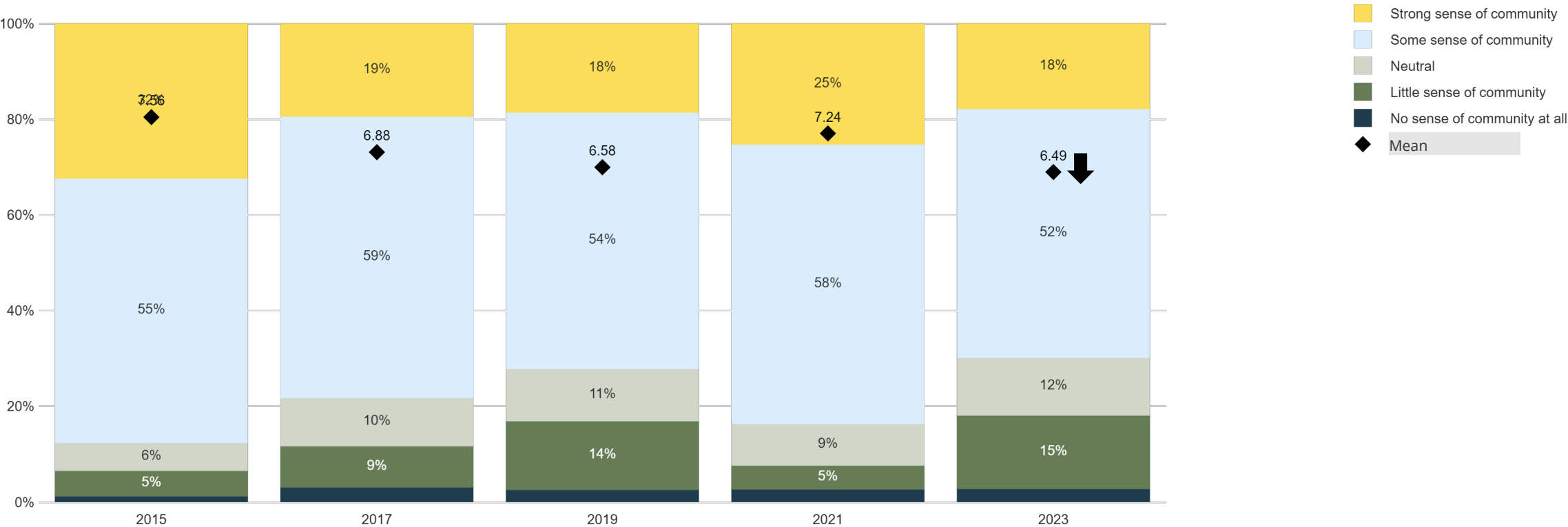
Government / Resident Involvement

Overall, respondents indicate that the Town does a good job in keeping them informed. There was no significant change for any of the four measured aspects between 2021 and 2023.



Community Character - Sense of Community

Beginning in 2015, residents were asked to rate the overall sense of community in Castle Rock. 70% of residents indicate that there is 'some' or a 'strong' sense of community. While this is significantly lower than 2021 (84%), it is in line with 2017 and 2019.



Determining Contributors to a Unique Identity

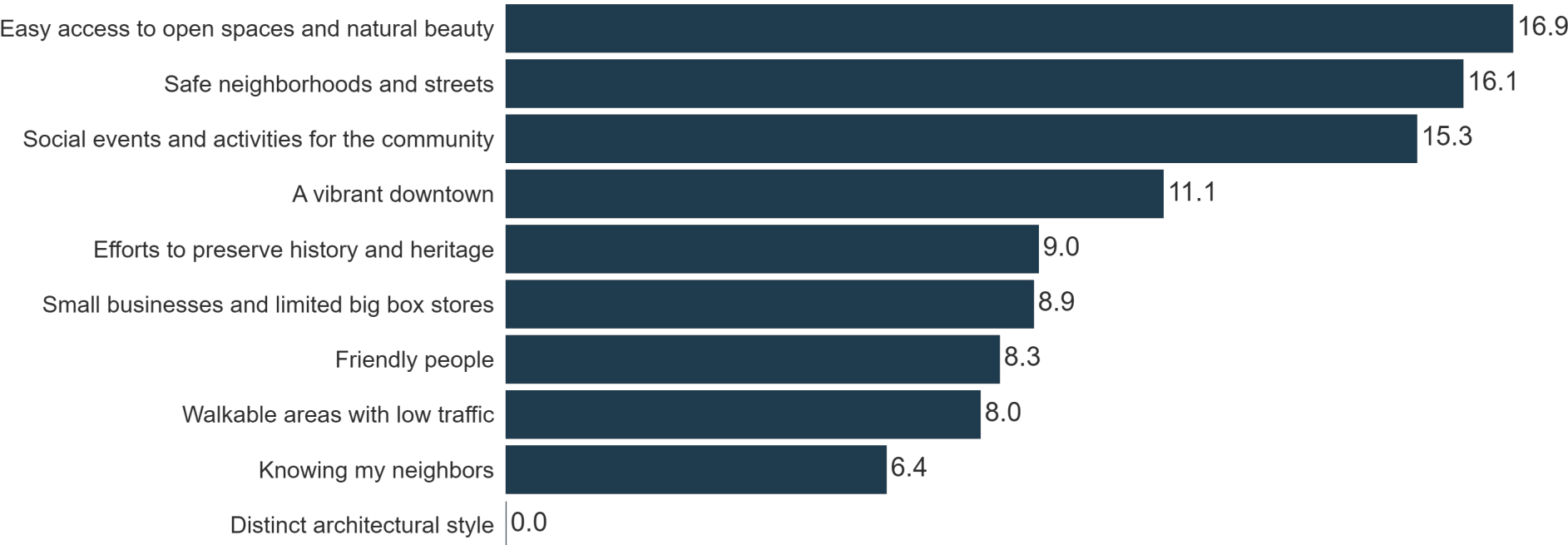
Respondents were asked to select up to five factors that they feel contribute to Castle Rock's unique identity. They were then asked to select the ONE attribute (of those selected) that contributes most, and the one (of those not selected) that contributes least. The result is a rank order of each attribute and the distance between those ranks.

Attributes Contributing to Unique Town Identity

- Special events and activities for the community
- Easy access to open spaces and natural beauty
- Safe neighborhoods and streets
- A vibrant downtown
- Knowing my neighbors
- Friendly people
- Small businesses and limited big box stores
- Walkable areas with low traffic
- Distinct architectural style
- Efforts to preserve history and heritage

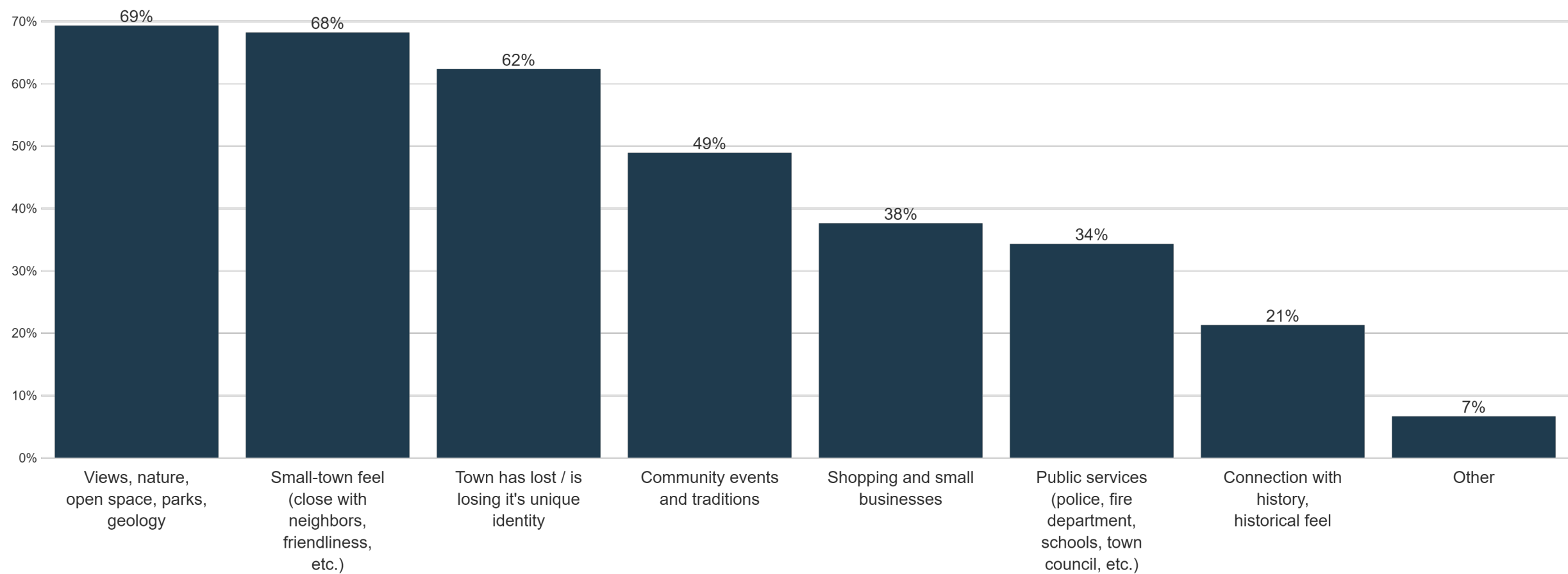
Contributors to a Unique Identity

Three items contribute most to the Town’s unique identity: Easy access to open space and natural beauty, safe neighborhoods and streets, and community social events and activities. These scores sum to 100 and represent relative importance. For example: "Easy access to open space and natural beauty" is twice as important as "friendly people".

After ranking the contributors, residents were asked to identify anything else that may contribute to the distinct identity of the Town.



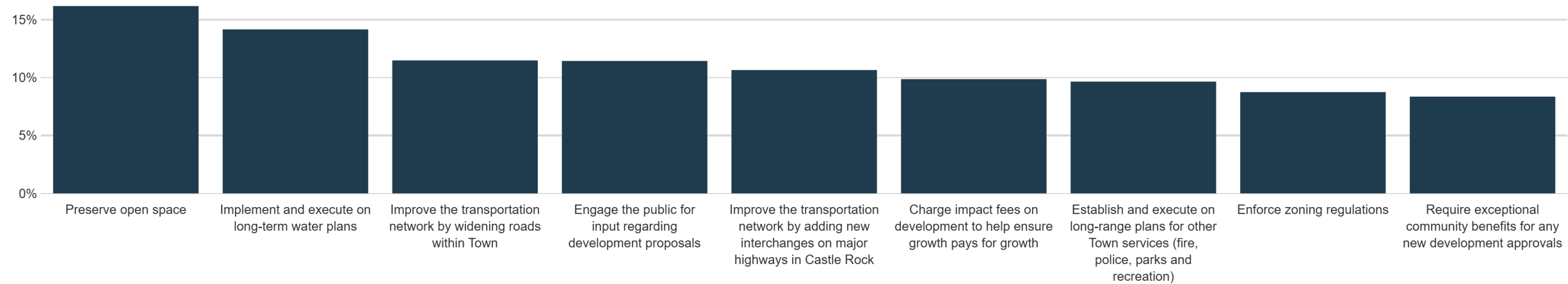
Growth in Castle Rock



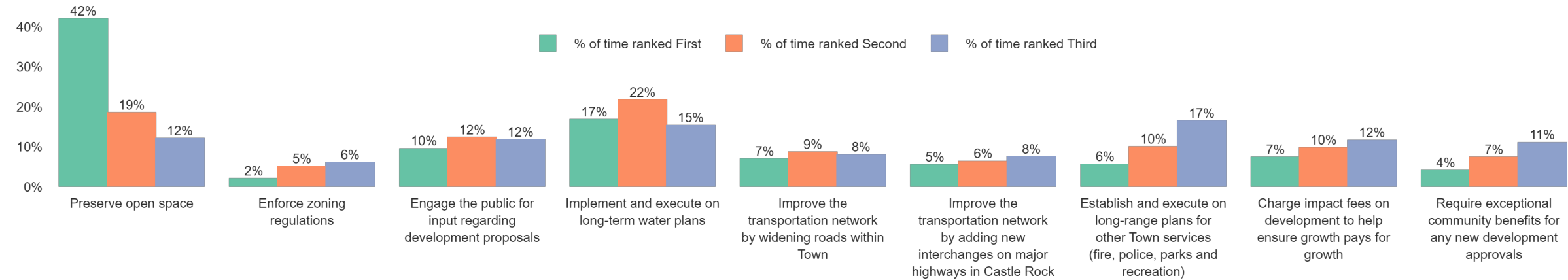
Growth Priorities

The 2023 survey asked residents to rank the priorities surrounding quality growth in Castle Rock. Open space and long-term water plans ranked among the top three priorities most often (top chart), and were most often selected as the first priority (bottom chart).

Frequency of being ranked one of the top three priorities

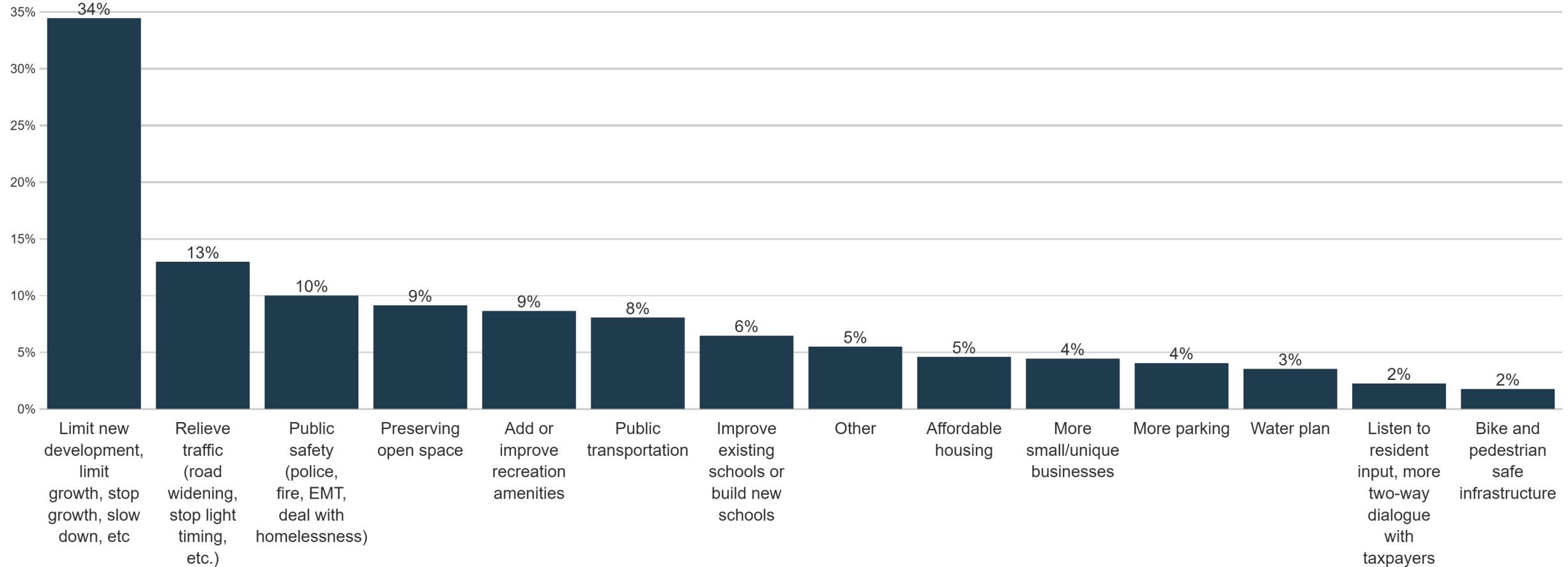


Frequency ranking for each position



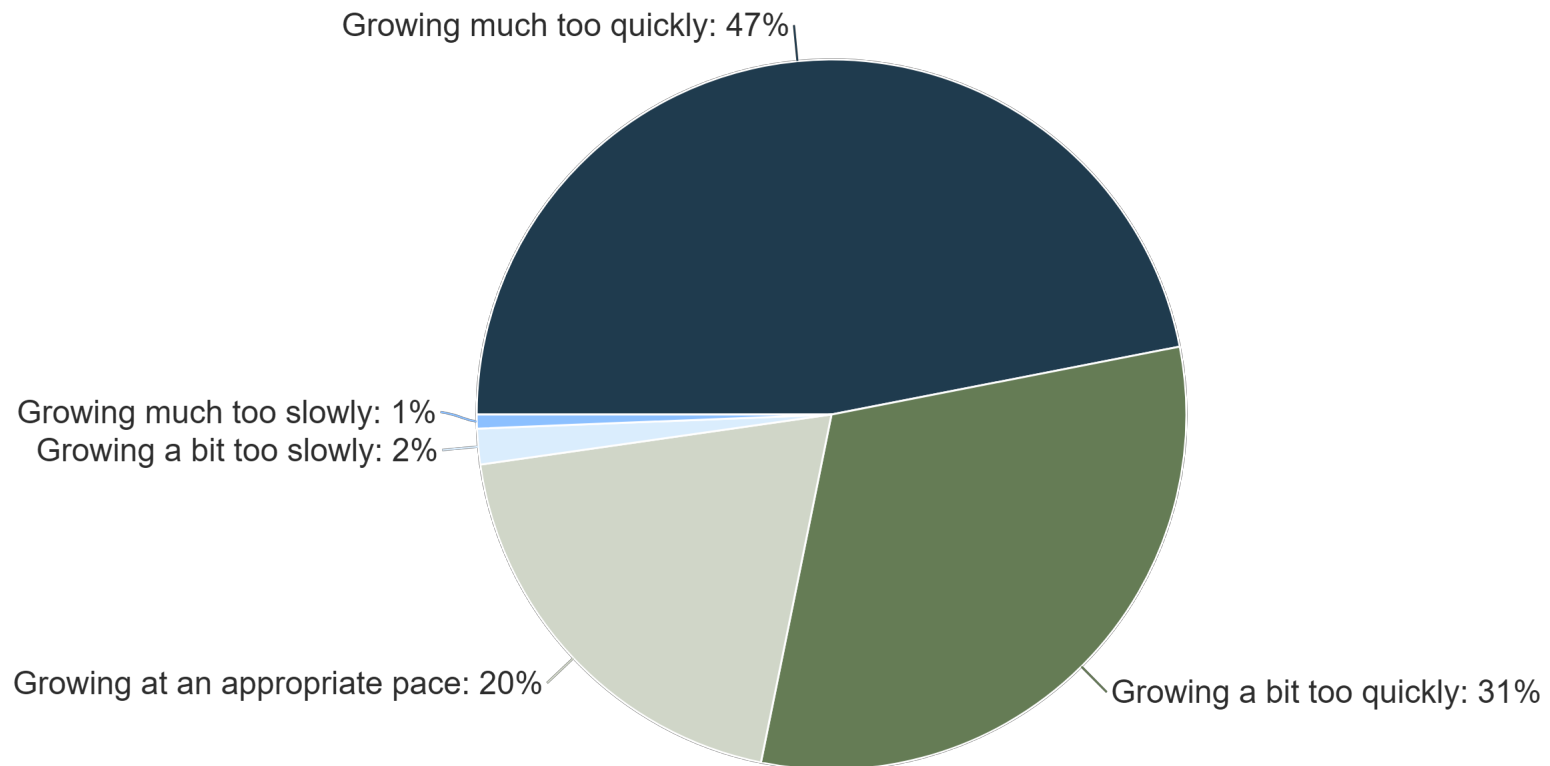
Other Growth Priorities

After ranking the provided priorities, residents were asked if there were any other measures the Town could take to ensure quality growth.



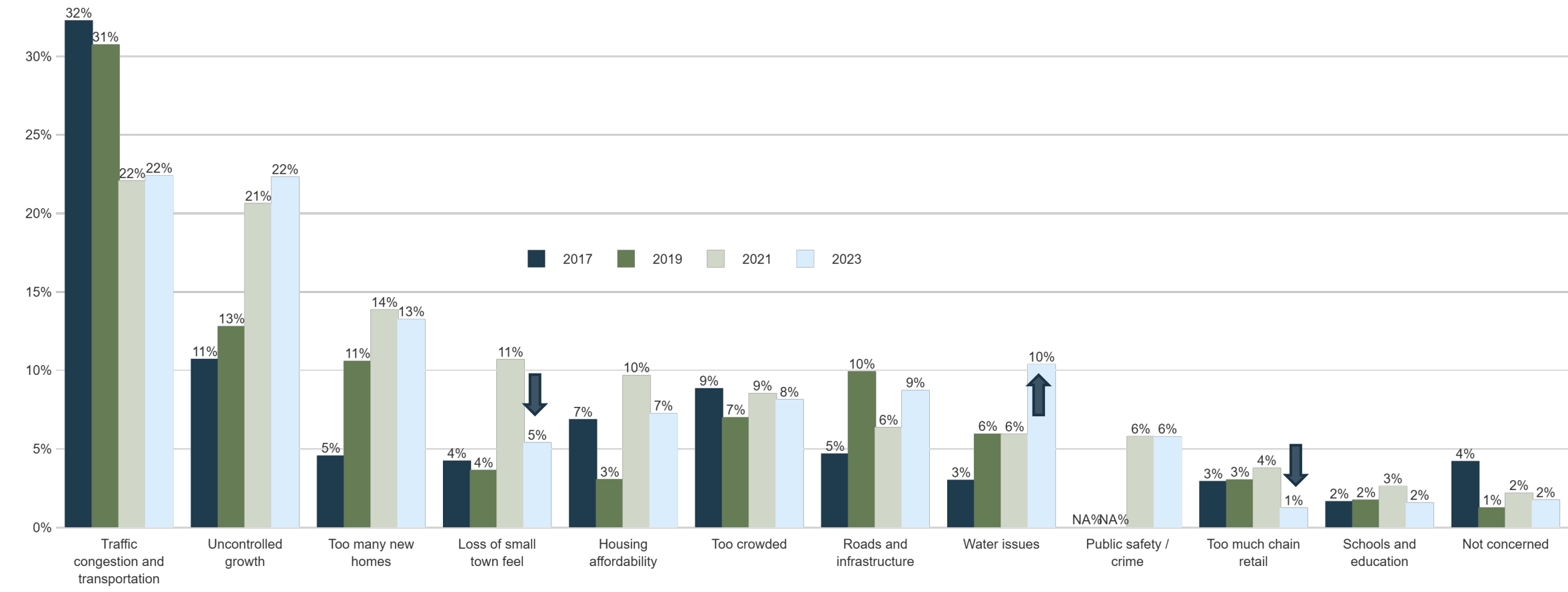
Rate of Growth

The 2023 survey introduced a new question asking residents to select the description that best reflects the Town's growth rate. 78 % of residents feel the Town is growing too quickly.



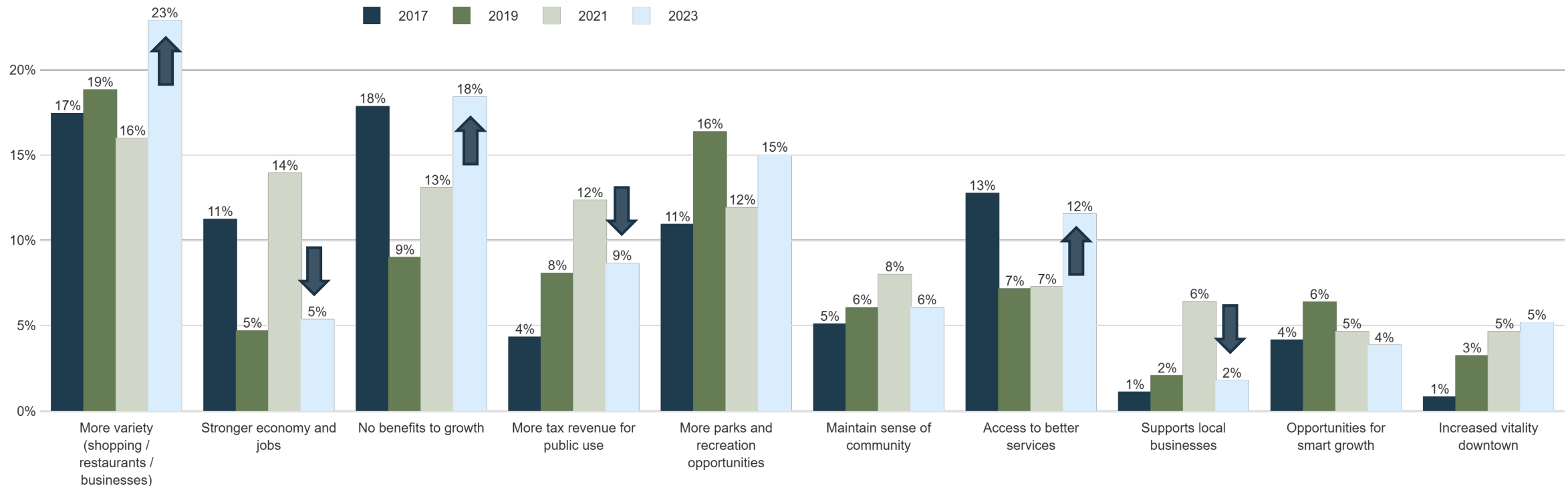
Negative Aspects of Growth

Respondents's top two concerns about growth in Castle Rock were the same as in 2021: Uncontrolled growth, and traffic congestion and transportation. About twice as many respondents mentioned water issues in 2023 vs. 2021, and there was a significant decrease in the proportion of respondents mentioning the "loss of a small-town feel" and "too much chain retail." The "public safety/crime" category was added in 2021.



Positive Aspects of Growth

When asked about the most beneficial aspect of growth in Castle rock, respondents most often mentioned having more variety in shopping, restaurants, and businesses. About one-fifth of respondents said there was no benefit to growth.

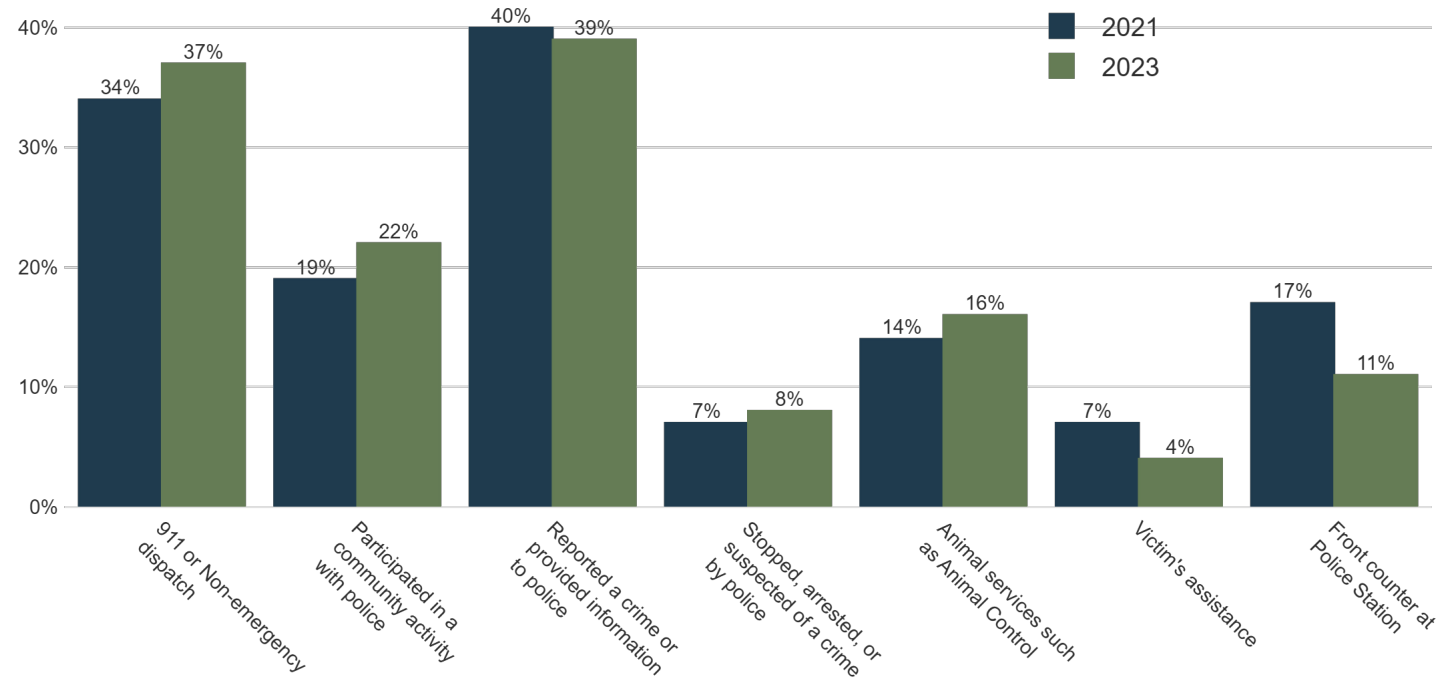
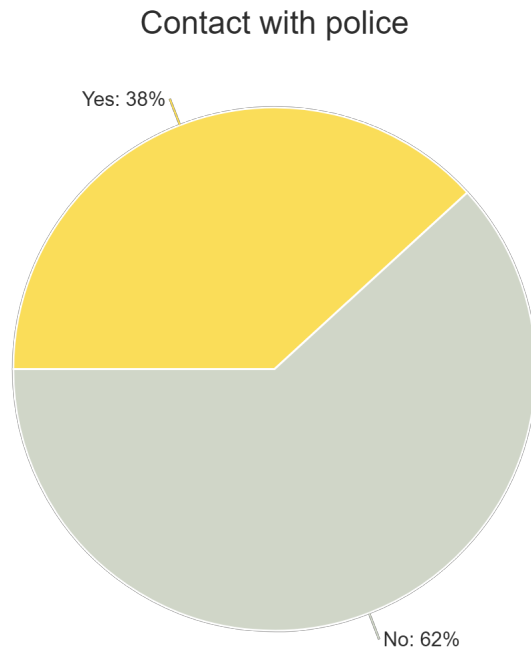


Castle Rock Police



Police Contact

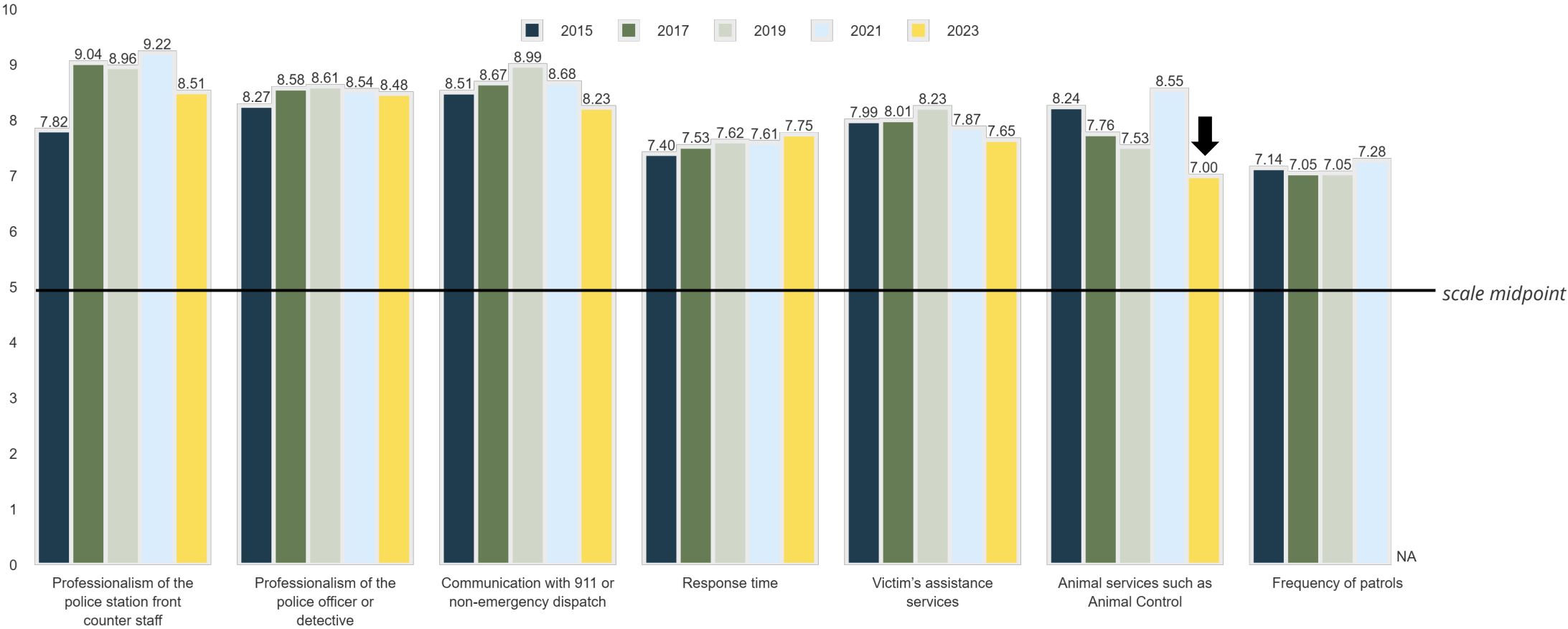
38% of respondents have had contact with Castle Rock's Police Department in the past two years: a significant decrease from 42% in 2021. The most common reasons for police contact remain reporting a crime/providing information to police and contacting 911/non-emergency dispatch.



