For placement in Castle Rock's Philip S. Miller Park
1375 W. Plum Creek Parkway, Castle Rock, CO 80109

Tree of Wings

John King and Mary Williams will design, fabricate, finish, deliver and install an original kinetic sculpture for Philip S. Miller Park in Castle Rock. Artists will work with designated representatives of the Public Art Commission and Town staff to finalize project details, such as color, placement, installation schedule, foundation type, etc. Proposal details will evolve during design process.

Artwork is to be attached to a concrete slab on a grade or pier foundation created by the artists. Artists will collaborate with the Public Art Commission and Town staff to finalize an agreed upon location within the park. Artists will also work with Town staff to coordinate the creation of the foundation elements on site.

The artwork will include a base tower that will elevate all moving parts to a height of 9 feet above the ground.

The sculpture will have a smooth and controlled kinetic motion in winds, high and low.

A nameplate for the artwork will be included.

Proposed sculpture specifications:

- Overall height – 15 feet
- Width of moving elements – 12-16 feet
- Height of moving elements above ground – 9 feet
- Construction will include –
 - Mild steel tubing with stainless steel bearing mounts and connectors
 - Sealed ball bearings with an approximate 10-year lifespan that can be easily replaced by park staff or artist
 - Galvanized steel and aluminum sheet metal
 - High-quality transparent automotive paints and double layer clear coat applied to all steel
- Foundation
 - The foundation will either be a 6-foot diameter round concrete slab on grade with 10-inch thickness, or a 24-inch diameter concrete pier foundation with a 5-foot depth
- Lighting – Artists are examining the possibility of built-in lighting in the sculpture, the budget may limit this option

