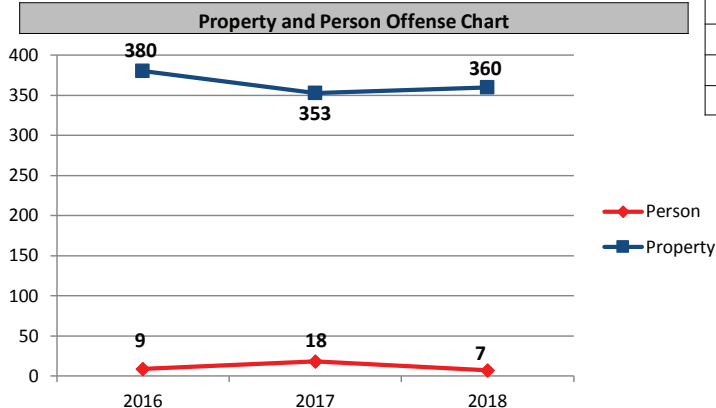

SOLICITOR REMINDERS

Often in the spring and summer, we see an increase of door to door solicitors. There are a few things that you should keep in mind as Castle Rock residents.

- Not everyone that comes to your home *acting* as a solicitor, is a solicitor.
 - * Sometimes criminals send someone to pretend to be a solicitor to verify if you are home.
 - * If you are not, they may burglarize your home.
 - * If you are home, they may try to see what you have inside your home to come back at a later time.
- All solicitors should be registered through the Town of Castle Rock.

 - * All registered solicitors should be wearing a registered badge with the individual or business name and badge number.