Police Performance

Police performance was rated very highly. All aspects scored 7 or above on a scale of 0-10.

- Exceptional ratings were given for professionalism of police station front counter staff and communications with 911/non-emergency dispatch. Lowest ratings were given to Animal services and frequency of patrols.
- Ratings for Animal Services decreased significantly since 2021, while all other aspects of police performance were steady.

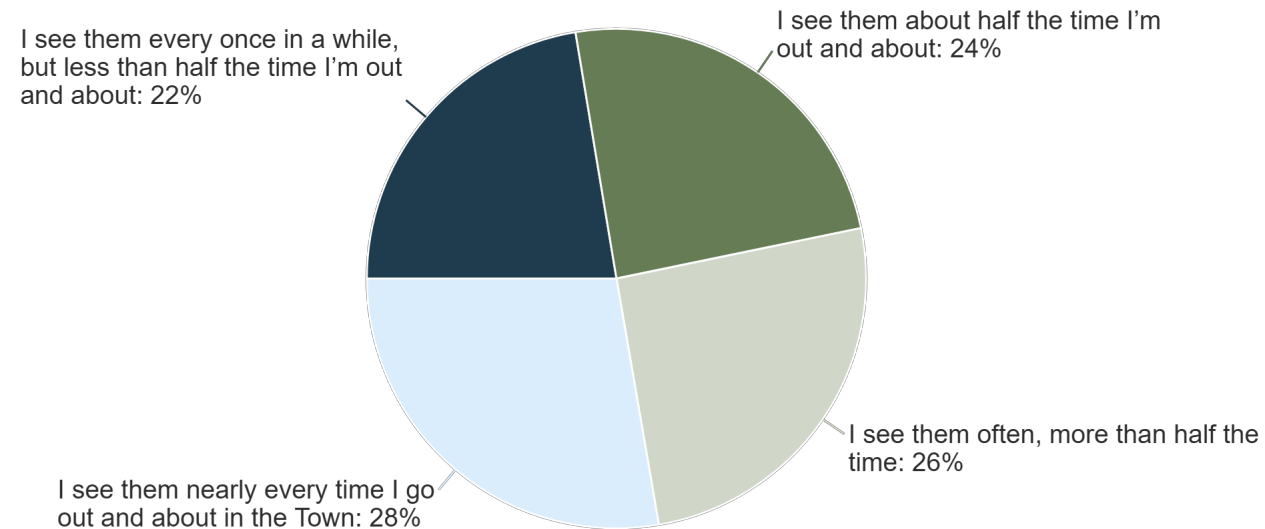


Frequency of Seeing Police

Responses were evenly split between the four choices, and no major differences in were found between respondent demographics.

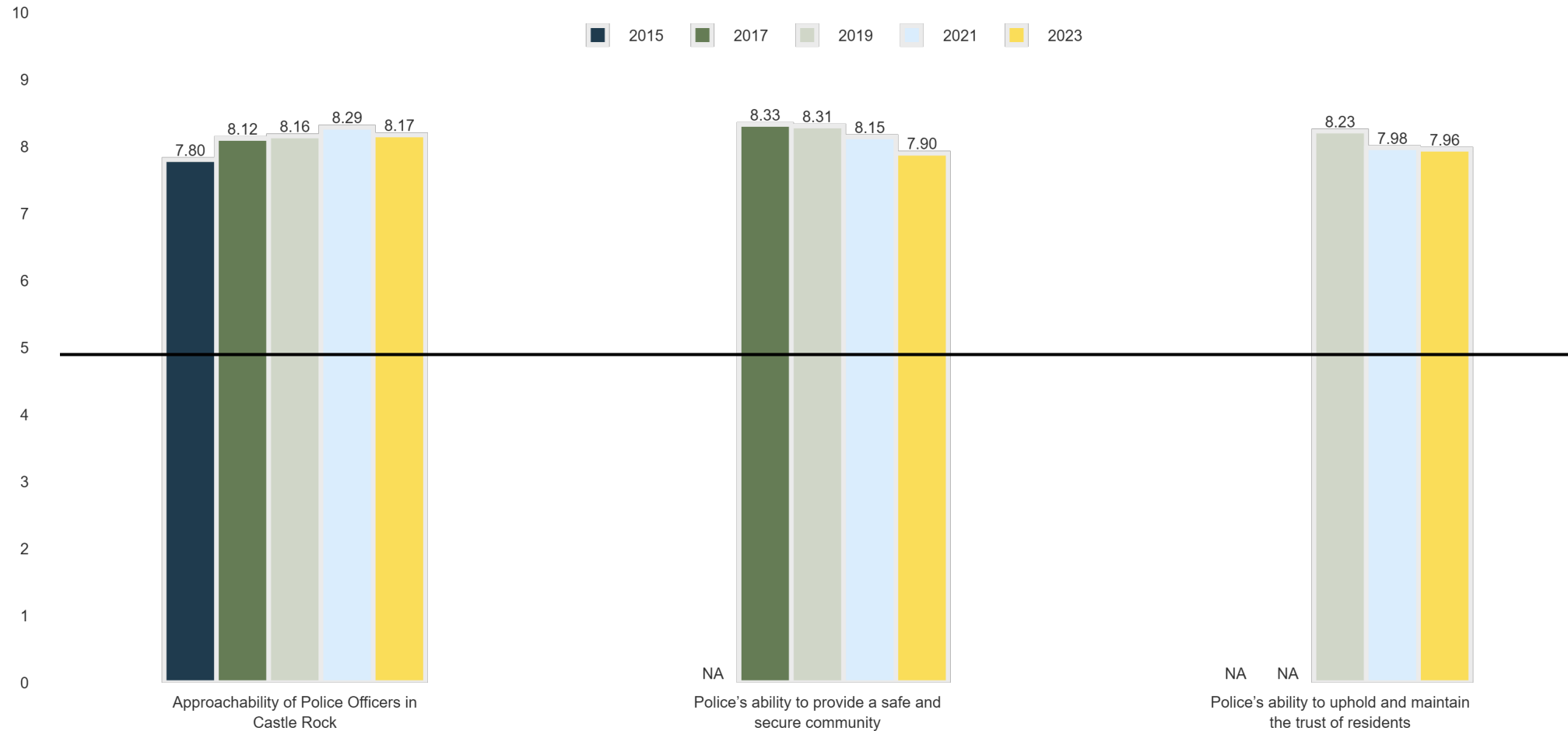
This question is new to 2023, and replaced the 0-10 "Frequency of Patrols" ranking on the previous slide.

Confidence and Approachability

Respondents gave very positive ratings for their confidence in Castle Rock police officers and their approachability: about an 8 on a scale of 0-10 for all three aspects. There were no significant changes in the three ratings shown between 2021 and 2023.



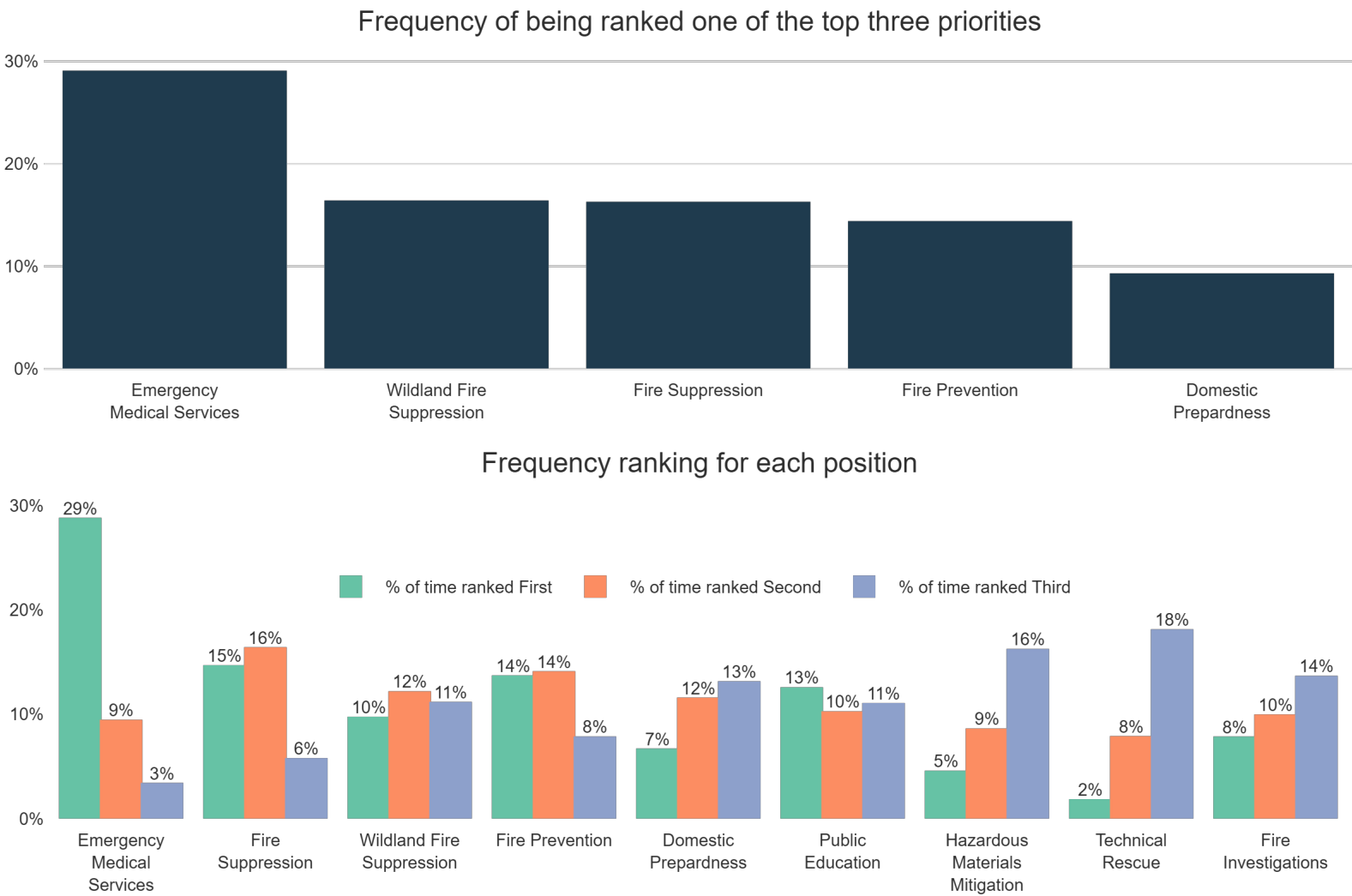
Castle Rock Fire and Rescue



Fire and Rescue Priorities

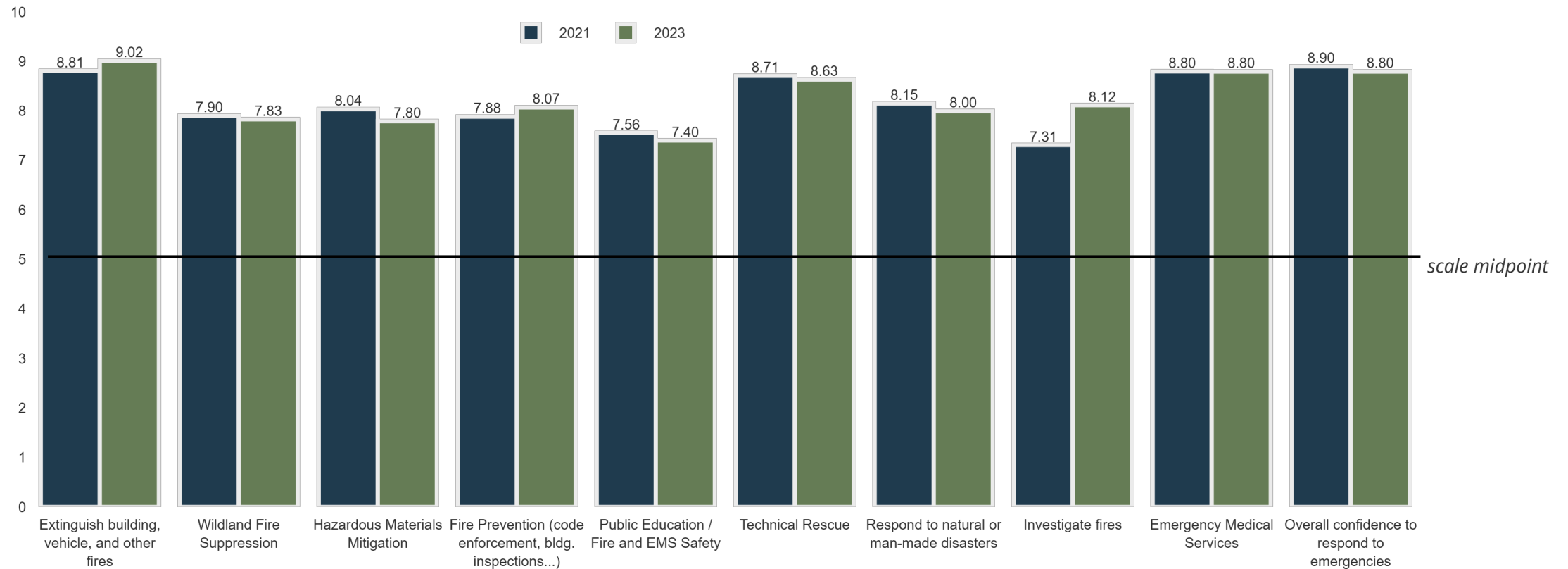
The 2023 survey asked residents to rank the top three priorities for the Fire and Rescue Department.

Emergency Medical Services is the clear top priority, ranking among the top three priorities most often (top chart), and ranking first more often than the other priorities (bottom chart).



Fire and Rescue Performance

After ranking their top three priorities, residents were then asked to rate their confidence for the priorities they picked. All respondents were asked to rate their overall confidence in the Castle Rock Fire and Rescue Department to respond to emergencies. Exceptional ratings were given to Castle Rock Fire and Rescue across the board. There were no significant changes between 2021 and 2023.

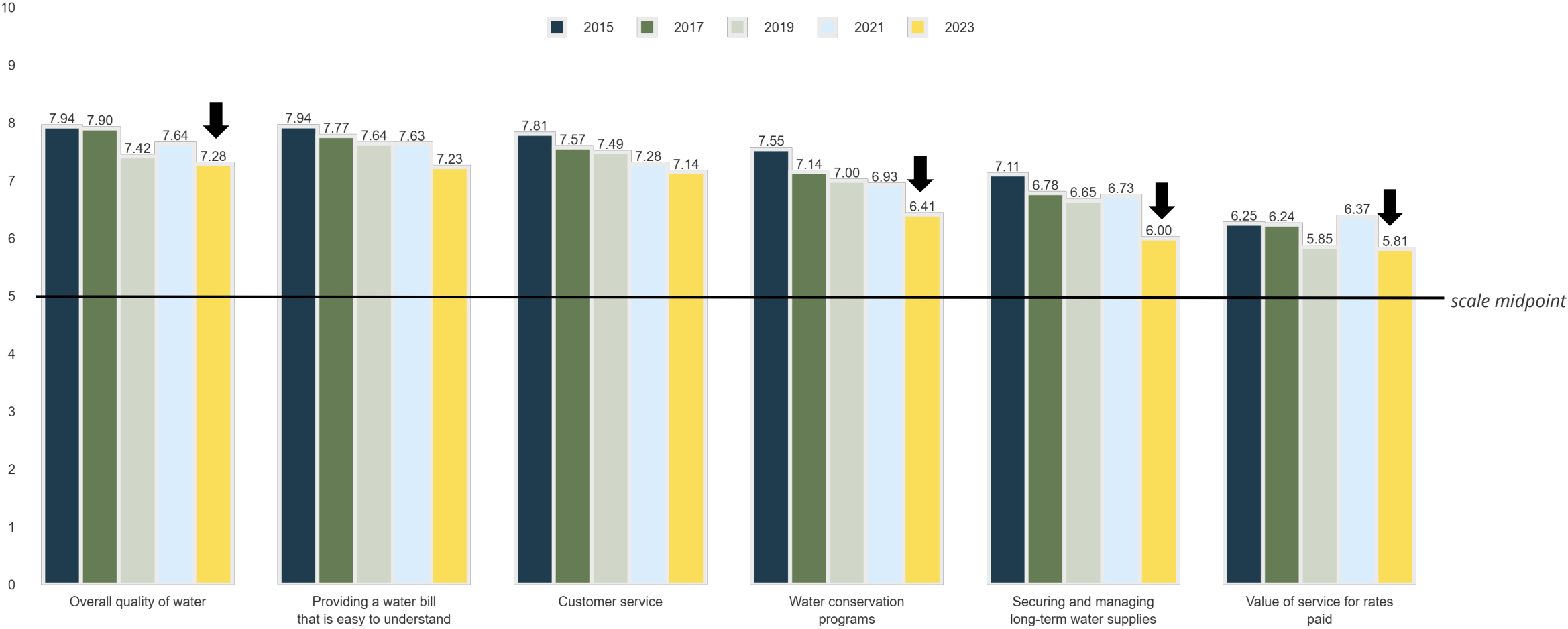


Castle Rock Water



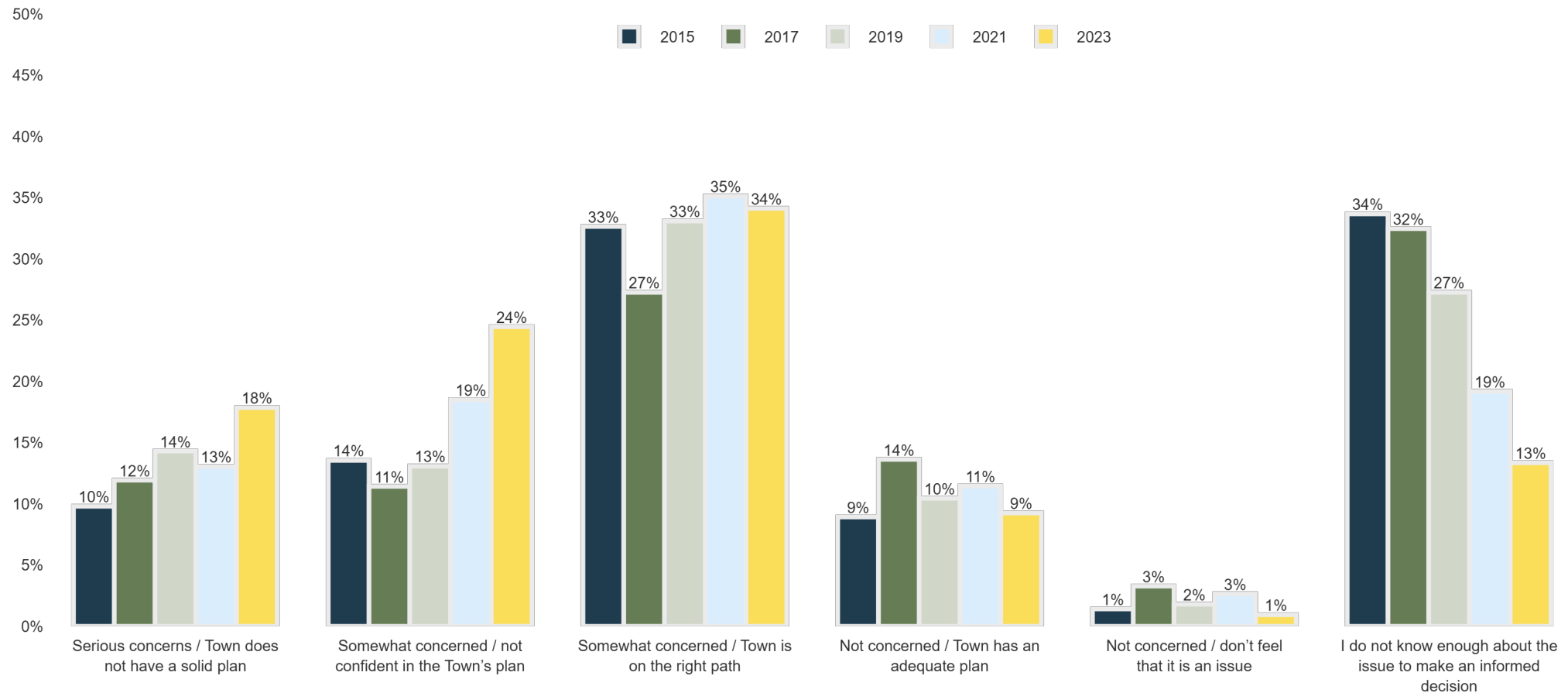
Castle Rock Water Services

- Four aspects of water service declined significantly from 2021: overall quality of water, water conservation programs, securing and managing long-term water supplies, and value of service for rates paid.
- The two aspects of Castle Rock's water service that did not change significantly from 2021 are "providing a water bill that is easy to understand" and "customer service".



Long-Term Water Issues

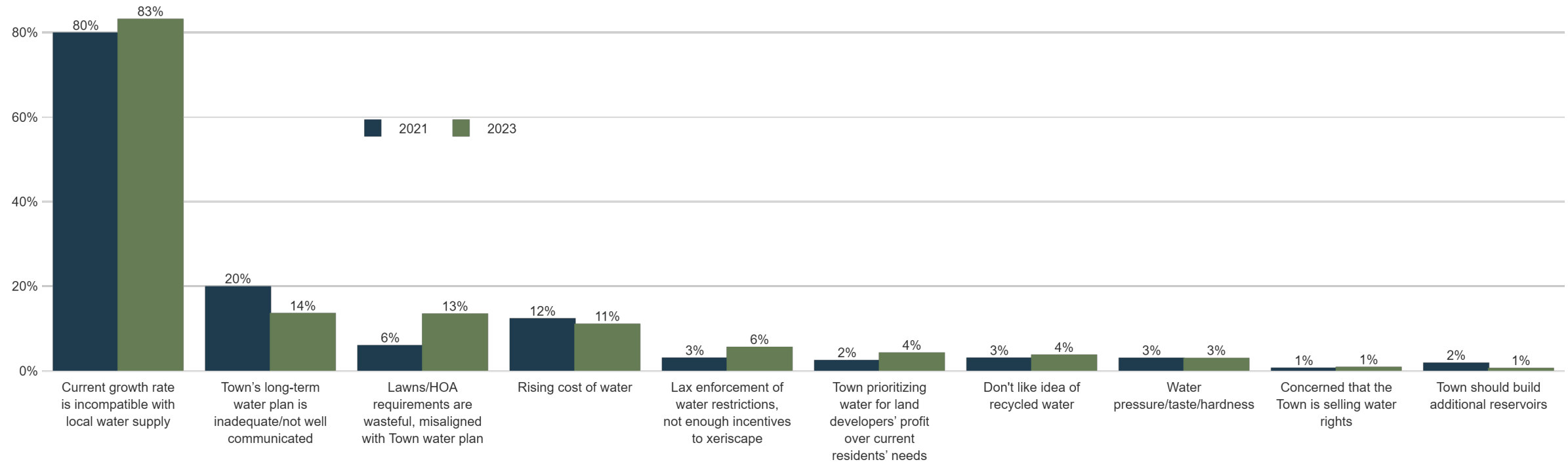
Respondents are becoming increasingly informed about long-term water issues. About a quarter of respondents are both *concerned and not confident* in the Town's long-term water plans. This is a statistically significant increase from 2021 levels. About a third of respondents are *concerned but confident* in the Town's long-term water plans.



Specific Water Concerns

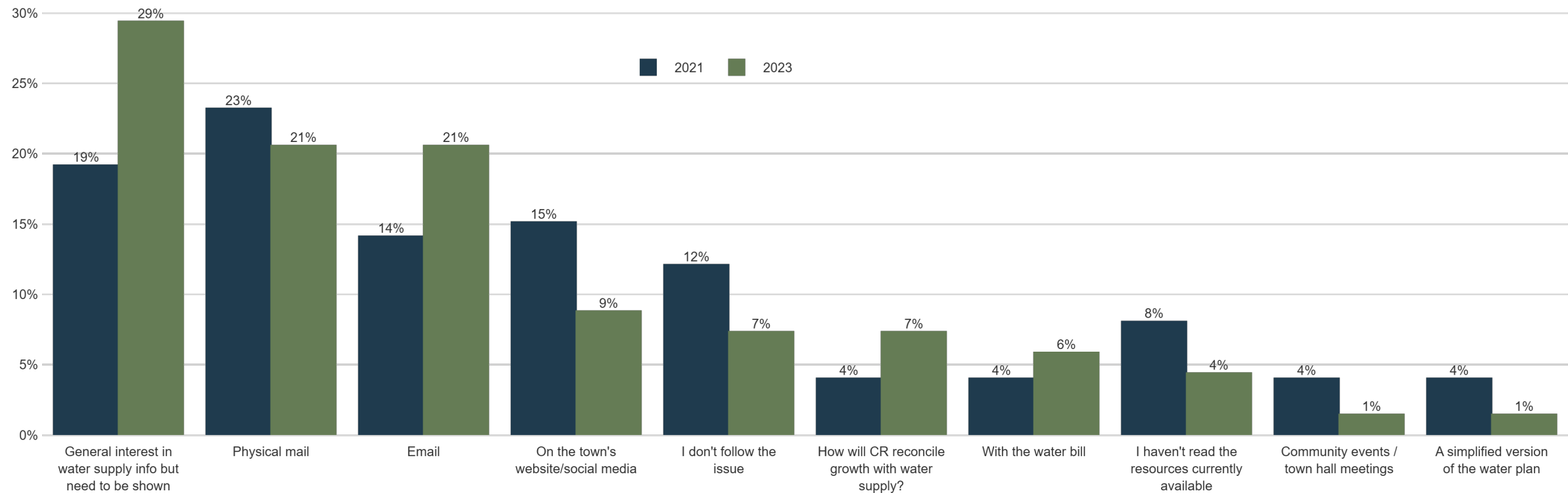
Respondents were even more concerned in 2023 than 2021 that Castle Rock's water supply cannot keep with housing and business developments. The most common themes among these comments:

- The Town is prioritizing developers over current residents by restricting water use but allowing new developments
- HOA lawn regulations (and Town landscaping) are counterproductive and must be addressed
- Castle Rock does not have a sustainable long-term water solution that provides for its growing population
- Water bills are high regardless of actual consumption; not enough incentive to save water



Communicating the Town's Long-Term Water Plan

Respondents are generally interested in receiving more information about the Town's long-term water plan. Physical mail and email were the most commonly listed methods of desired communication. There were no significant changes in these categories between 2021 and 2023 due to the relatively small number of respondents who gave an open-ended response.



