

## **CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES** *Parks, Open Space & Trails*

The following updates summarize general progress that occurred throughout the month on capital projects managed through the Parks and Recreation department; for background information and additional details visit CRgov.com/ProjectUpdates.



#### **METZLER FAMILY OPEN SPACE**

- Signage was installed along the trail and at the trailhead to provide orientation to users
- Parking lot construction is nearing completion and will wrap up in May
- A grand opening event will soon be advertised to inform the public of the property's new parking access off of Maleta Lane and East Allen Street, just north of Founders Parkway



#### **COLORADO FRONT RANGE TRAIL**

- One of the project's two bridges was set and the second will soon be placed on May 17
- The general contractor continues to build trail walls, as well as prep for the construction for the low stream crossing



#### **BUTTERFIELD PARK RENOVATION**

- The roof repair work on the pool structure was completed
- Painting of the pool building and bathroom and pavilion commenced, as well as tree and shrub planting
- The new courts will be surfaced throughout May
- Sign production is underway to provide orientation, park background information and donor recognition
- A grand opening celebration will be held Friday, June 9, featuring a sensory-friendly hour for Therapeutic Recreation division participants, followed by a host of fun activities more details to come!

## **CAPITAL PROJECT UPDATES** *Parks, Open Space & Trails*



#### MITCHELL GULCH PARK RENOVATION

- Work has been completed for water, stormwater and sewer utilities
- Crews are currently importing soil to prep for the construction of the tennis courts and the associated parking lot, as well as placing new irrigation



#### PLUM CREEK NORTH PARK

- Staff issued a request for bids from contractors to construct Plum Creek North Park
- Bids are due May 12 and staff will soon seek Town Council approval of a construction contract to commence project development later this summer






## **VEHICLE COUNTER** *Summary*






## **COMMUNITY** *Feedback*
