

DETECTIVE UNIT




VICTIMS ASSISTANCE UNIT (VAU)

In September, the Castle Rock Victim Assistance team hosted training for all Douglas County law enforcement victims' assistance programs. Our invited guest speaker was Ami McCarthy from the Colorado Organization of Victims Assistance and she presented on Vicarious Trauma and self-care. Thirty volunteers attended this dynamic and healing presentation.

The law enforcement victim assistance coordinators from Castle Rock Police, Lone Tree Police, Parker Police, and Douglas County Sheriff's Office jointly began the Volunteer Victim Assistance Academy. The academy will run for five weeks with each agency hosting one full day of speakers with a training agenda aimed at preparing twenty-one new volunteers to provide victim services in their respective jurisdictions. VA Coordinator Debbie Lewis, is thrilled to bring on eight new volunteers to the Castle Rock VA team. After completion of the academy, the new volunteers will be mentored during their first few call outs before taking their own shifts. It takes an extraordinary individual to dedicate so much time to the academy, the VA Program, and our community.





Unit Statistics sept. (2016-2018)