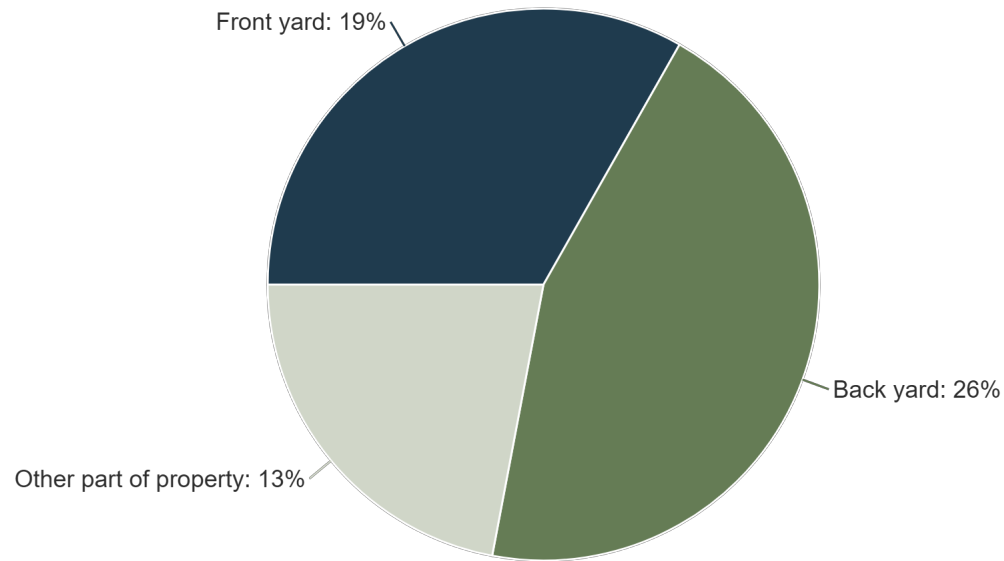
ColoradoScape Rebate - Awareness

Prior to reading about it in the 2023 survey, 42% of respondents (n=639) were aware of the ColoradoScape rebate program.

Of the 43% of respondents who said they currently have ColoradoScaped property (n=626), 45% (n=296) were aware of the rebate program. Only 7% of those with ColoradoScaped property took advantage of the rebate program (n=43).

Most respondents with ColoradoScaped property weren't aware of the rebate program. The vast majority of those who were aware of the program still did not participate.

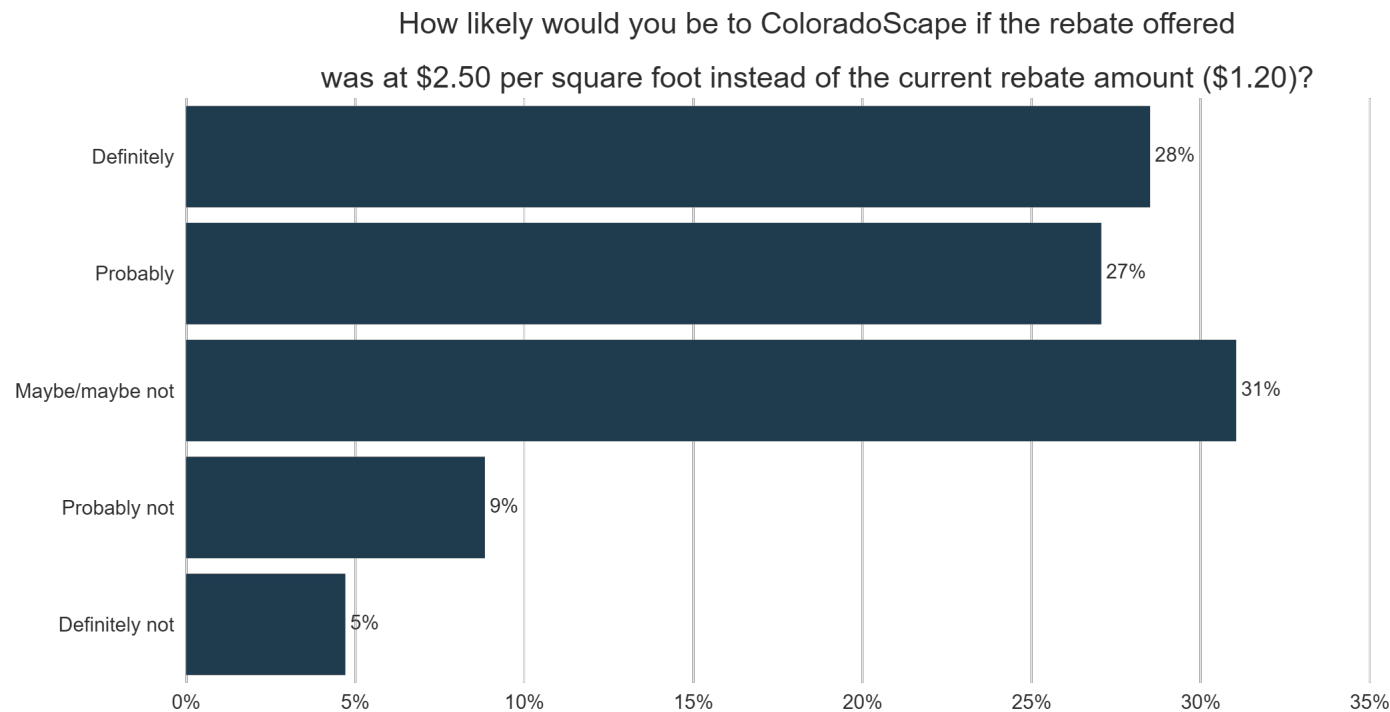
These responses indicate a large opportunity to increase **knowledge of** and **participation in** the rebate program.

ColoradoScape Rebate - Incentives

45% of respondents did not ColoradoScape any part of their property.

8% of respondents did not have a yard or were not in charge of their yard.

69% of those who did not ColoradoScape say that free design services and expertise would help incentivize them to do so.



Over half of respondents who did not ColoradoScape say that increasing the incentive to \$2.50/sqft would **probably or definitely** incentivize them to do so.

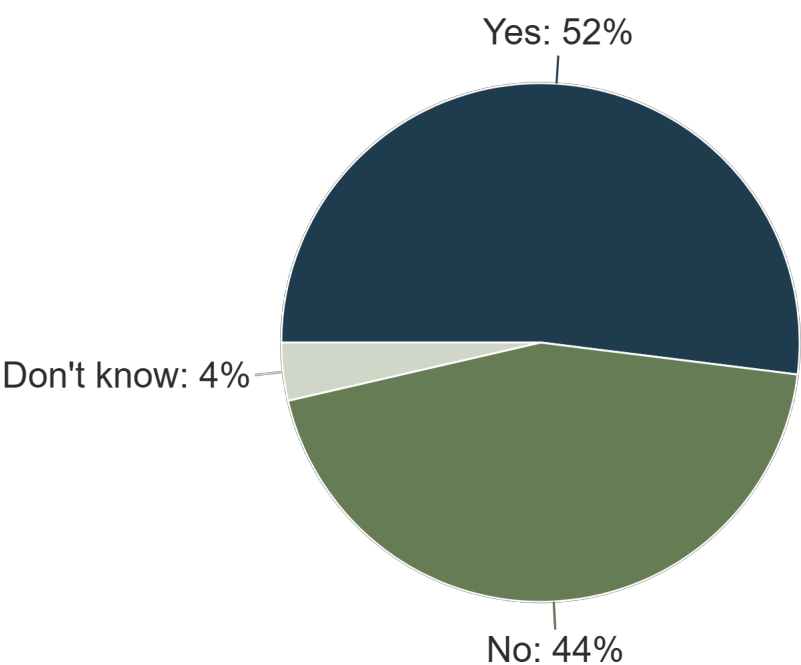
Roughly half of eligible respondents weren't aware of the rebate, and only 14% of those who were both eligible and aware actually took advantage of it.

Have you accessed the new online water billing system which was updated in January 2023?

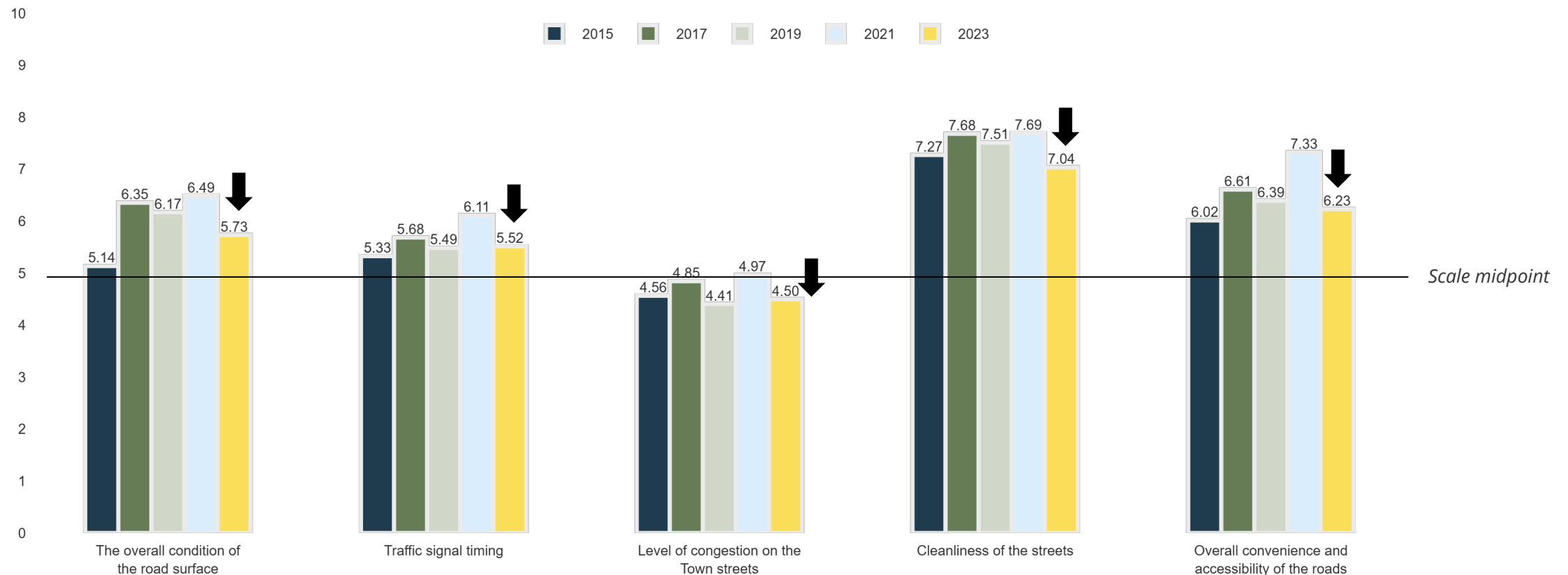

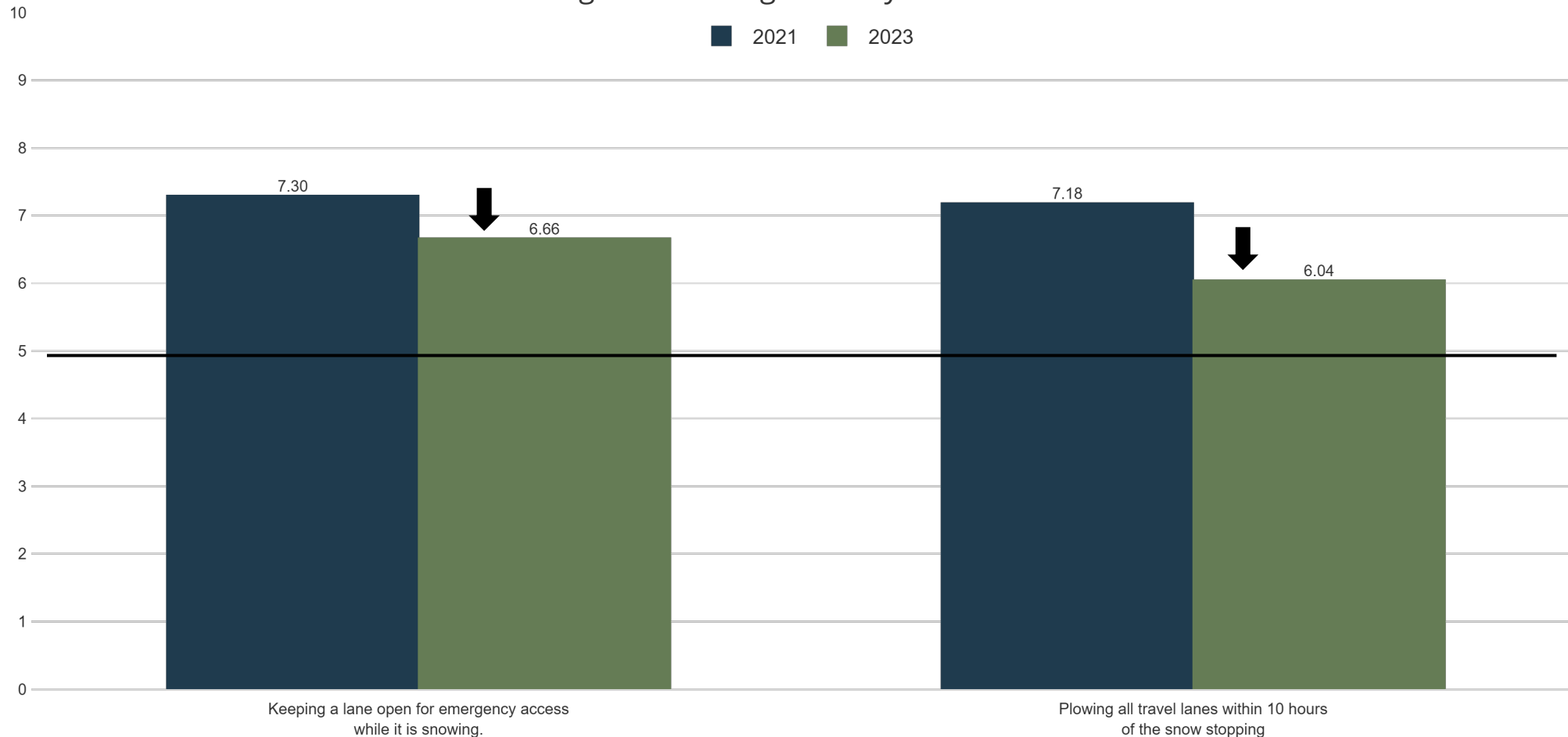

Respondents are most satisfied with street cleanliness and convenience/accessibility, and least satisfied with congestion.