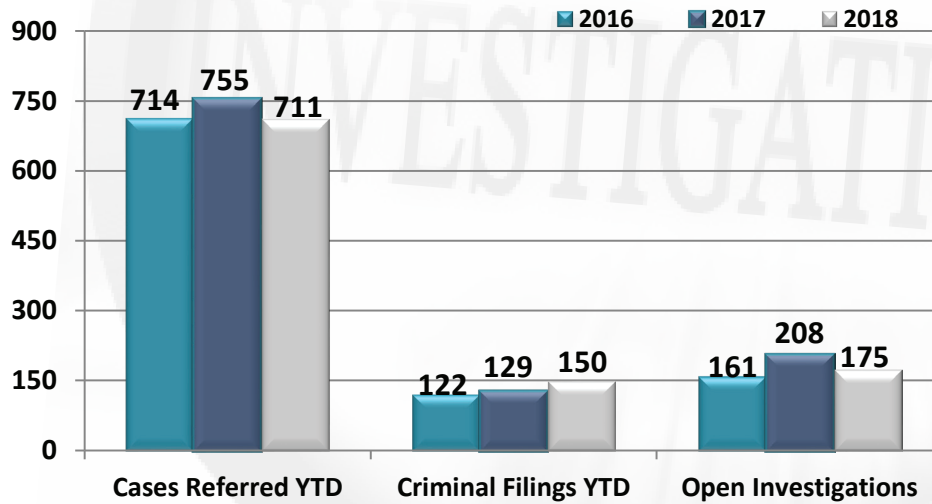

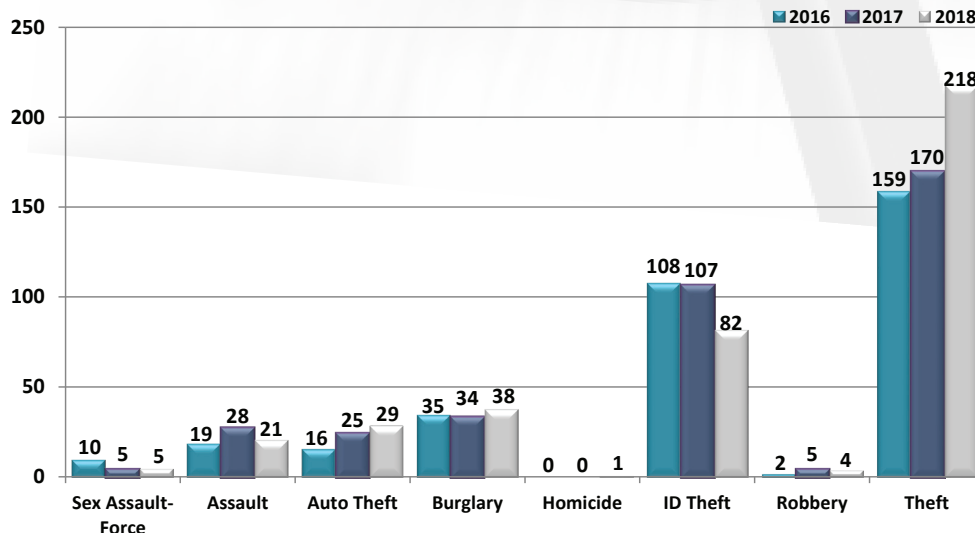

YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: **MAY** (2016-2018)



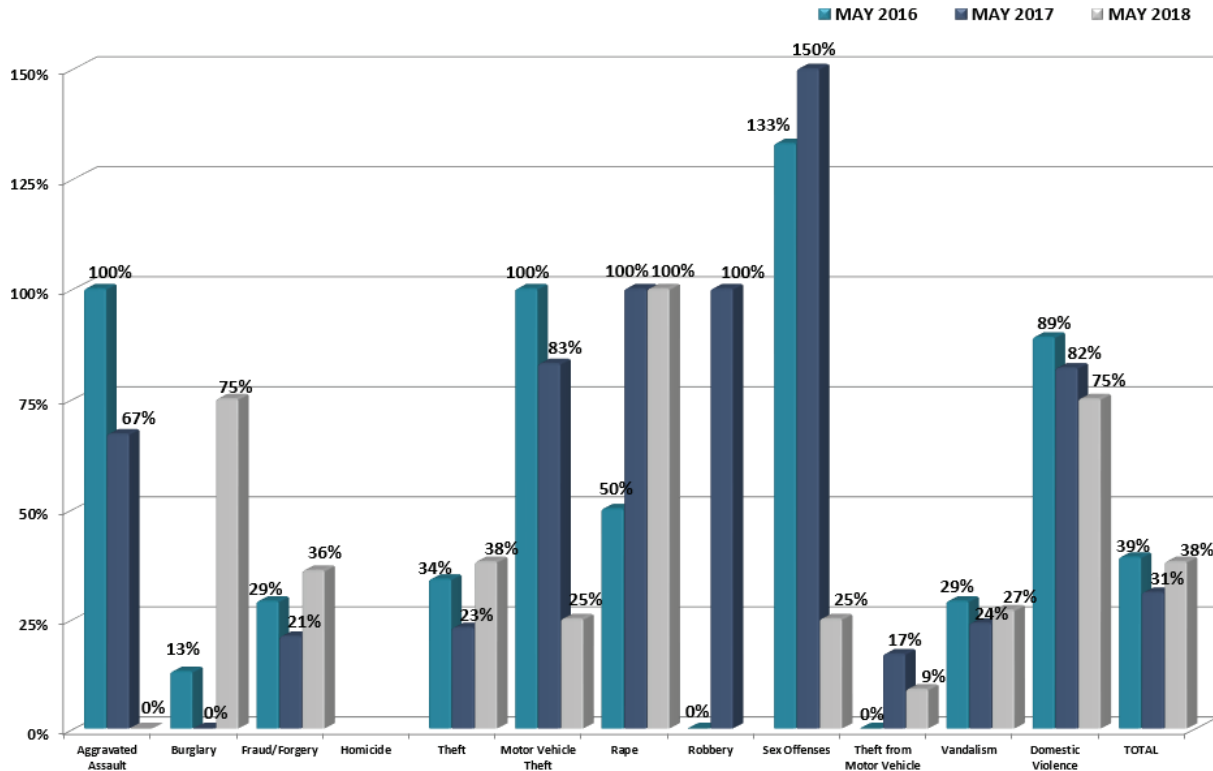
3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: **MAY** (2016-2018)

