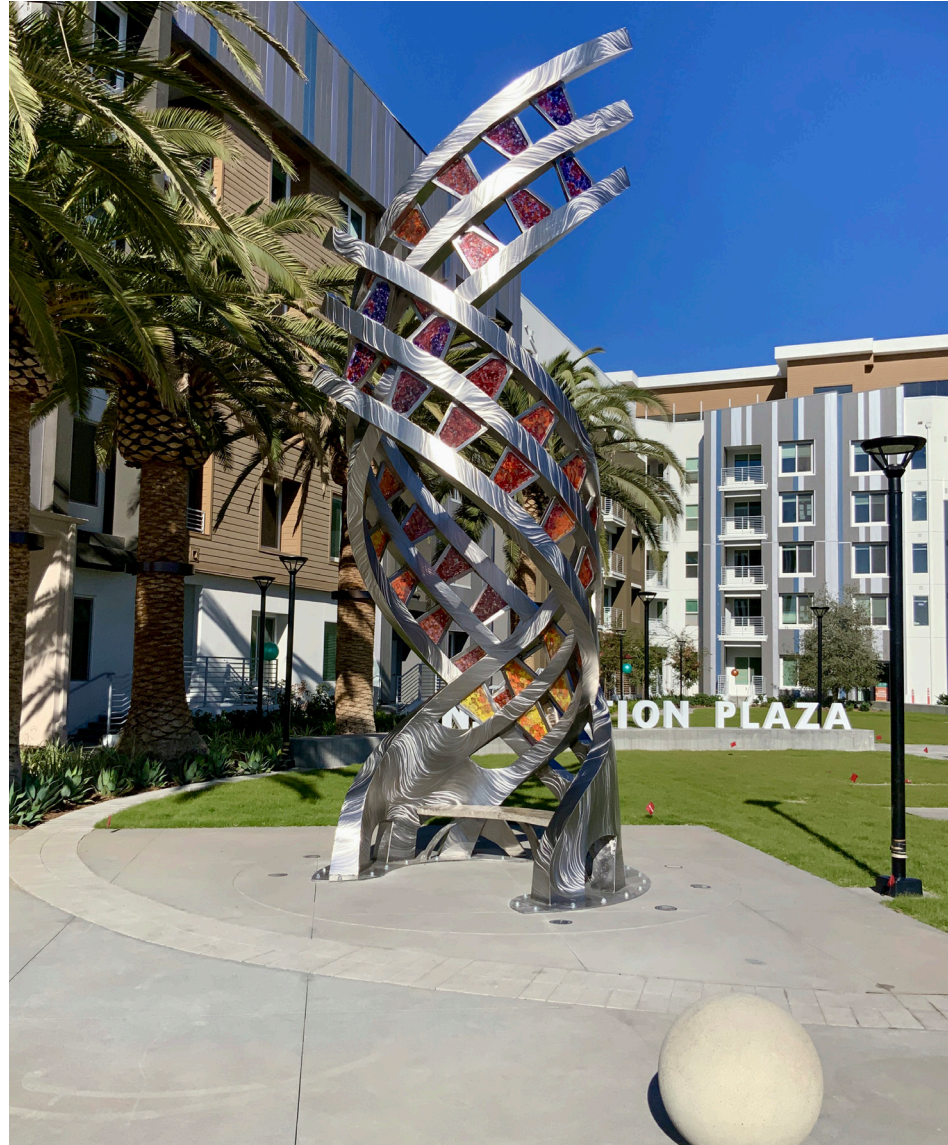

Title: The Flame of Inspiration

Location: Fremont, CA

Description: Sitting in Inspiration Plaza, the Flame of Inspiration is a 22ft tall stainless steel and cast glass tower. It features a concrete bench for sitting inside the sculpture, creating a place where visitors can sit and be inspired. Design, fabrication and installation by Amie Jacobsen. Title: Native Color at Unity Square

Description: 9 stainless steel and cast glass flowers based on the Native Wildflower of Oklahoma, commonly called "Indian Blanket" topped with three honey bees representing the Native American history of the area, and the bees represent the community working together. Maintenance for these pieces would include changing out any burned out LED strips when needed. Eventually the painted portions may need refreshing, expected after 15-20 years.

Concept Design: Still Wild

Located in the foothills of the Colorado Rocky Mountains, Castle Rock's ridges, valleys, open space and spectacular views lend to a stunning natural setting. Creeks and gulches meander through the many drainage basins and Ponderosa Pine and scrub oak cover the landscape. Panoramic views of the Rocky Mountains extend from Pike's Peak to the south to Long's Peak to the north. It also has a rich Native American history, before the settler's industries in mining, ranching and rhyolite quarries. Standing just over 15ft tall, "Still Wild" is meant to honor all that is native and natural to the land that now hosts a thriving community in the Colorado front range. It features three native wild flowers: The Silver Lupine, found abundantly in the Colorado mountains. Indian Paintbrush - though now using an outdated term in it's common name, I love that it was meant as a reference to the Native American people that once occupied the land, and is included as an acknowledgment to them. And last, yellow coneflower - or Black Eyed Susan - which is found often from the mountains into the eastern planes. "Still Wild" would be made of Corten (weathering steel), painted steel, and painted expanded steel, with internal LED lighting to glow at night. The Corten steel adds a rusty rustic feel, remembering Castle Rocks rugged past. The LED lights will create a modern, colorful glow that speak to Castle Rocks modern thriving community that, like the land around it, is "Still Wild" at heart.

Concept Design: Still Wild

Rhyolite stone base as a reference to the Castle Rock rhyolite quarries

Corten or “weathering steel” is designed to acquire a rust patina on the surface without rusting through. It takes little to no maintenance.

Painted steel accents will be painted with high quality, two part urethanes that will hold color for many years.



Expanded sheet metal will allow light to pass through areas of the petals so that the flowers can be lit from inside with LED strips to create a colorful glow at night.

Concept Design: Still Wild
Color Option 2

Color option 2 is the same concept, but would be made with shiny stainless steel and corten steel, with colored LEDs for a colorful glow at night. While not as colorful during the day, this look is more sophisticated and highlights a more modern community, while the corten steel still adds a touch of rugged and rustic. The colored LEDs would then bring a colorful flair to the piece at night, and could add some subtle color during the day as well.