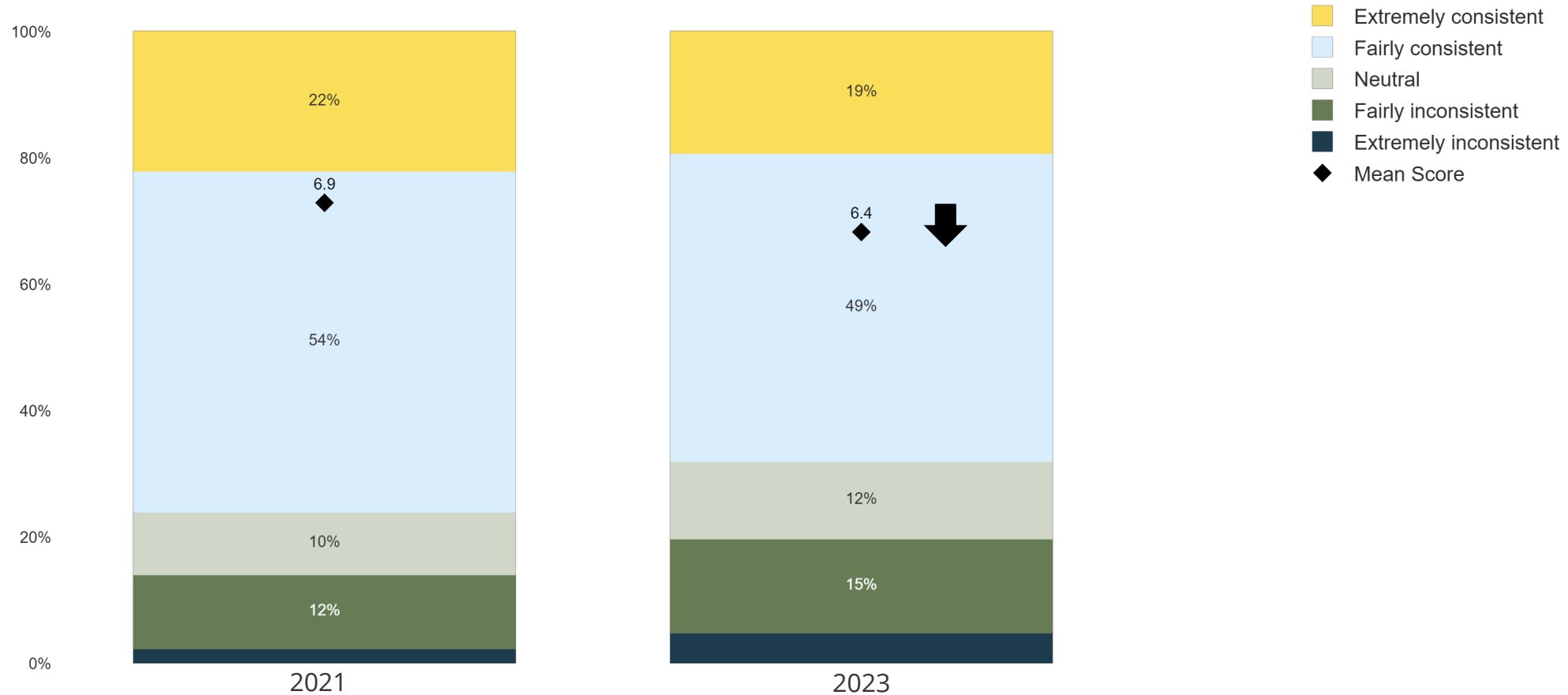
Plowing the Streets

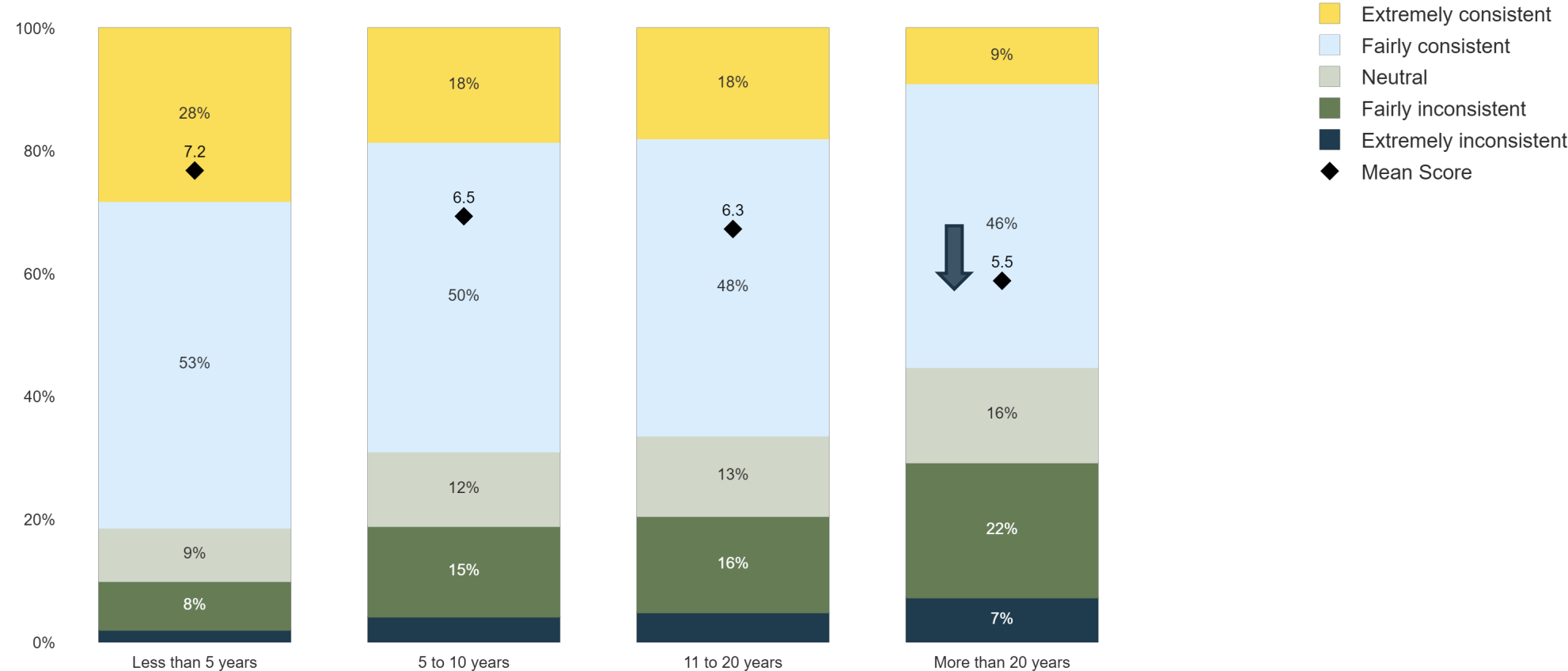
Travel Time - Trended

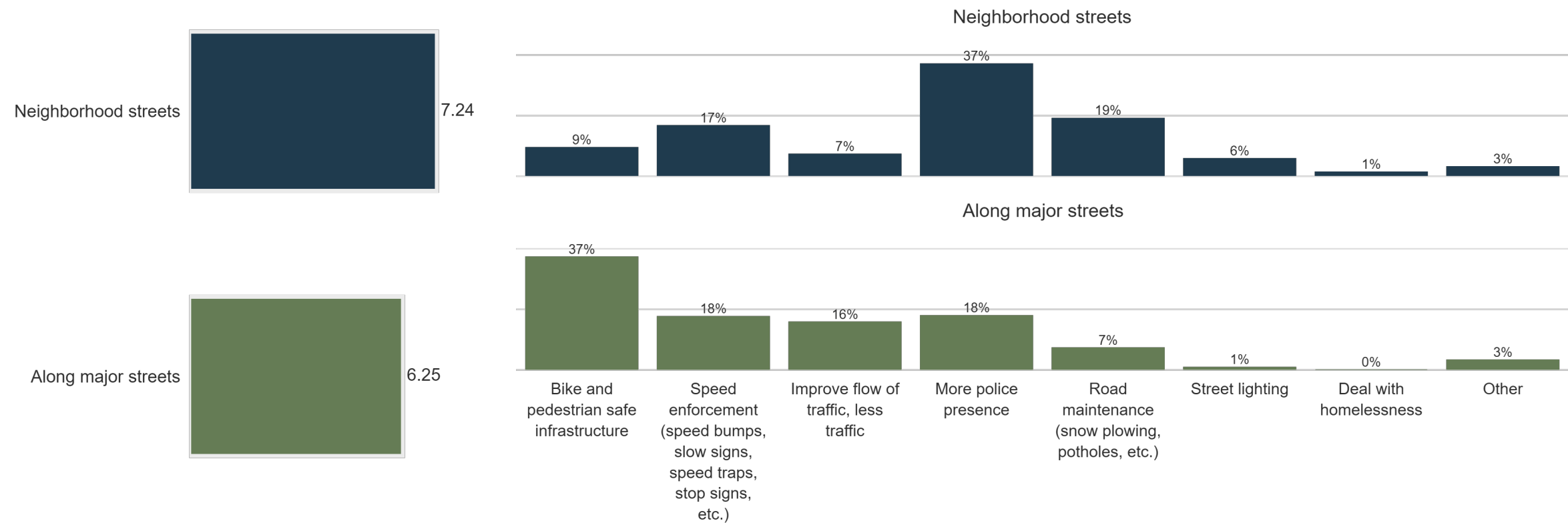

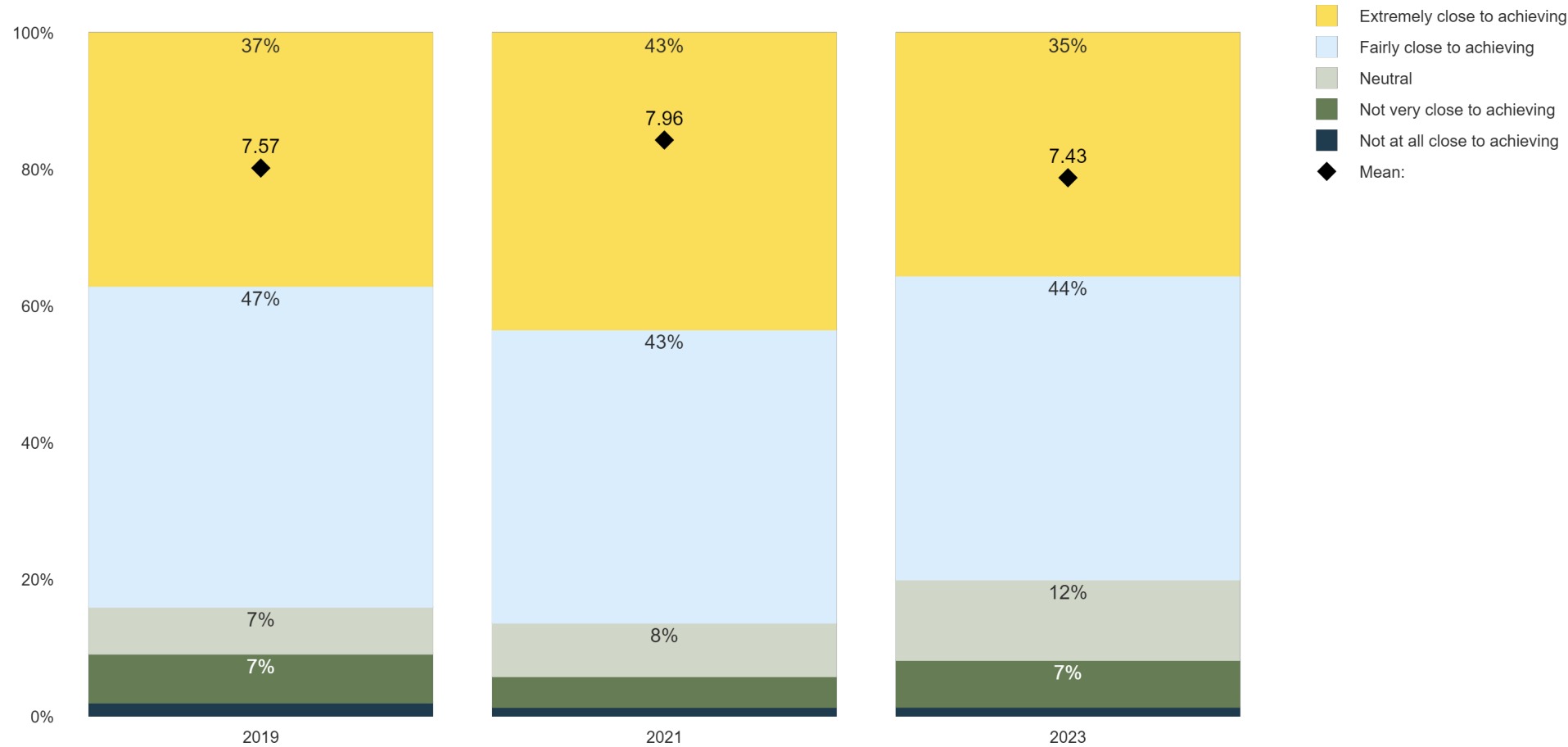

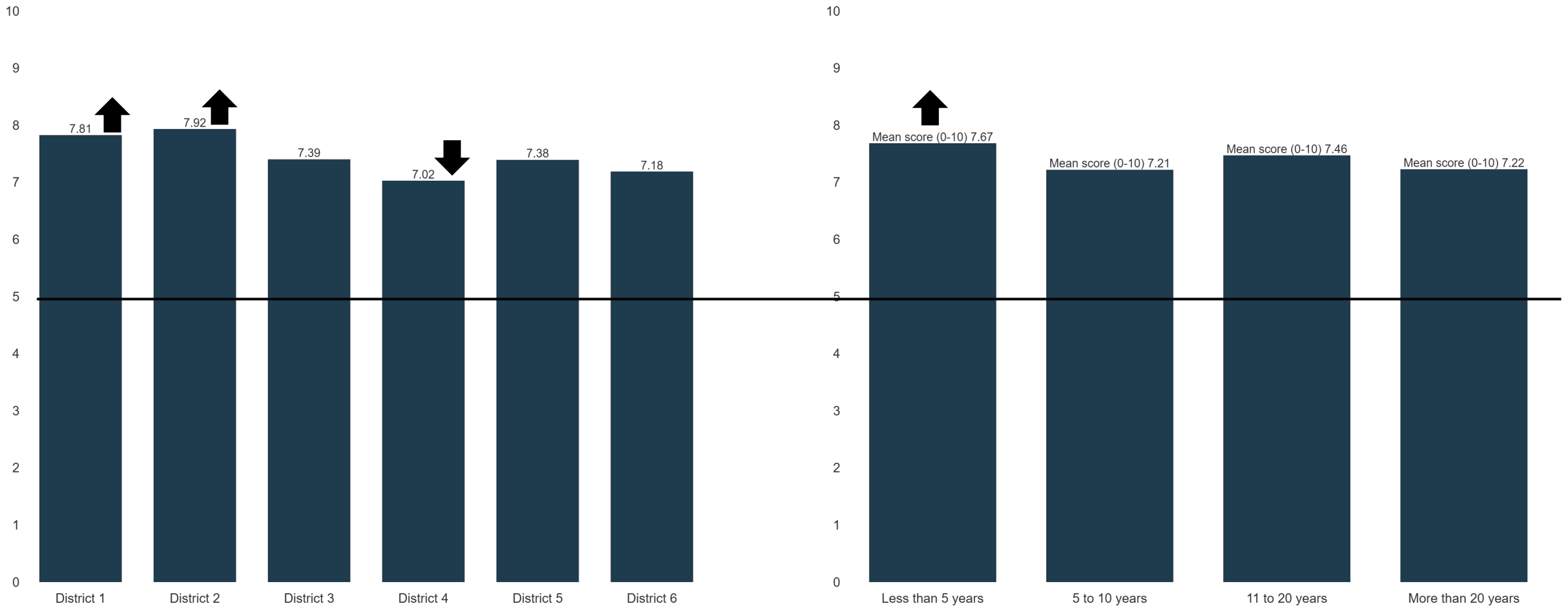

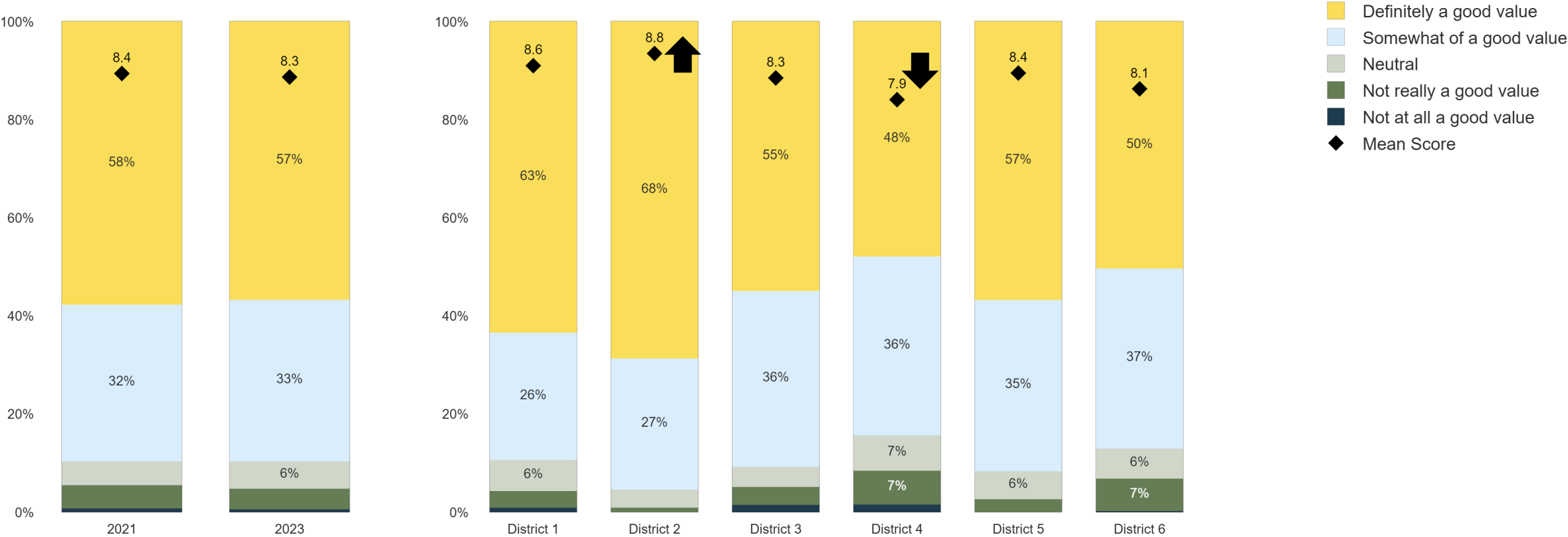
"Walkable" Parks Comparisons

Value of Access to Parks and Trails

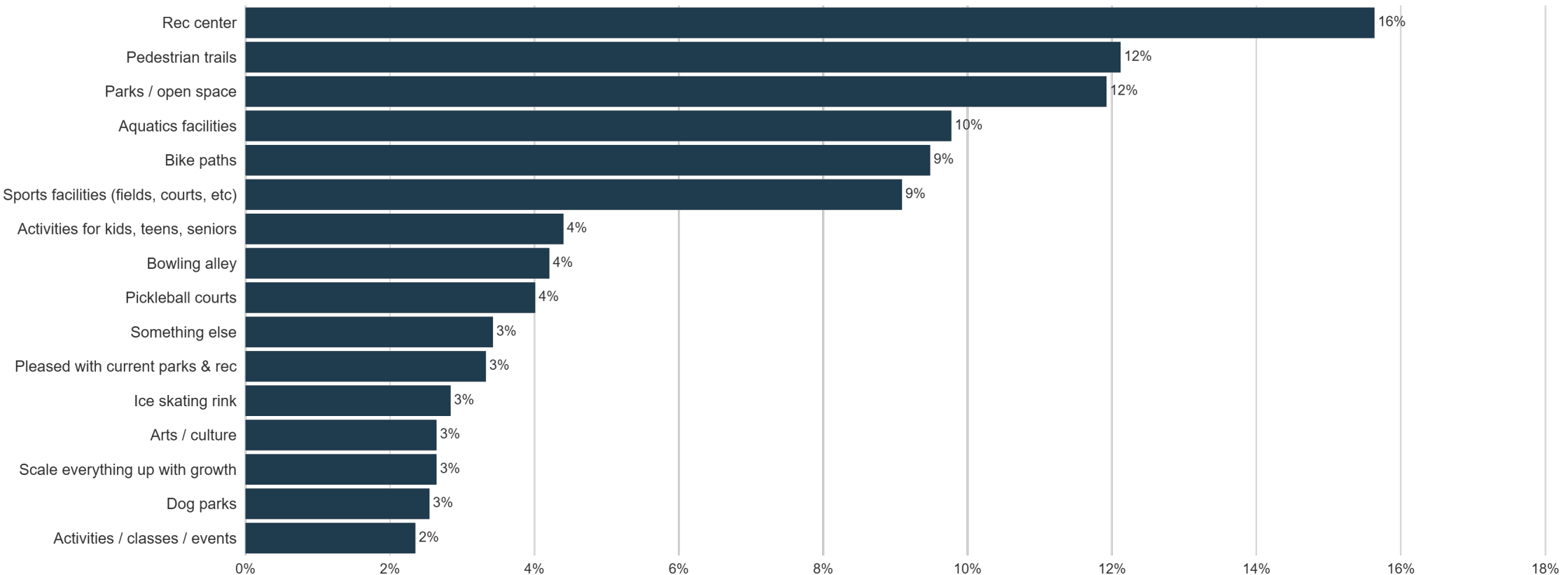

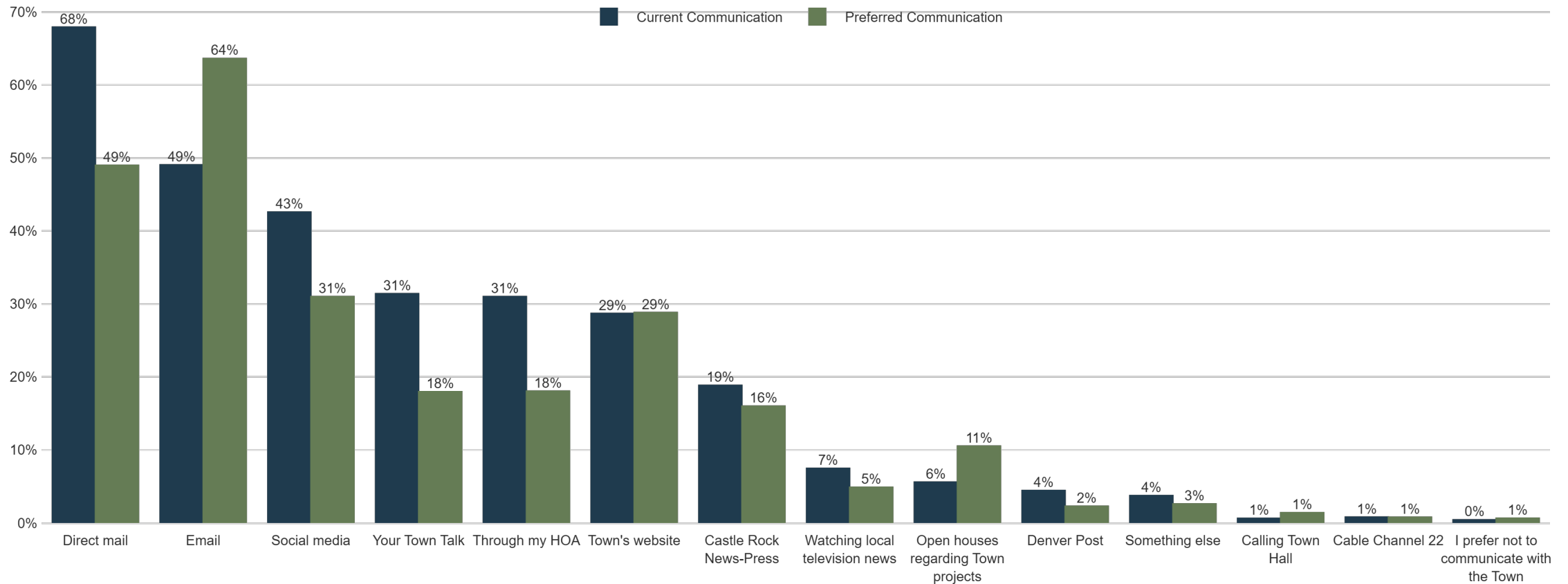

Current vs. Preferred Methods

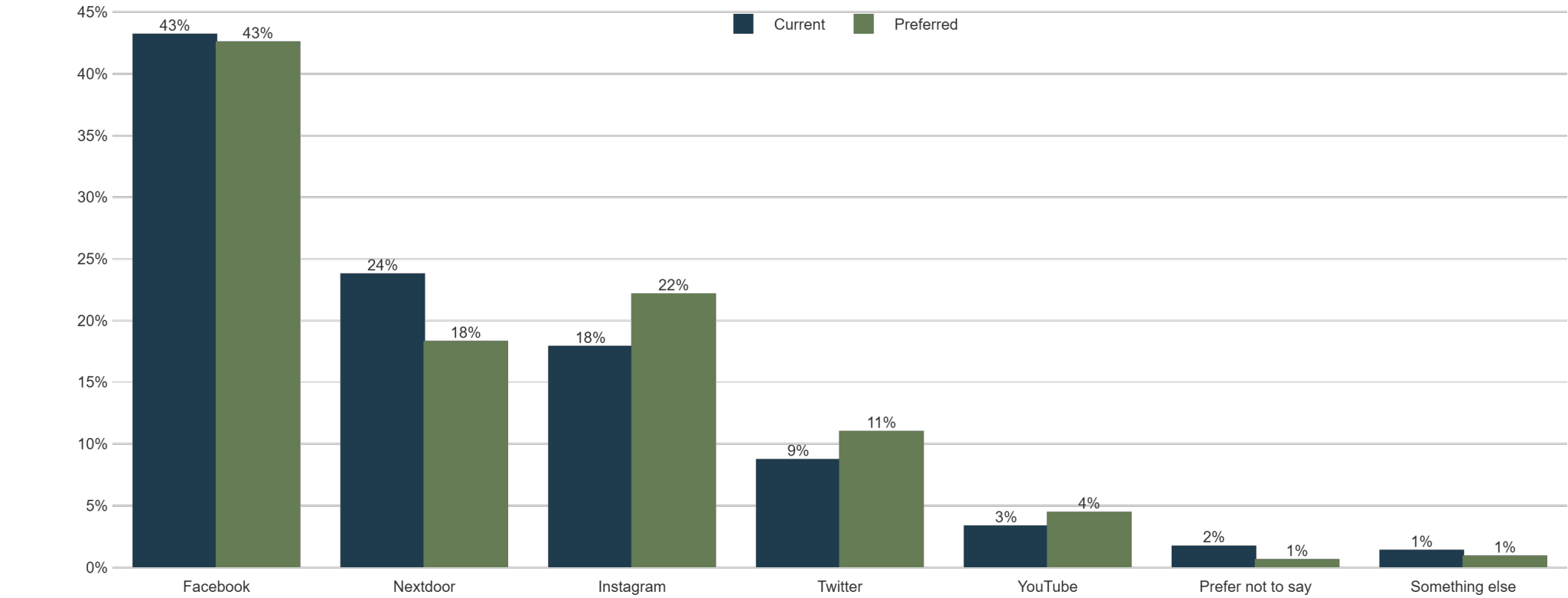
On average, respondents would prefer to receive fewer direct mail communications and more email communications. Email was the only communication channel that respondents would prefer to use substantially more than they currently do.

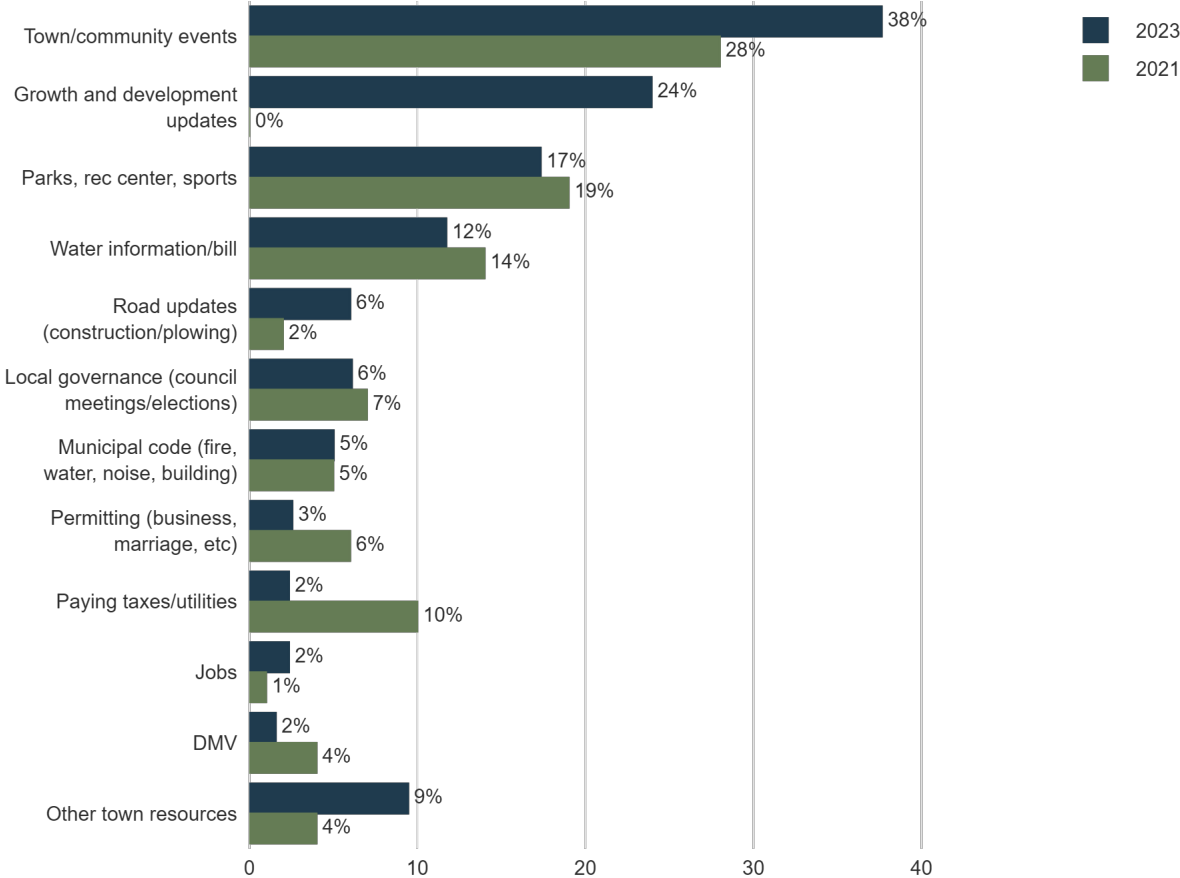

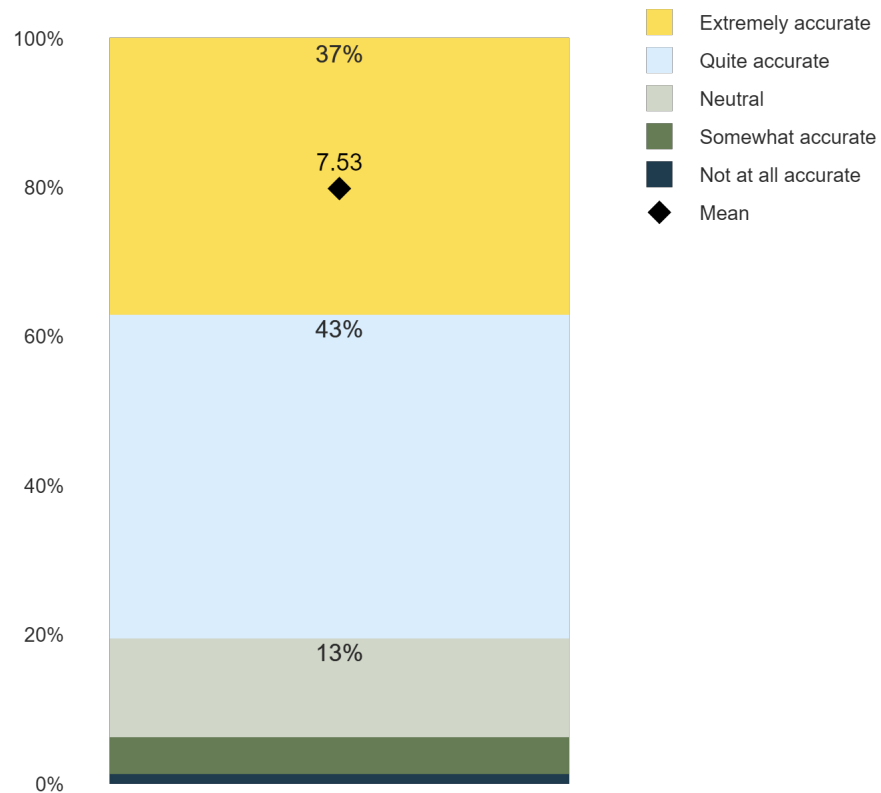
What information are you typically looking for when you visit the Town's website (<https://CRgov.com>)?



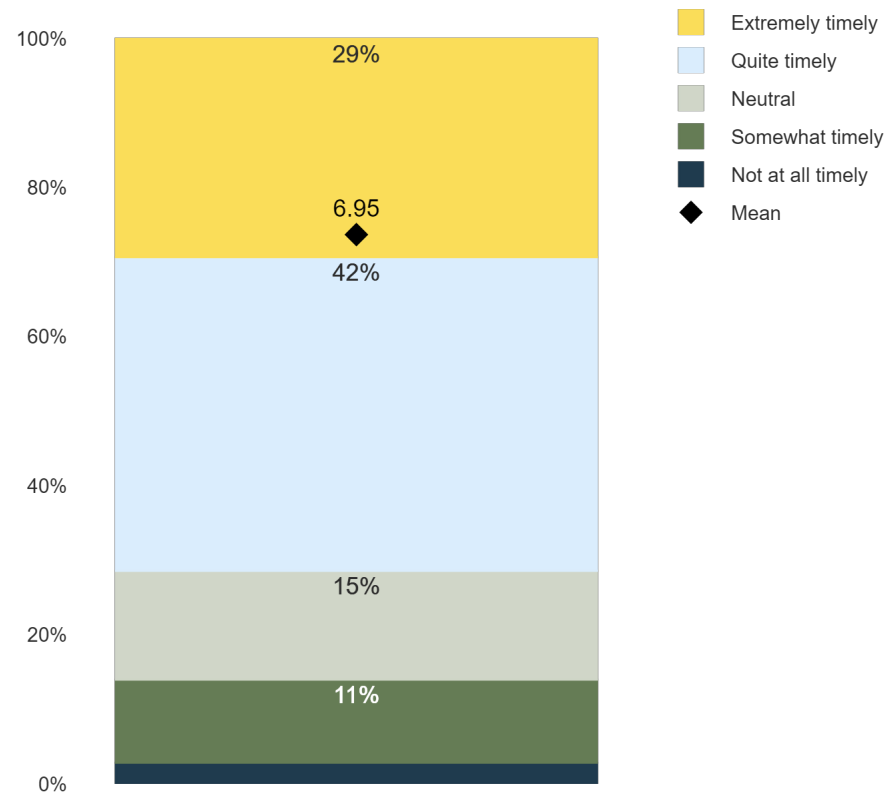
Information Ratings

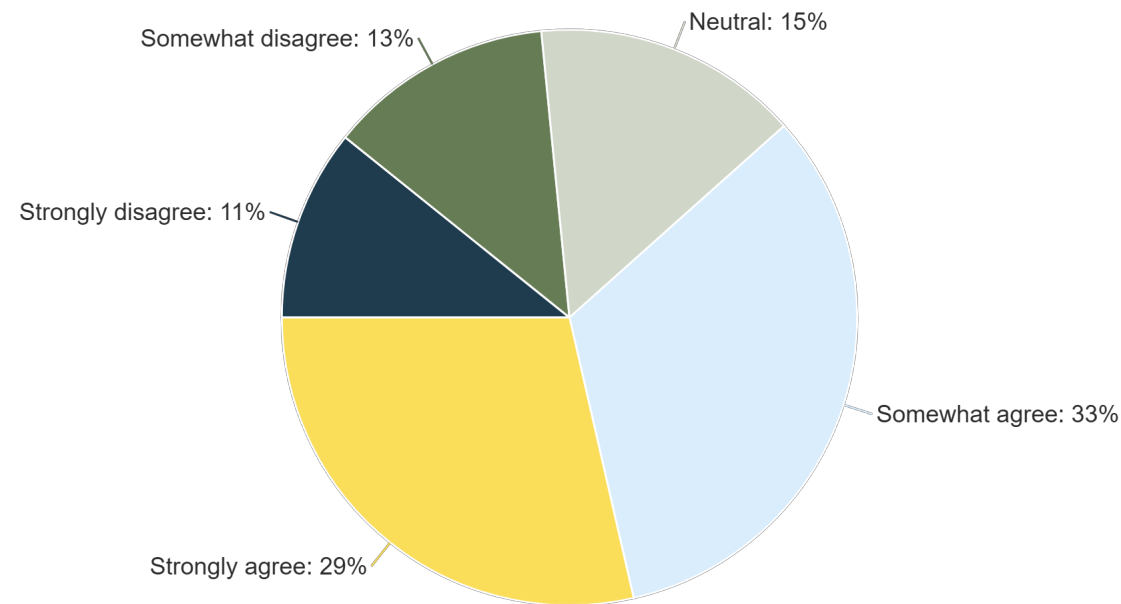

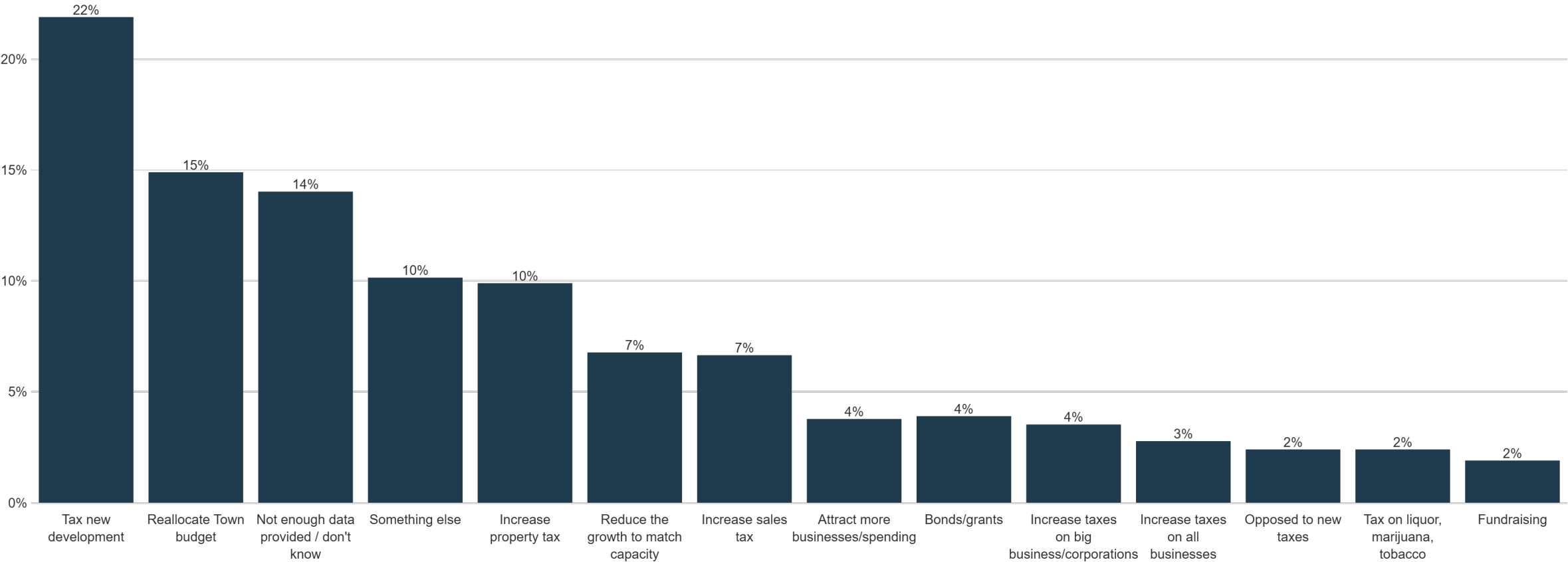

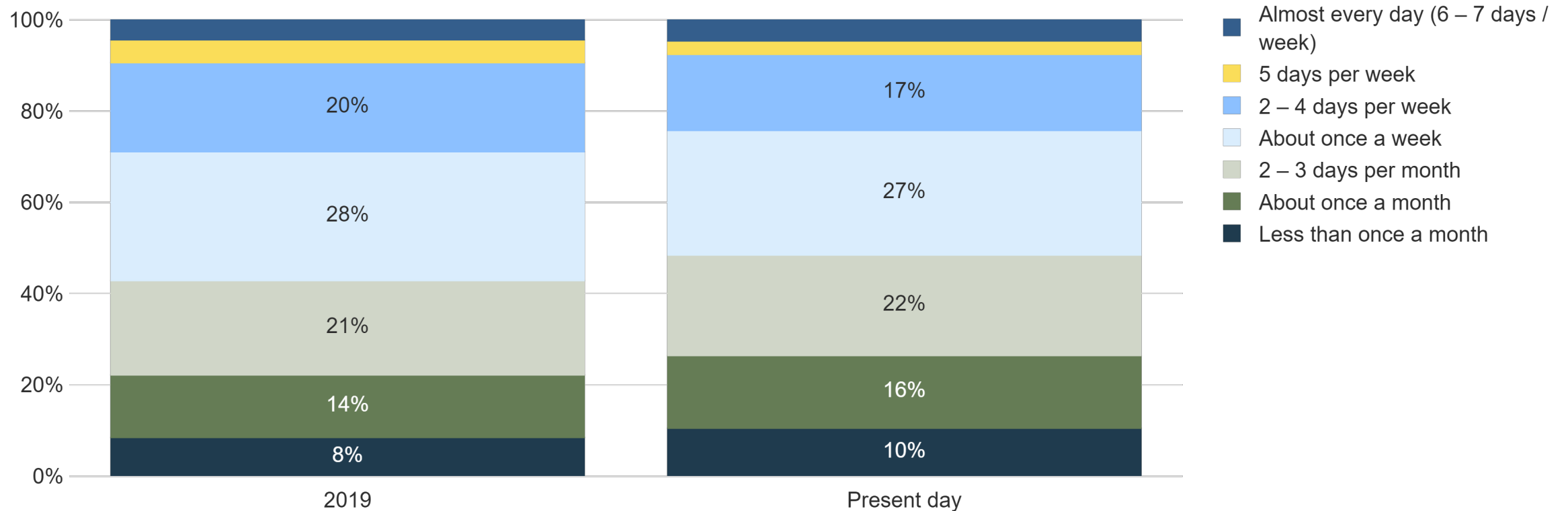
Funding Public Safety Programs

When asked how Castle Rock should get additional revenue to fund public safety programs (police, fire, EMS), the most frequent response was to tax new residential and commercial development.