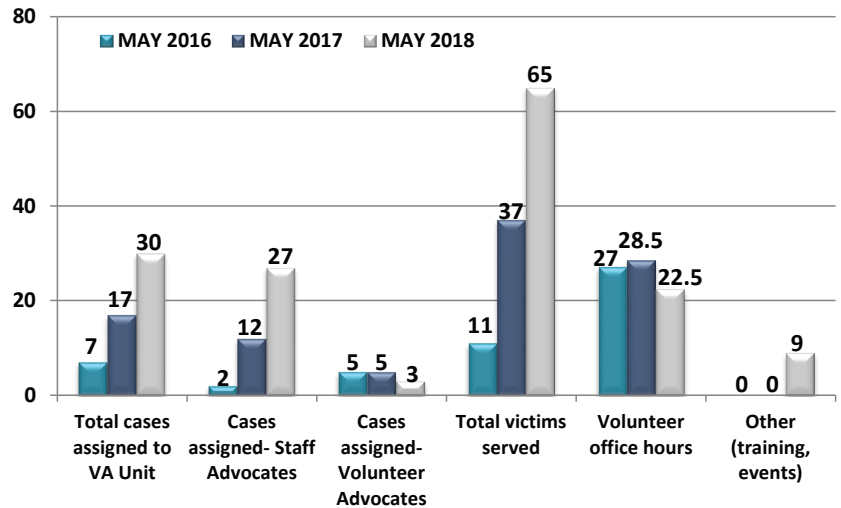
VICTIMS ASSISTANCE UNIT (VAU)

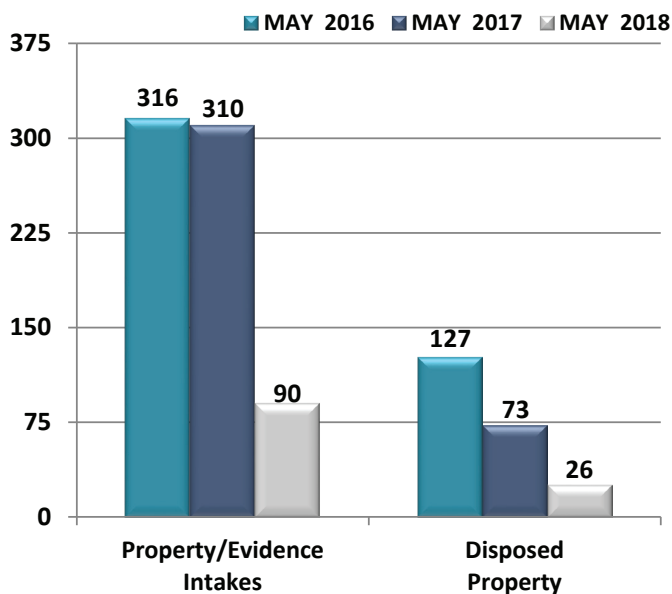


assistance to the citizens who experience loss due to fire.

