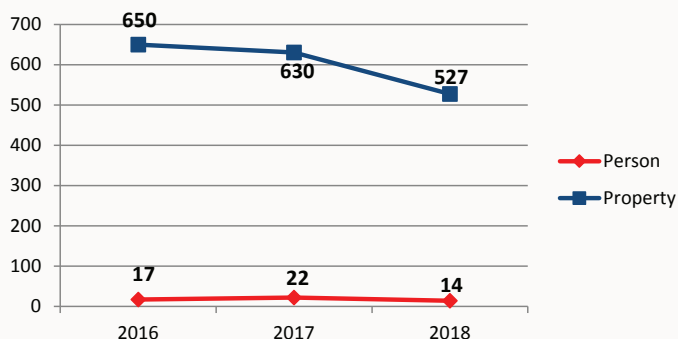

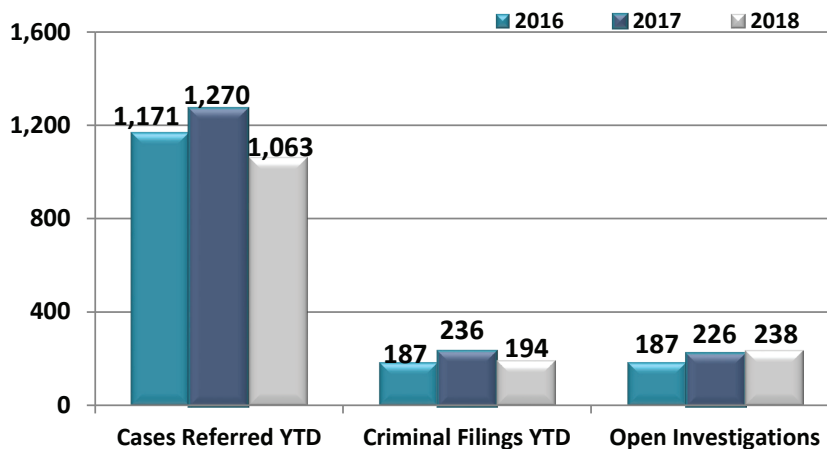

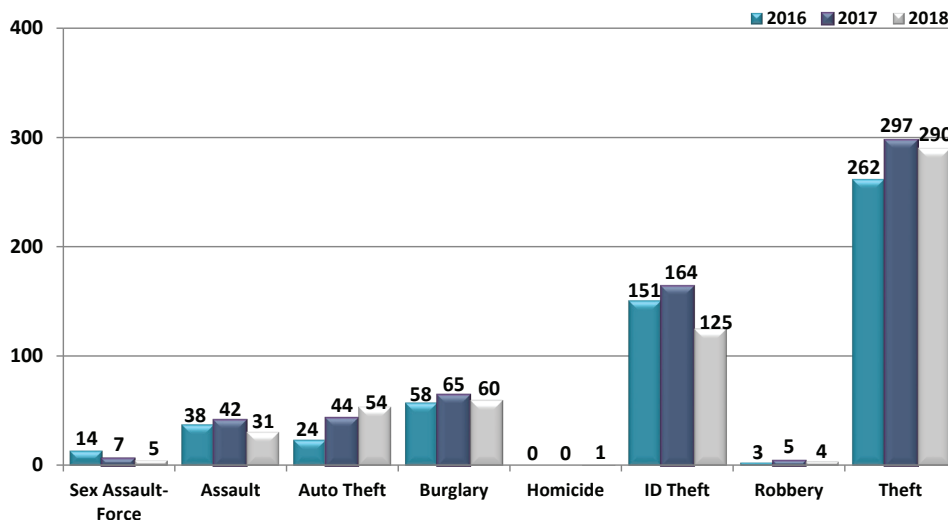
UPDATES

In June of 2018, a Castle Rock Police multi-departmental build team was created to evaluate the case report internal routing system. Due to suggestions made by the build team, in July of 2018 the Investigations Unit modified the process and criteria in which cases are assigned to detectives. Now in conjunction with the daily cases assigned to the detectives, criminal cases not meeting current solvability factors are individually reviewed by detectives proficient in that specific field (i.e. Motor Vehicle Theft, ID Theft, etc.). During the months of July and August (2018), an additional **206** cases were reviewed as a result of these changes.

