



# Motor Vehicle Theft Prevention

Motor vehicle theft is on the rise in Castle Rock, and law enforcement needs your help in preventing motor vehicle thefts from continuing. Not all motor vehicle thefts are crimes of opportunity, but that doesn't mean criminals won't take the opportunity should they feel your vehicle would be an *easy* steal.

In order to *help* law enforcement *help* you, below are methods in which you can further secure your vehicle to make it less appealing or easy for thieves:

- Never leave the car running or with keys in the ignition, even if you know you will only be away from your vehicle "for a minute."
- Never leave your keys inside the vehicle. ALWAYS have the keys to the vehicle with you.



- When you are out and about, park in well-lit areas that also experience a lot of foot traffic. The potential of being too easily seen by too many witnesses may work as deterrents for vehicle thieves.
- For extra protection, install a mechanical locking device—such as clubs, j-bars, or collars—that prevent the wheel from being turned more than a few degrees while you are away from the vehicle.





#### **DETECTIVE UNIT**



CLEARANCE RATES COMPARISON JULY (2016-2018)





On July 9, the Victim Assistance Unit attended a joint training with volunteers from Douglas County Sherriff's Office, Parker and Lone Tree Police Departments. Hosted by Lone Tree Police Department, volunteers heard from Jennifer Bishara, Sex Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Coordinator and learned about the sex assault reporting options for victims and what exactly happens during the exam. Bringing all the volunteers together from different agencies builds rapport and fosters ongoing professional relationships so that, if needed, we can assist each other in the event of a larger crisis.







#### PROPERTY & EVIDENCE STATISTICS

#### EXPLORER UNIT JULY (2016-2018)


During JULY, the Explorer Unit participated once again at the LEEPAC competition. They competed against 25 agencies from Colorado and Arizona and placed in the following categories:





# K-9 ACTIVITY: JULY COMPARISON PAST 3-MONTHS (2018)




# YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON YTD (2016-2018)







JULY YTD (2016-2018)