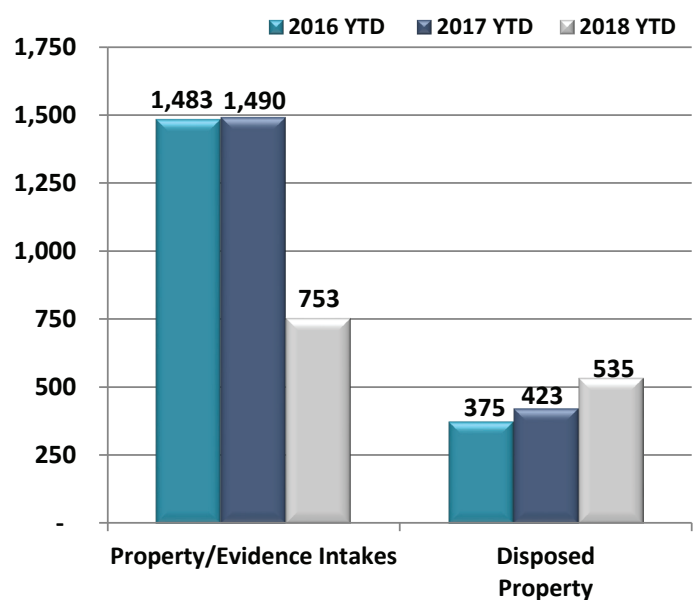


PROPERTY & EVIDENCE STATISTICS

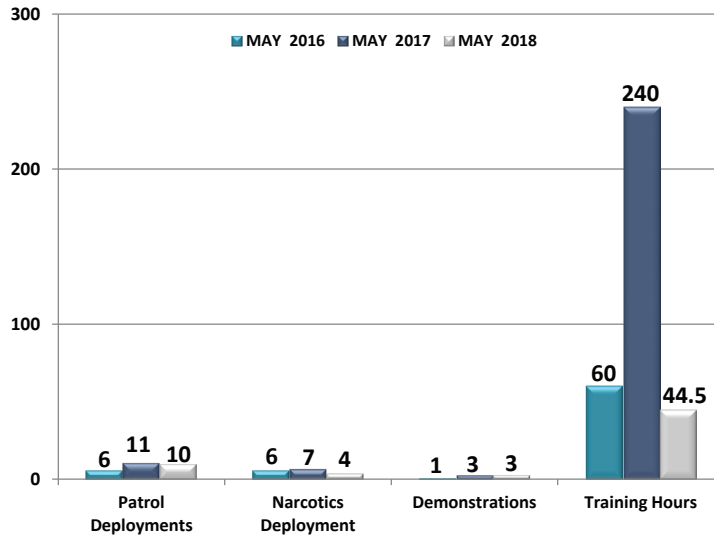

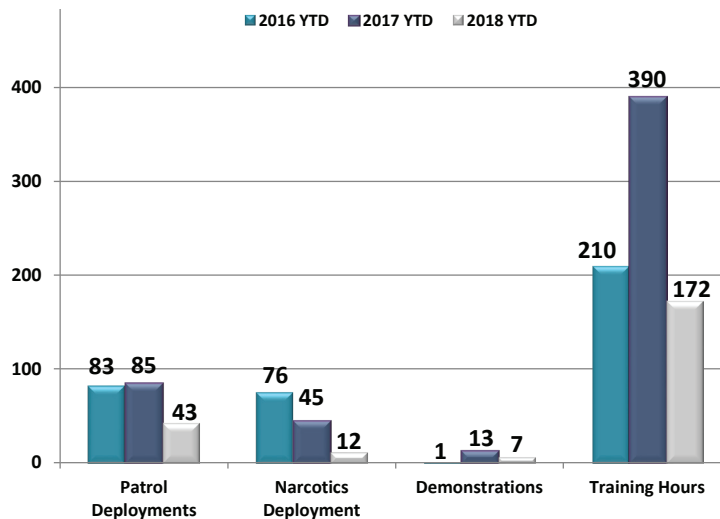

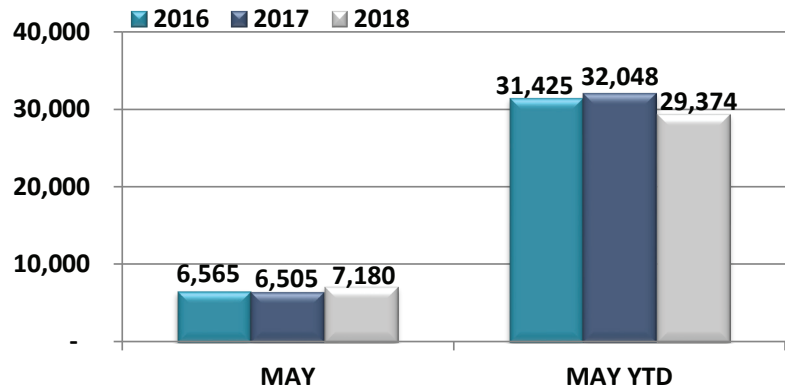