YEAR-TO-DATE COMPARISON: AUGUST (2016-2018)

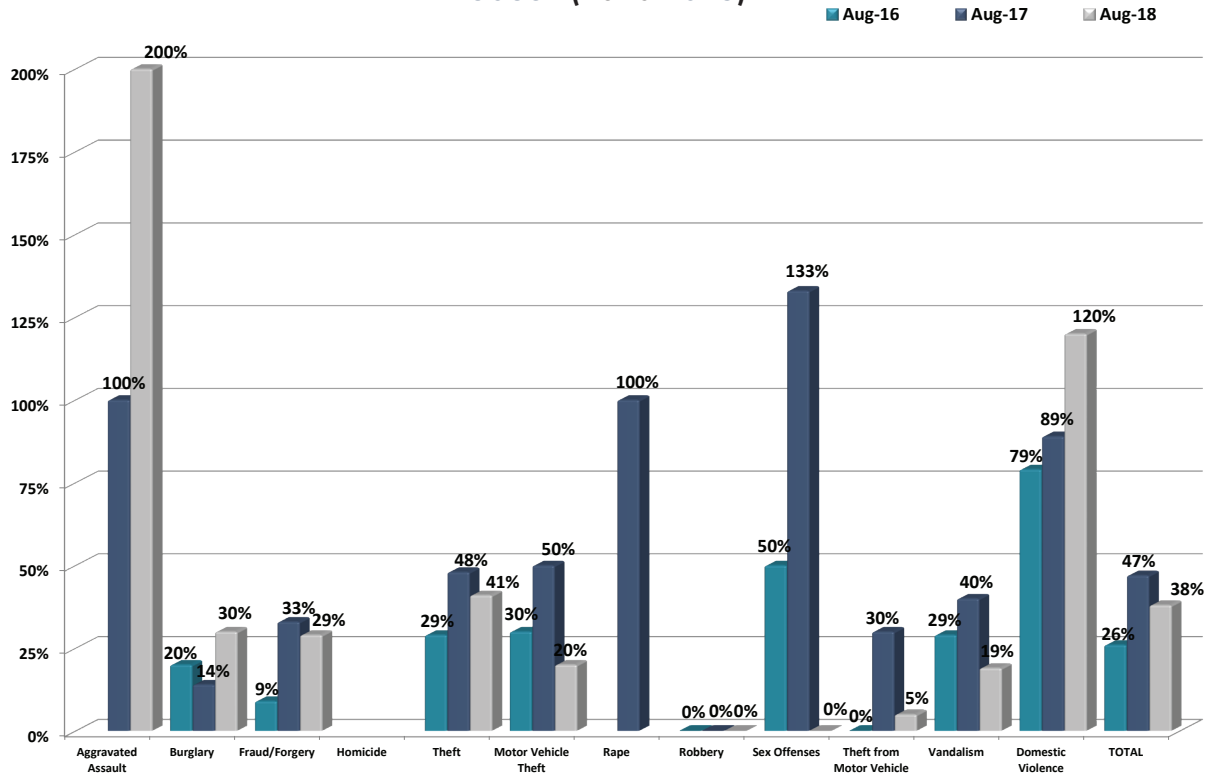


3-YEAR CRIME TREND COMPARISON YEAR-TO-DATE: AUGUST (2016-2018)





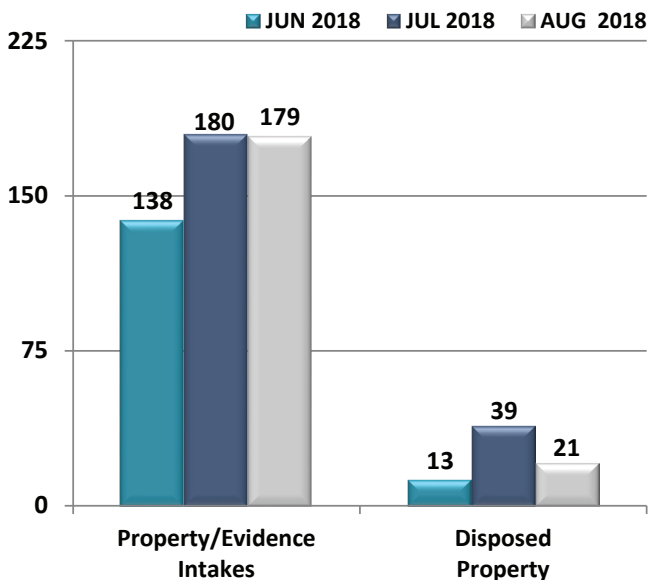
CLEARANCE RATES COMPARISON AUGUST (2016-2018)



