

RENTALS & HOUSING SCAMS

Summer is the time of year when rentals become more readily available and families move into a new home. But, this also means that it's the perfect time of year for rental scams. In the most common rental scam, criminals will post pictures of a home that they claim to own and want to rent out. Once they are contacted by an interested party (their potential victim), they will request that the victim send a security deposit via MoneyGram or Western Union, or will ask for a direct transfer to a Wells Fargo account. The criminal will typically request this money before the victim has even had a chance to see the home or apartment. Once the victim sends the money, the criminal will then become increasingly difficult to contact or will cease contact with the victim altogether.



So, if you are looking for a new home to rent, keep the following in mind during your search:

- Shop wisely if the rental price seems too good to be true, it probably is.
- Be wary of over-eager landlords who want to "get the deal done" as quickly as possible.
- Know your price if you're asked to pay an unusually high security deposit or upfront fees, walk away.
- Check for duplicate ads see if the apartment or home is listed on other websites for different prices or with different contact numbers.
- If you are requested to send money before seeing the apartment or home, do not send the money ask to meet with the landlord and see the home before you pay a deposit.
- If you go to see a rental or meet the landlord, make sure you do not go alone.

If you believe you have been the victim of a rental scam, immediately report it to your **Castle Rock Police Department!**



At our June volunteer meeting, Detective Williams provided an interesting training on Teens and Social Media Apps. The training provided an overview of commonly used social networking sites such as Tumblr, Snapchat and Kik that may be used to sexually exploit children and teenagers. Volunteers were fascinated to learn about platforms that can disguise the content of the apps on their teen's smartphone.

Detective Williams continued the training with an update of new legislation regarding sexting and the posting, possession or exchanging of sexual images. The presentation helped our volunteers to be more aware of what to look for on *their* teens' smartphones and was informed as to how our community's youth are communicating and what they may be exposed to when using their phones.