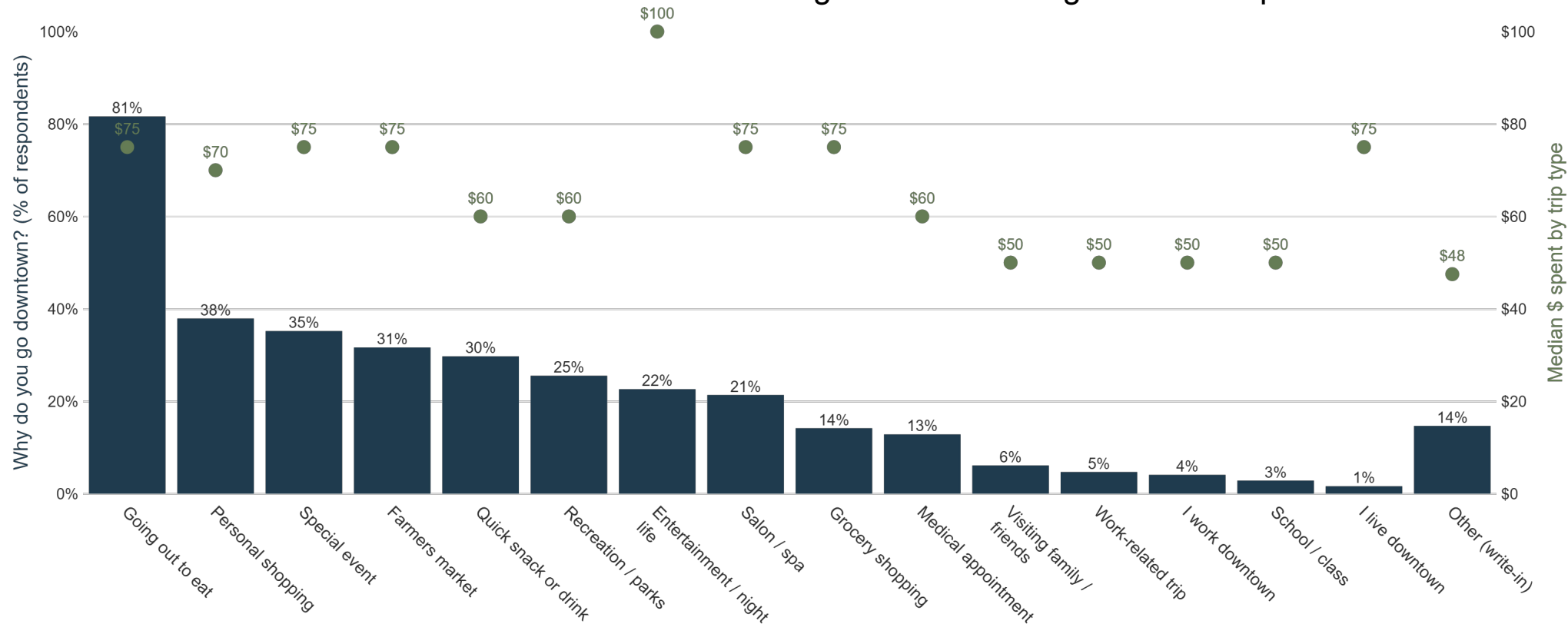
Downtown

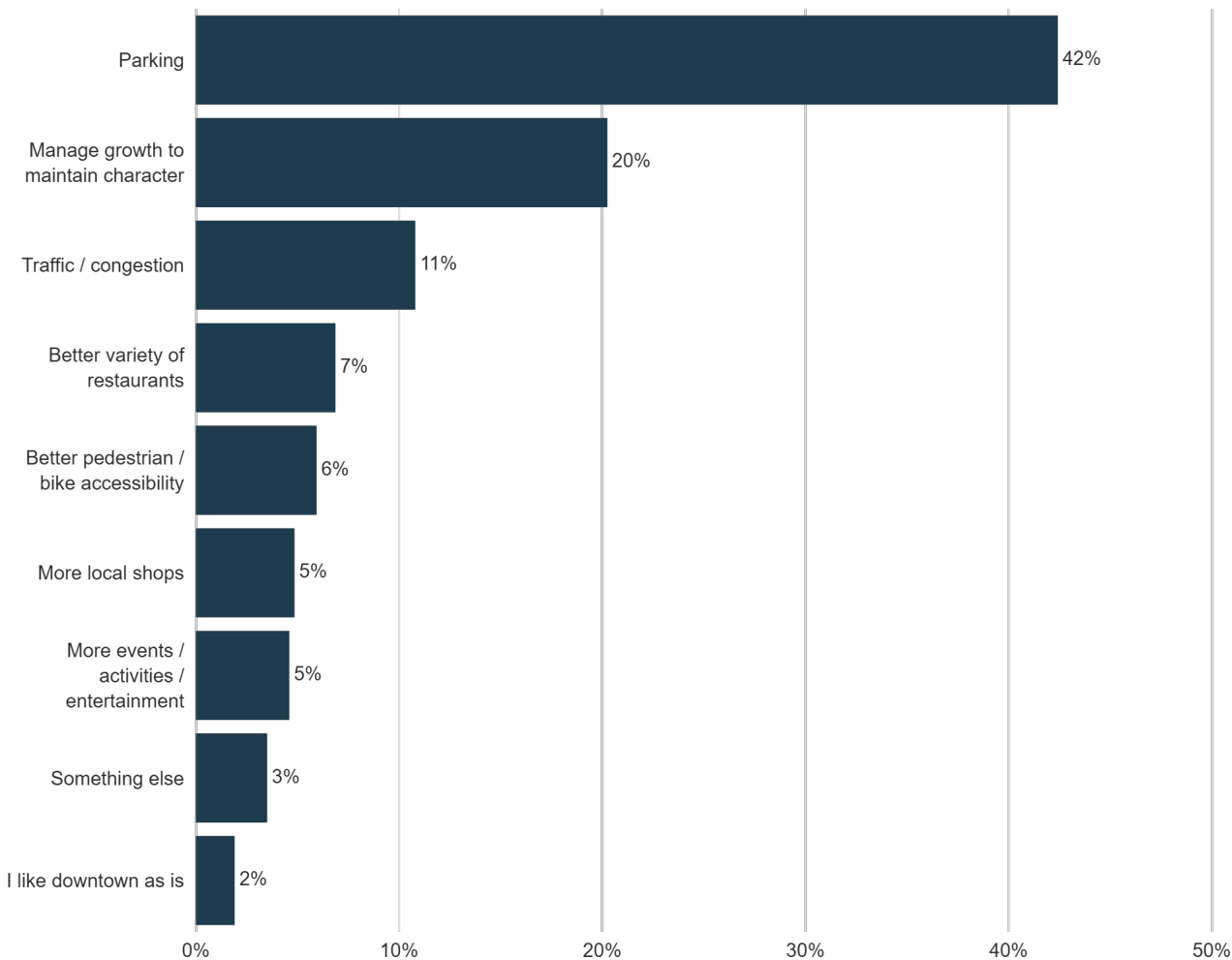


Downtown Activities

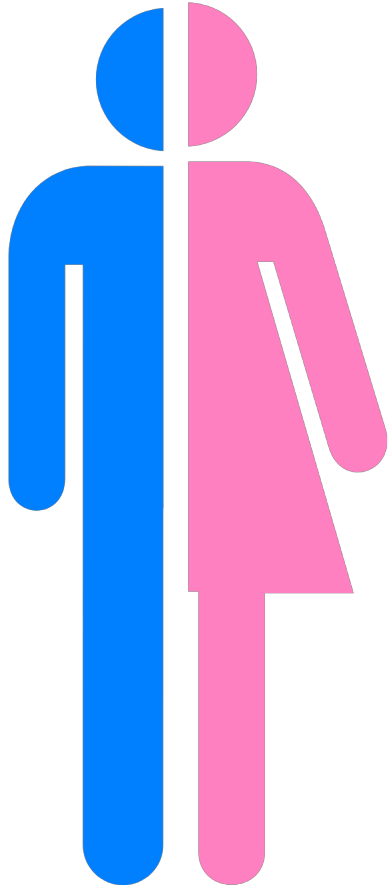

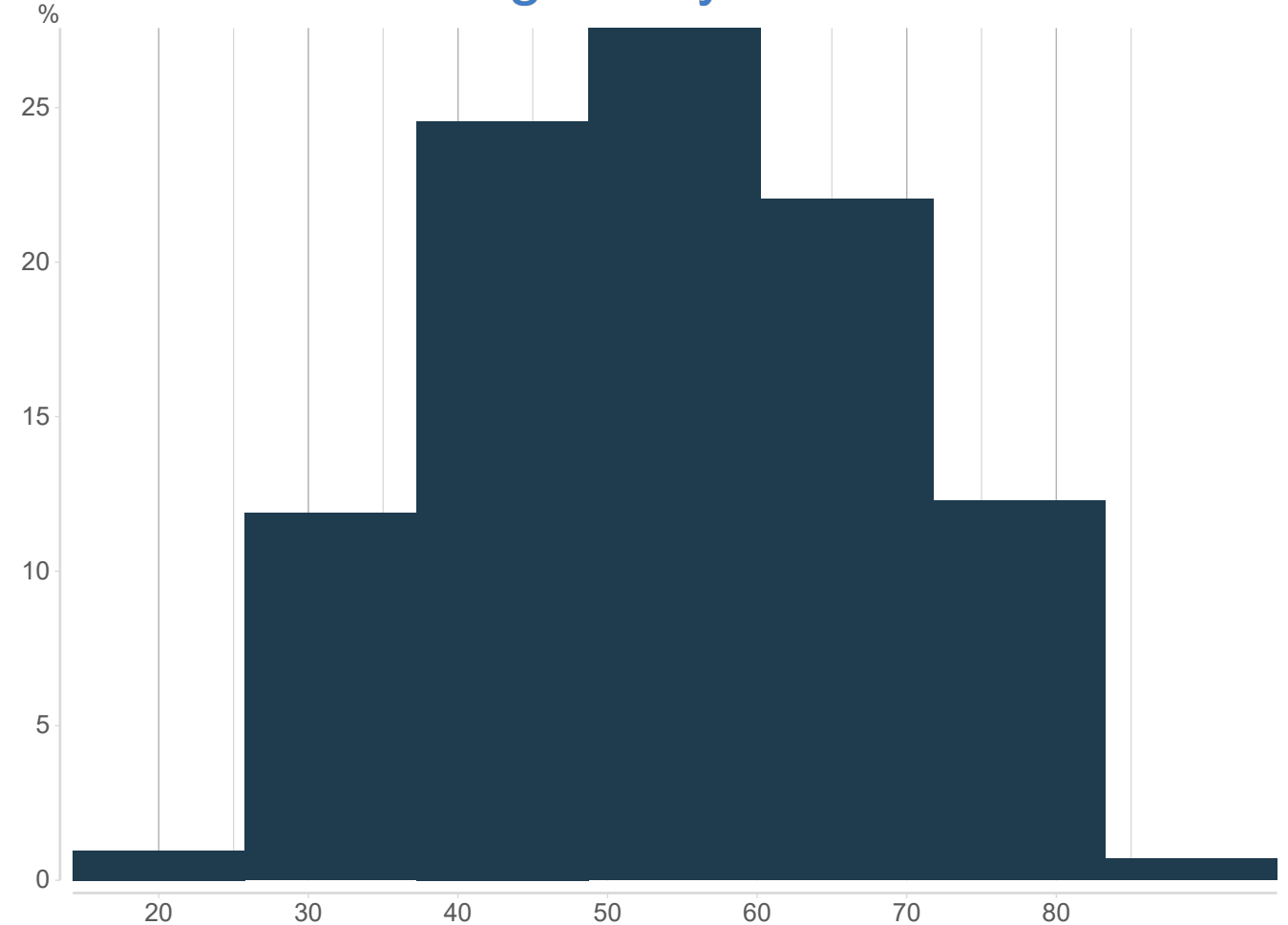

Respondent Age

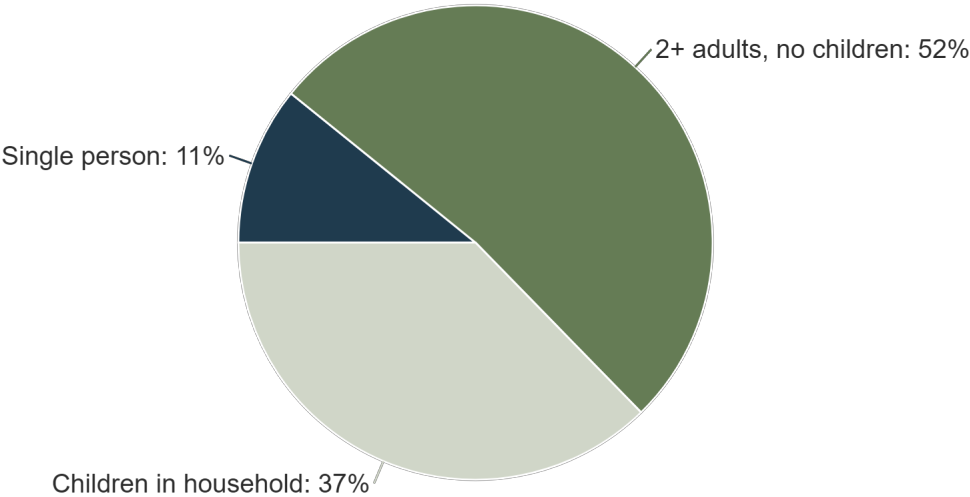

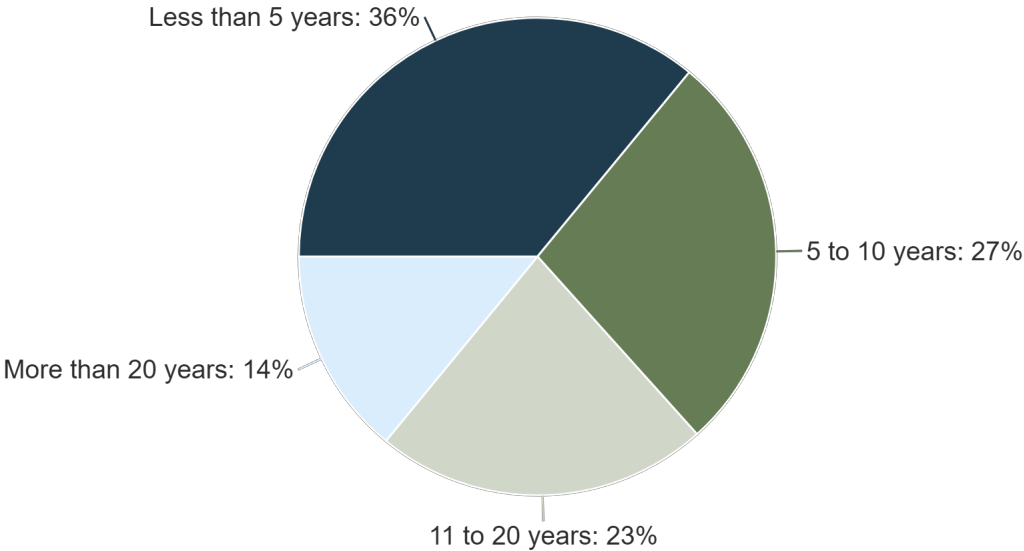

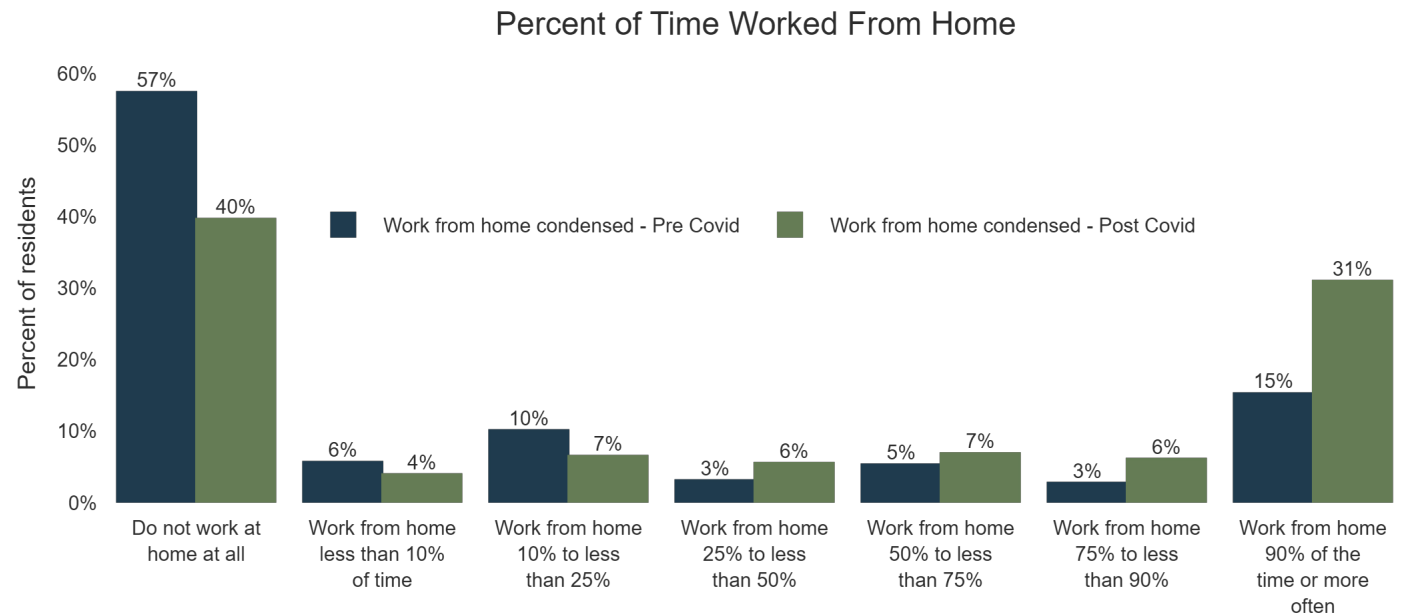
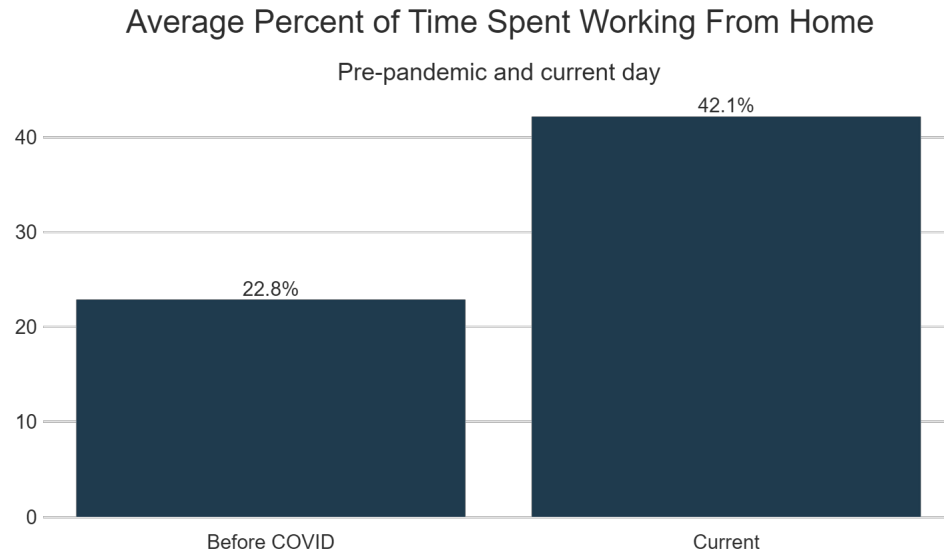
Work from Home

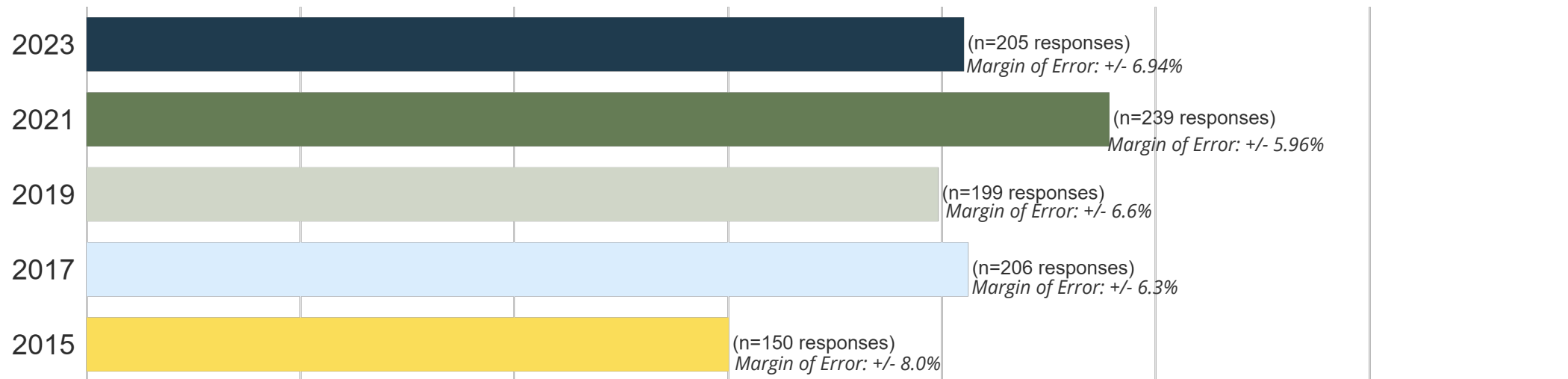
Business Survey Results



Methodology: Business Survey

A similar approach was used to reach licensed businesses located within the Town limits. The Town provided ComEngage with the list of 2,116 businesses with valid addresses and / or phone numbers. A letter was sent to all businesses on the list with a valid address, asking participants to complete the survey online or by calling the data collection partner. Email invitations were sent to all businesses with a valid email address. Follow-up phone calls were made to businesses that did not respond.

This approach resulted in a total of 205 surveys. The margin of error for the business survey is no greater than plus or minus **6.94%** at 95 percent confidence. Note that due to the small “universe” of businesses, the finite population factor is taken into account when determining statistical significance. The finite population factor is a mathematical adjustment to the margin of error when a survey results in a sampled population of more than 5% of the total population. In this situation, the survey effort resulted in the number of sampled businesses (completed surveys) accounting for 11% of the businesses in the Town.



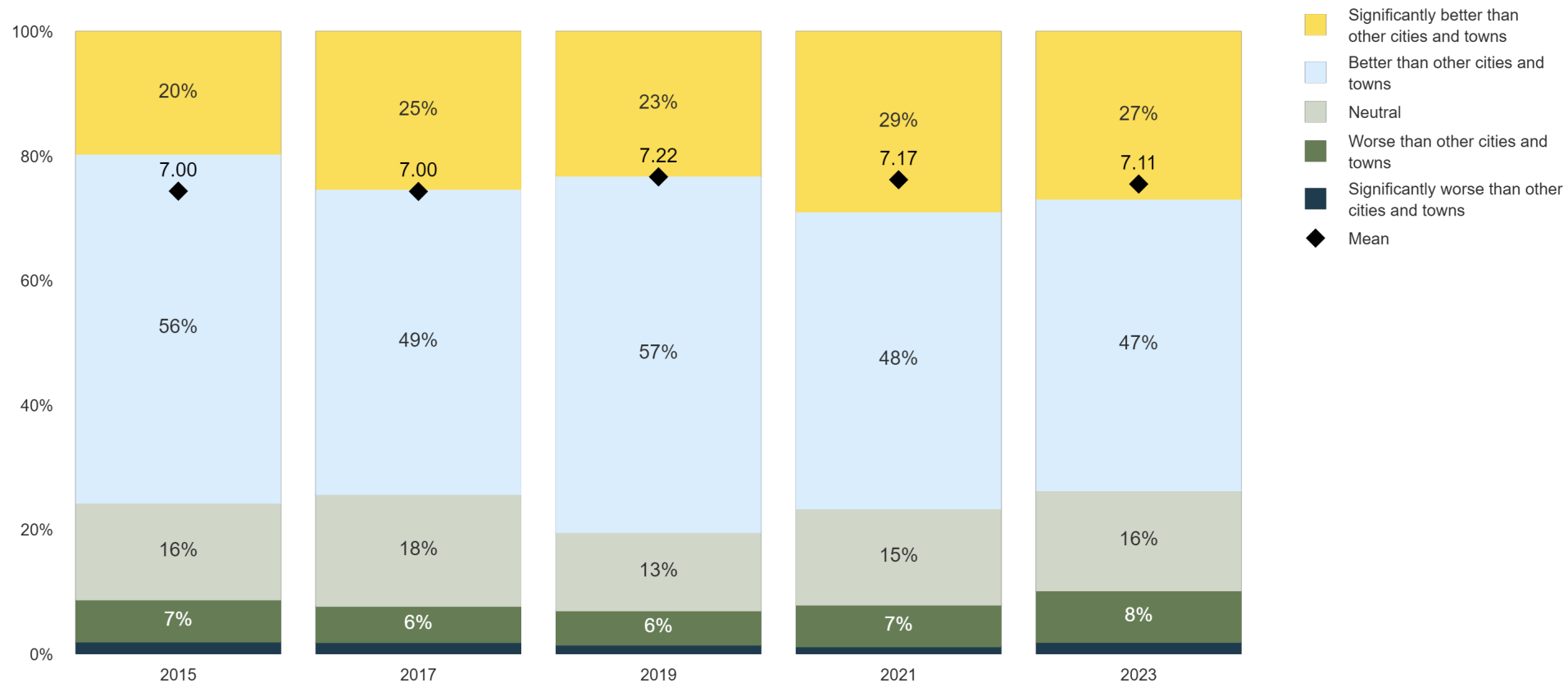

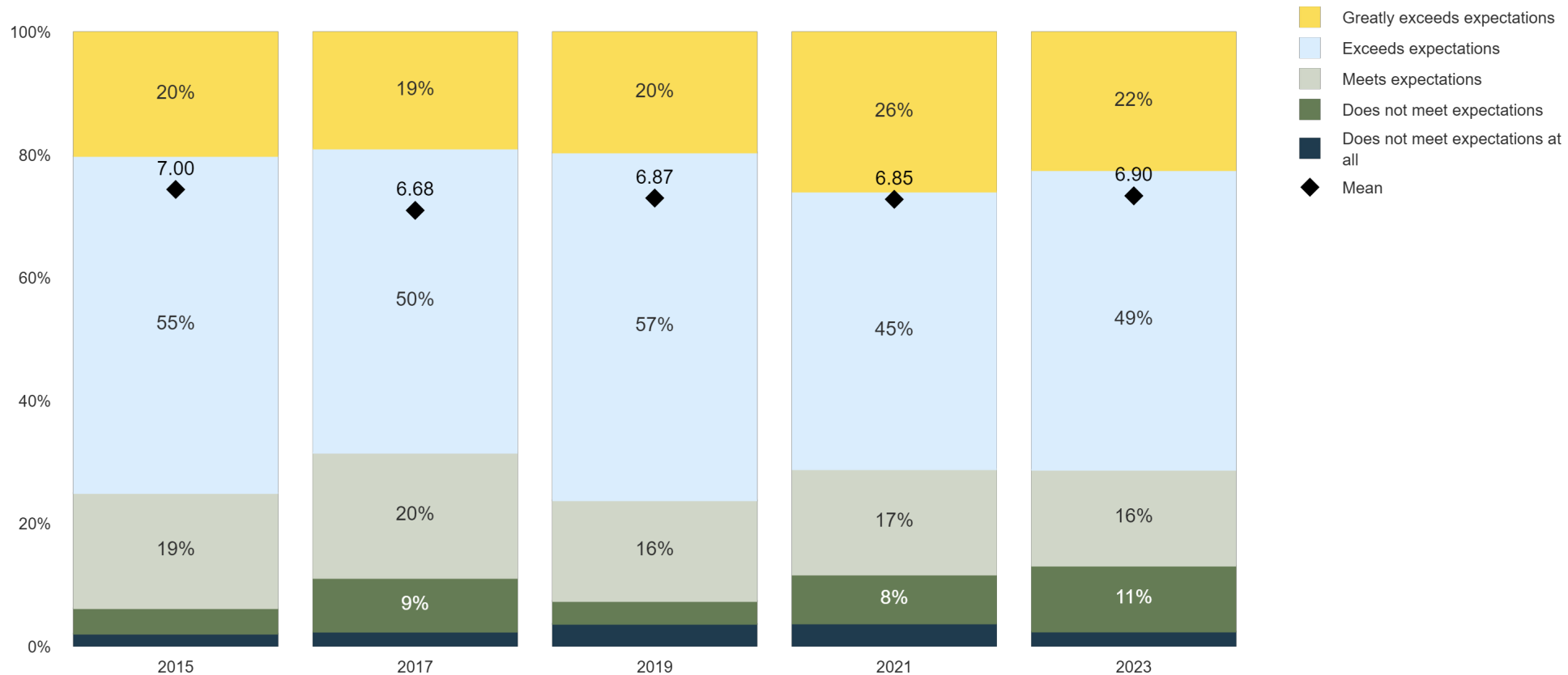

Three out of four businesses believe that Castle Rock is better than other cities and towns as a place to operate a business. Responses to this question have remained consistent since 2015.