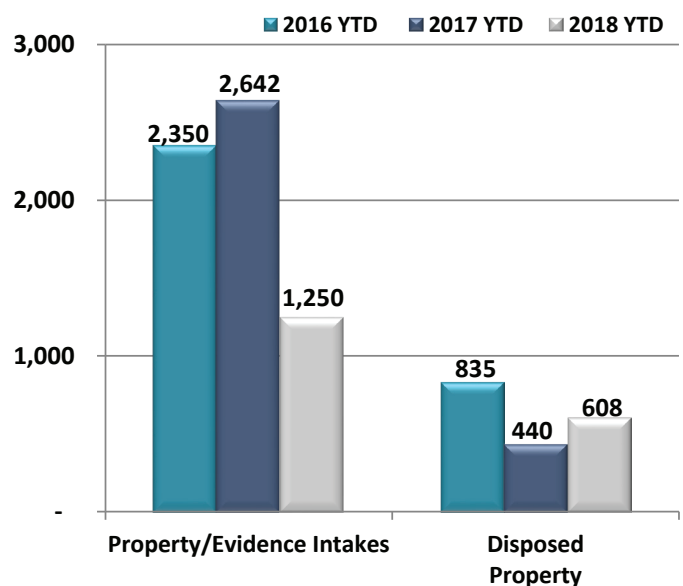

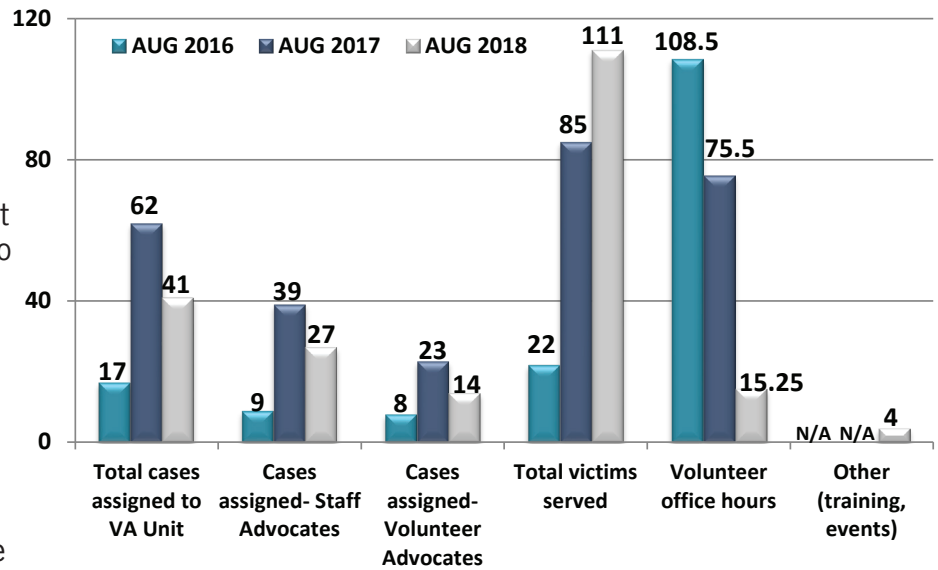

Narcotics Deployment - Officer Thompson and Ronin conducted a drug sniff at DC Oaks, which resulted in a marijuana discovery.

