SPECIAL EVENTS

Annual Youth Congress: Held at the State Capitol. 150 youth attend, working with elected officials

Annual Youth Awards: Recognizing youth who have overcome various hardships and difficulties

Monthly "Youth Connections" program; held at local high schools, where officials meet with youth. Four have been scheduled thus far.

Lunch-n-Learns for the adult community in 2023; topics might include: Sex Trafficking, Fentanyl dangers, and others as needed.

WRAPAROUND

- Free
- Voluntary
- Work with families with youth, ages 5-21
- Work in the home, for 12-24 months
- Working to keep kids, safe, healthy, and remain in the home and attend school

WRAP works with families who have very complex needs.

WRAP families have gone from a 60% involvement rate to a 70% rate, showing an increase in complexity of family issues

Act as resource for the community, re: resources, problem solving, etc.

DCYI PROJECTS

Truancy

Serve on Truancy Prevention CMP Cmte. Attend Court, receive referrals from Family Magistrate, work with youth on obtaining GED's, work with youth via WrapAround

Juntos/Connexion

Collaboration with CSU Extension and DCSD; program for families who do not speak English in the home, helping develop leadership skills and post secondary education.

Teen Courts

Working with Towns supporting their Teen Courts

La Liga Jr and Sr: Coordinate, promote and help fund free soccer games

Implementation of ideas from Youth Congress A need that has been clearly identified as a priority

New for 2022 - 2023, DCYI's Truancy Project

For youth in court for truancy, which is about 80 youth as of Sept. 2022, DCYI is developing a Truancy Continuum, partnering with the DCSD, Courts, and CASA.

Continuum:

- DCSD sends letters A, B and a truancy contract
- Set up a SARB, Student Attendance Review Board meeting
- Coordinate a visit to the JAC, Juvenile Assessment Center appointment
- And , for the Youth in Court, others are assigned to assist:
- GAL, CASA and Wrap Specialist

Our program will work with the family and the youth; engage with the youth; help carry out assigned action items; will meet with youth once a week; will work with the CASA Mentor and the GAL to discuss strategies; communicate with the school on a regular basis, brainstorm as to what is working, what is not working, strategize on how to help student while in class, e.g., working with a student who does not attend, mainly due to not being at grade level, thus feeling overwhelmed.
