

RESOLUTION NO. 2018-**A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE CRYSTAL VALLEY INTERCHANGE COALITION**

WHEREAS, the Town Council finds that determining the proper configuration and developing a plan for funding the proposed Crystal Valley Interchange and related frontage road improvements (“Interchange”) is of high priority,

WHEREAS, on October 2, 2018, Town Council directed Town staff to continue to develop funding options and seek community input for the Interchange and report such options and community input back to the Town Council for further consideration and direction,

WHEREAS, the Town Council has been made aware that a group of stakeholders interested in development of the Interchange has organized the Crystal Valley Interchange Coalition (“CVIC”), as further described in the attached October 2, 2018 correspondence, and

WHEREAS, the Town Council believes that the CVIC may bring perspectives and resources which will aid in development of the Interchange.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE TOWN COUNCIL OF THE TOWN OF CASTLE ROCK, COLORADO AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Town Council formally recognizes the Crystal Valley Interchange Coalition, as an *ad hoc* organization supporting the development of the Interchange, and in particular, analyzing the availability of potential funding sources to support construction of the Interchange on an expedited basis. The Coalition is encouraged to coordinate its efforts with the Town on all aspects of the Interchange planning.

Section 2. The Town Council recognizes that Councilmembers Teal and Loban may from time to time, serves as informal liaisons to the CVIC and shall update the Town Council and Town staff on the activities of the CVIC as appropriate.

Crystal Valley Interchange Coalition (CVIC)

What is the purpose of CVIC?

The Coalition is to be a proactive advocacy group focused on approving and accelerating the design, costing, scheduling, and funding of the new Crystal Valley Interchange and West Frontage Road from Plum Creek Parkway south to Tomah Road.

What are the focus areas for the CVIC?

The Coalition will assist in identifying funding sources and financing mechanisms to advance project implementation. The Coalition will also look to improve safety, Plum Creek traffic congestion, connectivity to adjacent roadway network, and ability to support Town of Castle Rock Southwest Quadrant Masterplan.

Why form a Coalition?

Coalitions have been a successful model for obtaining transportation funding and advancing projects in Colorado (i.e. T-REX, US 36, C-470, I-70 Mountain, I-25 GAP). It has become a familiar approach with CDOT and other policy makers with an objective to leverage resources, coordinate efforts and speaking with one voice.

Who are the members of the CVIC?

What are the project limits of CVIC?

The Coalition is focusing their efforts on accelerating the priority and construction of the Crystal Valley Interchange and 5.48 miles of West Frontage Road from Plum Creek Parkway to Tomah Road.