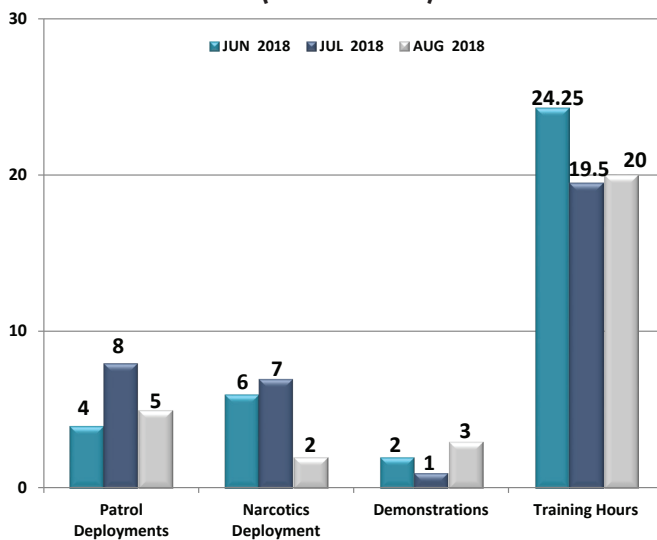
Demonstrations - Officer Thompson and Ronin participated in three K9 demonstrations this month. Great attendance at our annual National Night Out (NNO).

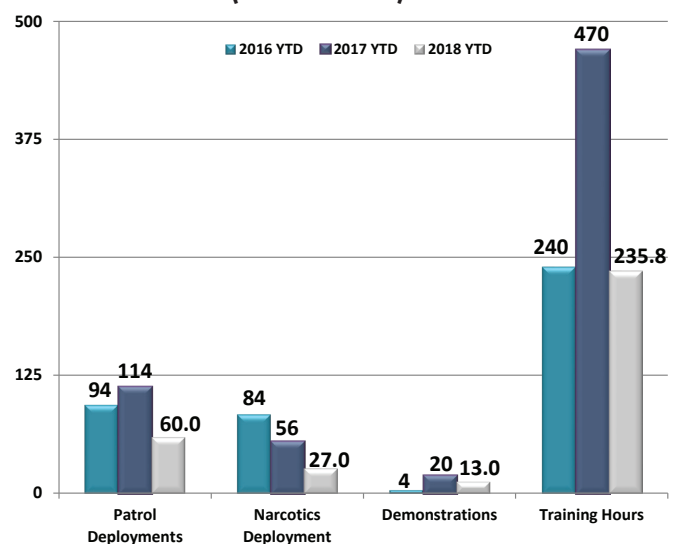

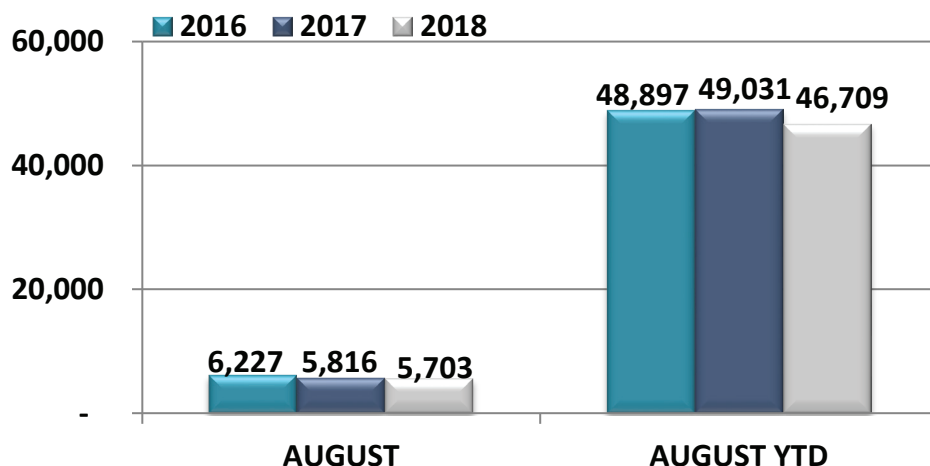

During AUGUST, the Explorer Unit was busy preparing for the upcoming haunted house, which opens in October (three weekends only).