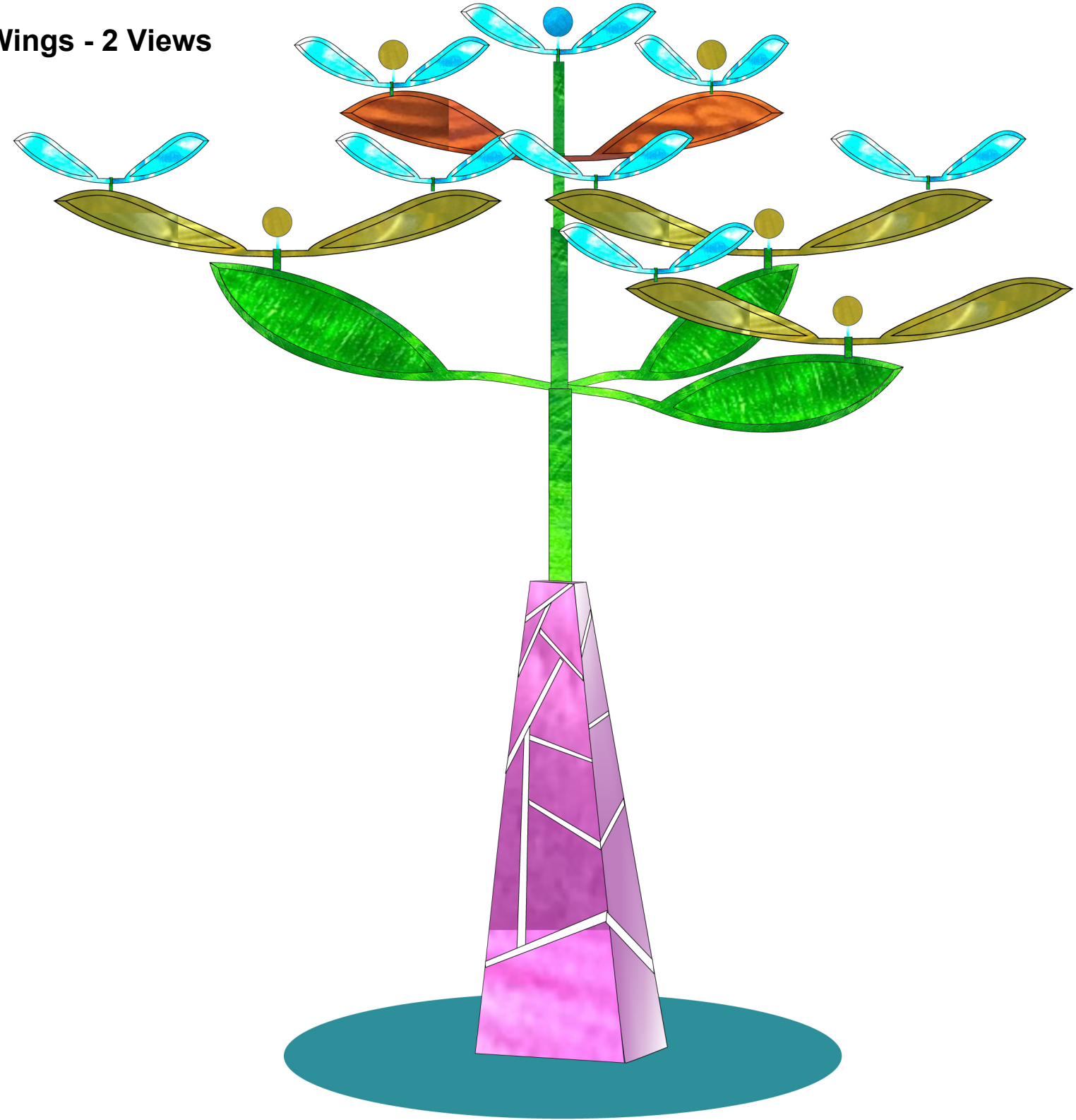
Tree of Wings - A

Request for Proposal Application Letter

Dear Castle Rock Public Art Commission,

Mary Williams and John King would like to submit a proposal as a team. When we learned of this opportunity we were excited to submit as we have successfully integrated relevant artworks in similar recreational spaces in unique and memorable ways. You'll find in our proposal examples of sculptures that we have collaborated on together and other pieces that we believe are excellent examples of what we would like to propose for the Philip S. Miller Park.

Our vision is to create a signature artwork relevant to your site that engages your audiences and creates an overall lasting image for the park. With all the active amenities such as: The Mac, The Challenge Hill, Zip Line, and the The Epic Adventure Tower to name just a few, the park is action packed and full of motion. Which is why we thought that a static sculpture, while potentially interesting, just wasn't enough to live up to this energetic park! Thus we turn to the world of kinetic sculptures.

We would like to submit two ideas that have kinetic executions. Sculptures that create motion seemed like a perfect fit to embrace the essence of the park. Our first concept we call "Tree of Light" resembles a tree with branches and leaves circling overhead in the wind. The leaf shapes have holes within them that would cast dancing shadows on the ground. We envision children dodging the shadows like a game. Our second concept " Exercisers" has three sculptures graceful moving around each other as if they were participating in an exercise routine. Brightly painted they will surely be seen from a distance and welcome visitors to park. These sculptures would beg for photos, as viewers are likely to mimic the movements of the sculptures for the camera.

The sketches attached show both concepts in recommended potential locations. Colors are yet to be determined. " Tree of Lights" would be approximately 14'tall x 10' wx 10'd. Weighing 600lbs. Placed on a 6' – 8' diameter slab on grade 8" – 12" thick. The "Exercisers" would be approximately 17' tall x 14'wide x 14' d for all three. Weight per sculpture 200lbs. placed in individual postholes 14" diameter by 3' deep. Both concepts can be created within the \$50,000 budget. Itemized breakout of cost will be provided if one of these concepts is chosen for the semi-finalist round.

John and Mary have a combined 25 years of experience working within the field of public art. They are experienced in effectively communicating concepts and enjoy the spirited creative process of working on a team. We would approach your project using various time-tested materials that are commonly used for outdoor structures.

We believe collaboration is about shared visions driven by powerful ideas. A successful project is one that ensures that the vision and ideas are protected throughout and that the final outcome is one that is not a surprise, but spot on! We are available for your timeline and are excited to create a signature kinetic sculpture for the Philip S. Miller Park.

1. Hibiscus Flower Sculpture 2017 11' x 12' x 12'

Located at the Castle Rock Adventist Hospital Healing Garden, Castle Rock, CO.