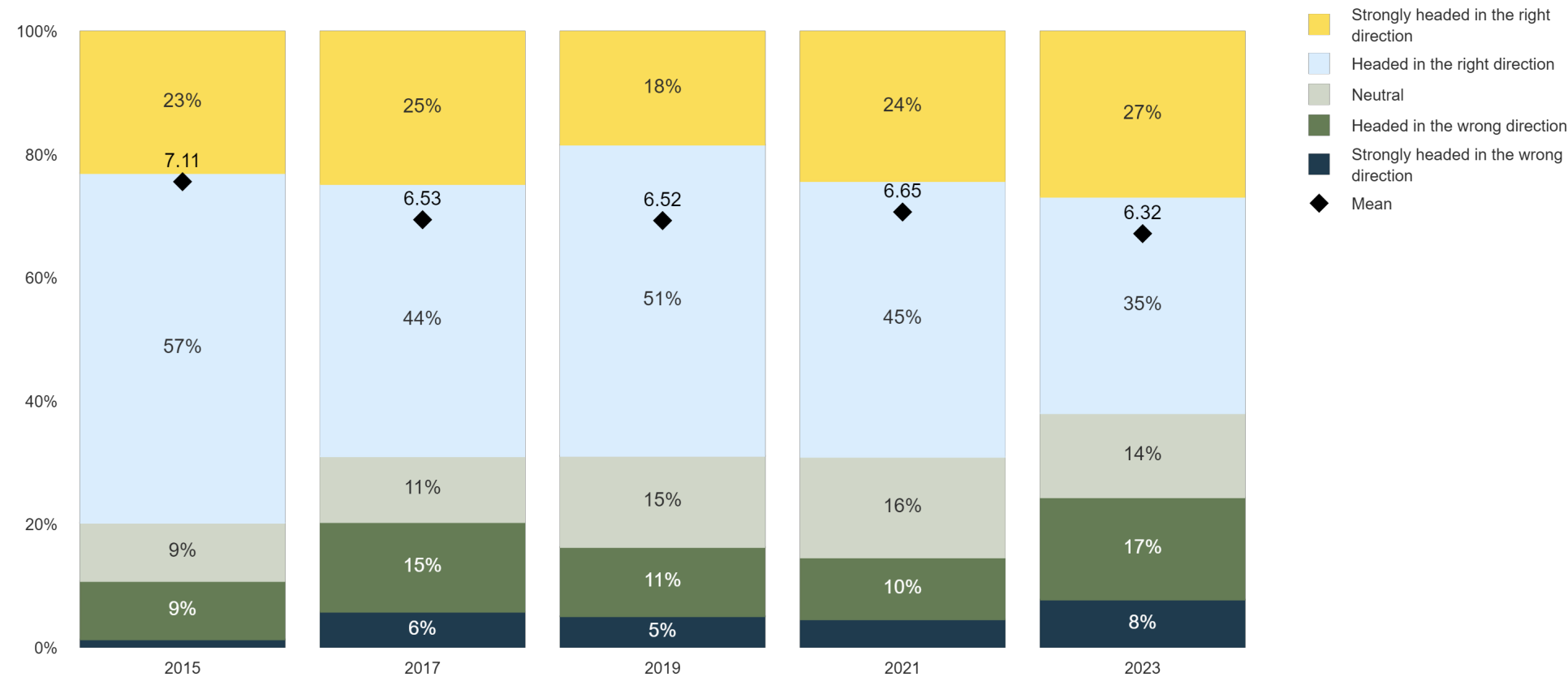
Quality of Town Services

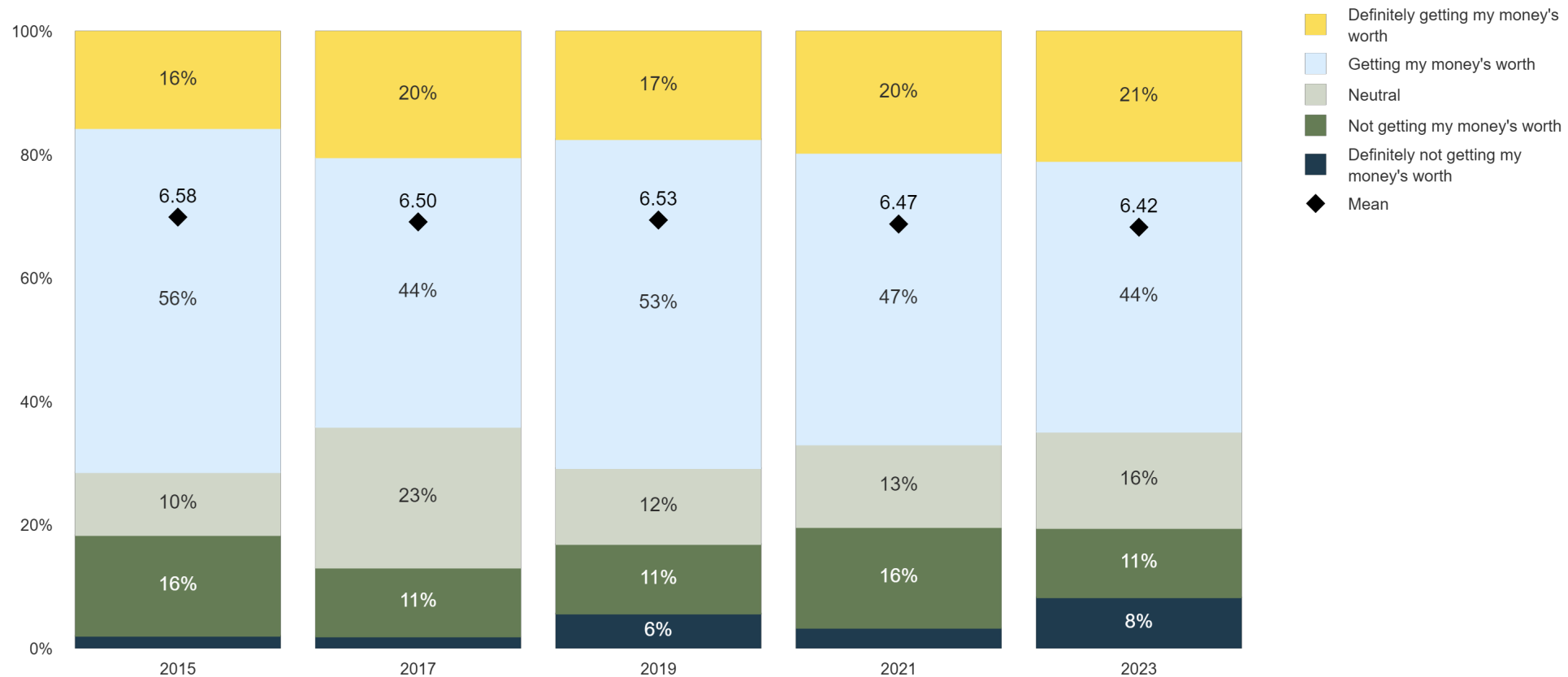
Direction Town is Headed

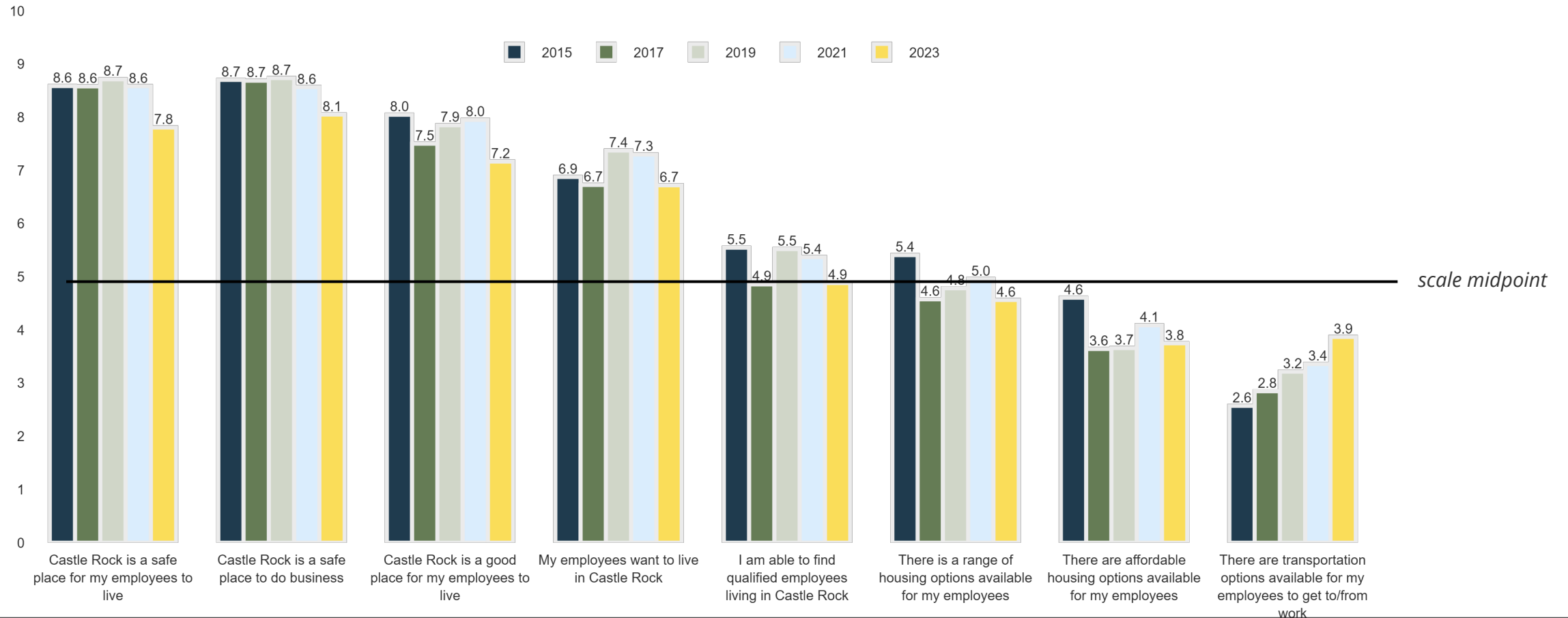
Value of Services for Taxes Paid

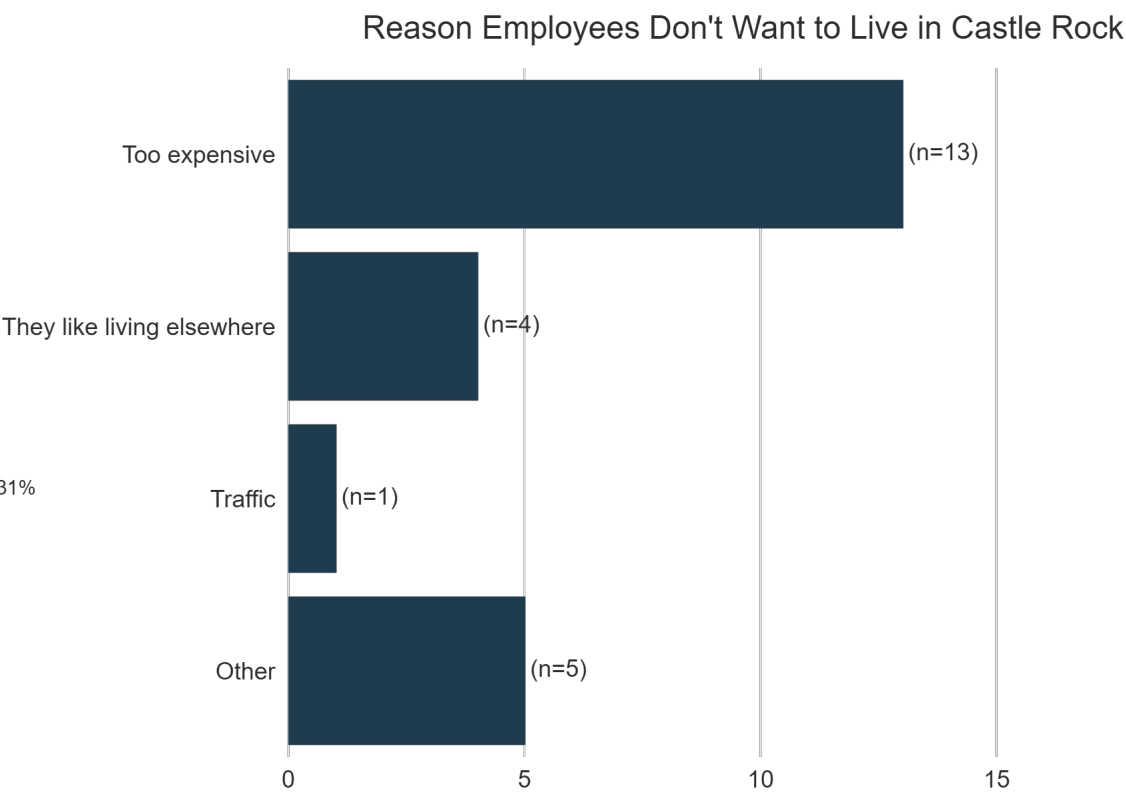
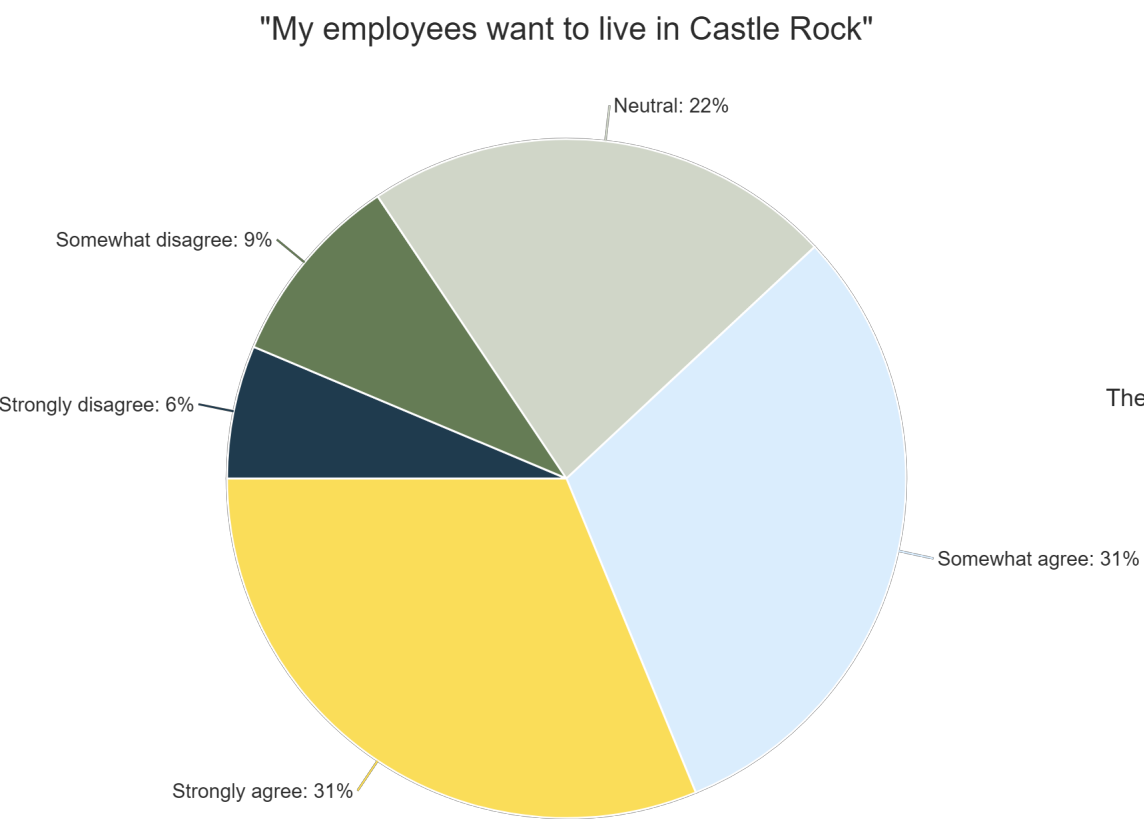