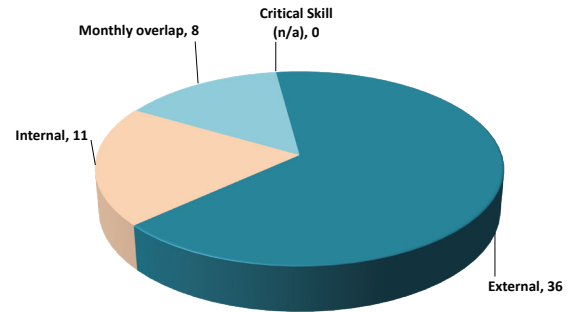

MAY 2018



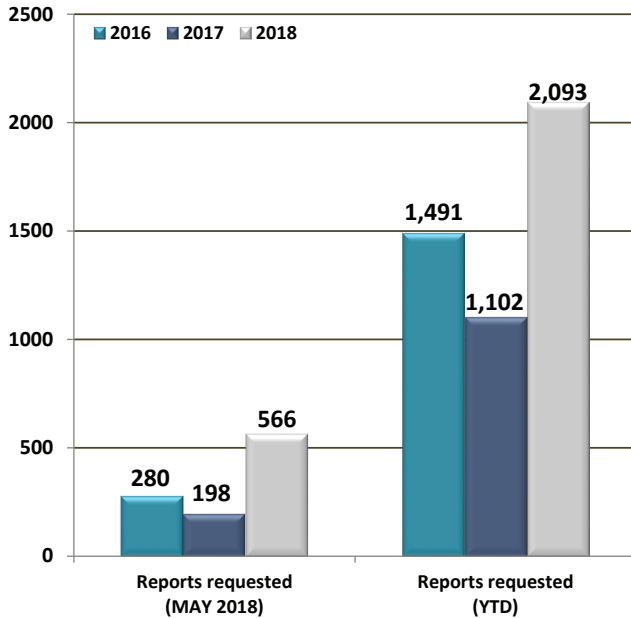
TRAINING HOURS BY CATEGORY

MAY 2018



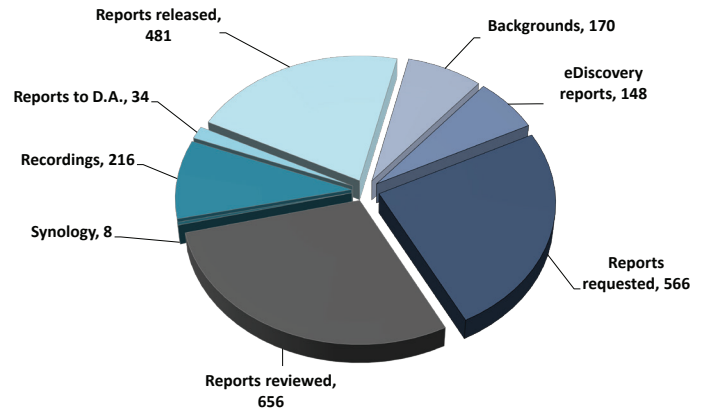

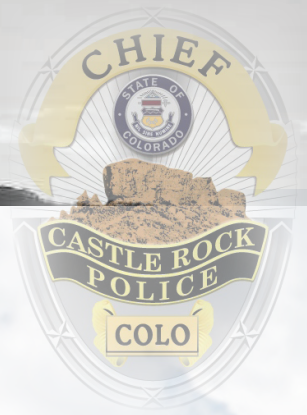