The donor requested the theme of a Hibiscus flower. The pedals of the flower were created in ground by using a graphic pattern of Lithocrete (crushed glass in bedded in concrete). The concrete stem with the kinetic component mimic the stamen of the flower. The kinetic component is intended to create a calming motion for mediation purposes within the garden. When approaching the sculpture from the garden level the pedals are revealed so that the viewer can discover the sculpture is a flower. The views from 2nd and 3rd floors of the surrounding buildings reveal the complete flower. The motion from the stamen invites the viewer to visit the garden for a closer look.

Medium: Lithocrete concrete, automotive paints on steel.

2. Memorial Candles 2017 7' x 6' x 5'

Located at the Parker Adventist Hospital Healing Garden, Parker, CO.

The objective of these sculptures was to create a memorial for associates of the hospital who had passed. Candles are a beautiful and appropriate sign of the continued beauty and meaning of someone's life. Lighting a candle provides comfort, warmth and hope, and often helps with the grieving process. The kinetic flames flicker in the wind symbolizing eternal light.

Medium: steel and patina copper.

3. Solstice Sculptures 2011 Summer 9' tall x 10' w x 10'd Winter 6'tall x 3'w x 3'd

Located at the Elk Ridge Park, Castle Pines, CO.

Mary's collaboration with the landscape architects, Design Concepts, was a successful example of a design team and artist working together to realize and create their vision of geology and discovery. The interaction of the summer and winter solstice within the sculptures created an ongoing opportunity for engagement with the community.

For three weeks around the solstices the sun passes through the sculptures and marks another sculpture on the ground.

Medium: interior steel armature, epoxy clay, finished with a bronze, copper and aluminum metal cladding.

4. Beaver Creek Totems 2005 14' tall x 12' w x 12"d

Located at Beaver Creek Ski Resort, Beaver Creek, CO.

Commissioned to create a totemic structure that would hold the kids ski school trail map. Images used were inspired from the trail run names. This sculpture has become an icon for the kids school and photographic point for many families.

Medium: Cedar, outdoor house paint, automotive urethane.

5. BOB 2003 8' tall x 5'w x 5' d (suspended from a 30 ft. ceiling)

Located at Philip S Miller Library, Castle Rock, CO

This commission's objective was to create a colorful and whimsical sculpture to hang in a glass tower devoted to teens only. The space required the sculpture to hang from a 30' ceiling and speak to the teen audience. This objective was accomplished by the color, design, use of local aspen trees and neon. We had a contest for the teens to name the sculpture which created a sense of ownership and established a gathering place that was unique for them.

Medium: aspen, acrylic, aluminum, neon

1. Cloud Castles 2016 18' high, 12'w x 12'd.

Located at Rotella Park, Adams County, CO.

One of three Interactive and wind activated sculptures. All on the theme of "Look Up". The piece is turned by the viewer engaging them to look up at the shapes intermingling with each other as if clouds were flying overhead.

Medium: Powder coated steel.

2. Taking Wing 2016 2 towers, 20' tall x 10' w x 10'd.

Located at Denver Public Schools Emily Griffith Campus, Denver, CO.

Taking Wing references the life journeys of the students of the 5 schools located within the high rise building. Wind activated.

Medium: Powdercoated steel.

3. Star Catcher 2017 14' tall x 10'w x 10'd.

Located at Children's Hospital, Denver, CO.

An engaging meditation on the sky... Turning the sculpture reflects ones' attention upward... helpful to visitors during times of challenge.

Medium: Automotive paints on steel.

4. Lollipop Tree 2017 17' tall x 14' w x 14' d.

Located at Uptown Trees, Greeley, CO.

The Lollipop Tree was chosen as a commission for the Greeley Uptown Trees exhibit. Brightly colored leaves and lollipops turn and tumble in the breeze. The piece handles itself well in light and strong winds.

Medium: Automotive paints on steel.

5. Sunrise 2017 20' tall x 18' w x 6'd.

Located at Aurora City Center Rail Station, Aurora, CO.

A large interactive turning sun with flashing elements is turned by passers by on the light rail train platform. Created to engage the travelers as they wait for the train.