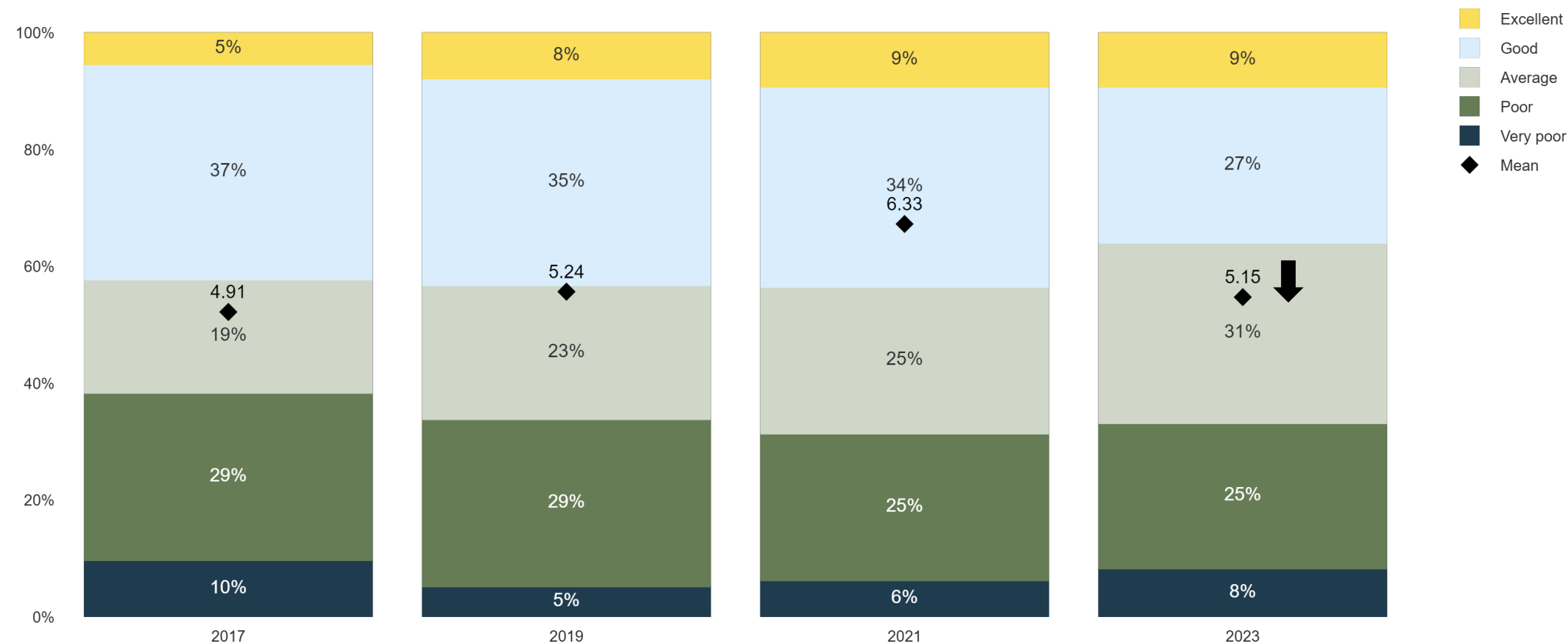

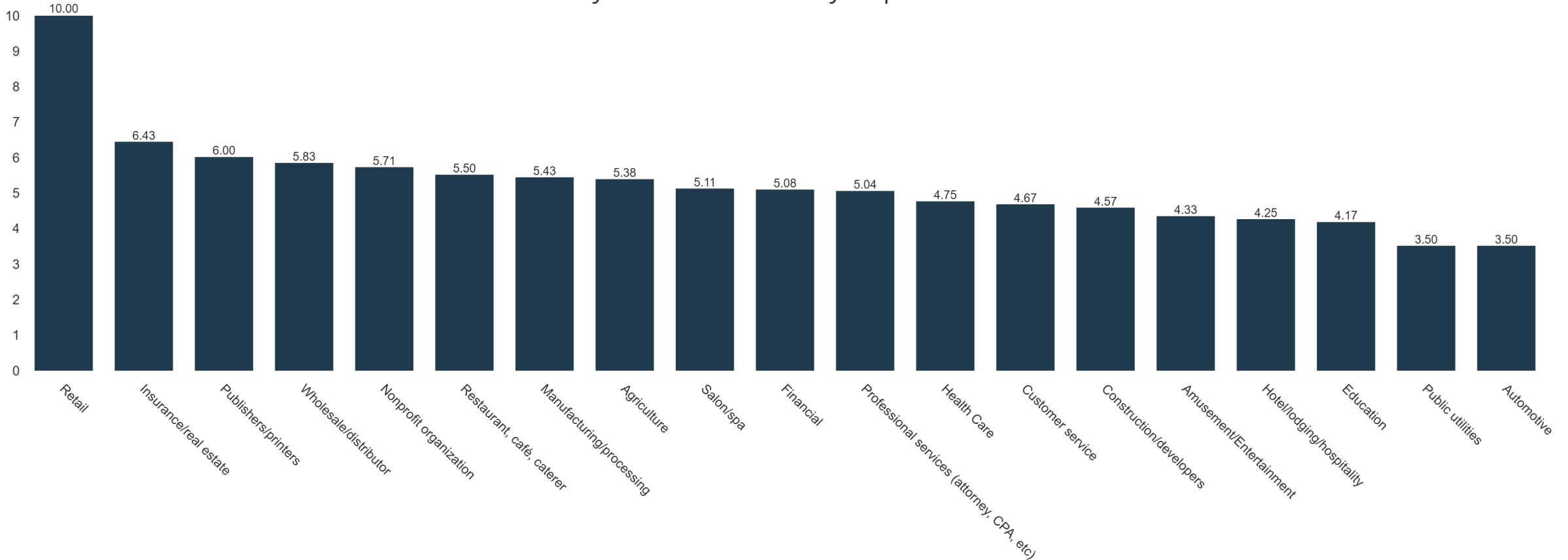

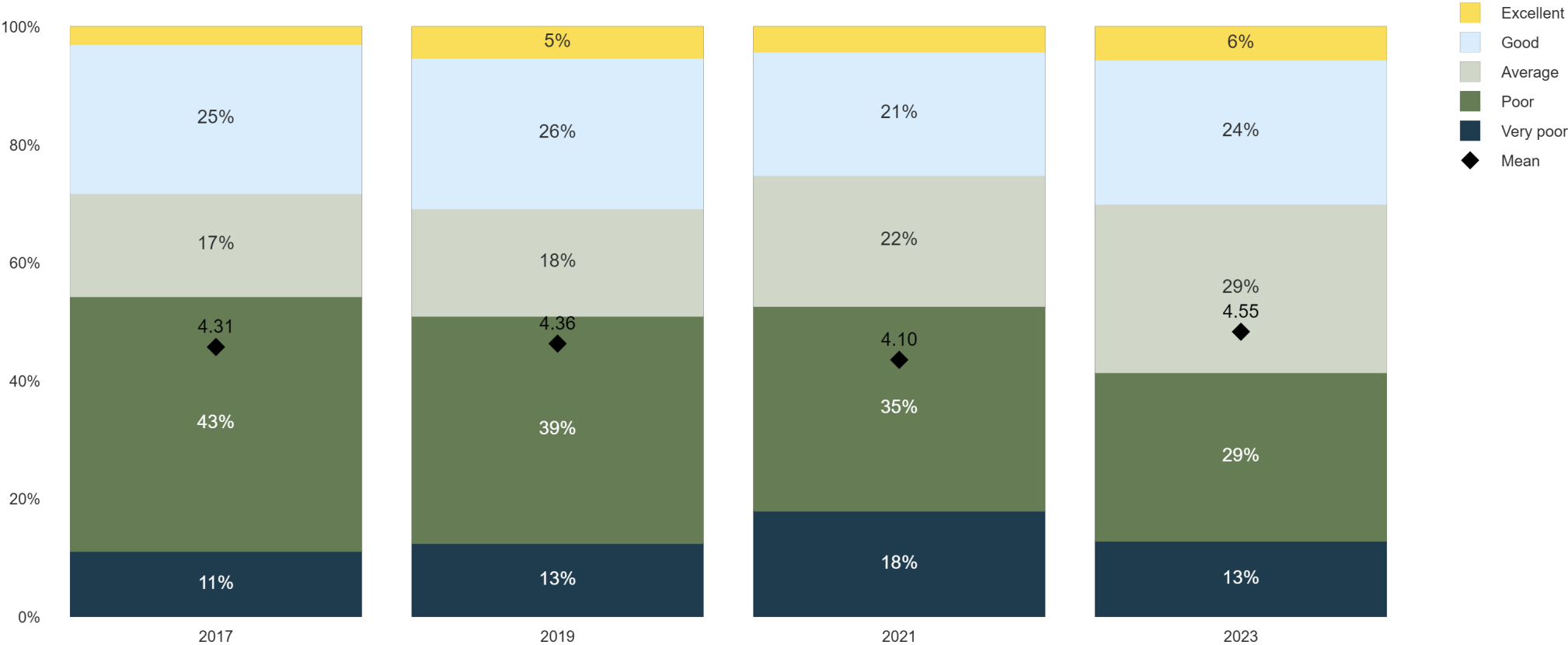
Availability of Real Estate by Industry

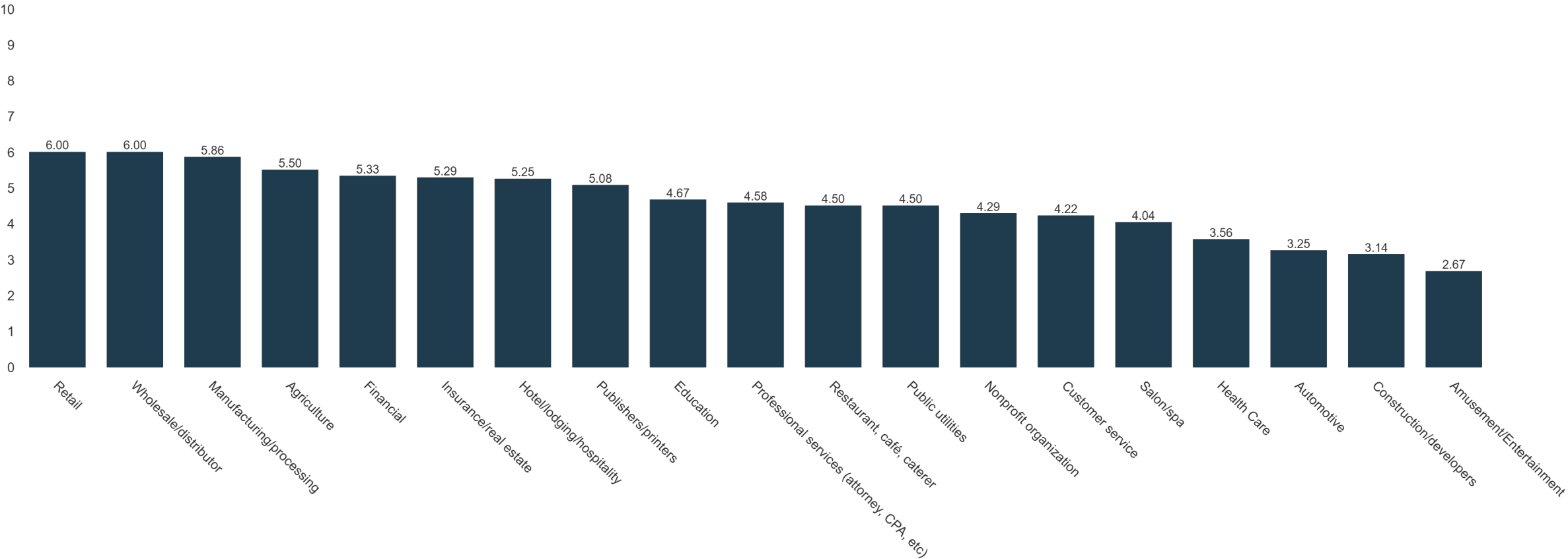

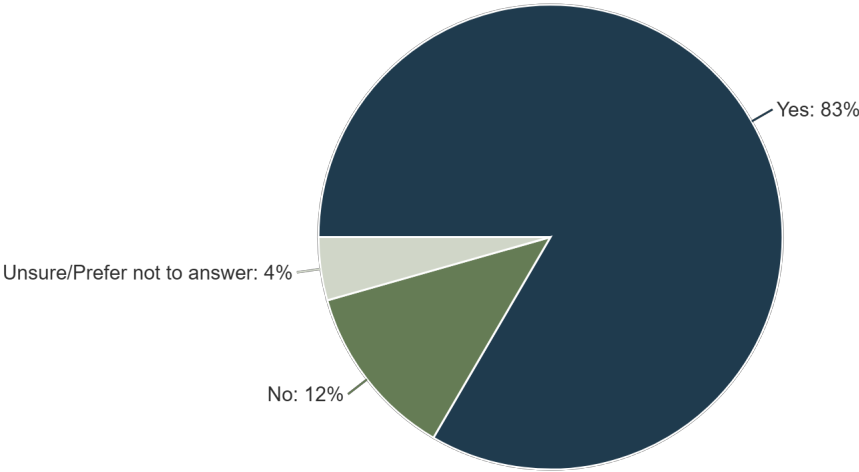

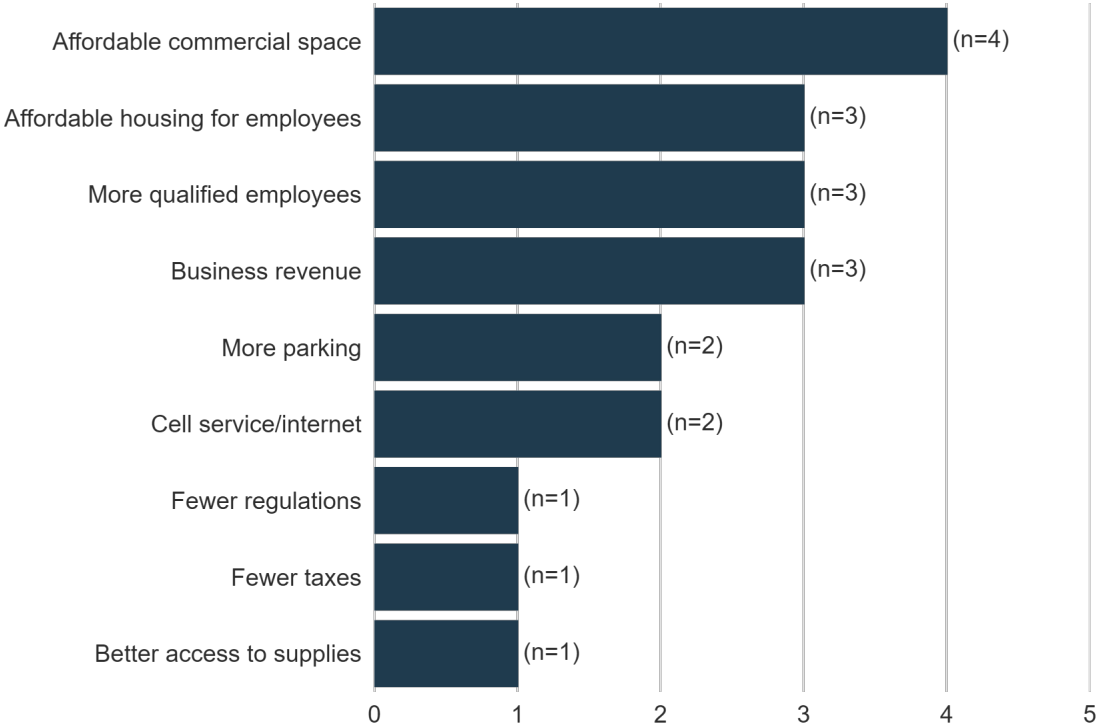

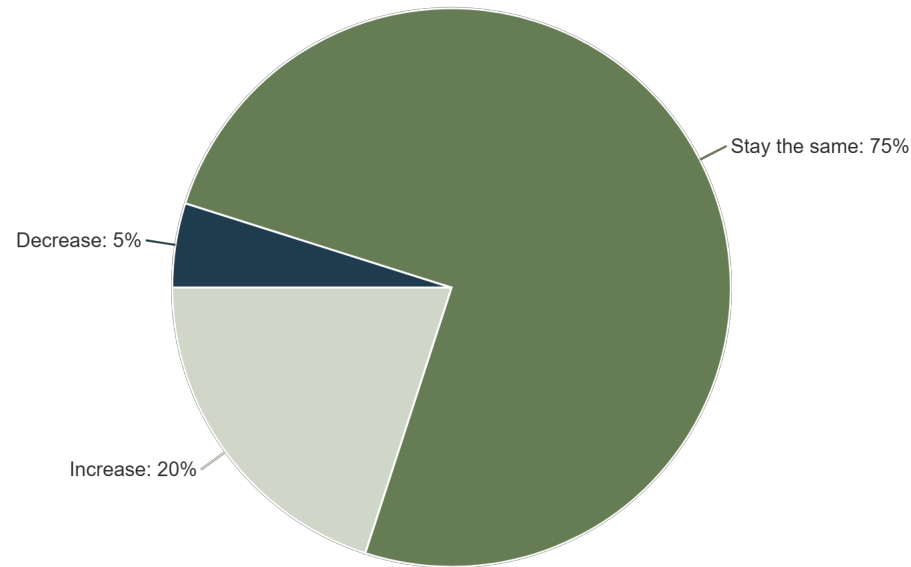

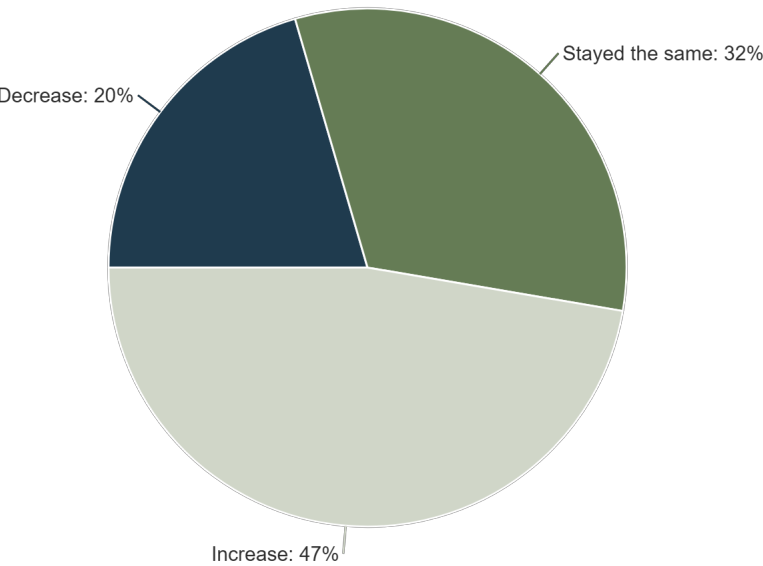

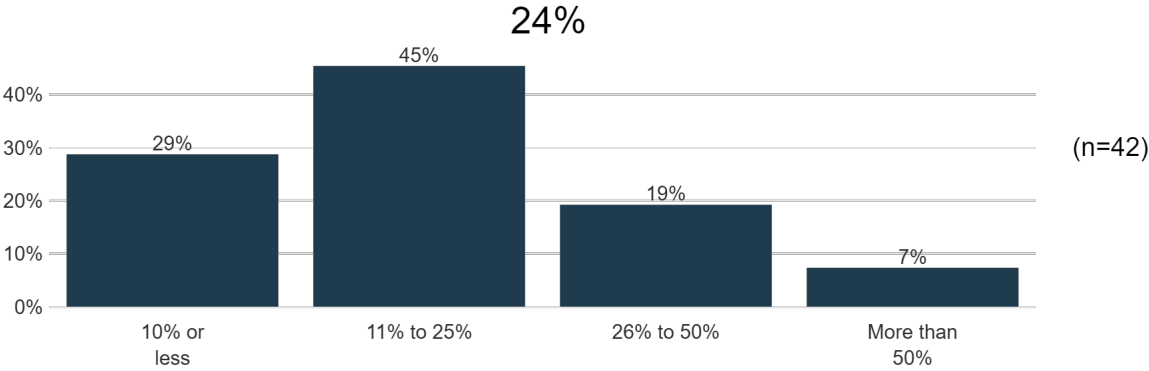

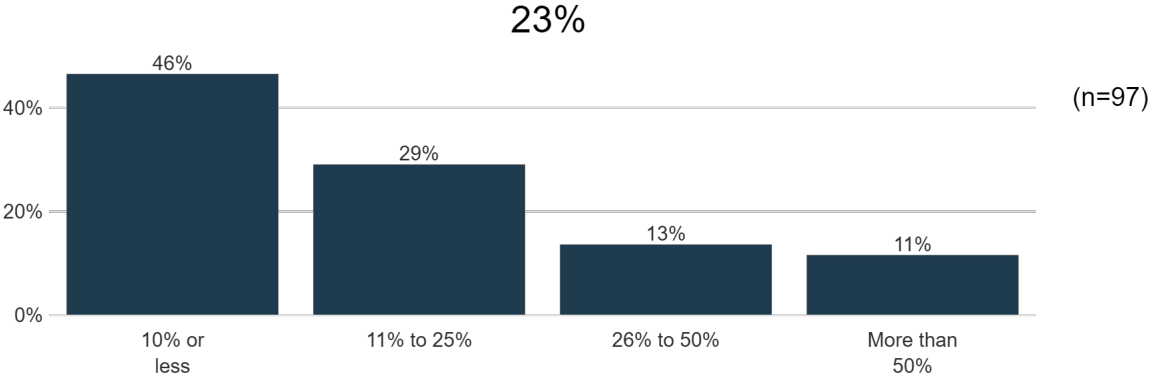
Change in Revenue 2021 to 2022

Mean DECREASE in revenue from 2021 to 2022:

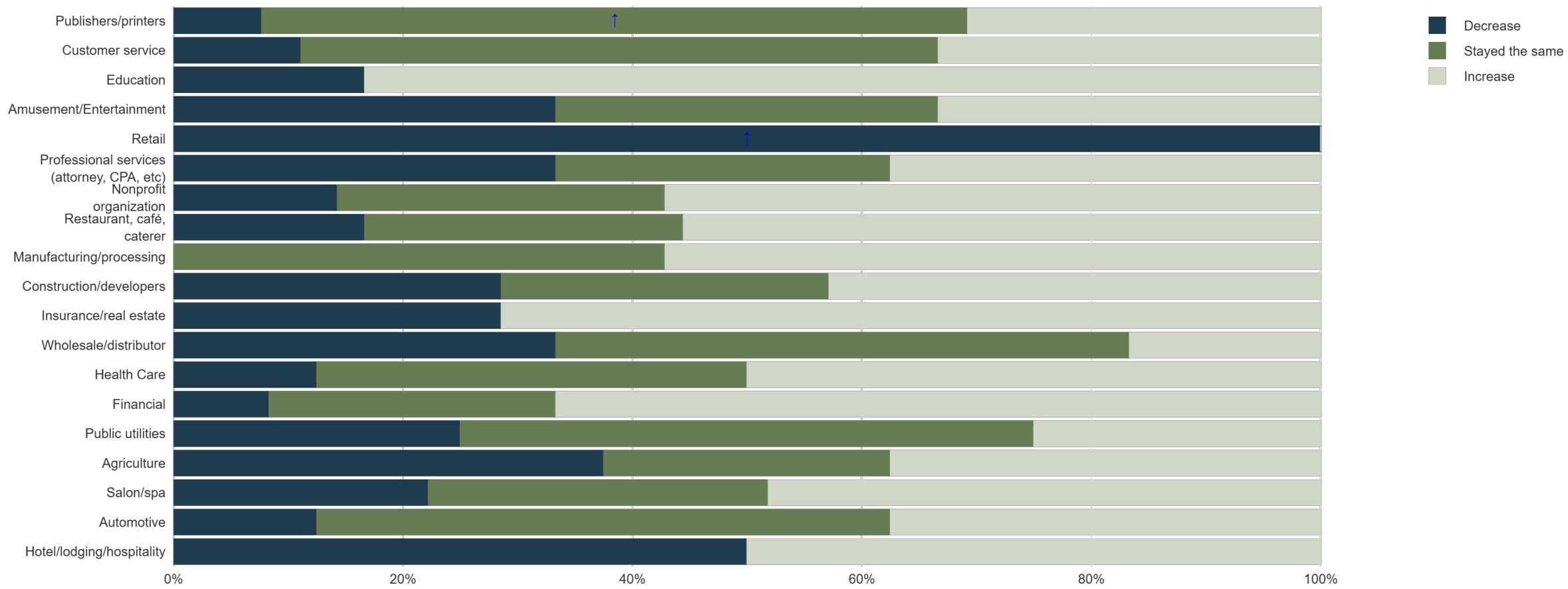


Mean INCREASE in revenue from 2021 to 2022:



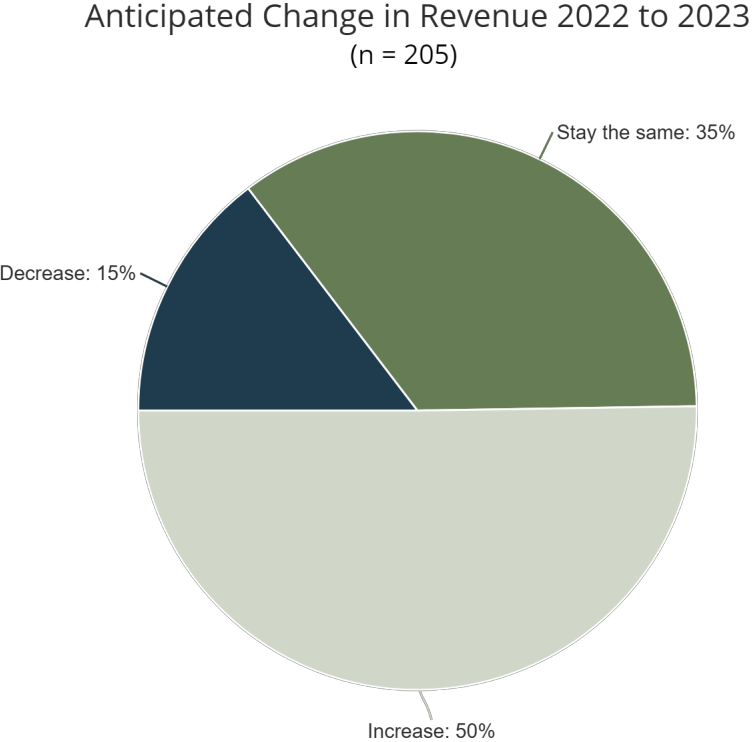

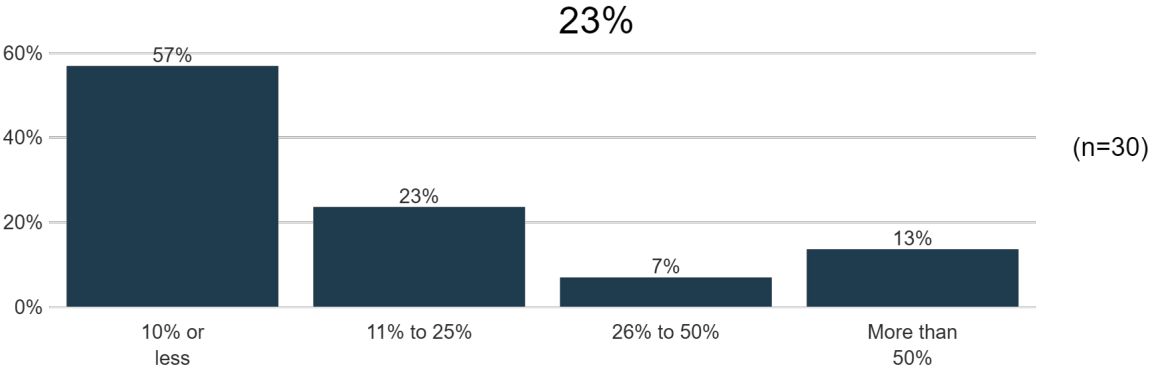


Changes in Revenue 2022 to 2023

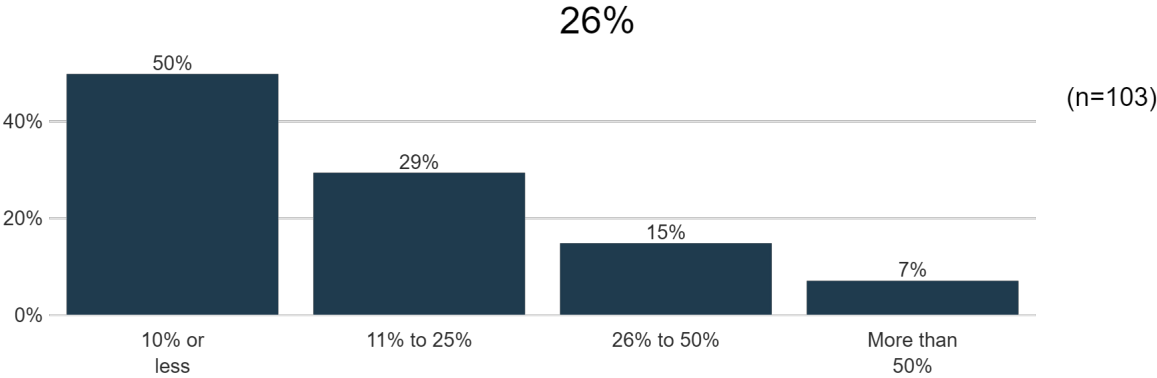

Mean anticipated DECREASE in revenue from 2022 to 2023:



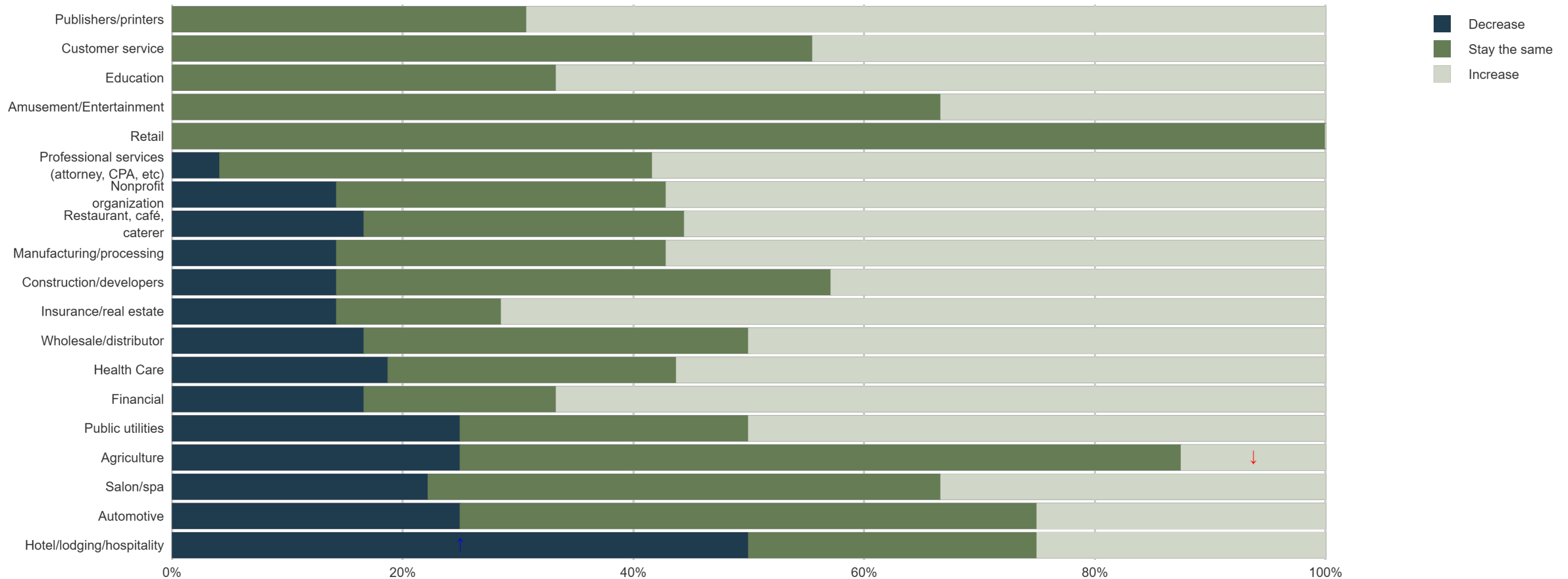
Mean anticipated INCREASE in revenue from 2022 to 2023:

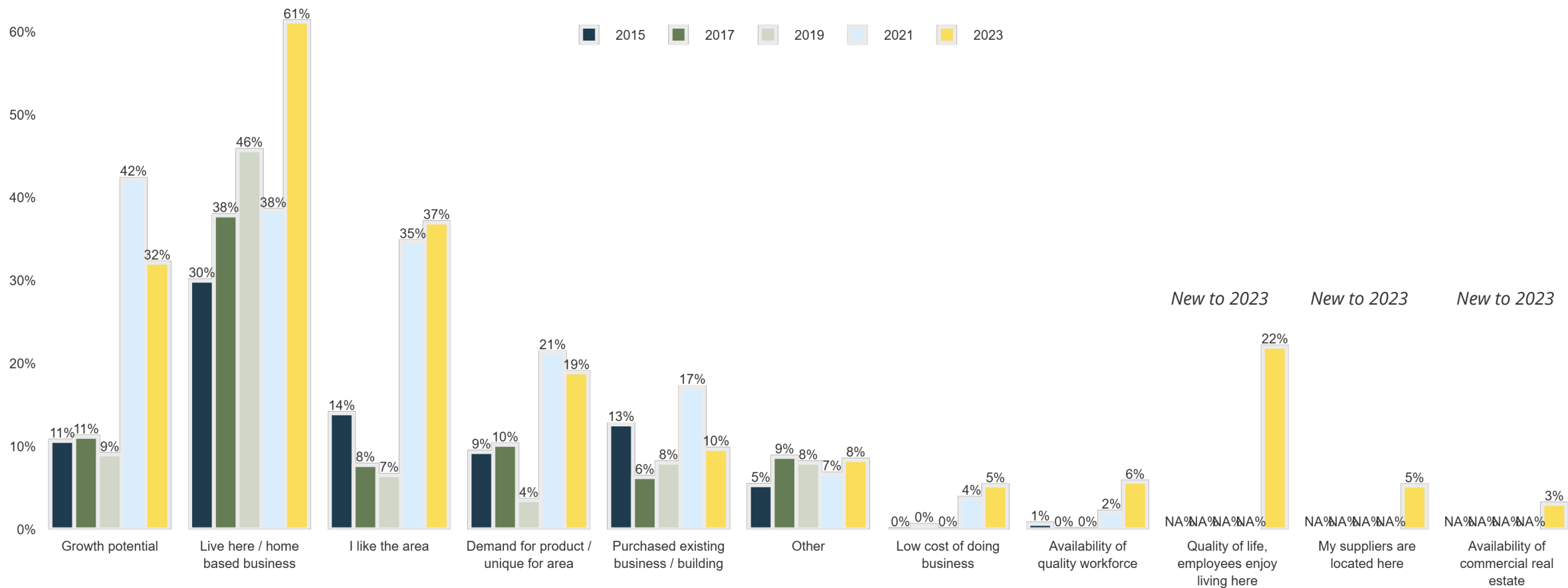

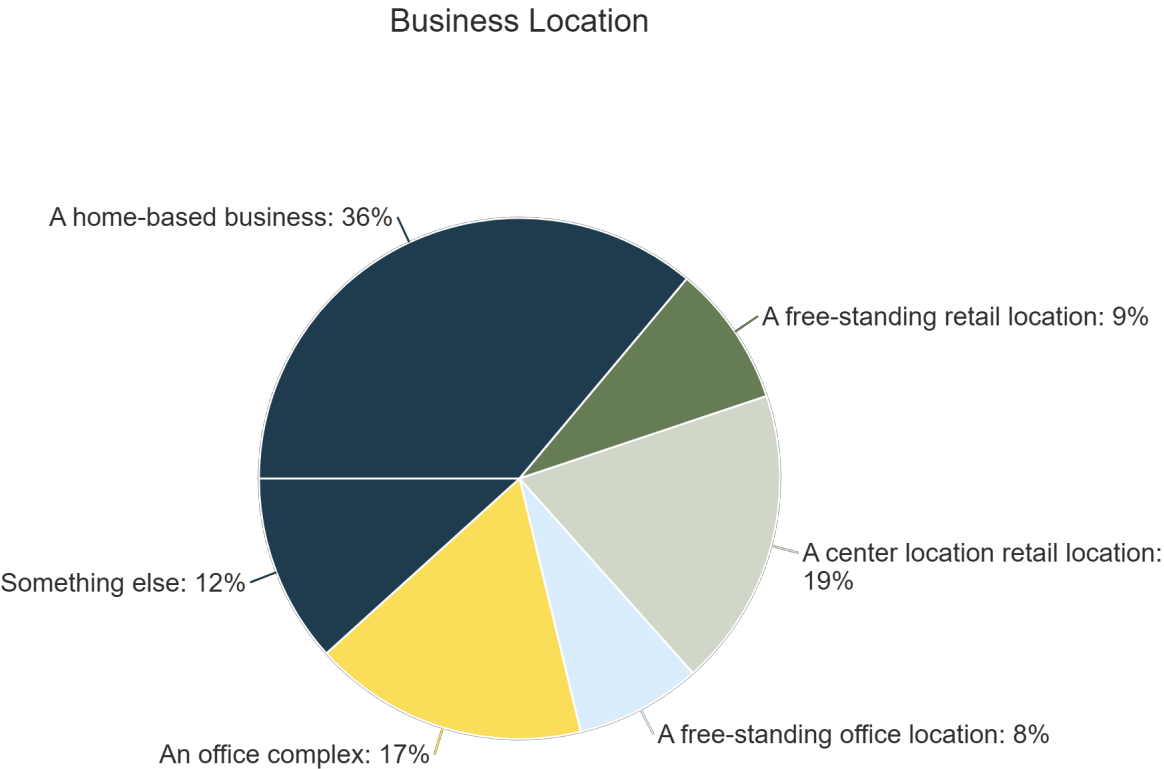

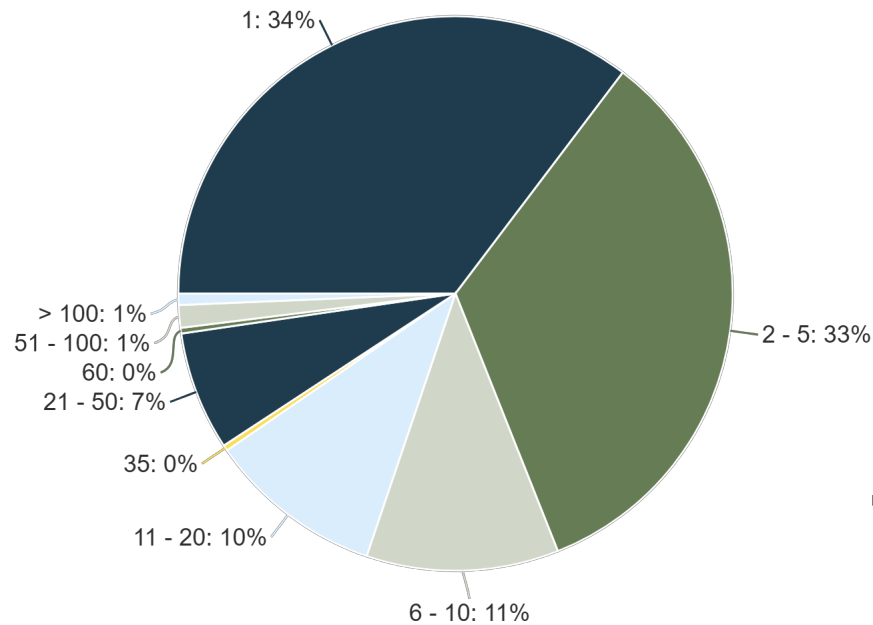

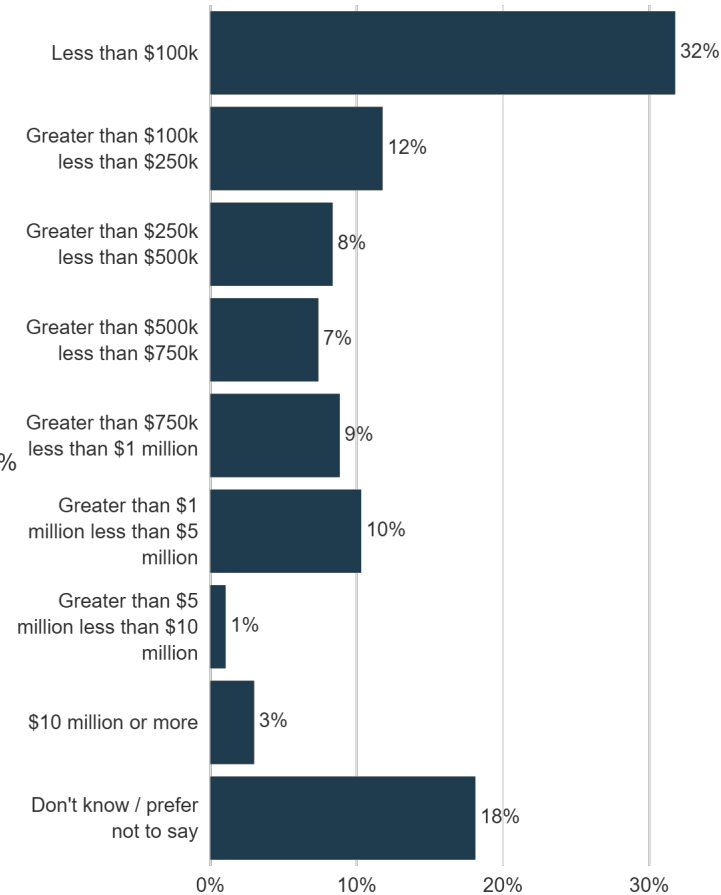

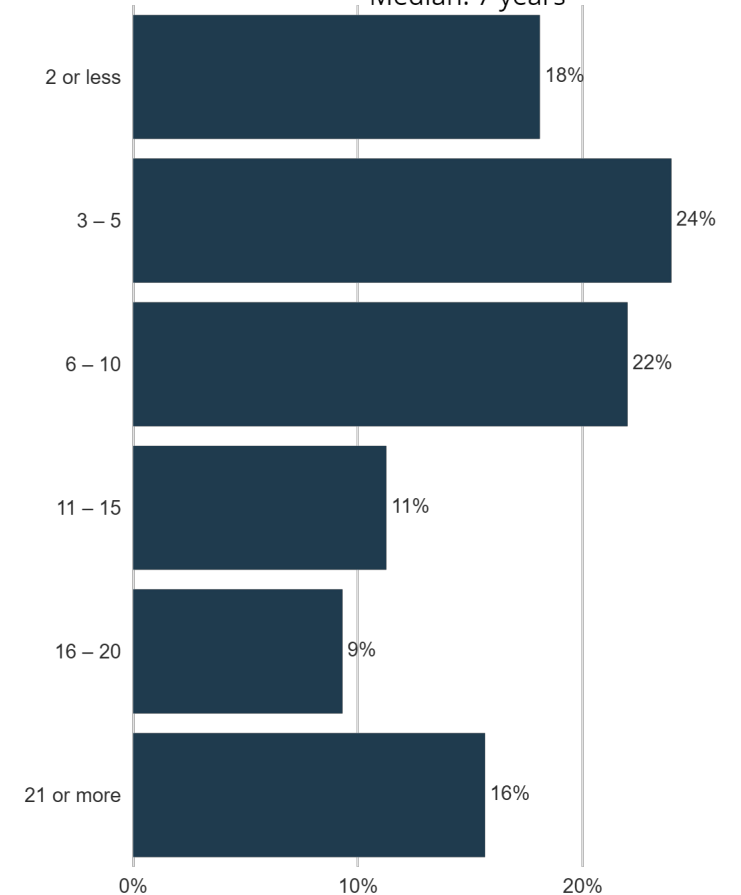


2022 Revenue

What specific concerns do you have about the Town's plan to address long-term water?

1. Further investment in education for water usage is needed to help to significantly reduce water usage towards irrigation. I have lived in CR for over 16 years and had the extra fee that I have paid for future water. I don't understand what has been done with all of the money collected for all of these years and why we have the highest water bills of anyone I know in CO. I think it's reckless to have all of the homes going in and allowing them to put in full yards.

I have not seen statistics that measure current water consumption or projections on use/availability to targeted growth projections.

I have read they have a handle On it but is they true and how does that match growth

I have seen reduced water pressure and wasteful watering amoung commercial properties. If I can get charged 2-3 times the amount for going over my average monthly usage, I should be able to bank the amount I save during the months I am under my average and apply to my account. I am a water wiser member, very conservative and respectful.

I have to put something here which doesn't really make it "optional"

I just don't believe the Town has enough water going into the future with the growth of the densities in our various subdivisions and with all the multiple family units being built downtown. My husband and I believe that the Town will probably be able to obtain the water needed in the future but that it will prove to be very costly.

I know there's a plan. My concern is whether it's keeping pace with the relentless building (commercial and residential) that continues, especially with the continued addition of very high density residential development.

I live in a semi-arid climate. No one knows how much water is underground. We are growing population wise very fast. Do our "professionals" REALLY know where our water is going to come from in the future when we grow to a city of between 120,000 and 140,000 people? Growth, apparently, is not paying for itself so how do I or anyone know if we will have water when we grow out to that number? If we don't have water our "Quality of life" is meaningless, isn't it?

