



WARMING UP VEHICLES MOTOR VEHICLE PREVENTION TIP

As the days become colder, most of us warm up our cars before driving to work, and many of us do not want to wait outside shivering while our vehicle is warming. Unfortunately, criminals know we are not fond of this routine and will attempt to take advantage of any opportunity. An unlocked vehicle *left running with the keys in the ignition* is a prime target for theft.

Below are a couple of tips to ensure your vehicle does not become a target while warming up:

- 1. Do not leave your vehicle unattended leaving a vehicle running and unattended is illegal in the state of Colorado.
 - ⇒ Instead: stand near, sit inside the vehicle or scrape off the snow and ice while your car warms up.



- 2. Do not leave your vehicle running and unattended while you run errands especially with children inside.
- 3. Keep your garage door opener and any spare keys with you not inside the vehicle. If your vehicle is stolen, the criminal may come back with your garage door opener in an attempt to access your garage and take other items.

Liquor code inspections were conducted at 10 Castle Rock businesses in NOVEMBER. No issues were reported at these locations.






DETECTIVE UNIT




3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: NOVEMBER (2015-2017)




YFAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: NOVEMBER





K-9 Activity: Monthly Comparison NOVEMBER (2015-2017)










