- Section 1 Added some definitions and revised some existing definitions for clarification purposes only. No intent or program changes as a result of these additions or clarifications.
- <u>Section 2</u> Expanded the education discussion to include the Water Wiser Workshop. Introducing / implementing a five (5) year expiration associated with the Water Wiser designation.
- <u>Section 3</u> No change to residential watering days or hours.

Removing the requirement to publish the watering schedule two times in a newspaper of general circulation. Instead, the watering schedule will be published on the Town's conservation website <a href="www.CRConserve.com">www.CRConserve.com</a> and in the official notice section of the main Town website <a href="www.crgov.com/notices">www.crgov.com/notices</a> and included in a new customer welcome packet.

Expanded the non-residential discussion to include a fixed three days per week watering schedule, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. – 6:00 a.m. Non-residential properties west of I-25 will be designated to water on Monday / Wednesday / Friday and properties east of I-25 will be designated to water on Tuesday / Thursday / Saturday.

Irrigation exemptions will not be issued or applicable July 1 - 31. An administrative fee up to \$25 will be charged for processing exemption applications.

Exemptions for sod are being reduced from 30 days to 21 days.

Exemptions for seed and other plant material are being reduced from 45 days to 30 days.

Water waste violations can be issued at any time throughout the year, independent of the watering schedule. This is not a new requirement, but discussion has been expanded to clarify the intent.

Residential customers shall complete irrigation repairs within five (5) days of violation; previously this was seven (7) days.

Non-residential customers shall complete irrigation repairs within one day (24 hours) of violation; previously this was two days (48 hours).

For non-residential irrigation services, a disconnection or reconnection fee of \$45 may be assessed.