I live in apt complex, the water is hard and seem to leave a scaly residue, kills my hair. I'm not sure if this is the town problem or just the complex.

I need more visibility into the plans and schedules.

I selected this item, but I believe the Town does have a plan in place; however, I still have concerns regarding the long-term water supply especially due to growth. I also have concerns regarding cost and how we will be affected by this. A few years ago, I considered purchasing a new home and requested that they not put sod in the front as I would Xeriscape it. They said they had to or a Certificate of Occupancy could not be issued. I found this frustrating because I wanted to save water, but also couldn't believe it was not an option. Why pay for something that I wanted to rip out anyways? In addition, I believe the State is enforcing toilets that save water and specific toilets can be purchased and used in Colorado. I recently upgraded my bathroom and purchased one of these toilets. I didn't like it and had to replace it with a different one. I like this one better, but I actually end up using more water and my bill has increased because I have to flush multiple times just to clean the tank. I work in downtown Castle Rock and recently noticed the toilets there are using less water. I hate to use the bathrooms at work now because they smell and small bits of toilet paper are always remaining after one flush. I'd much prefer my old toilet that worked great and used more water, but one flush cleaned the bowl instead of having to flush multiple times. I'd rather reduce my water consumption in other ways than the toilet or shower. And I was very disturbed that the new toilets increased my water bills. I really wish I could use my old toilet.

The town could have also delayed some of the housing phase-ins and established vastly reduced non-essential water usage for commercial developments. In short, our town's vision has focused largely on immediate economic expansion to the detriment of a realistic water plan. Ultimately, unless Castle Rock finds a way to more effectively restrict water usage as we move forward, the vision in the contemporary plan will not materialize as a real benefit to residents.

Change the local code to allow marijuana stores to sell. This would make the local taxes stay in place and not go to Denver. Slow down on development and work to get what is built fill up before expanding mote in town.
Change the zoning requirements to include properly sized parking spaces, one space per bedroom and sub-divisions having streets wide enough to park cars safely on both sides because garages are not big enough for two SUVs. Institute minimal lighting requirements to keep the dark sky dark. Do NOT require customers to pay developers fees for years at eating and shopping venues within their development. Especially in downtown Castle Rock, I'd like to see very careful review of the architectural style, quality of materials, and appropriate size/scale of all development. Don't want to lose the charm and character of our core downtown areas.
Establish a mechanism by which developers are held accountable for fulfilling their commitments to the town.
Establish and adhere to a master plan.
Establish mass transit to limit 1-25 traffic
Establish public transportation within and surrounding the town; Establish affordable internet services; Establish system for ADA access through out the town, ie., clearing sidewalks of snow, debris and overgrown shrubbery and trees. Our seniors and disabled residents need city intervention with these chores.
Execute a vote on high rise heights within the town to 4 stories max. Any Mayor should have no votes on development within in the city if they are a owner of a business. Taking land from home owner by eminent domain is wrong. This city is just adding to the CARBON FOOT PRINT.
Expand bike and hike trails
Expand community activities to include things that are not family focused (events for singles)
Expand the space for parking and handicapped accessible
Explore options for mass transit between here and Denver.

Find additional ways to provide funding beyond sales tax and new development. I understand there are prior commitments for zoning that has happened decades ago, but it is important to understand what was discussed and possible decades ago for an area may not be in the best interest of Castle Rock today especially when it comes to water resources, public safety, and transportation (speeding).
Finish planned roads like Woodlands from the Senior Center to Metzler Ranch.

Get rid of Gray
Get rid of roundabouts. Incent businesses to expand on the south end.
Get the RTD line extended from lone Tree to Castle Rock. Improve cell coverage for the southern half of town, especially in Crystal Valley and up towards Ridge.
Give residents a plan (and \$\$\$) to encourage artificial sod in their yards - it would help with water.

I am really concerned about increasing crime rates. I grew up in this area and I had never been afraid to go out or go to the store. I have had scammers walk up to me at the gas station, the grocery store, and other stores around town, begging for money, claiming they don't speak English. The town has to do something to keep the crime rate down.
I am so tired of the extensive growth that has taken place. The beauty of Castle Rock is being destroyed because of excessive building. Stop!!!!
I am worried that as the city grows it will keep growing into a more car dependency. This is an outdated city development plan. They city should ensure residents can live in multipurpose neighborhoods that are not tied to zoning laws that restrict homes from being build large distances from accessible consumer needs like groceries and restaurants.
I am worried that the growth rate will cause an increase in water shortage for the area
I asked the town for a speed bump on our street because we live right off downtown, and people zoom down our road to avoid the roundabouts and I was basically ignored and asked to do a ton of leg work to prove people were speeding. I already have a FT job, how about you enforce speed laws downtown and in the surrounding neighborhoods.
I believe that enforcement of the laws (local, county, state & federal), are most important.
I can't add the water plan and the interstate transportation improvements but those are also important.
I don't know if this is the space for a complaint or if the Town even has any responsibility for the horrendous mail delivery (or should I say mail "undelivery"). I have "Informed Delivery" which shows what was delivered yet letters and most importantly PACKAGES which have been sent to my LOCKED MAILBOX have not shown up. I read about the complains people have and the efforts they have made by relaying their problems to our local P.O. but NOTHING CHANGES. If this is DeJoy's fault, that's one thing but in the past year (going back to 2022), mail delivery has been spotty; Sat. & Mon. delivery is usually non-existent. What can we do?
I don't think we can continue to grow at the rate we are and have "quality growth" anymore than we have had in the last 20 years. MY QUALITY OF LIFE has continued to go downhill since the beginning of the 21st century as far as I'm concerned.

I don't want to see Castle Rock grow at all. It is already become too big.

I feel the town should have stricter guidelines on maintaining the quality of incoming investor ideas for large-scale housing structures and developments that restrict the views and feel or ambience of Castle Rock. Our once quaint and desirable town is now a congested location, particularly on weekends.

I hate the high density housing in town

I have been a Castle Rock resident for 17 years and I love all the changes. My biggest concern is that as the town grows, the town events such as downtown events, concerts, etc. have become so crowded that I'm more inclined to stay away from those events now. I really don't know how you can change that other than to add multiples of each event like the art show. The art show is held for two days and it significantly reduces the crowds. But I'm sure making every event go for two days is very costly and not feasible.

I have concerns about the number of houses being built and the amount of water being used by more building more housing. The amount of water being used for grass and in landscaping of HOA neighborhoods.

I know most of the land is already privately owned and zoned for development, it's just so sad to see open fields being replaced everywhere with houses and commercial development. It is also a shame that light industrial was allowed to be zoned behind houses in the Meadows near Castle view. No one wants to look at warehouses off their back deck. Those houses are most definitely lost value. Terrible zoning decision.

I know that participation in RTD and light rail was voted down. I think this needs to be revisited. Not being able to get anywhere - like downtown or to the airport - without a car really affects our quality of life.

I like the idea of fees on development to help growth pay for growth

I like to the small town feel and I would like to keep it that way.

I live in Cobblestone Ranch and we pay a higher fee for that privilege because Castle Rock annexed this area. What we don't get is effective policing. When police officers join in to celebrate fireworks displays when they're not allowed you know you're not in the right neighborhood.

I moved here because I wanted to live in a small town and I like that small town feel. I would like to see the small town feel remain and new buildings blend with the historic landscape. Some of the new buildings are ugly and out of place.

I moved here for the open spaces. The good schools. The small town feel. I understand that some growth is necessary but this town has changed too much in the last 10 years. It is no longer a small town. For castle rock, Money today seems to be more important than the families of the future.

I think it's too late for this. Small town charm is gone due to all the developers and what was approved in the 80's. Looks like California to me and traffic to DTC is horrible bumper to bumper. Commute that took 35 minutes is now 50 and accidents make it an hour. Sad as I approach retirement. Not sure taxes will be affordable.

I think some for if public transportation is necessary. Years ago we had a free shuttle, now there is nothing. I would also like to see better bike lanes throughout town.

I think supporting more local growth. Instead of allowing national chains to open shops or restaurants, maybe offer locally owned shops or restaurants get tax breaks.

I think the lack of affordable housing is a huge issue for this community. The fact that there is a shortage of service workers here is an indication of the problem (this was an issue pre-pandemic)

I think this town has been absolutely destroyed. We are now just another, glorified Highlands Ranch, but without enough infrastructure to support our citizens. Views blocked, crowded, vanilla chain strip malls, way too many multi dwelling buildings in areas that already didn't have enough parking. The new people moving here - are awful. I just saw a post of a woman who just moved here showing a photo of some elk in her backyard and the horizon of her new natural wonderland was that insane wall of jam packed houses along i25. I'm truly disgusted and feel powerless. It's not easy to uproot, sell a house and move. But, that's likely what I'll do. The water situation. We don't have the water to support this town. How do they keep approving more mega development here?

I think you need to have a set minimum of documented input from town residents impacted by the growth of a project in favor required prior to a growth measure being given approval. I don't feel like the people have much of a voice. This is not necessarily the fault of the town as a lot of people are not interested in participating but everyone is impacted regardless of involvement and should be recognized.
I understand that more affordable housing is needed, but stop building tall apartment buildings. They're starting to close Castle Rock in and block all our views of the mountains and rolling hills.
I understand that there is a huge number of residential entitlements still waiting to be executed. The town really needs to slow down the execution so it can stay on top of infrastructure. The too fast development means that the roads are always behind... enormous volume of construction trucks immediately ruin newly surfaced roads. In addition, there clearly aren't enough resources implemented to care for roads in town when there are snow storms (to do thorough plow jobs on all roads, use an ice melt that doesn't cause potholes, etc). I understand that the town gets a windfall for every house and business that is built, but the existing residents don't see that benefit. Build good roads and maintain them to plan for a slowed-down building process by developers. Don't rush new businesses into empty lots just to get their revenue, but carefully think about how those businesses will impact existing residents.
I would like the building to stop already , instead of ruining the town
I would like the HOA fees to cover access to the Town's recreation centers like in Highlands Ranch. The HOA fees here are more than Highlands Ranch but there are less trails and zero access to the recreation centers.
I would like to see a ban on drive through restaurants / fast food / coffee. Have existing drive throughs converted to patio space. Would make huge impact on air quality.
I would like to see it stop growing as in housing
I would like to see more family activities such as bowling, better sit down family restaurants.
I would like to see more investment into getting less chain and commercial vendors and more local and unique vendors/restaurants/businesses.
I would like to see the police enforce driving laws.
I would like to see the Town not get ahead of water availability. That's something that's too little too late if you get behind. Also, I've seen a decline in the quality of roads and of policing service.
I would like to see the town slow down growth. I don't see the value of getting to an optimum size when there aren't the services to uphold the growth (water especially and police and fire services).
I WOULD LIKE YOU TO STOP THE GROWTH OF CR. WE CANNOT HANDLE THE TRAFFIC COMING IN AND ALSO THE PEOPLE COMING IN TO OUR TOWN IS UNDESIRABLE
I would love to see more ways to move across Town. Sometimes it's very inconvenient to move from one side to the other.
I'd love to see more local businesses and less chains.
I'd like a Trader Joes
If it's even possible, encourage development of family-friendly town squares in areas away from the Town center, rather than strip malls.
If not already in existence then a guarantee of so many police and fire employees compared to population.
If residential snow removal is performed, do it right or don't do it at all. Your crews make it worse by their "one-narrow-swipe" approach--- hugely ineffective and it looks like a "box checker." Multi-dwelling housing is of major concern! Too much!
If the decision to allow further growth remains intact, what is the town of CR proposing to commit to the people who already live here and their ability to access the highway and surface streets?
If you're going to build, build condos and townhomes. And make sure there is an equal amount of publicly accessible open space for new development

impacting current residents with expansion for new growth seems unappreciative. While expansion may be necessary it should be thought out and done at the right time. If a developer has plans for an entire area of the city. They should improve the infrastructure for the entire development first rather than making early residents live through a decade of construction.
Implement a public safety tax for ALL residents. Everyone benefits from our public safety. It shouldn't be only taxed on new builds or residents. Our fire department and police are strained and will soon fall behind with the level of service they offer if we don't find better permanent funding!

Incentivize businesses to come to castle rock to support the new resident growth

Increase impact fees on developers and builders for any new residential development with rebates for low income housing, similar to the recent ballot issue that failed. Require even more strict renewable water commitments for any new development, both residential and commercial.

Increase pay for teachers

Increase public safety resources

Increase requirement for spacing between homes. Charge a hefty significant fee for water taps.

Infrastructure before growth

Infrastructure should be in place before developments - this includes water, roads and community services. It isn't great to see things torn up right after they were put in - Crowfoot Road is an example of this.

Investment in public transportation within Castle rock and to light rail system

It feels that the infrastructure is not in place to support the level of growth the Town is currently seeing. The roads are backed up every day on the way to school/work, the grocery stores aren't plentiful enough to make quick trips, the recreation opportunities feel stunted compared to other cities in the region (like Highlands Ranch with numerous rec centers and pools accessible to the entire community). It feels like a tremendous number of people squished into a small area that can't decide if it's rural, suburban or urban (and in fact is all 3 within 3 minutes of driving). "Jack of all trades, master of none" is what Castle Rock feels like to me.

IT IS EASY TO SAY YOU'LL ENGAGE THE PUBLIC (1), BUT YOU NEED TO LISTEN TO THE PUBLIC, AS WELL. YOU ENGAGE PRETTY WELL, BUT YOU DON'T LISTEN. I PUT ZONING ENFORCEMENT AS (2), PRESUMING THAT THE CURRENT ZONING PROTECTS THE QUALITY OF LIFE FOR THE INCUMBENT REGION. SOMETIMES UPDATING THE ZONING TO REFLECT CURRENT REALITY (LIKE NOT PUTTING IN 5,000 MORE HOUSES IN DAWSON BECAUSE A 1980'S REGULATION ALLOWED FOR IT) IS A BETTER WAY TO GO. BUT IF CURRENT ZONING PROTECTS THE WAY OF LIFE THAT THE PRESENT HOMEOWNERS PURCHASED WHEN THEY BOUGHT THEIR PROPERTIES, THEN IT SHOULD BE UPHELD IF A ZONING CHANGE IS PROTESTED. YOU ALSO NEED TO DO SOMETHING ABOUT SNOW REMOVAL. THE CURRENT STANDARD IS INSUFFICIENT.
It would be great to improve transportation networks by other means than just widening roads. perhaps an interchange directly into the outlet malls could help. Maybe adding additional roads going in the same direction could help as well (for example, adding another road from the west side of 25 to the east side, so people just going to target don't have to deal with the people trying to get on 25?)
It's time to stop building
Just because land was approved for development 30 years ago, things have changed and the City does not have to approve based on changing population. Quit using this as an excuse for development.
Just because something was approved in the 80's doesn't make it viable today.
Just because you can doesn't mean you should. When adding residential areas, consider adding all resources, properly trained plow operators, waste, recycling. Consider the never ending cycle of the road restructures you are often blocking entire developments access to common routes.
Just say "no" instead of "development entitlement." Remember that existing residents are "entitled" to the quality of life they expect also.
Keep bike path and sidewalks open while road construction is being done
Keep businesses in one area. Do not let business be in neighborhoods.
Keep Castle Rock attractive for new Business and growth by incentivizing taxes and putting forth policies that allow for affordable and assessable development opportunities.
Keep downtown feel
Keep downtown strong, remember why people live here and maintain standards of downtown especially becoming like the rest of castle rock/ sprawl/ franchises
KEEP ISSUEING BUILDING PERMITS, WE ARE ALMOST LAKEWOOD!
Keep open space for a good balance of nature and people

Larger lots. Lots too small. False advertising claiming town is preserving open space. all that is happening is making lots smaller and calling the stolen back yards as "open space"
Less apartment building
Less banks and car washes
Less chain restaurants and more unique and privately owned.

Less chains and more unique shops and restaurants, more community events
Less huge chain restaurants, more independent ones.
Less money towards police. We do not need more boots on the ground. Invest that money in public spaces and education.

The Town Council should have the final approval on all growth and development issues, not a committee that was created by the Town Board such as the Downtown Development Board. All appointed boards should be advisory only to the Town Council. This is how it was when the Planning and Zoning Commission and Board of Adjustment existed years ago.

The town council should have the final input on building projects within the town. Development is controlled by people that are not interested in maintaining the quality of life that Castle rock has had.

The town has already exceeded capacity. The hospital and medical services are already outgrown. We lack Rec center capacity and can't serve the recreational needs of thousands of youth/residents. The ratio of population to amenities is imbalanced. It's a rare occasion we're able to enjoy downtown restaurants or events (e.g., concerts, star lighting, or other special events) due to lack of parking, General space/capacity, accessibility via Wolfensberger or Plum Creek (which is a nightmare), and we work 8-5 jobs in South Denver metro making it difficult to even arrive on time to weeknight events. Service at many restaurants is well below average because quality of service is poor; we don't have a demographic/population to draw upon to staff such businesses. What are we doing to create a draw for employers keeping residents in town for work (not retail/hospitality jobs)? How can we draw a college or university here to increase a demographic of part-time or retail staffing? Schools?! We keep building developments that draw families, but where are those kids going to attend school? We pride ourselves on the downtown aesthetic and value but it's built to only serve a very small percentage of the population. I could go on but will stop here, as capacity overload is a primary concern.

The town is building stupid!!!! You've created the traffic nightmare by what has gone where without thinking of the long term. The basic necessities such as a grocery store has become a nightmare with all the people. My neighborhood store can't service the demands you have put on it with your thousands of new homes. What are we doing about the schools? There are not enough schools, teachers, and bus drivers in Castle Rock. Also with all this growth why in the world is recycling only picked up every other week?

when approving apt. complexes be sure there are a minimum of two parking spaces per unit. Downtown has added lots of things to draw people but you can't easily find parking.

When I first moved to C.R. a little over 20 years ago it was a wonderful bedroom community. Close enough to the Tech Center for major shopping needs, restaurants, etc. but situated far enough away to feel like you have left behind the headaches of a more populated city. I used to love seeing the rolling hills, glimpses of wildlife and taking a long walk/ light hike. Now I wouldn't recommend living in C.R. to anyone. It takes me 20 mins to drive from hwy 86 & Founder's to the I-25 on ramp. Soothing rolling hills and peaceful walks= gone. I have to decide between running my dishwasher and taking a shower because the water pressure has gotten so bad and the only wild life I see are bunnies and squirrels. I don't know if it is too late to turn things around or not. But investing in preserving what is left would be nice.

When new subdivisions are created, that those subdivisions must. Must realistically, I repeat realistically account for and manage the change in traffic, the change in the number of people in an area so that those particular areas don't become a cluster like the recently added subdivision at ridge and Endurud near the King Soopers. That area right now is now a nightmare. I understand the city is trying to widen ridge road down to plum Creek, but that actually does nothing to account for that small area between the entrance to the neighborhood and 86 with King Soopers right there. That was too many houses and too small of an area and those houses are way too overpriced. If the town of Castle Rock wants to be known for managing growth, they have to be harder on the developers and that means, yes, the town may have to turn away developers unless they're willing to provide low to medium income housing instead of starting housing at 3 to 400,000. That makes it impossible for anyone working in restaurant, minimum wage jobs, etc to actually live in Castle Rock and work here without having multiple jobs or roommates. It's getting out of control. When I moved here 17 years ago we bought our house at 197,000, which was a lot of money for us back then. But none of these houses that are the same square footage as ours about 2,000 ft² are severely overpriced and are forcing good people to have to work harder than they should and not be able to enjoy life and the amenities that the city is trying to provide. If this doesn't get fixed you will actually have more people leaving the city then coming in.

When you shut Wilcox or Meadows during high usage hours to expand infrastructure, you failed me.

Why is Castle Rock so white? When we moved here from San Diego in 2015, where diversity is everywhere, I thought I landed in Pleasantville!! Didn't know this before moving here. Also, didn't know that this was mostly "Trump country" ;((But I am glad people are pretty nice here, in general. They just turn to crazies, when they go on Next Door...

Widening roads would have been my 6th choice above.

Wilcox/Wolf. Exit could be massively improved aesthetically. It's embarrassing & an eye sore....always has been. PLEASE IMPROVE by cleaning up, landscaping, signage, art, lighting.

Winter snow removal for roads is poor, I have noticed just this year that liquid de icers are being used, this is an improvement but much more is still needed. I am unsure if it is staffing or equipment issues. Snow removal on the secondary roads is poor and I am unsure if street snow removal is a priority for the Town.

With the growth in population and traffic, traffic has increased drastically specifically in the meadows. I hate to suggest construction I.e. widening roads, more mainline road options, and increased parking downtown, but these issues may need to be addressed with this growth.

With the rate of popularity of growth in Castle Rock, we need more amenities to support it all. This means more grocery stores and restaurants. This would also mean building of new access (roads) to all of these rather than the use of main arteries (Founders Parkway or the interstate) to reach them as well - which is a deterrent for me to get out and shop and eat here. Those arteries are just too busy and too much traffic on them. We often leave CR and go to Parker, Lone Tree or Highlands Ranch to shop and dine. The low quality and lack of diversity of restaurants in CR also push us out of the town to dine out. Many of the restaurants are dirty, lack ventilation, and/or lack quality of service. Inspections don't seem to be happening.
Work on all major roads and parking lots. More affordable living homes and apartment for the new generation to afford.
Worry about where kids will go to school.
Would be nice to keep castle rock quiet and calm. Just afraid too much growth too quickly will be detrimental to the small town feel of castle rock
Would like to see Light Rail extended down to Castle Rock Also would like to see quicker snow removal in residential areas.
Xeriscape as much as possible for new construction to conserve water.
Yes - stop allowing builders to build houses on top of each other. It increases anxiety and hostility among neighbors and is a huge fire hazard.
Yes keep low income housing outside of the city limits. I know it's needed but out in the county would be preferred.
Yes slow down the growth. The town is not what it wasn't and honestly I can't wait to move from here. I moved here because there wasn't so many businesses and it was a small town. It has more than doubled since I moved here.
Yes stop. We've grown too much
Yes, implement a plan like Boulder (Danish plan?) to limit growth. Works very well for Boulder and has helped keep property values high for over 40 years. Also, in regards to above - I hope you are already enforcing zoning laws, shouldn't be up to me to ask.
Yes, please evaluate and assign priority to establishing bicycle lanes on roadways. Castle Rock has an active population but it seems like bicycle lanes on roadways are never considered.
You allow builders to put up a thousand small homes with no land and destroy Castle Rock's future. Look at Aurora – how well are those areas with cheap small homes with no land doing now? They turn into dumps – properties in dis-repair, crime, etc. You allow all these new people to move in and then tell everyone else they have to cut back on their water usage – no more green – it has to be Rock. Castle Rock used to be special – now it's over crowded, the wildlife is killed off, you don't want to drive during rush hour traffic – it's lost its charm. You fell for these sweet talkers who were here just to use Castle Rock so they could stuff their pockets with cash and then leave us like damaged goods.
You allow tiny homes to be built on tiny lots. You destroy the natural beauty - you destroy the wildlife. You destroy what made Castle Rock special.
You keep building residential real estate but not enough grocery stores or restaurants to accommodate all the residents.

All of the items suggested above, ranking not required, account for Castle Rock's uniqueness in a positive way.

All the choices of things that we have to do around town e.g. the MAC, the shopping, the eating establishments.

Although I think having friendly people in the community is super important, so many people have moved here from out of state where they are less friendly and have very different values. The friendliness factor for Castle Rock has already been lost. There is so much negativity in this community that didn't exist before. Political rifts, school board divisiveness, Covid feuds etc. Would like a "friendliness campaign" in Castle Rock to help people prioritize the culture in our community and find common ground.

Architecture is being ruined with the downtown expansion

As I have said before and having grown up here, Castle Rock has lost its unique town identity. Calling it a "town" is a sign of ignorance on the part of our leaders if they don't understand the history of Castle Rock. I will bet very few employees of CR even know any of its history.

If the town goes too far trying to provide lots of job opportunities of all types, this will likely change the character of Castle Rock and steer away potential remote-work residents.

We're too big! Need something for "everyone" to do, like bowling alley and arcade. Too many retail jobs and eating places.

We've heard that council has considered building tiny homes | tents for those who are experiencing homelessness. It is actually more heartless to enable than to empower. We have many programs in place to help give a hand up not a handout. Again, look to Denver's failures and learn from them.

What about historic preservation of property & places related to Castle Rock's history?

What was least important to me was because I feel the city is doing a good job of balancing rental and home options. when people have housing that they can afford, safety and other matters fall right in line. when people have trouble with a roof over their heads, everything else suffers.

When we moved here in 2019 the population was ~68.5k and given today's entitlements the Town's population will grow to 120-140k residents. We will likely be motivated to move to a less populated area before then.

Wildfire mitigation

With growth (which is inevitable) comes growing pains. Some may complain, but you're doing a great job! Thanks for doing your best to maintain the safety, security & beauty of Castle Rock.

Work with those who manage roads leading to and from Castle Rock to help them plan and grow capacity as new home development is being considered

Yes, infrastructure should keep up with the town needs, i.e. Crystal Valley Parkway I25 interchange and schools. We have thought both of these would have happened within 10 years of buying our house.

The surrounding towns don't want to drive in Castle rock because of the speeding. Meadows Blvd name should be changed to the Indie 500.

How do you propose the Town get additional revenue to fund public safety?

-Place this as a top priority -Moderate Visitor tax funding sources added to transitive activities (hotels, fuel, rental services (cars, bikes, parks, trails, etc) for non-residents

"...tax revenue is not expected to be able to provide additional revenue needed" is an assumption based on projections provided by the town's Fire Chief and Chief of Police. What has changed that makes the portion of sales tax directed to public safety not enough? The town population is exploding which means taxes are also increasing at a rapid rate. Are the Fire Chief and Chief of Police proposing Gucci packages? The comparisons they made to Parker and other towns last year were based on skewed data points, which indicates there was a move to get funds even if the statistics had to be massaged to support their proposals. Rather than looks for ways to pull more money from the taxpayer, perhaps the Fire Chief and Chief of Police could offer gold, silver, and bronze options. It felt like last year we only got the gold option.

(1) Incentivize businesses to locate themselves here. (2) Add speed cameras in high accident areas. (3) Develop the Crystal Valley Overpass so additional development can be completed. (3) Eliminate requirements for home to be on the grid to reduce infrastructure management. (4) Add Solar, water use reduction strategies, and do heavy energy retrofits to all public buildings.

1. Add a separate tax "Public Safety Services" to property taxes or sales taxes. Just make sure it goes to police, fire, and EMS. If we can pay 20% for a tip at Starbucks, we can support Public Safety better. 2. An automated gate at the entrance would not cost much and this would eliminate much of the crime in and around the parking garage. There have been several recent autos stolen from (residents that live there) in the parking garage by thieves in cars that quickly enter to park next to the vehicle to be broken into then stolen. This does not happen across the street at Riverwalk, only at Encore where there is poor security and crime is rampant. A gate and charging non-residents and non-employees at the Encore parking garage would put an end to the cycle of stolen cars and constant vandalism in the parking area. Almost every night suspicious vehicles enter and go up to the 5th, 6th, and 7th floors. Many of them are just doing drugs or drinking, but some are throwing large objects from the top and some are writing graffiti. Violent assaults have happened as well. Many elderly residents live at the Encore condominiums, and they have continuously voiced how they are scared every time they have to walk to their reserved parking spots in fear. A few of them have already moved saying that it's not safe there. Adding a gate and charging toll to nonresidents (city employees and city vehicles would be exempt) or to people who have no business here other than to cause trouble would keep out the riff raff, lower crime, bring in lots of revenue to the city, and would instill confidence in the people in charge of public safety. That's how they do it in Denver and in Colorado Springs. And in every other growing, successful town/city in America. Why do we have to be lackluster town of Colorado that can't progress with the times?

If Castle Rock Fire and Rescue Department were to separate into a fire protection district, the Board of Directors could assess property taxes and manage their own financial obligations. The general public can not possibly be informed enough to astutely answer this question. This conundrum is why we elect public officials. We are not a city of industry or resort as a primary source of employment and revenue. I suspect this has, and most likely will always be, the most pressing issue in our city because short of industry and resort, this problem will never be solved, as the question implies. A proportional question requires a proportional response. The state of Colorado must recognize Castle Rock as a “pass through” town that it was created to be. Therefore, the state must provide Castle Rock with revenue from the transportation of goods via rail and road through Castle Rock. The I25 corridor as well as the railroad is our greatest natural resource. It is why and how this city began and the response to this question should derive from just that.

The most reliable source of revenue for public safety would be a mill levy specifically used to pay for public safety needs, an alternative reliable source of revenue would be an increase to the Town's property tax mill levy.

It might be unpopular, but it would seem that it is time to increase property taxes. These are very low and we actually get a lot for our ~\$40. We should also be looking separate line items in the property assessment so that people will know this is money going directly to public safety. There should be a study to consolidate Fire districts. Castle Rock Fire responds to many of the calls for Jackson and West Douglas districts. CR also provides service to areas like Bell Mountain for a fee by court order. A professional study should be conducted to determine if the area fire/emt services should be regionally consolidated, like was done for the Denver Metro area 25 or so years ago.

The Town needs to expand its business to include a large white collar business park — seems like Dawson Ridge is the best chance for that to happen since Millers Landing cannot do what they said they could do. In addition to the business revenue, it keeps some of the white collar household money in town during the day. But “if you cannot control price, you must control cost”. If public safety services and all that is Castle Rock cannot keep pace with growth, you must slow growth. Or start patrolling the parks and walkways to fine all the dog walkers not picking up after their dogs. It would appear there is lots of revenue just waiting to be scooped up!
