## FROM THE DESK OF THE CRIME ANALYST

#### Spring Tips

With spring upon us, you may be considering repairing your roof, fixing your driveway, or having some landscaping done in order to be ready for the upcoming warm weather. However, it is likely that you are not the only person thinking about these home improvement projects. Did you know there are groups of con-artists that attempt to scam unsuspecting homeowners or business owners, offering to do work on properties for cash, work without a contract, or work for an "unbelievable" price?

*Below are warning signs to be on the lookout for this type of scam:* 

- Going door-to-door and offering to work on your house or property due to working in the immediate area with leftover materials and/or spare time.
- Providing you with very little information about themselves or their business, e.g., no last name on a business card, no address of the company, or no available references.
- Not requiring a contract or written deal for their work.
- Pushing you to make a decision without providing you an estimate—if what they are offering you is "only available today," it is likely a scam.
- Stating they are "cash only."

Before hiring a contractor, remember to check the <u>Better Business Bureau</u> for any complaints the contractor may have received.

Remember to contact Castle Rock Police Department, if you feel you have been a victim of a crime.






#### **DETECTIVE UNIT**


3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: MARCH (2016-2018)







**Training** - Officer Thompson and Ronin participated in a training inside a tear-gas filled room. WATCH VIDEO (if reading electronic version)




Total Traffic Stops (2016-2018)





Training Hours by Category (average per officer) MARCH 2018