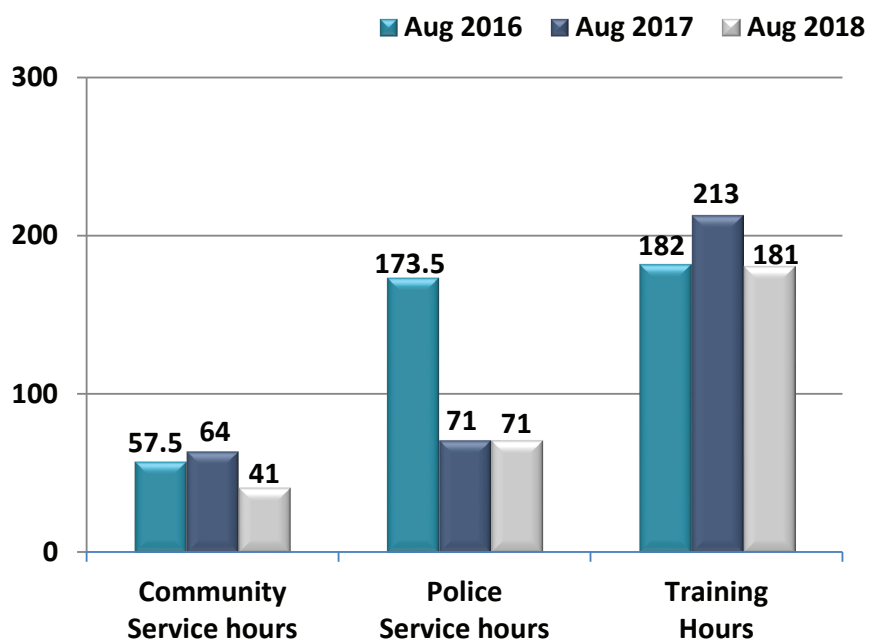
The unit has recently welcomed three new Explorers with two more applicants in process.

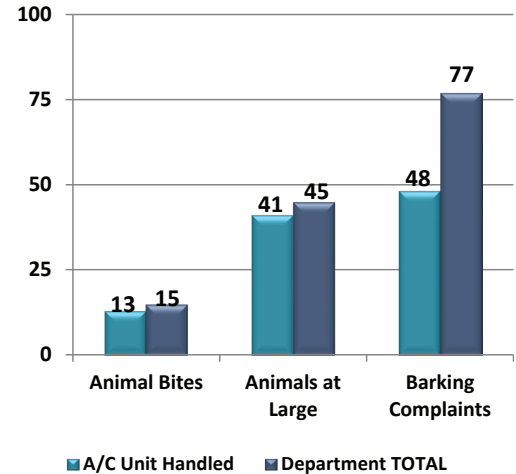

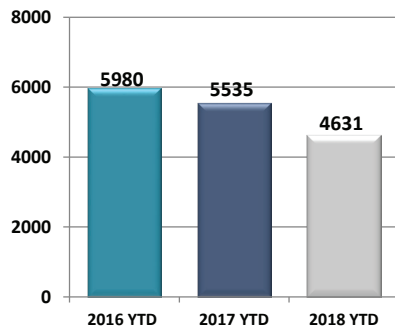

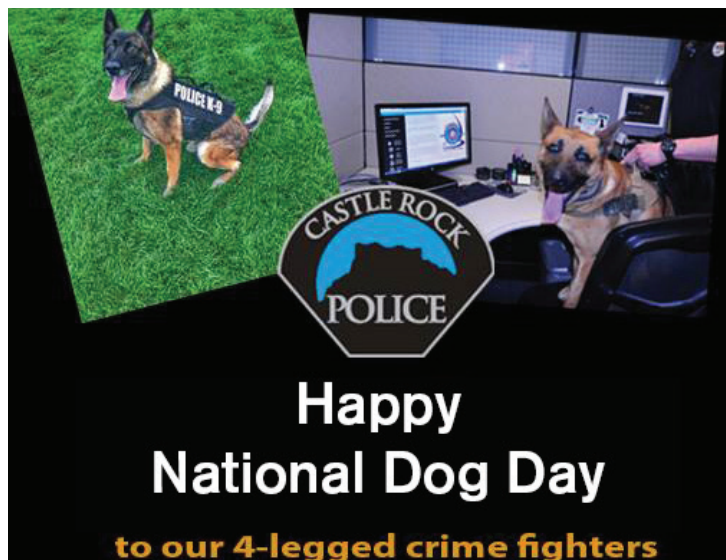
